With sparkling hazel eyes magnified by thick spectacles, and brilliant front teeth, eight-and-a-half year old Teddy Wells pours over another copy of his recently published book. Carefully putting pen to paper he continues signing his name in small circular motions, sporadically giving his large glasses a push upward to keep them from sliding down his nose. Slouching in his chair while swinging one leg back and forth he leans close to the pages, concentrating. Piles of his recently published book "How Snake Learned to Smile" are stacked neatly in rows on a table inside the North English, lowa community center. Though the town has a population of fewer than 1,000, Teddy proudly wears the snake shaped nametag cut out by his grandmother. A large homemade poster featuring the cover of his book sits upright behind him reading, "Meet the Author."

At such a young age it is, to be expected, his first book signing. While excited, he perhaps doesn't grasp the true sensationalism of this experience. At a tender age he is realizing his dream while overcoming the physical obstacles of a speech impediment and vision problems. So, today is his shining moment. Most likely, one of many. A kind of, 'from this day forward' type of experience that will remain just below the surface of his belly often resurfacing as butterflies just long enough to remind him of his strengths, creativity and beauty. In fact, Teddy personifies the character of Snake in his book. But, we'll get to that later.

As an aspiring author he is telling a great story about acceptance, inner beauty and the value of kindness. Today, the small and curious crowd that has decended on the community center is patiently waiting for autographed copies.

To understand the true sentiment of this story, you have to back up a bit to the beginning. Last January, to be exact.

"I was experiencing a sleepless trip to San Diego to see my art piece on display at the Natural History Museum Gallery opening and all I wanted to do was get some rest when a fellow passenger kept trying to visit with me. I finally gave up on the idea of getting some sleep and indulged her and I am so glad I did because she turned out to be an amazing person. Now, I have this inspiring experience to share," said Kitty Kolden, an artist and employee at Northeast Montana Health Services.

It turns out that the talkative lady, Grace Wells, was the grandmother of young Teddy.

In conversation at some 32,000 feet, they shared information about each other including Kolden's photography, Grace's love of sketching and their mutual love for the natural world. Exchanging email addresses, they parted.

After Kolden returned home the flood of emails between the two began to flow. The most inspiring of them was the one stating Teddy had been motivated after viewing Kolden's photography online. In particular, her series of snake pictures helped inspire his children's short story and her bull snake photographs would create the final touches for his story.

Typing as if they had known each other for years, the correspondence Kolden gets choked up when she reads a few other emails from Grace. "Her ease with words is wonderful. Her sentences are delicious and create vivid images and feelings," Kolden said.

The final consensus was that Kolden would help them to publish Well's book through a website called ArtsCow. A total of 80 copies were made of the 20 page book and more are available to print in a moment's notice. Professing to be something of a doodler, Grace created a sketch of a snake wearing glasses that is reading Teddy's book with the caption, "It all sounds great, but how will I sign autographs?" It is featured on the last page of the book.

Many locals know Kolden creates the Kolden Report where she documents family gatherings and outdoor scenery to share via email with friends and family. What started out as a way to keep connected with family has caught the interest of many and is now sent to people in seven different countries. It also helps people view her latest photography and travels. Recently, she featured her photography of bull snakes in it and some of the photos were just what were needed to complete Teddy's story.

The storyline is one of kindness for others and more than just acceptance for those who are different, but also admiration of those differences. The story begins with a snake that hides under rocks and retreats whenever people come around. After repeatedly hearing that he is ugly, he starts to believe it. In the end, the kindness expressed by one person changes the minds of many and provides the snake a chance at happiness. "What I take away from the story is that every-

body should be given a chance and that everybody is beautiful, you just have to look," Kolden said.

"This smiling snake has topped off my Montana summer with whipped cream and a cherry on top," said Grace Wells. Much like the snake character in his book, Teddy is different in the sense that he faces challenges. "Teddy has long been the boy that nobody notices. This book has created so much joy for him," said Grace Wells.

If you've had the chance to meet Kolden, you probably already know she is full of positive energy. It seemingly radiates from within, gently slapping at those she comes into contact with. She has a willingness to truly experience life and takes advantage of its seemingly inopportune opportunity's

While inspiration most often resonates through an emotional song, a vibrant sunset or fluid ballet, Kolden was able to find inspiration in the most unassuming of places; a cramped seat aboard a Boeing 747 airplane. With open eyes and a catch-all heart, she is able to see the extraordinary in what many might view as ordinary; just as she creates her extraordinary photographs one click at a time.

"This story about Teddy is amazing. That kid is going to bloom," Kolden said. She is donating some of the books to local elementary schools to share the lessons behind the story. "The message is very powerful," she said.

To date, Teddy has even received an email from a Bengali translator and author from India named Subhamay Ray who read the book and wanted to offer congratulations and encouragement to the young author.

A Little Bit Country Early Fall Soil Testing Suggested

Warren Froelich NDSU Extension Agent Williams County

It has been a practice to delay the collection of soil samples for nitrogen tests until mid to late September. The reason for waiting is the fear additional nitrogen will be made available through mineralization and not show in the test results. Dr. Dave Franzen, NDSU Soil Specialist, tells us soil nitrate levels change very little and sampling can take place immediately after harvest with no sampling date adjustment necessary.

Franzen sites several advantages for sampling right after small grain harvest. Probably the biggest advantage is growers are more likely to use the test results to direct a fall nitrogen application if the soil test results are in their hands soon enough to consider before fall fieldwork begins.

Franzen also indicates soil testing prior to fall tillage will result in more consistent 0-6 inch sample core which provides the best sample for testing phosphorus, potassium, percent of organic matter, and zinc. Additionally, regrowth of volunteer grain will not hide available nitrogen. Early sampling will show the nitrate that will be available for next year's crop.

Finally, sampling right after harvest will guarantee that fields will get tested and not missed due to weather problems which could happen late in the fall.

Hay Forage Crops Can Be Poisonous

In response to the much smaller hay crop this year, cattle growers were freed to plant such crops as oats, sudangrass, and millet for an emergency hay crop. Often times these crops do not perform as expected and can present some problems when used as a feed for cattle.

One concern is nitrate poisoning which in itself is not toxic. When consumed by ruminants the nitrates normally found in forages are converted by the digestion process to nitrite. The nitrite is absorbed into the red blood cells and combines with hemoglobin to form methemoglobin which cannot transport oxygen as efficiently as hemoglobin. When this happens, the animal's heart rate and respiration increase, the blood and tissues of the animal take on a blue to chocolate brown tinge, muscle tremors can develop, staggering occurs and the animal eventually suffocates.

The majority of nitrate poisoning cases in North Dakota occur in drought-

stressed oats, corn and barley. However, a number of other plants also can accumulate nitrate, including sudangrass, sorghum – sudan hybrids and pearl millet

Feeds can be analyzed for nitrate content. The cost is very reasonable compared to the loss of sheep and animals. When feeds are high in nitrate content, management practices can be used to reduce the total nitrate levels consumed.

Another threat to livestock is prussic acid which inhibits oxygen utilization and results in suffocation of the animal. This can occur in sorghums and sorghum hybrids including sudangrass. Young, rapidly growing plants generally have high levels of prussic acid until they reach 18 inches in height. Frequently prussic acid poisoning occurs after the crop is harvested in the fall followed by a rain which stimulates regrowth.

Prussic acid is a cyanide. Often the cyanide gas escapes when the plant is killed through the harvest process or a high frost. However, if the forage had extremely high concentration before cutting or if the hay was not properly cured, dangerous levels of prussic acid can remain. Again, a low-cost test for prussic acid is recommended.

The carnival will be held Saturday, September 15, 2012 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Richland County Fair Event Center. There will be games for children of all ages, face painting and food vendors. Tickets will be available for purchase at the door for a price of \$.25 per ticket, and games will range from 1 to 4 tickets.




EARS SHS Ag Dept Event



Health Partners Team Up to Offer Vaccination Clinics in Williston and Watford City for School-Aged Children

As back-to-school time arrives again, record enrollment numbers are expected in schools across the oil patch in North Dakota as the population in the western part of the state soars. With these increased numbers, the North Dakota Department of Health is reminding parents of schoolaged children in this area how important it is that kids are fully immunized for the new school year.

To meet this pressing need, a coalition of health-care partners will be teaming up to offer easy, affordable immunizations to any school-aged children or teenagers through vaccination clinics scheduled in Williston and Watford City.

The Department of Health, Southwestern District Health Unit, Trinity Hospital in Minot, Mercy Hospital in Williston, McKenzie Hospital in Watford City, Craven-Hagan Clinic and Upper Missouri District Health Unit are joining together to provide this service in these two communities. The vaccination clinics will be open in Watford City on Sept. 14 and 28, and Oct. 12, 11 a.m.-6 p.m. CDT, at the Watford City Fairgrounds. And clinics will be open in Williston on Sept. 15 and 29, and Oct. 13, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. CDT, at the Williston Fairgrounds.

"By increasing access to these required immunizations in this region of the state, we hope to minimize the spread of preventable illnesses in their schools and provide children with a healthier environment in which to learn," said Abbi Pierce, Vaccines For Children Manager for the Department of Health. "It is so important that we provide this assistance to help assure that as many children as possible will meet the

immunization requirements set forward by the state."

Children eligible for the Vaccines For Children (VFC) Program, including those who are Medicaid-eligible, American Indian, uninsured, or underinsured (have health insurance but it does not cover the cost of the vaccine) will be charged to Medicaid. The cost per vaccine for insured children will be \$24. Costs can be billed directly to Medicaid or Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota. Anyone with other insurance plans or Blue Cross Blue Shield from other states will need to submit claims for future reimbursement. Credit cards will not be accepted; cash or check only. No one will be turned away due to an inability to pay.

All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. All those seeking vaccinations must bring insurance information and their complete immunization records. Any individuals from out-of-state should bring vaccination records from the states they previously lived in. For more information on how to find your immunization records from another state, visit www.cdc.gov/vaccines/recs/immunizrecords.htm. Staff will try to look up immunization records for any individuals who are without their records.

"With so many new residents in this part of the state, we are seeing an increased need for a wide variety of services, including these important vaccinations for school-aged children," said Sherry Adams, Executive Officer at Southwestern District Public Health Unit. "New North Dakota residents should contact the state health department in the state they previously lived in, or their previous health-care provider, to find their child's immunization record."

Children entering elementary school should have five doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis), four doses of IPV (polio), three doses of HBV (hepatitis B), two doses of MMR (measles, mumps and rubella), and two doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. There also are vaccines required for adolescents when entering middle school. Middle school requirements include an immunization against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (Tdap) and meningococcal disease (MCV4). This is also an excellent time for high school seniors to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease, as they will need two doses to attend college in North Dakota next fall. Other vaccines may also be recommended

Language translation service will be available for those who cannot speak English. The clinics will be handicappedaccessible. Anyone in Williston can tune their radio to 1620 AM to hear more information about these clinics, including expected wait times on the days of the clinics.

"Attendees will come away with a better understanding of the state's environmental regulations and the permitting processes."

Topics will include air quality and discharge permitting, and inspections. A full day is devoted to siting and compliance requirements and permitting for opencut operations. Enforcement and transportation issues will also be addressed.
