Fairview Switches To Class B For Most Sports

Bv Dianne Swanson Other than football, the Fairview Warriors will be facing new competition this season with a switch to Class B mandated by the Montana High School Athletic Association. Rather than being one of the largest Class C teams, they will now be one of the smallest in Class B. Enrollment at Fairview High School has remained consistently over 100 for many years now, and when the MHSA changed the numbers for classifications from 118 to 100, the school knew they would soon be required to go up to Class B. The rulings are made in two-year cycles so the status could change depending on enrollment numbers, but School Superintendent Luke Kloker said they will be Class B for at least four years. Football, however, remains the same in the 8-man league with MHSA rules at 130 students, so Fairview will play its usual opponents and not have the extra driving time that the other teams will face. Along with Circle, Culbertson, Scobey, Poplar and Plentywood, they will also play Wibaux which has switched to 8-man this season. Non-conference games will include Broadus

Basketball and volleyball teams will face long

and Belt.

travel times with games in Poplar, Wolf Point, Glasgow, Malta and Harlem. Rather than the comfortable district tournaments which have been held in Sidney, teams will travel to Wolf Point and then Conrad and Malta for divisionals. Volleyball teams will travel to Glasgow for Districts and Malta for divisionals this season while track will alternate between Glasgow and Great Falls. There are only three divisions in the state for golf while speech and drama has its own division.

Junior High sports remain in Class C meaning no extra travel for those teams, something Kloker is thankful for. "They will still play the local schools which is really helpful. We really appreciate the C schools letting us continue to do that," he said.

All the Warrior coaches have returned this year, providing valuable experience for their teams. They have known about the change and have been preparing. Volleyball teams have been competing against Class B over the years so many

of those are familiar but basketball coaches are unfamiliar with strategies and players from their district. Kloker said coaches are most concerned about travel rather than competition. "We will be competitive." Kloker said. "But we will be playing potentially bigger and better schools that can field three teams where we will only have JV and Varsity." He stated that all the coaches have high goals and expectations. "We've been pretty successful over the years and we want to keep that

going. The goals are the same, we just have different opponents."

Kloker also expressed how much Fairview will miss being part of the Class C community. "We will really miss the competition and the friendships we've made over the years," he said. "It's kind of exciting to move up and do things differently but I can't say enough about how much we have enjoyed being in 2C, including the tournaments in Sidney. We've had 25 years in 2C and we're going to miss it."


Possible Human Remains Found on Yellowstone River South of Sidney

They recovered bones from the site and turned them over to the Sheriff's Office.

The Sheriff's Office with the assistance of the Richland County Coroner and the Montana Fish and Game are following up with an on-site investigation. The bones recovered will be submitted to the Montana State Crime Lab to be further analyzed.





This year's annual E-rase your E-waste event is set for Sept. 8 and 9, so clear out those closets and storage sheds and recycle all of those damaged and obsolete electronics for free.

"We've had a number of questions from people asking about our fall event, so we are excited to let everyone know that the dates have been set," event coordinator Heather Luinstra said early this month. "Once again we have partnered with Yellowstone E-Waste Solutions, Billings, and we will host a joint event with the Town of Fairview. Collection times for the weekend event in Sidney are from 3-7 p.m., Friday, Sept. 8, and 9 a.m.noon, Saturday, Sept. 9. The collection site will be at the Richland County Shop, right next to the fairgrounds.

Fairview's collection event is on Saturday, Sept. 9 from 10 a.m.-noon. The Fairview location will be at the water station on 9th Street.

"Just like many other markets that we are seeing changes in lately, this year we will see a few changes to what our recycling partner is able to accept to recycle. Unfortunately, this year, we cannot accept any TVs, and we cannot accept any large copy machines. However, our recycler does accept all rechargeable batteries and even car batteries, as long as they are in good shape and not damaged," said Luinstra.





Yes to Clean, Drain,

While the effort to stop the introduction and transportation of aquatic nuisance species in North Dakota has been mostly successful, challenges remain as not all anglers, pleasure boaters and other water enthusiasts are abiding by the clean, drain, dry message.

For example, last week department game wardens and other department staff inspected over 1,200 watercrafts throughout the state. Unfortunately, these inspections found four watercraft that were transporting zebra mussels. Luckily, in all four incidences, the zebra mussels were determined to be

North Dakota waters remain relatively free of aquatic nuisance species. Besides common carp, most species - zebra mussels, Eurasian water milfoil, flowering rush, curly-leaf pondweed and three species of invasive carp - are only found in a handful of waters in the state.

To keep our waters clean of aquatic nuisance species, the Game and Fish Department reminds all anglers, pleasure boaters and water users to clean, drain and dry all equipment after every use.


- Clean and remove all plants and animals from watercraft or equipment prior to leaving any recreational area.


Drain all water from watercraft and equipment before leaving designated access points. Not draining water can be extremely hazardous and may cause negligent transportation of aquatic nuisance species to other locations.

Anglers Should Keep Fish Caught in Deep Water

North Dakota Game and Fish Department fisheries personnel encourage anglers to keep fish caught from depths of more than 25 feet, rather than practice catch-and-release.

Scott Gangl, Game and Fish fisheries management section leader, said with the exceptional fish bite at Lake Sakakawea this summer, anglers should know fish reeled in from this depth will likely die if released.

"As water warms during summer, fish tend to move to deeper, cooler water," Gangl


said. "This is particularly true for walleye in the big lake, where they follow their primary forage of rainbow smelt to deeper depths as summer progresses. Now fish are being caught at depths where barotrauma is a concern."


Change in water pressure will cause the swim bladder to expand, Gangl said, which means fish can no longer control balance. In addition, he said other internal injuries are likely, such as ruptured blood vessels or damaged internal

organs. Because of these other internal injuries, biologists discourage fizzing, the practice of deflating the swim bladder.

Barotrauma can hapin any deep water body such as Devils Lake, Lake Oahe and Lake Sakakawea. Gangl said, but it is especially noteworthy for this time of year in the big lake.

Sidney, MT - Whether children walk, ride a bicycle or take the bus to school, it is important to follow proper safety precautions. Statistically, school buses are the safest way for children to travel to and from school; however, nearly 12,000 children are injured and 26 die each year in school bus accidents. Most children injured and killed in school bus accidents are harmed while getting on and off the bus, not while riding.

Robert Miller, Guardian Flight regional director, recommends that parents and guardians review these tips with their children before they return to school later this month:

Getting on

 Always stand at least three giant steps (6 feet) away from the curb.

 Be sure the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver.

· Never walk behind
