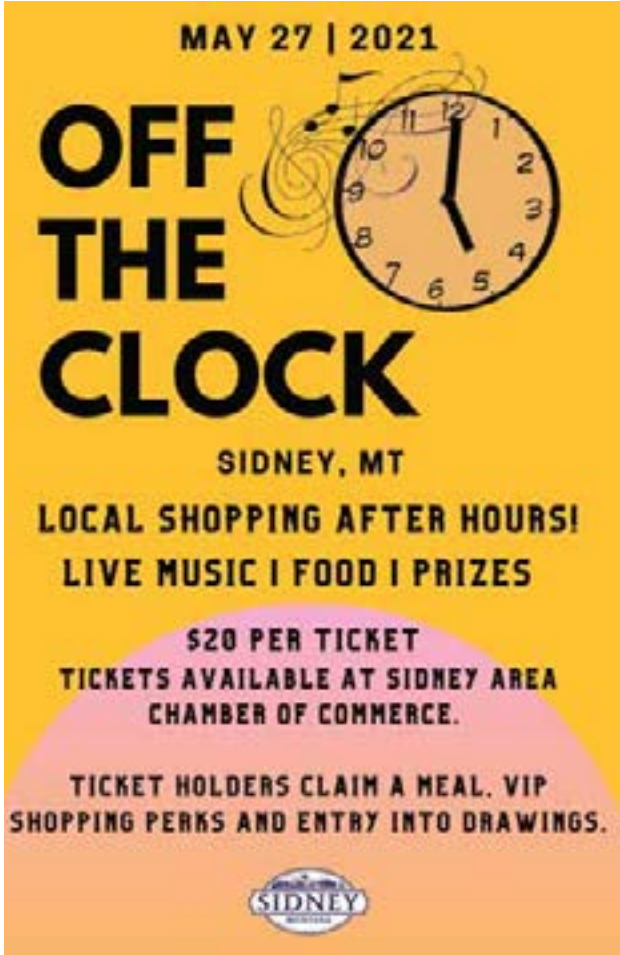

Watford City's Wolf Pup Learning Center To Be Transformed With Mural Beginning May 10

The Wolf Pup Learning Center Watford City, along with the Long X Arts Foundation and a committee of parents and teachers, have worked to raise funds to develop a mural on the outside of Wolf Pup Learning Center, which was formerly a post office building, now owned by the city of Watford City.

The vision of the mural is to reflect on the outside, what is being taught and celebrated on the inside of Wolf Pup Learning Center Pre School, which is a home to learning, music, creativity and diversity for preschool students in the area. With help from a North Dakota

Council on the Arts Artist in Residence Grant and matching funds provided by the Long X Arts Foundation, the committee was able to begin the process of collaborating with and hiring renowned street artist, muralist and creative consultant Shawn McCann, Minnesota, who has created his special brand of 3D murals from the Midwest, to Disney World and across the globe. He will be working with the students in the classroom, conducting fun art lessons and ultimately using their interpretations of the question, "What makes the world a better place?" to supplement the mural's aesthetic.

"The committee wanted to make this more than just

beautification of a building, but also a way for the students and community to engage with a professional artist through unique art curriculum," said Jessie Scofield, Long X Arts Director. "We wanted to give the students a chance to learn first-hand about how art can connect people while demonstrating to the community how art engages our youth and serves as a connection and a way to tell and celebrate our stories."

As an artist in residence, McCann will stay in the community for the duration of 2 - 3 weeks, working with the students, teachers and community members to create the mural from start to finish. Watford City City

Council and the Building Committee have approved a preliminary design.

Some of the students' work, and/or an interpretation of the students' work, will be featured in the official design. The students, although young, have and will play a key leadership role as they serve as inspiration for the outcome

When the mural is complete and when the weather allows, there are plans for a chalk-fest celebration and unveiling ceremony outside in the parking lot of Wolf Pup Learning Center that will include music, treats, recognition, sidewalk chalk painting and other hands-on art activities for the students as well as the community as

a whole.

The North Dakota Council on the Arts, the Long X Arts Foundation, the Rough Rider Fund, community donations and an Arts Midwest Resiliency Grant has financially supported this project. It has also been awarded the Governor's Main Street Vibrancy Grant. The committee is seeking donations to complete their fundraising needs. Guest Opinion: Legislative Report

Greetings from Home! This Legislative Session was different than other sessions in a couple different ways. First, there was concern over the Covid virus that originated in China. It was reasonable, at first, to be scared of it because we didn't know much about it. But, by the time the session started we were pretty familiar with the virus, knowing it didn't seriously affect very many people who didn't have an underlying health condition. We understood that it was a lot like the flu. It was amazing to me that the flu was pretty much nonexistent in Montana this past year. The argument was do we wear a mask, should we be 6 feet away from each other, should we be caged in with plexiglass, or should we be there virtually. Most of the people in our caucus chose none of the above. We were there to do the people's business and these choices would hinder our ability to communicate. Because of our choice, Democrats, bureaucrats, and the media said we were going to be a "super spreader". There were a handful of people in the Legislature who got Covid, with few symptoms. So, it was far from being a "super spreader". It was a political tool for a lot of people.

The other thing that was different about this session is that we had a Republican Governor, and the Democrats knew that all the bills we passed were not going to get vetoed. Some things that we accomplished were: passed pro-life legislation, passed constitutional carry, lowered taxes by \$120 million, secured some of our freedoms during declared emergencies, got rid of some government regulations, and several other things. Overall, I felt we had a good session.

We passed some legislation that we felt would help the courts stick to interpreting the law instead of rewriting the law when making their decisions. However, that didn't sit very well with the Montana Supreme Court, so they used taxpayer resources to lobby against the legislation they didn't like. As a result, we, as the Legislature, are in the process of investigating the Judicial Branch.

Several bills I sponsored were passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor. One bill that I sponsored, SJ 16, that is to encourage the US Congress and President to allow the Keystone pipeline to continue, was filed with the Secretary of State and will be sent off. The Keystone Pipeline is very important to Eastern Montana.

Celebrate Montana Tobacco Quit Line's 17th Birthday By Quitting Your Way

"Tobacco free is a breath of fresh air. A freedom not experienced in years." – Montana Tobacco Quit Line Caller

Richland County - May 10 marks 17 years of helping Montanans quit tobacco. Since 2004, more than 100,000 Montanans have called the Montana Tobacco Quit Line for help with their quit attempt. Montana has the highest quit rate for all tobacco products in the nation, according to the North American Quitline Consortium. The quit rate is significantly higher for Montanans who utilize the Montana Tobacco Quit Line than for those who try quitting alone (36% compared to 4-7%). Montanans who call the Quit Line and use Chantix have a quit rate of 50%.

The Montana Tobacco Quit Line has made significant advances over the past 17 years to better reach and serve Montanans. This year, the Quit Line added a new feature allowing Montanans to chat online with a live coach. Montanans under 25 can also text with a live coach by texting "start" to 36072. Utilizing the Quit Line is completely free and those engaged in the program can access free nicotine patches, gum, or lozenges as well as three months of free Chantix.

Since its launch, the Quit Line has also made improvements to better serve vulnerable populations and populations targeted by the tobacco industry. In 2013, the Quit Now Montana Pregnancy Program launched to help Montana pregnant women who want to quit tobacco. This program offers nine free coaching calls with a dedicated female coach as well as cash incentives with each completed coaching call: \$20 for completed calls while pregnant and \$30 for completed calls postpartum. In 2015, the American Indian Commercial Tobacco Quit Line launched, which offers free coaching calls with

American Indian coaches who can speak to the culture and quitting commercial tobacco. In 2019, the Quit Line launched its newest program, My Life, My Quit, a free texting/chat program for youth who are looking to quit all forms of tobacco, including e-cigarettes.

"While we have seen moderate declines in adult tobacco use from 2004 to now, we still have one in four Montanans using some form of tobacco, whether it be cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, e-cigarettes, or a combination of these. The introduction of e-cigarettes

has driven an increase in tobacco use among youth in Montana with one in three Montana high school students currently using e-cigarettes. Our work is far from over," says Jacklyn Damm, Richland County Health Department tobacco prevention specialist.

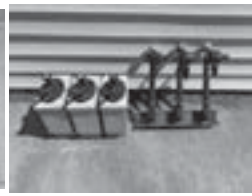

ANS Sticker Required On Watercraft

By North Dakota Game And Fish

Boaters with watercraft registered outside of the state who do not have a 2021 aquatic nuisance species sticker are reminded to purchase a current sticker before operating watercraft on North Dakota waters.

The state law requires a \$15 ANS fee for motorized watercraft not licensed in North Dakota to be paid for each calendar year, and the ANS sticker must be displayed on the watercraft.

In addition, Minnesota anglers launching boats on the North Dakota side of the Red River must have a current ANS sticker displayed on the watercraft.

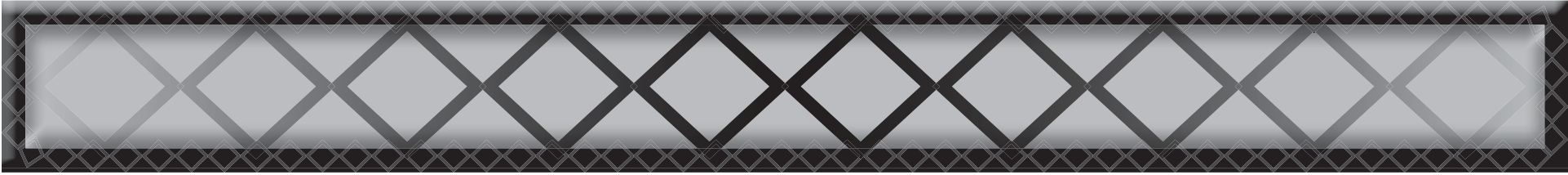

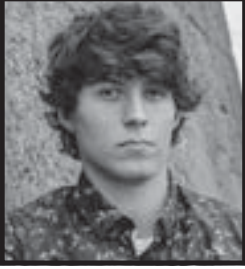

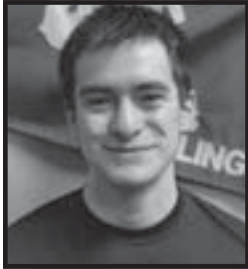

The Richland County Health Department will be offering walk-in COVID-19 vaccine clinics on Tuesday in May and June. The one-dose Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) and the 2-dose Moderna will be offered on alternating weeks.

Walk-in COVID-19 vaccine clinics will be offered on Tuesdays, 12:30-3 p.m. MST.

Moderna 2-dose vaccine will be offered May 11, 25, June 8 and 22. Those re-

ceiving the Moderna 2-dose vaccine should plan on attending an additional clinic 4-6 weeks later to receive the second dose. Dates for a corresponding second-dose clinic will be provided at the first clinic.

Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) 1-dose vaccine will be offered May 18, June 1, and 15.

There will be no COVID clinic on June 29. Additional clinics further into the summer will be announced.

All clinics are held at the Health Department, 1201 West Holly, Sidney. The Health Department is located in the Community

Services Building, next to the Mainstays Hotel; in front of the Law & Justice Center; and kitty corner to the new Fire Hall.

Those seeking the vaccine must be 18 years of age or older; and must not have received any other vaccines in the two weeks prior to the clinic. If you have insurance please, bring your insurance card. Expect to spend about 30 minutes at the Health Department, though there may be additional unforeseen wait times. For questions regarding the COVID-19 vaccine, please call 406-433-2207.

Golden Roundup

Many decades ago when I was 15, I couldn't wait to get my driver's license. I figured a license would give me freedom; I could join the world of responsible drivers and transport myself hither and yon without the embarrassing need to have my parents or an old-

er sibling chauffeur me from place to place. The thought of driving filled me with glee.

Well, after nearly six decades of driving, I am cured of that particular itch. In the last 50+ years, not only have I driven thousands of miles to get to and from a workplace, but I've also driven cross

country multiple times, I've maneuvered my way through blizzards, endured hours of hot car seats to reach various destinations, spent enormous sums of money on purchasing and maintaining vehicles, and have even spent a night in my conveyance due to snowstorms and drifted roads. I always carried survival gear, so the unplanned overnight stop was an inconvenience, not a disaster. However, enough is enough. A lifetime of driving has taught me that when the time comes to turn in the keys, I will do so willingly.

Older drivers are generally more cautious, they wear their seat belts,

and they do not tend to drive while impaired. On the other hand, many seniors take daily medications, which may or may not affect their ability to drive. Many older people also drive too slow because they are overly cautious, which ends up becoming a hazard rather than a safety measure.

I've decided that there are four basic types of older drivers on the road today. Those that are still quite capable, those that imagine they can still drive but who are actually a menace to themselves and every other driver who shares the roadway with them, and those who know they can no longer safely handle a vehicle but continue to drive for various reasons. The fourth type of

driver reaches the point where they understand it is time to burn the driver's license, sell the vehicle, take the bus instead, and then follow through and do so.

I am the first type of driver, but I also know when the time comes, I will willingly give up the keys. I know I will recognize when I need to step away from the driver's seat, as I continually assess myself and have already stopped certain driving activities such as negotiating the roadways at night. I detest driving and drive as little as possible. I walk or bike everywhere possible and only take a vehicle when I need to get groceries, make the day long drive out to visit my sister once a year, or perform some other task that cannot be done in Virginia City. For the most part, my vehicle sits in the driveway. I've got a 2004 pickup with only 100,000 miles on it, which illustrates my point.

If someone else offers to drive, I accept quite happily.

My father was the second type of driver. He was a hazard on the road but he couldn't or wouldn't realize and accept that fact. My sister and I were visiting my parents at the time and I drove my father and my sister to town for some small errand. My father became incensed when I drove through the parking lot to reach the road home, as he figured it would be a much easier and shorter route to drive across someone's lawn, snake down a footpath, hop over a curb, and rejoin the main road that way. He was still annoyed with me by the time we arrived back at his house.

This is the same man who the year earlier had taken us on a tour through the old timer's village

where he and my mother had recently moved. He was driving, and he tore down the streets at 60+ mph. When my sister and I pointed out to him that the speed limit was 35 mph, he sniffed disdainfully and said, 'Those rules are for old people.'

He was 86 years old at the time.

My mother took away his set of keys shortly after that incident.

My mother was the third type of driver. She knew she had reached the point where she no longer felt safe steering a vehicle, but she continued to drive to hair appointments, for groceries, and to get my father out and about. After my parents moved to the elder village, it took quite a bit of persuading to convince my mother that she no longer needed her car. The village had transportation available for residents, so she really did not have to drive anywhere at all.



She finally did agree to give up the keys, and when she did, she thanked us, as she truly did not want to drive any longer.

At this point in my life, I am still young enough that neither I nor my friends or siblings have quit driving. I know I will make that choice happily when the time comes. I'm already planning how I will accomplish tasks such as grocery shopping when my turn comes to sell my vehicles. The thought of using my own two feet, or my bike, or taking advantage of the county transportation bus to get places does not distress me at all.

After all, isn't it relaxing to take the bus and leave the driving to someone else?
