# Ross Rosaaen Donates "Cancer Battle Suit" To The 10th Annual Best Kept Secret Bra Auction

Every year since 2012 Ross Rosaaen has donated a unique bra for the Best Kept Secret Bra Auction, an event which raises money for the Cancer Coalition Relief Fund. This fund offers assistance to patients receiving cancer treatment through the Sidney Health Center and are specifically designated to assist with living expenses during treatment and provide cancer screening in Richland, McCone, Dawson, Wibaux, Prairie, and Fallon Counties. Rosaaen has taken the initiative to use his skills as a welder to fashion some of the most interesting and elaborate bras at the annual event.

In 2011 Donetta Asbeck came into Niehenke Welding needing his help with a bra she was working on for the event and after that Rosaaen decided to create one of his own.

This year he is dedicating his donation to Asbeck, Nikki Carda, and Mickyla Eide.

"They are the reason I got involved in the first place," said Rosaaen. "They sparked my interest."

Over the years, his donations have raised over

\$55,000; two years ago, his "Superman" bra sold for \$33,000 with the condition that Rosaaen try it on himself, which, being a good sport, he obliged.

"There have been a lot of great supporters," he commented of the fundraiser. Having had family members with cancer, he added, "You never know when someone will need help. It's great community support and the money raised stays local."

This year, his donated creation, which is nothing short of artistry and is his biggest one to date, is entitled "Cancer Battle Suit" and is highly anticipated, promising to shock and awe. This year may be Rosaaen's last Bra Auction for a while as business and family is keeping him quite busy and he is hoping to peak people's interest with his to-be-donated bra weighing nine pounds and that's not including the accessories which complete the "Cancer Battle Suit".

Rosaaen, who was born and raised in Sidney, says he enjoys the challenge of building the bras and so far has put about twenty-four hours into welding the "Cancer Battle Suit" that will be unveiled at this year's Best Kept Secret Bra Auction, Friday, May 1st at the event Center in Sidney with registration from 6:00 pm to 7:00 pm and the live auction from 7:00 pm until 9:00 pm. In addition to the silent and live auction, there will be appetizers, DJ music, and drinks available.

Rosaaen is hoping for a large turn out this year as it is the 10th Annual Bra Auction and would like to see regular supporters as well as those new to the event turn out. "The ladies that put this event together are awesome," he commended. "It's a fun way to get involved and help the community."

# Yellowstone River Water OK For Irrigation

Lower Yellowstone Irrigation Project manager James Brower was happy to report to his board that The Center for Toxicology and Environmental Health (CTEH), along with an independent laboratory, have determined good water quality that poses no hazard in using the Yellowstone River water for irrigation. The testing was done as a result of the Bridger pipeline break January 18, 2015.

Brower reported that comprehensive water and silt samples from in front of the first, middle and last gates at the Intake Headgates had been taken on April 8. The independent laboratory had confirmed that no volatiles were found in any of the samples and only normal trace amounts of hydrocarbons had been found in the silt in front of the gates. These trace amounts were normal for navigable waters, similar to baseline readings upstream from the pipeline spill and way below threshold for reporting and MT DEQ screening level.





# **No E-Rase Your E-Waste Event In May**

Members of the E-rase Your E-waste committee announced this week that there will be no e-waste collection in Sidney this spring, but that the event will be held as usual in the fall.

"Our e-cycler recently informed us that they would not be able to take televisions or CRT monitors at our annual spring collection event in May because of a backlog of those items in recycling warehouses across the country," Committee Chair Jackie Couture noted. "We also heard the same thing from Montana DEQ (Department of Environmental Quality). Because those items represent a large part of what we collect at our events, we've decided to wait until September to hold another collection to give us and our e-cycler time to come up with options for local residents.'

The committee is hoping the backlog will be addressed by the time its fall event comes around in September, according to Couture. She added, however, that the group plans to go ahead with the fall event regardless so that residents can safely dispose of their other e-waste items.

If the backlog continues there may have to be a charge for recycling television sets and CRT monitors at future E-rase your E-waste events, Couture said. In cancelling the May event this year, organizers are hoping the backlog for CRT monitors and TVs will be at least partially alleviated by fall potentially curtailing the need for a charge, but if not, the committee will also have had time to consider other options to reduce the expense for area residents.

"When we started these collections more than a decade ago, there was a per pound charge for all the e-waste brought in for recycling," Couture noted. "At that time, the city and the

county contributed funds and we raised additional money from local businesses and individuals to help offset the charges for

ber E-rase Your E-waste event in Sidney, or recycle them with other recycling businesses in the area. For example, in Sidney Pacific Steel & Recycling takes e-waste, and while they, too, are feeling the crunch in recycling televisions and CRT monitors, they can take other e-waste items and in some instances will pay you for them. They may also take some televisions and monitors for a charge, but before hauling those items, interested persons are encouraged to call ahead to see what items are being accepted and what if any charges exist for recycling those items (406-433-1301).

Couture also reminded residents, that one well-known local recycling business, Richland Opportunities Inc., DOES NOT handle electronic waste (just paper, cardboard, some plastics, etc.) so please do not drop your e-waste there. She also discouraged residents from taking their items to the Richland County landfill.

"Given the high lead content in TVs and CRT monitors - up to 4 pounds in the glass - the last thing we want people to do is to dump them in the local landfill," Couture said, noting lead poses a human health hazard. "We're hoping to have a solution by fall. In the meantime, we're very disappointed not to be able to hold our spring event, but will work hard to ensure that September's event goes on as planned."



# **2014 Richland County DUI Statistics**

April is 'ALCOHOL AWARENESS MONTH' and Richland County DUI Task Force and District II Alcohol and Drug Program work diligently throughout the year to bring education, awareness, prevention and treatment to the community, with focus on

alcohol issues. Collection of data, awareness campaigns, trainings and policy development are all part of the effort to make Richland County a safe and healthy place to live.

In 2014 there were 319 DUIs, which was an increase of 104 DUIs over 2013, with numbers steadily increasing over the last four years. Why the increase? There are several factors that were discussed at the quarterly DUI Task Force meeting.

The community needs to looks at the increase in vehicle traffic, and the increased residents and visitors alike from the Bakken oil boom. Local establishments are busier than they have been in years past.

The RADD (Report a Drunk Driver) program has given the community accountability and ability to report impaired drivers. The community is sending out the message 'if you drink and drive you will be reported'.

Montana Highway Patrol, Richland County Sheriff's Office and Sidney & Fairview Police Departments are putting emphasis on reducing DUIs in our communities. With changes the Bakken Boom has placed on our community, law enforcement has also been changing to keep up with increased area of needs. Increased staffing and training of officers has led to higher traffic stop rates. Training and diligence of judges and prosecutors has had a positive impact on DUI prosecution rates; DUIs are not being pled down but prosecuted as written.

It is important for the community to remember that when DUI rates go up, it is not always because of an increase in drinking and driving. It can be due to an increase in enforcement efforts, with more people being pulled over for drinking and driving. However with consistency in education, awareness and consequences, the DUI rates should decline. The community will slowly change and create a safer environment.

# **Nourish Your Eyes** for Optimal Health

When was the last time you had a full eye exam? About 16 million people in the U.S. over the age of 45 report some vision loss, so regular vision checkups are very important. The most debilitating eye diseases are glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration (AMD), cataracts, diabetic retinopathy, retinal detachment and refractive errors. The greatest risk factor for most eye diseases, especially AMD, is age.

Several of us may be more likely to have AMD later in life because our relatives have or had AMD. However, all of us should consider preventing AMD through a variety of methods; the first is regular eve exams. The dilated-pupil exam allows your eye doctor to have a comprehensive look at the macula.

Good nutrition also is vital, and fruits, vegetables and eggs are particularly important for eye health. Taking an eye supplement such as lutein and zeaxanthin is not a replacement for an inadequate diet. Substances in green, leafy vegetables may be effective in preventing AMD, but scientists are not sure if the reason is lutein, zeaxanthin or an unidentified substance in plant-based food.

If you'd like to make some changes in your diet or lifestyle

to improve your eye health, the North Dakota State University Extension Service can help. The Extension office in McKenzie County is holding a class at 11 am on Tuesday, April 28 at the Watford City Senior Center.

This class is part of NDSU Extension's Nourishing Boomers and Beyond program. The program is designed to provide rural North Dakotans age 50 and older with information and strategies to reduce their risk of developing chronic diseases. However, any adult can benefit from the information.

Nourishing Boomers and Beyond offers classes on a different topic each month. Participants will be able to take part in hands-on activities and discussions, and they'll receive material such as handouts and healthful recipes to take home.





He will continue seeing patients for several months and hopes to be able to return to the area periodically to see patients. His ability to do this will depend on where he finds employment. "I am taking my time with this process because we are not in a hurry to leave. I want to find a place where I can envision myself staying for a long period of time, much like I did here at RMC. Those perfect-fit career paths take time to locate and I am being very selective," he said.

Lambert first came to the area after graduating from

# Public Involvement Sought To Celebrate Fort Union's 50th Anniversary And The National Park Service's Centennial

Williston area residents convinced Congress to create a nation's park nearly 50 years ago. And to celebrate that accomplishment and the MonDak region's inspiration for "America's Best Idea," its national parks, the National Park Service seeks community input.

To share your thoughts and ideas for how the National Park Service could celebrate Fort Union Trading Post's 50th anniversary in 2016, join the park's staff for a public meeting at the Williston Public Library. The meeting will be Wednesday, April 29, at 7 p.m.

"The park exists because of the people of Williston and the greater MonDak area," Fort Union curator Fred MacVaugh said. "They inspired Congress to authorize the historic site in 1966. Then, despite NPS opposition, they convinced Congress to fund the post's reconstruction in the 1980s."

That same community enthusiasm and commitment is desired again to celebrate not only the park's 50th anniversary but also the National Park Service's 2016 centennial. "Without historic Fort Union," MacVaugh said, "America might not have national parks at all." It was after visiting Fort Union and the Upper Missouri in 1832 that the artist George Catlin first called for Congress to create a "nation's park."

In addition to seeking community input at the meeting, Fort Union's staff will introduce and solicit support for two anniversary-related proposals. The first is to collaborate with individuals and community organizations like the James Memorial Art Center to develop a museum exhibit that showcases the region's role in the park's creation. "Rather than us telling the story," MacVaugh says, "we'd rather invite local residents to share their stories and memorabilia of their own and the communities' involvement."

The exhibit would be displayed at Williston's James Memorial Art Center and Sidney's MonDak Heritage Center during the summer of 2016, MacVaugh said. At the meeting, park staff will outline the exhibit proposal and ask for interested community members to share their memories and help develop the exhibit.

The second proposal is for park art workshops. Because of the region's rich tradition of American Indian and Euro-American artwork, the park wants to develop art workshops for school-age children in collaboration with community partners such as the James Memorial Art Center. The hope is to inspire kids to explore the park and learn the area's history while developing their own skills as sketchers, painters, photographers, or storytellers. To help with this, the park wants to recruit interested local artists as volunteers to lead workshops either at the park or the heritage center.
