For being the first baby born at Sidney Health Center in 2015, Jaxon and his parents received a gift basket full of baby items valued at more than \$200 from the Sidney Health Center Volunteers.

Although Jaxon was the first baby born in 2015, 2014 was a busy year for the obstetric department. In the past year, 165 babies were delivered at Sidney Health Center averaging 13

babies per month. Eighty-three of the babies were girls while eighty-two were boys.

Sidney Health Center's female Obstetrician Gynecologist provides essential obstetrical services to women living in the MonDak region including preconception counseling, genetic screening and diagnosis as well as management of both low and high risk pregnancies through delivery and follow-up care. Dr. Shari Twigg has been practicing in Sidney since 2011.

The Sidney Health Center obstetric and newborn units feature Labor, Delivery, Recovery, Postpartum (LDRP) rooms. These rooms are equipped with Jacuzzi tubs and Hill-Rom birthing beds. During labor, options for pain medication are offered. A trained and experienced OB and Nursery Staff is available 24 hours a day.

The obstetric department also offers a One-Day Childbirth Class four times per year with the first one in 2015 scheduled for February 7 in the hospital classroom from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Instructors, Joyce Schulz, RN and Katharine King, RN will review the following topics: relaxation, anatomy and physiology of childbirth, types of delivery, anesthesia, breast feeding and child care. The session is free of charge; however, donations up to \$25 are gladly accepted to cover expenses.

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month

Cervical cancer used to be the leading cause of death for women in the United States. However, in the last 40 years, the number of cases of cervical cancer and deaths resulting from it has decreased significantly. The decline is largely due to advances in early screening for precancerous cervical changes that can be treated before the cells become cancerous. Cervical cancer, when caught early, is highly treatable. Cervical cancer is almost entirely preventable in most Western countries due to routine screenings and a vaccine to prevent HPV (human papillomavirus) infections which when left untreated can lead to cervical cancer.

HPV is an infection that is thought to be responsible for 90% of cervical and anal cancers, about 70% of vaginal and vulvar cancers, and more than 60% of penile cancers in the United States. Furthermore, recent studies indicate that about 70% of oropharynx (throat) cancers are related to HPV infections. HPV is transmitted by skin to skin contact – not through the exchange of bodily fluids. Approximately 80% of all sexually active people in the United States will have had HPV by the time they are 50 years old. HPV is the most common sexually transmitted illness and there are more than 40 subtypes of the virus that can infect both men and women. Not all subtypes cause cancer, but vaccines are available for both males and females to prevent those that do

The following steps are the best way to prevent cervical cancer: Get routine screenings as recommended by your provider.

Avoid or reduce tobacco use. Know your body. Get vaccinated. If you would like more information, contact the Richland County Family Planning program at 433-2207. HPV vaccine is available during clinic hours on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays from noon until 4:30pm. Call today!



Eagles Take Second At Fargo's Rumble On The Red Tournament





Will Plummeting Oil Prices Affect Boom Town?



WILLISTON: The combination of the discovery of the Bakken shale, fracking technology, and horizontal drilling has brought with it many things

including: an economic boom, catapulting employment rates. steeply heightened rental rates

and increased crime rates. Oil production in North Dakota has grown approximately 600 percent over the past decade and the Bakken region itself is producing over a million gallons of crude oil a day.

This growth has meant major investments in infrastructure and housing for the city of Williston.

Williston Mayor Howard Krug, recently spoke with

member of NPR's Here and Now stating that the population in Williston has grown from 16,000 residents to more than 27,000 residents.

Klug told NPR that the city of

Williston is around \$300 million in debt due to expansion of its housing and infrastructure to support the new residents. He also says that the city is four years behind on paying off this debt. But now, the low oil prices are making it difficult to continue to repay that debt, which Klug said would otherwise be "manageable."

In July 2014, oil prices plummeted to a five-year low and have continued to fall ever since. It's been great news for drivers at the gas pumps but not such great news for oil producers and for the economy.

So far, the decline in oil prices has not deterred investors from their interest in Williston.

"We have a plan that we'll be able to spread out our debt," Klug said. "The state of North Dakota has enough money to make Williston whole right now." Klug also boasted on the area's agriculture stating, "We have some of the most fertile farm land in the entire world. We're number one in lentils. We're number one in durum." Klug is optimistic in thinking that as long as the oil prices do not stay down for a long period of time, "we should be just fine here in western North Dakota."



A Little Bit Country

New Durum Garners High teres

There has been great interest in a new variety name Joppa which was developed by the NDSU Durum Breeding Program. It was released by the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station in 2014 but production problems prevented its release in time for the 2014 growing season. As a fresh release for the 2014 planting season there is an above normal amount of Foundation seed available for 2015. Some of the people in-the-know tell me there is approximately 10,000 bushels available statewide to be grown under contract with local county crop/ag improvement associations and the Agricultural Experiment Station. If history is any indicator, the amount of allocations made to each interested county will be

based on historic durum production. This will put Williams County at the top but still there will not be enough Foundation seed to meet all requests of interested Williams County

Priced at \$31.50 I am quite sure local requests will trend downward. All of the seed granted to each county must be grown under contract which has several conditions. First, the contract grower must apply for field inspection and such fields must pass the inspection. The inspector will first look for the field's isolation from adjacent fields and free from noxious weeds and other crop plants. Second, following harvest the grower must condition the seed and make all seed available to the county association to be redistributed to other growers for the 2016 season.

The seed increase program is not for everyone. Promoting the availability of seed is sometimes difficult, especially if the grower is not known to be in the seed business. Then there is service and accommodation to the customer. Some might want 100 bushels on February1 and another might want his allocation on April 20, just about the time the Foundation grower is about to enter spring planting himself.

Pasta quality characteristics of Joppa include very high dough and gluten strength, high gluten index, and outstanding color. Compared with other popular varieties, Joppa was rated highest in pasta color tested by the NDSU This variety also scores high on the mixograph scale.

Joppa has medium straw strength and a good disease resistance package including scab (FHB) resistance similar to other NDSU varieties.

In comparison with Mountrail, the longstanding industry standard variety, Joppa has high yield and better quality traits. The gluten strength of Joppa is a notable improvement over Mountrail. Joppa also consistently outyields Mountrail in variety trials across the state

Joppa was named in honor of Dr. Leonard Joppa, the renowned USDA durum research geneticist. Dr. Joppa made significant contributions to the improvement of durum wheat quality.

To help ensure genetic purity, Joppa durum will be protected under Plant Variety Protection (PVP) Title V and must be sold as a class of certified seed.

The directors of the Williams County Agricultural Improvement Association will be meeting sometime around mid-January to submit a request for Williams County. I do not envy their effort to estimate 2015 supply with expected demand for 2016. The 2016 supply should all be eligible for registered grade and the statewide price for this seed is likely to be high especially if commercial durum is in high demand. Presently there is a lot of this year's durum still stored in farm bins with the hopes of following years crops will be low in vomitoxin so this year's crop can be blended to meet the industries food standards.
