H&R Men's Softball Team Takes State Title

Richland County's H&R Men's Softball Team won the Men's Class D State Softball Tournament in Bozeman on August 11, beating out 18 other men's teams from across the state.


For coach and player Art Herman, this makes three state titles and numerous other tournament wins under his belt. "Every year they get harder and harder," he explained. "If you don't hit the ball and play a great defense, you don't win." Herman has been involved with softball for 46 years, and has been running the softball league in Richland County for 40 of those years. "We won a state tournament in 1984, when I was just a kid," he joked. His team won again in 2014, and now in 2019.

The team travels all over Montana for games, including Billings, Missoula, and Boz-

eman, and also plays in Minot, Bismarck, and South Dakota. "We play about 11 weekends," Herman explained. "We put on a lot of miles," beginning the second week in May and finishing up with the state tournament the second weekend in August.

The H&R team is comprised of players from Richland County, and as far as Billings and Colstrip. "You've got to mesh it all together," Herman explained. The team had a slow season, and went into the state tournaments without one win. "We had to beat 18 teams," Herman said. At the state tournament, "the team finally played together. They became a team. They were unbeatable at state-they just walked through everybody, and those were some really tough games," Herman said of their experience

On day one of the tournament, H&R beat the Triple Dogs 16-15 and Salvo 19-7; and on day two beat Team Beaver 20-16

NAN Season Kicks Off With "Love That Dog" Sept. 12, Sidney



Badlands Search and Rescue Assists Hiker in North Unit

On September 2 at 1:46 pm Badlands Search and Rescue responded to Theodore Roosevelt National Park-North Unit, 2 miles from Oxbow Overlook on the North Achenbach Trail.

Badlands Search and Rescue (BSAR) was called out by the National Park Service for a 66 year-old female with injuries to both wrists sustained from a fall. Others with her hiking party called 911 via satellite phone and began first aid to her injuries. Weather was foggy, cloudy, with misting rain. Trail conditions were wet and muddy with a bison herd in the vicinity.

National Park Service (NPS) Rangers established incident command and deployed a team of NPS rangers, McKenzie County deputies, and BSAR members with wheeled litter. McKenzie County Ambulance was also staged at the command post at the Oxbow Overlook.

NPS had assessed the woman's injuries and she was able

to continue walking under her own power. At 3:24 p.m., responders accompanied her and her 17 person hiking party from the location back to the trailhead to ensure that all safely returned.

All parties and the patient were back at the trailhead at 4 p.m. and the injured woman was taken to a local hospital via private vehicle.

This is BSAR's first official deployment! We operate with the NPS within the borders of the Theodore Roosevelt National Park with a good faith assistance agreement and today's call went very smoothly.

Information Requested Regarding String Of Watford City Vehicle Break-Ins

On Wednesday, September 4, 2019 at approximately 6:45 a.m., Watford City Police Department Officers were dispatched to a vehicle break-in in the 400 block of 3rd Ave NE, Watford City. Shortly after the first call, dispatch received another call of a burglary of a garage less than one block away. The homeowner of the second break-in chased the suspect, and while doing so, a firearm fell to the ground from the suspect's pants. The suspect picked the handgun up, and continued to flee to a residence in the 200 block of 6th St NE. WCPD officers were able to recover a second firearm from the same area, as well as other stolen items that were dropped by the suspect(s). WCPD secured the

residence and a search warrant was granted for it.

During the execution of the search warrant at the residence, three adults and three juveniles were detained. Two adult males, Timothy Ray Allgier (Watford City – Age 43) and Steven Oliver Larson (Watford City – Age 58) were arrested for Felony Possession of a Controlled Substance – Methamphetamine and Felony Possession of Drug Paraphernalia – Methamphetamine. Officers also located a stolen firearm, ammunition, and other stolen property in the residence. One juvenile was placed in state custody, and the other two were released to their parents pending further investigation. The adult female was released from the scene, pending further investigation. The investigation revealed that 12 different residents within the City of Watford City were victims of the string of vehicle break-ins. Due to suspects being juveniles; no further information on this active case will be released.

The old National Guard armory located on west Holly Street is the new facility for Richland County Transportation and the Commission on Aging. Director, Jody Berry, is glad to be moved in to the department's new location as it brings much more needed space for the transport vehicles and program development

"The process took a few years to finalize," stated Berry. With freshly painted walls, the armory provides a great space for development of current programs provided by the Commission on Aging. This new location provided a large increase in area from the previous 670 square feet at their old office, is great for storing and maintaining transport vehicles inside, and was essential for preserving the pri-

vacy of program participants. The agency plans on adding an ADA compliant elevator, which is budgeted for 2021 fiscal year.

Programs that the Richland County Commission on Aging provides the community are transportation, meals on wheels, Medicare Part D supplemental insurance assistance, Medicare 101 classes, and arthritis fitness and nutrition programs. The Richland County Commission on Aging provided over 6700 senior center meals, 6300 meals on wheels and 3000 health screenings for the previous fiscal year. The department provides free health screenings that include weight check, blood pressure, heart rate and blood sugars. During the open enrollment period for Medicare October 15-December 7, 2018, 500 people were signed

up for Part D Medicare supplemental insurance through the SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) with a savings of over \$724,000. "The supplemental food program will eventually move over here as well," Jody Berry says. All programs are open to seniors age 60 or over, regardless of income level.

The staff is having an open house Friday, September 13 to answer questions and allow the public to see the new facility location. There will be food, door prizes, games and demonstrations for exercise programs provided by the agency. Free will donations are gladly accepted to help support programs. Open house is from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. For more information visit richland.org or call 406-433-3701.





Snyder shares her inspirational story at speaking events across the United States. Snyder not only has a book that shares her life story but also a movie In 2018, Netflix released a movie based on Snyder's life titled, "Walk Ride Rodeo."



"It will help lower costs because there will be younger and

healthier members using it," Williams said.

One community member at the meeting asked Williams how she feels she differs from her opponents. Williams said her

experience and name recognition are key and sets her apart from those she is running against.

Williams noted that she also bridges the gap between com-

munity and politics and takes the time to hear what Montanans want and need from her.

"I know how to make lobbyists work for me, not the other

way around," Williams said.

When the situation with Sidney Sugars was brought up, Williams took note and said it was something she would look further into. She plans to return to Sidney to take a tour of the factory and to find out more of what she can do to help the situation.

Laura has been a School Counselor/School Psychologist in both Montana and North Dakota for the past 28 years. Laura is currently working at the Rau School in Sidney as School Counselor. After retirement for Jim, the Germanns moved to the Squaw Gap Community to enjoy life on the family ranch. Their son Cole and family help with the ranch. In August of 2018 Jim and Laura Germann started a journey they never could have imagined. Laura was diagnosed with a recurrence of a Pleomorphic Xanthoastro-

cytoma (brain tumor). She un-

derwent surgery in Bismarck,

ND on August 14, 2018. After surgery a brain infection developed and she was hospitalized to clear the infection. Later, she underwent radiation and chemotherapy. August 2019 came around and this time it was Jim who was diagnosed with Glioblastoma Non Form, a type of terminal brain cancer. He was flown to Rochester, MN and underwent surgery for tumors found on his right temporal lobe and one on the parietal lobe. After surgery he developed a brain bleed and suffered a stroke. 
