# **Women An Integral Part Of Hardy Operation**

Sherri Hardy, Fairview, snapped the photo which won The Roundup's Women in Agriculture photo contest. As the picture demonstrates, women play an important role on the Hardy farm, particularly during harvest. Hardy explains that family and friends of both sexes all chip in to help out during the busy sugarbeet season. Without women, the Hardys would have a difficult time completing harvest.

"We draw from family, friends and retired people to complete harvest," explains Hardy. "My sister is a flight attendant and she takes the month of October off to help drive and to clean up the labor houses after harvest. My mother comes from Missouri and cooks, cleans, does the laundry and goes for parts. My mother-in-law runs from field to field and marks the entrances and exits and the culverts, and she also marks the bad turns on the road with cones and flags so truck drivers know where to go. My brother-in-law is a pilot but he takes the month off to help, my dad drives, and nieces and nephews all help."

She continues, "We have three daughters and they all take part in the operation. They drive tractor and haul barley and irrigate all summer, doing what needs done. Our oldest daughter attends the University of Mary and she came home three weekends in October to help with harvest, and two of those weekends she brought friends home with her to help. It would be a lot more difficult to farm without the assistance of women and our daughters. Everyone plays a part, and everyone knows what they have to do to get the job done."

Life gets quite hectic when sugarbeet harvest arrives. Hardy hires the truck drivers while her husband, Dave, hires the field crews. Hardy will hire women drivers whenever possible. "We have ten trucks on the road 24 hours a day during sugarbeet harvest," she remarks. "We need a lot of drivers. I generally hire 20-22 drivers, depending on who can do what. Usually I hire six or seven women every year. Women drivers tend to be more cautious and careful, so if a woman can drive and wants to work, I hire her."

This year, as the photograph points out, the Hardys did have a tip-over accident and yes, a qualified woman with a CDL was driving, but the accident was not her fault, and fortunately no one got hurt. "This wasn't our first-ever accident," Hardy comments. "The accident happened about a half mile from the Snowden Bridge, and that road is very narrow and washboardy with a lot of blind curves. We've lost three trucks in that half mile stretch."

She adds, "This year that road flooded in the spring and was impassible for awhile. There are still soft spots in that portion of road, plus some people in the Valley don't understand big trucks and bad roads."

Hardy's driver rounded a blind curve to find a pickup traveling in the middle of the road. The pickup failed to move over, so Hardy's driver had few options. "The pickup didn't get over," Hardy says. "Our driver could either have hit the pickup or hit the ditch, so she chose the ditch. The sides of that road just suck you in, there was a small incline in the ditch, and it caught the truck and laid it over. Thank goodness no one was hurt."

Once again, women took care of the problem of the tipped truck and spilled beets. "I ran the loader and scooped up beets, and the crew helped," Hardy concludes. "We off-loaded the beets onto another truck, and we had to pick up the last few bucket loads by hand."

A Neighborhood Watch Program is a crime prevention program that stresses education and common sense and empowers citizens to become active in community efforts through participation in neighborhood watch groups.

Richland-McCone County RSVP Director Idelle Badt has had several people inquiring about starting such a program in Sidney.

"We tried to start a Neighborhood Watch Program about five years ago and didn't have anyone show up for the meeting," said Badt, "We have all the materials from then that could be used if people really want to get this going."

With the increase of residents and a noticeable increase in crime, newcomers and long-time residents are concerned about what can be done to feel safer.

"The size my of neighborhood has grown so much I see people who don't know each other. I see people liv-

ing in a sort of fear that is not necessary." said Rachael Derry, a longtime area resident.

Derry shared her interest in the Neighborhood Watch program getting

"I see young mothers, many of them new to Sidney, that don't realize how our friendly community was before all of the new people moved in. People in Sidney, in general, need to work together to make it better and keep it the way it was. Neighbors watching out for each other."

Badt wants people to know that a program of this sort is a commitment, but residents can feel like they are doing something to make things better for their community neighborhoods.

With all of the small crime happening, a Neighborhood Watch Program could be a great asset to the community and the law enforcement departments that are overwhelmed and understaffed.

"It would help people feel safer being involved in a program like this." commented Derry, "And maybe even get to know each other."








We are painting the county red! Richland County is celebrating Red Ribbon Week Nov. 7-11. The Red Ribbon Week campaign is now the oldest and largest drug prevention program in the nation, reaching millions of young people each year. Red Ribbon Week provides all community members with the ideal opportunity to unite and make a visible stand against drugs. Here in Richland County, we are taking it one step further. We want to tell our youth that we support them in choosing to live drug-free. We want them to know that we care about the decisions they make.

Our goal this year is to bring Red Ribbon Week beyond the walls of the schools and into the community. Preventing youth drug use is so important it takes a community to effect change and really make a difference. Surveys conducted in local schools show that 25% of our high school students are binge drinking (more than five drinks at a sitting) and there are dramatic increases reported by 8th grade students. # Bakken Infrastructure Finance & Development Summit

The 2nd Annual Bakken Infrastructure Finance & Development Summit was held Oct. 24-26, in Denver, CO. The summit was an opportunity for those in any area of the oil industry to meet key decision makers from government, E&P companies, investment houses and financial institutions, midstream and other infrastructure developers and operators who are involved with Bakken infrastructure.

Approximately 350 people attended the second annual Bakken Infrastructure Finance and Development Summit in downtown Denver. Keynote speakers at the summit were Harold Hamm, CEO, Continental Resources, on day one and North Dakota Governor Jack Dalrymple, on the second morning of the summit.

The three-day summit was initiated to be the business center of infrastructure expansion in the Williston Basin and focus on current and future infrastructure projects in the Williston Basin and how this affects the economics of the region. For investors who attended it was an opportunity to learn where the investment opportunities are in real estate and community growth.

Day one of the summit featured workshops on the traditional Bakken and where it is headed today, the latest updates on the growing production from the entire Williston Basin and review on the increasing potential in resource plays outside of the traditional Bakken production. Workshop leaders discussed the expansion of the Bakken play into Montana, Saskatchewan and Alberta. There were detailed presentations covering the geology and the economics of these shale plays.

Day two agenda topics included briefings on every major pipeline project currently under development. With new pipelines for oil and natural gas liquids (NGL's) and rail transloading stations being constructed in the Bakken, midstream infrastructure providers need to build relationships with the Bakken producers to meet their infrastructure needs and the summit was able to provide a network for these issues. There was also talk of how much additional midstream infrastructure is needed to accommodate increasing production levels.

Another focus was the activity in Bakken E&P, midstream, rail, trucking, housing, labor and power generation. One panel focus was how power companies are involved and can they help with growing drilling activity in the Bakken infrastructure, a discussion of major power issues related to growing drilling activity in North Dakota, what counties suffer with power shortages the most and a question of what are the plans for power plants expansion to secure sufficient power sources for expanding drilling activities.

An important panel discussion held on the second day of the summit looked at overcoming the community challenges related to drilling activities. They discussed the challenges oil and gas producing counties in North Dakota are dealing with and the social impact the drilling activities have on the local communities.

Considering the first summit of this kind a great success, local officials are planning another summit for next year.
