The Bags & Bones Cornhole tournament is being sponsored by RTC Networks and will start at 11 a.m.



Montana Cares Cellphone App For Mental Health & Resources Is Live

Montana Cares, an app developed to provide simple and fast access to school and community resources, is now live. With the app, asking for help for one's self or others is just a tap away.

According to an email sent out by Richland County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Timothy W. Tharp, the free app provides help for many things that people sometimes are too afraid to ask for help with such as food, housing, crisis counseling, suicidal thoughts, anxiety, depression, abuse, and violence intervention.

Once downloaded you click on the "Search For Your School" button and enter the county you are looking for information for. Even though the app is titled "Montana Cares" there are a few schools and counties in other states. Users are given three main methods for help. Resources give users customized information and help at the community, local, state, and national levels. The Crisis Text Line is manned by licensed people trained to respond to a crisis. The third method is under construction. It was originally designed to send a message directly to school contacts, but Tharp wants each school in the county to decide what they want for it. There are also tools to organize and track the local services asked for and received.

According to Tharp, the app was originally designed to be used in the school setting. In the schools, administrators can use a central admin platform to review incidents, communicate securely via two-way messaging, and manage resources supplied through the app. They can also send broadcast messages directly to users. Tharp and Jessica Gilbert, Northeast MT Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) director, control and regularly update the list of resources for Richland County. More services will be available for the schools once the school year starts again, but the app is available to everyone now.

Montana Cares launched for Android back on March 16 and it is currently only available for Android and Apple iPhones, tablets, and Chromebooks. According to the app, no data is shared with third parties, no data is collected without the user willingly providing it, any data provided by the user is encrypted in transit, and a user can request that data be deleted. "Nothing brings people together like food; we are excited to work with Mike and do our part to contribute to what will be a great weekend," he stated. "Baseball and BBQ, not going to get much better than that.'

The Food Truck Rodeo will kick off 701 Food Truck's season with 7-8 large scale events in about six different markets in North Dakota. Official event hours, list of vendors as well as other promotions and activities will be announced throughout the next two months.

Stroke Can Happen At Any Age: Know The Signs

Younger people are being hospitalized for stroke. Know the symptoms of stroke and get treatment fast.

The number of people hospitalized for stroke between the ages of 15 and 44 rose as much as 37% between 1995 and 2008, according to researchers at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Thirty-five patients have been treated for strokes at Sidney Health Center over the last two years with ages ranging from 41-96 years of age.

- 41-44: 2 patients
- 49-57: 5 patients
- 62-64: 5 patients
- 65-70: 6 patients • 71-96: 17 patients

Those numbers point to the need for younger people to control stroke risk factors such as obesity, diabetes and high blood pressure, the CDC says. But they also highlight the importance of knowing the symptoms of a stroke and seeking prompt

Stroke treatment is most effective when administered within 4.5 hours. Rapid treatment improves your chances of survival. and it reduces the possibility of permanent disability, regardless of the severity of a stroke.

The Signs of Stroke A stroke is when the blood supply is blocked to part of the brain or when a blood vessel in the brain bursts. Brain cells begin to die from a lack of oxygen.

Stroke symptoms come on quickly and, according to the American Stroke Association, often include:

- Confusion and speech problems
 - Vision problems
- Numbness or weakness, particularly on one side of the body
- · Dizziness, loss of balance or loss of coordination
- A sudden, severe headache with no known

Call 911 if you observe any of these signs. Don't dismiss them. Even patients suffering from a transient ischemic attack (TIA), a so-called mini stroke, can reduce their chances of disability with immediate treatment, according to a recently published study in the American Heart Association Journal Stroke.

Stroke Treatment

The most effective treatment for stroke is a clot-busting drug known as tPA, which must be given intravenously within 4.5 hours. After that window of time, treatment focuses on preventing a secondary stroke with medications that limit the blood's ability to clot and procedures such as stenting to keep blood vessels open.

Early supportive care, such as physical therapy, can also make a difference in recovery.

You can reduce your chances of having a stroke by making the same healthy diet and lifestyle choices that help prevent all cardiovascular disease: manage your blood pressure and cholesterol; lose weight; eat plenty of fruits and vegetables and foods low in sodium and

saturated fat; participate in regular physical activity; and stop smoking.




