# **Comments Sought Regarding Watford City Bypass**

Watford City, McKenzie County and the North Dakota Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration, are proposing a highway bypass/reliever route around the corporate limits of Watford City, North Dakota connecting ND Highway 23 and US Highway 85.

The project consists of developing an Environmental Assessment (EA) which would analyze the potential environmental, social, and economic impacts of constructing a bypass/reliever route around Watford City, North Dakota. Alternative highway bypass/reliever route alignments would be analyzed within the identified study area. The project is anticipated to include right-of-way acquisition and is expected to be constructed during the 2014 construction season. To ensure that all social, economic, and environmental effects are considered in the development of this project, they are soliciting your views and comments on the proposed project pursuant to Section 102(2) (D) (IV) of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended. They are particularly interested in any property which you or your department may own or have an interest in, and which would be adjacent to the proposed roadway improvement. They would also appreciate being made aware of any proposed developments that are being contemplated in the areas under construction for the proposed roadway facility. Any information that might help them in their studies would be appreciated.

# **KB's Bubbles Open For Business In Sidney**

There's good news for oil workers and RV dwelling residents who don't have the convenience of personal washing machines and dryers in their homes.

The opening of KB's Bubbles at 115 9<sup>th</sup> Ave NE along the truck route is providing a place where people can wash their clothes in coin operated machines or take advantage of the wash and fold service that enables laundry goers to drop off their clothing and pick it up the next day.

for oil will be available within the elling next week. e the Kelly Bahls, 39, a lifeonal long Sidney resident hopes

his newest business venture will create a retirement security net for himself while helping fill a growing need in the community. "With all of the people coming into the area I wanted to start a business that would be sustainable that I could plan on for my retirement when the time comes. I saw a need for additional laundry facilities and by doing this I have created a future maintenance job for myself," he said.

Wash and fold services

With 32 new stainless steel washing machines humming along and the smell of fresh linen and fabric softened clothing wafting the air, Bahls' business dream has become a recent reality. Inside, black tables and chairs are available for folks to pull up a seat and relax and in a matter of days a couple of television sets will be installed to help keep patrons entertained. The building is also equipped with Wi-Fi capabilities for those who want to stay plugged in. Several washing machines are strictly designated as greaser machines for oil splattered clothing.

With coin operated services available 24 hours a day, patrons with varying work schedules can use the laundry facilities at their convenience.

Jacob Phillips, a patron, said he is using the facility

until he is able to get a washer and dryer hooked up into his RV. "This is a really nice facility. Everything is new and the washers are a really good quality. I will still come here to wash my linens because the washers are so big," he said.

An anonymous patron from Idaho said he was most excited about the wash and fold services available because he doesn't have the time or the desire to wash his own laundry. "This place is definitely catering to the oil field and I think it's great to have these services available," he said.

Originally, Bahls planned to only offer coin operated services but his entrepreneurial thinking grew the business before the doors ever opened. While including the wash and fold services, he also plans to add an attached convenience store that will carry snacks and other travel friendly foods. Hiring several employees, he plans to lean on the expertise of Kellie Hart to help manage the convenience store and Deb Huft, of Sidney, to help him iron out the details of the wash and fold service.

Bahl's currently owns his Kelly's T n T, a drywall company and has been in business for nearly 10 years. KB's Bubbles is named

after his seven year old daughter, Kaylee Bahls. Bahls started searching

for a piece of property a year ago that could potentially house his laundry facility. He chose the location along the truck route because potential customers pass by continually and it would be convenient and accessible to truckers driving large semi trucks. Once he acquired the land he used his carpentry skills to build the business literally from the ground up and used local contractors for the heating and plumbing. He broke ground last August and poured concrete in September admitting that it could have been completed faster if he had not traveled to Alaska for his annual moose hunting trip.

For design inspiration, he traveled to places like Billings, Mont., and Dickinson N.D to look at other established facilities. Once he came up with a layout for his own business he received some additional help and suggestions from Dexter, the company he purchased the washing machines through.

"One of the good things about building something yourself is that you can control costs better. This entire process has been an exciting adventure. It's a big step for me and I'm nervous but everyone seems to really like it," he said.

Locally, Bahls contracted with B & J Heating and Mike Potts of Sidney and Quality Concrete and Quinnell Electric, of Savage.

Bahls said he still has more concrete to pour to increase the size of the parking lot and anticipates completing the convenience store by the end of summer.

The laundry facility is open 24 hours a day and the next-day, wash and fold services are tentatively scheduled for 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.








# **PSC Warns Of National Scam Targeting Utility Customers**

The Montana Public Service Commission is warning state residents of a nationwide scam that promises assistance with paying utility bills.

The scam claims President Barack Obama has authorized credits or payments to utility bills. The program does not exist, however.

The con artists are posing as utility representatives to make their pitch, which comes with a request for personal information such as Social Security, credit card and bank account numbers, putting customers at risk for identity theft.

In other instances, victims were given a fraudulent bank account number and asked to use the account when paying residential utility bills.

Victims in other states were contacted by phone, text message, through social media or in person.

The scam has not yet reached the Treasure State, but the PSC reminds Montanans to be cautious if contacted about utility payments.

# **Documentary Project Moving Forward**

A documentary project, seeking to document the lives of six brothers growing up in McKenzie County during the Great Depression, World War II years and beyond, has been progressing.

"We've raised enough financial support to begin the interview process," says Daniel Stenberg, a grandson of one of the six brothers, who is co-producing the documentary preliminarily titled 6 Brothers with Prairie Public Broadcasting. "Thanks to the generous support of over 70 individuals and businesses, a grant from the North Dakota Humanities Council and support from Prairie Public, the project has raised approximately \$61,000 of the nearly \$75,000 budget." The project, which will be based on the six Stenberg brothers-Arnold, Casper, Christian, Henry, Raymond and Selmer (all deceased)-will be told through interviews with neighbors and relatives. Additionally, community leaders and humanities scholars will also be interviewed to include more information about the activities of the surrounding area and state. Stenberg says the goal is to appeal to those viewers interested in how local, national and international events-primarily during the

1920s-1950s-affected a common North Dakotan family. Filming of interviews will begin in June, and the project is hoped to be completed sometime in the middle of 2013 provided sufficient funding is raised in time.







# Spill Prevention, Control & Countermeasure Deadlines

Montana State University Extension has been fielding numerous questions about confusion over deadlines required by the Environmental Protection Agency's program for Spill Prevention, Control, and Countermeasure (SPCC).

Seeking to prevent oil spills in the waters of the United States and adjoining shorelines, the program calls for farms and other facilities to have an oil-spill prevention plan, or SPCC plan, with a deadline for filing that plan set to expire next year.

The EPA definition of a farm is "a facility on a tract of land devoted to the production of crops or raising of animals, including fish, which produced and sold, or normally would have produced and sold, \$1,000 or more of agricultural products during a year."

Many questions concerning SPCC regulations

regarding farms has been related to public notices about a compliance deadline extension for farmers.

Farms that started operations after August 16, 2002 are entitled to an extended deadline of May 10, 2013, for filing their SPCC plan. Farms in operation before August 16, 2002, should maintain or amend their existing plan by May 10, 2013. Farms in operation before August 16, 2002, that do not already have a plan should not wait until May 10, 2013, but should prepare and implement one as soon as possible.

The SPCC regulations under the EPA have been on the Federal Register since 1972.

"There is widespread misunderstanding that these are new regulations; when in fact, SPCC rules were authorized under the Clean Water Act of 1972 and made effective in 1974," said Adam Sigler, Water Quality Associate Specialist in the MSU Department of Land Resources and Environmental Sciences.

Under the regulations, a farm falls under SPCC only if it meets certain criteria. Those covered by SPCC are farms that store, transfer, use or consume oil or oil products — diesel fuel, gasoline, lube oil, hydraulic oil, adjuvant oil, crop oil, vegetable oil or animal fat - and store more than 1,320 U.S. gallons of those products in aboveground containers or more than 42,000 U.S. gallons in completely buried containers, with a reasonable risk that they might spill into waterways of the U.S. or adjoining shorelines of interstate waters. intrastate lakes, rivers and streams.

The law specifically applies to "navigable waters," which has been and continues to be a matter of legal dispute.

Although there has been anticipation about possible changes to the SPCC legislation, MSU Extension cautions farmers that they are responsible for determining if their farm falls under the criteria in the SPCC rules.

Guidance for inventorying and documenting oil storage capacity and determining reasonable risks for spills into applicable waters are available on webpages maintained by MSU and North Dakota State University —http:// waterquality.montana.edu/ docs/SPCC.shtml and http:// w w w . a g . n d s u . e d u / waterquality/spcc-1, respectively.

MSU Extension recommends that farmers keep a record of their findings, although it is not necessary to file findings with the EPA. While the EPA does not actively seek violators, it does have the authority to inspect farms, and failure to comply with SPCC may result in a fine. Both university websites provide links to templates and EPA websites to help insure an inspection will meet EPA requirements.

# Sidney Health Center To Host **Cancer Survivor Celebration**

Sidney Health Center is hosting a Cancer Survivor Celebration open house for area survivors, family and friends on Tuesday, June 5 from 4:00-6:00PM in the Cancer Care Suite.

Each year, National Cancer Survivors Day is observed on the first Sunday of June. This year marks the 25th annual celebration of life for hundreds of communities worldwide. Cancer survivors, caregivers, family members, friends and healthcare professionals unite to show that life after a cancer diagnosis can be meaningful and productive.

The general public is invited to attend the open house at the Cancer Care Suite, located at 214 14th Avenue Southwest in Sidney. There will be tours of the radiation therapy area as well as updates on the construction of Phase II, which entails relocating chemotherapy to the Cancer Care Suite.

"It's a great opportunity for us to honor area cancer survivors and share the exciting news regarding the construction of Phase II," commented Judy Carda, Cancer Care Manager. "We can hardly wait to see this project to completion. Our patients will see the benefits first hand from improved privacy to personalized care." According to a 2011 assessment, Phase II of the Cancer Center was a high priority for cancer survivors. In fact, the majority of focus group members wrote down Phase II as the number one action step for Sidney Health Center to become a cancer center of excellence. Many focus group members raved about the care they had received through the chemotherapy department despite the location, referring to the designated space in the ER area.

Phase II involves renovating Suite 103 in the clinic and building a private entrance to the Cancer Care Center. Upon completion of the project, all outpatient cancer care services will be centralized, enhancing and streamlining patient care for those going through treatment. The renovation includes adding four chemotherapy and IV therapy infusion rooms with a centralized nursing station as well as providing designated clinic space for the medical oncologist.

Anyone living with a history of cancer - from the moment of diagnosis through the remainder of life, is a cancer survivor, according to the National Cancer Survivors Day Foundation. Nearly 12 million Americans are now living with and beyond a diagnosis of cancer. In the United States, men have a slightly less than a 1 in 2 lifetime risk of developing cancer; for women, the risk is a little more than 1 in 3. Learning about this disease is crucial, because many forms of cancer can be prevented and most cured if detected early. Major advances in can-

cer prevention, early detection, and treatment have resulted in longer survival, and therefore, a growing number of cancer survivors. However, a cancer diagnosis can leave a host of problems in its wake. Physical, financial and emotional hardships often persist after diagnosis and treatment. Survivors may face many challenges such as hindered access to cancer specialists and promising new treatments, inadequate insurance, financial hardships, employment problems and psychological struggles. In light of these difficulties, our community needs to focus on improving the quality of life for cancer survivors.

"Despite the adversities, cancer survivors serve as an inspiration to all of us," stated Dr. Lyle Harrison, radiation oncologist. "I've been serving the MonDak region for 15 years and it never ceases to amaze me the strength and courage that many cancer patients display through the course of their treatment.

# **Boat Validation Decal Reminder**

Don't be embarrassed this summer by that old green decal on your boat!

Remember, owners of motorboats, sailboats or personal watercraft must have the new, free orange 2011-2014 validation decals on their watercraft. The new decal is good until 2014.

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks boating law enforcement coordinator Ron Jendro reminds boaters that even when they have permanently registered their boats, sailboats, or PWC they must still obtain two free boat validation decals every three years at FWP regional and area offices, or by going to the FWP website at fwp.mt.gov at Boat Validation Decals.

Owners who order validation decals on the FWP website will receive the decals in the mail. A current boat registration receipt issued by the County Treasurer is needed to obtain the decals.

For new boat or PWC owners, the County Treasurer's office will provide the first set of validation decals when the watercraft is registered. Boat owners will obtain subsequent sets of validation decals at a FWP regional or area office, or online.

# **Recreationists Reminded To Check Stream Access Rules**

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks reminds Montanans planning camping, fishing and float trips to check the rules and regulations governing stream access. Montana's 1985 Stream Access Law enables water-related recreation, including fishing, floating, swimming, and boating on rivers and streams even if they flow past private land—but only up to the ordinary high water mark.

With the passage of Montana's bridge access law in 2009, FWP is working with landowners, counties and other agencies to provide safe and legal access to rivers and streams at bridges.

When waterways are running at full flow there may be no dry land available below the high water mark to walk on. Montana's laws do not allow recreationists to enter private lands bordering streams or to cross private lands to access streams without permission.

"At high water, aside from being careful, recreationists should either avoid the area until water levels drop or get landowner permission to cross private land," said Jim Kropp, FWP Enforcement Chief. Kropp said recreationists using bridge crossings for stream access must also be able to stay

# **First Fish Certificate**

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department is reminding parents to capture their little angler's first catch on a specially designed First Fish certificate.

First Fish has no qualifying weights or measurements. The only requirement is the successful landing of a North Dakota fish. Certificates are available to all who request them, and have ample room for all the important information, such as name, age, lake and a short fish story, plus a blank space for a photograph big enough to contain the smile of the happiest little angler. Free certificates are available by contacting the Game and Fish Department at (701) 328-6300, or send an email to ndgf@nd.gov. within the high-water mark during high flows and not cross private property.

Recreationists must ask for permission to use private land to access public waterways.

"Irrigation ditches are generally private property and no access is allowed without the permission of the landowner. But with a little advance planning, those wishing to use Montana's streams have huge opportunities to float, fish or just enjoy," Kropp said.

# Deer Application Deadline Is June 6

North Dakota deer hunters are reminded the deadline for submitting applications for the 2012 gun season is June 6. Hunters are encouraged to apply online at the State Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov.

The deadline applies to muzzleloader, regular gun, gratis and nonresident landowner, and youth antlered mule deer applications (specifically for antlered mule deer in units 3B1, 3B2, and 4A-4F).

The deadline for regular statewide youth licenses is Sept. 1. In addition, the deadline for submitting an antlerless whitetailed deer gun application for ages 12 and 13 is Sept. 1. Hunters are reminded that completion of a hunter education course is required before applying.



# **FSA Allocates Additional** 400,000 Acres For Wildlife **Enhancement Initiative**

USDA North Dakota Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Aaron Krauter has announced that FSA has allocated an additional 400,000 acres nationwide to the State Acres for Wildlife Enhancement (SAFE) program that improves habitat for high-priority wildlife species.

"SAFE is a voluntary conservation initiatives that provides an opportunity for grassroots conservation partners to develop related projects to address high priority wildlife needs through habitat restoration," said Krauter.

Various conservation practices currently offered under the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) are fine-tuned

# Non-game Check Off Funds Put To Work

Every year at income tax time many Montanans contribute to the income tax check-off fund for wildlife. Annually these donations contribute on average about \$27,000.

Proposals for putting this funding to work include: \$15,000 for work to identify the most critical habitats for non-game, threatened or endangered species and identifying and monitoring any threats to these critical habitats.

\$15,000 for inventory, monitoring and conservation work on species of concern including bald eagles, common loons, bats and amphibians.

\$5,000 for a stipend for a student to perform non-game species research. This work supports elements of FWP's overall non-game management program. The tax check-off funding is used with email: State Wildlife Grant funds for high priority habitat, survey, inventory and conservation needs.

through the SAFE proposal to improve, connect or create higher-quality wildlife habitats by promoting healthier ecosystems in the project areas identified as essential to the effective management of high priority wildlife species.

Krauter added, "Once a project proposal is approved and acreage allocated, the SAFE program is implemented through a continuous CRP signup allowing USDA to accept producer acreage offers year-round."

As with other Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) initiatives, the land and producer must meet certain eligibility requirements. Once approval of the SAFE project is announced, interested landowners can submit offers to voluntarily enroll qualifying acres in a SAFE project/CRP contract for a term of 10-15 years. In exchange, SAFE/CRP program participants receive annual rental payments, project incentives and cost-share assistance to establish habitat-enhancing natural covers on eligible land.






