Nail will be joining Josh Turner 2011 and he recently released Born in November, 1977. for an unforgettable night of his third album, "I'm on Fire." country music.


> Nail was born and raised in Kennett, Missouri. In 2009 he married his longtime girlfriend, Catherine.





The Montana Department of Revenue, Liquor Licensing announces the availability of one (1) Montana Retail On-Premises Consumption Beer License(s) for the Sidney area as a result of the 2013 population estimate. The Sidney area includes the incorporated city/town of Sidney and that portion of Richland County situated within five (5) miles of the incorporated city/

In the case where more applications are received than there are available licenses a lottery drawing will occur. Any person intending to apply for one of the licenses is required to send a Lottery Application, Form LOTAPP. On this form please state the name of the applicant(s) including all potential owners, corporate stockholders, all partners of a partnership, and all members of a limited liability company. This application is due to the Department no later than 5:00 PM on the 2nd day of September, 2014. Late, unsigned or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Only one (1) Lottery Application will be accepted per person for this area. A "Person" as defined in the Administrative Rules of Montana is any individual, firm, partnership, limited liability company, corporation or association. When applying for a "floater" license you may only apply for one area per year.

If a lottery is necessary, the drawing will take place in Helena to determine who has the opportunity to apply for this license. Applicants will be notified of the date, time and place where the drawing will take place. Applicants do not need to be present to be chosen.

Those successful in the lottery drawing will be required to send a License Application within 30 days. The License Application needs to have identical ownership information as to what was provided on the Lottery Application.

All new licensees are required to meet the legal criteria of a license as outlined in the Montana Alcoholic Beverage Code and the Administrative Rules of Montana.

The license cannot be used to conduct any gaming or gambling activity on the premises.



The Montana State University Agricultural Experiment Station and Extension Service held their 34th annual Field Day in Sidney on Thursday July 24th. The event capped 100 years of dedicated service by the MSU Extension Office. The employee's of the extension office have dedicated their careers to identifying diseases and improving the production of the crops grown in Montana.

Our unique growing conditions present many challenges and opportunities to the agricultural community. The scientists at each of the seven research centers located around the state conduct experiments designed to develop seeds that are able to increase the productivity of the agricultural industry in Montana. These experiments have generated a quantifiable return on investment, as agriculture remains the number one industry in our state.

Senator Matt Rosendale and Representative Scott Staffanson were in attendance as the scientists presented their work. The tests ranged from techniques which use seed manipulation to strengthen wheat stems to withstand high winds prior to harvest, to growing crops in such a fashion as to disrupt the reproductive cycles of the problematic insects thereby reducing crop damage.


Agricultural Field Day Additional experiments have assisted the agricultural community into developing

crops, which can be grown in a rotation with their traditional crops such as sugar beets or wheat. Many times, by changing the crop which has been grown in the same location for many years, the farmer may improve the soil conditions and reduce the presence of disease and insects that have slowly been reducing their production and profits.

Always of interest is the marketability of any new crops. Soybeans have shown to be a good rotation in both dryland wheat and irrigated fields. They deposit nitrogen back into the soil and have been highly successful as a tool to help with weed management. Several local producers have

found that they have ready access to markets making soybeans a nice addition to their crop rotation.

Duane Peters, Agronomist for Sidney Sugars, Inc. spoke about the different varieties of sugar beets and gave a brief outlook for the current sugar beet crop. At present he estimates an average of just over 29 tons per acre of beets to be harvested in the fall. This is greater than any of the other regions and more than two tons an acre greater than the previous record of 27 tons per acre set in our area. The producers must still keep an eye to the global sugar markets and the production in Mexico more particularly as that can have huge impact on the actual value of their crop.

Pronghorn Application Deadline is Aug. 6

Pronghorn applicants are reminded the deadline for submitting applications for the 2014 hunting season is Aug. 6. Only North Dakota residents are eligible to apply.

Hunters are encouraged to apply online at the State Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov. People who have accumulated preference points and choose not to apply this year will not lose their points.

A new state law requires

residents age 18 or older to prove residency on the application by submitting a valid North Dakota driver's license number or a North Dakota nondriver photo identification number. Applications will not be processed without this information.

The season is open only in unit 4-A, the far southwestern corner of the state. A total of 250 any-pronghorn licenses are available, and the season is split into an early "bow-only" portion, and a later gun/bow season.



Montana Consumers Will Benefit From \$2,719,595 in Health Insurance Refunds

Health care law will provide families in Montana with an average refund of \$286 this summer

Health and Human Services Secretary Sylvia M. Burwell announced today that 14,170 consumers in Montana will benefit from \$2,719,595 in refunds from insurance companies this summer, averaging \$286 per family, because of the Affordable Care Act.

Created through the law, the 80/20 rule, also known as the Medical Loss Ratio (MLR) rule, requires insurers to spend at least 80 percent of premium dollars on patient care and quality improvement activities. If insurers spend an excessive amount on profits and red tape, they owe a refund back to consumers.

"The 80/20 rule is bringing transparency and competition to the insurance market, ensuring that consumers are continuing to receive value for their premium dollars," said Secretary Burwell. "Standards like these created under the health care law are providing Montanans with immediate savings and are helping to keep costs down over the long-term."

Nationwide, consumers have saved a total of \$9 bil-


lion on their health insurance premiums since the 80/20 rule took effect. Last year alone, consumers nationwide saved an estimated \$3.8 billion because of reduced premiums as insurance companies operated more efficiently. Additionally, consumers nationwide will receive \$330 million in refunds, with 6.8 million consumers due to receive an average national refund benefit of \$80


Since the standard took effect, more insurers year over year are meeting the 80/20 rule by spending more of the premium dollars they collect on patient care and quality, and not red tape and bonuses.

If an insurer did not spend enough premium dollars on patient care and quality improvement, Montanans will see their value reflected in one of the following ways:a refund check in the mail: a lump-sum reimbursement to the same account that they used to pay the premium if by credit card or debit card; a reduction in their future premiums: or their employer using refunds to improve their health coverage.

Study **Shows** Montana's Beer and Wine **Distributors Boost Economy**

Montana's beer and wine distributors support more than 2,000 jobs, with average earnings of nearly \$54,000, according to a recent study by the University of Montana Bureau of Business and Economic Research.

The study, commissioned by the Montana Beer and Wine Distributors Association (MB-WDA), found that distributor operations increase the number of jobs, levels of household income and tax revenues

across the state. "We found that distributors make Montana's economy larger, more prosperous and more populous," said Colin Sorenson, a BBER research economist who conducted the study along with BBER Director Patrick Barkey.

BBER's study found that Montana's 22 beer and wine distributors have the following economic impacts: An average of 2,048 additional permanent, year-round jobs in the state; More than \$120 million received by Montana households; Disposable income of over \$100 million; Nearly \$200 million in sales from businesses and organizations based in Montana; and Tax and nontax revenues, not including property taxes, of more than \$36 million.

Distributor activity sustains nearly 1,200 jobs in wholesale trade and more than 800 additional jobs in manufacturing, state and local government, construction and other private sector industries, the study found.


"A lot of our work is behind the scenes, so people may not realize the pivotal role we play in getting products to customers," according to Mike Markovich, a Montana Beer and Wine Distributors Association board member. "For example, it would be pretty hard to get many of your favorite Montana craft beers in your local store without distributors to help make it happen. We are able to transport the beer of even small Montana breweries in our trucks alongside the nationally known beers, which provides a great diversity in products offered by Montana retailers."

Association distributors deliver beer and wine to approximately 3,200 licensed accounts located throughout Montana's 56 counties.




