Though ordinarily politically-fired, Prather's Sidney performance will include


commentary on family life and other family-focused hilarity.





#### Roosevelt County Extension Offers Many Opportunities

The Roosevelt County Extension Office, located in Culbertson, has a full schedule of learning opportunities coming up in the next few months.

The office is staffed by just two agents-4-Hand FCS Agent Ardis Oelkers, and AgricultureAgentJeffreyChilson. The agents are tasked with collaborating with other regional Extension agents to offer educational outreach programsforcommunitymembers. Early 2019 offerings include many programs for teachers, ag producers, and community members.

One of the first opportunitiesisthe "Solid Finances" webinar series. The series is "a whole bunch of information on financialmanagementandestateplanningavailablethrough Extension,"saidOelkers.The webinars are recorded, and community members can accessthemfromhome. Viewers can contact the Extension officeforadditionalinformation on the content, or guidance on putting knowledge into practice. "We have wonderful specialists. They have such good knowledge," said Oelkers. "The webinars are a good waytogetthatknowledgeinto the community.'

An additional financial management course is the FarmManagementworkshop on the 13th and 14th of March at the Roosevelt County Extension office in Culbertson. Thetwo-dayworkshopcovers financial analysis, enterprise budgeting, risk management, cropandlivestockproduction, agricultural leases, policy issues, and farm and ranch succession. The workshop is led by MSU Extension economists Kate Fuller and Joel Schumacher.

ServeSafe courses are available to the community quarterly, with courses alternating between Poplar and Wolf Point. ServSafe is a national food safety curriculum approved by the Montana

Department of Public Health andHumansServicestomeet the food safety certification requirement for licensed establishments, such as bars, restaurants, schools, and hospitals. The course offerings include the full Certified Food Protection Manager, as well as the shorter Food Handler course. The longer, 8-hour course concludes with the paper certification test. The course offerings are a collaboration with the Northeast Montana Health Services.

In June, the Extension office will be offering continuing education courses with approved credits forteachers. "We provide 16 hours of education," Oelkers explained. "They're usable, hands-on activities. Our goal is to provide renewal credits that are at an economical cost, that are appealing to a variety of teachers." Information on specific course offerings is forthcoming.

## Legislative Report

By Steve Hinebauch Greetings from Helena!

We have finished 20 days of our 90-day session. The three committees I am on are real important committees, but they can be emotional at times. In Fish and Game, we heard a bill (SB70) to remove Headwaters State Park from the primitive list. The bill did not have any opponents. This seemed a little odd to me because most groups that come in to the Fish and Game Committee want to make everything primitive, whether it is a conservation easement, a wilderness study area or a monument. Do they want more land to be primitive or do they have another agenda? Everything in Health and Human Services Committee is emotional, and important, because it deals with people's lives and DPHS, which takes the biggest chunk of the state budget, over \$2 Billion a year. In Judiciary Committee we discussed bills from requiring an ultrasound before an abortion

both emotional topics.

There is always the urge for government agencies to take more of our money and chip away at our freedoms. The State government has plenty of money, it just needs to be prioritized. To paraphrase Benjamin Franklin, those who give up freedom for security might lose both.

The State of the State was this past week. The Governor reassured us that he wants to start government funded preschools, continue Medicaid expansion, have a \$300 Million ending fund balance (slush fund), and other programs that take money. To cover his want list, he needs to raise taxes \$160 Million.

Things seem to be getting busier all the time. We will be seeing more bills come through our committees and onto the floor as we get closer to the transmittal date.

It was good to see US Senator Steve Daines in the Capitol this week. He spoke at the Montana Federation of Republican Women's Legis-

# Landowners Have Until March 15 To Apply For Access Tax Credit Program

Landowners have until March 15 to submit applications to Montana Fish, Wildlife, & Parks for enrollment in the Unlocking Public Lands Program.

to stiffer penalties for DUIs,

This program is designed to provide recreational public access to state or federal (Bureau of Land Management or United States Forest Service) land where no legal public access currently exists. In exchange for access across the private lands, landowners will receive a tax credit in the amount of \$750 per agreement and up to a maximum of \$3,000 tax credit per year. Landowners decide how the public may cross their private property and may limit access to foot traffic only. "Offering a tax credit in exchange for allowing public access across private land to reach public land is a unique and innovative way to increase public access," said Ken McDonald, FWP wildlife division administrator. "We hope these new opportunities and incentives may appeal to landowners throughout the state."

The Unlocking Public Lands program is a product of the 2015 Legislature, which expanded a program called Unlocking State Land passed by the previous legislature. While Montana contains near-

ly 31 million acres of BLM, USFS, and state land, much of this land requires landowner permission to cross private land to reach the adjoining state or federal land.


Van Cleve, who lives in

#### Through With Chew Week, Feb. 18th - 22nd

Smokless tobacco includes chewing tobacco products like Skoal, Snus, RedMan, and are often flavored to appeal to young users. Smokeless tobacco is not a safe alternative to cigarettes or vaping, as some young people believe, and it is even more habit forming because it contains a higher concentration of nicotine than cigarettes. Smokless tobacco can cause oral cancer, especially in the cheeks, gums and throat. In addition, smokless tobacco is addicting. It can also lead to

other problems, from heart disease and pancreatic cancer, to other dental problems, such as mouth sores, gum recession, tooth decay, bad breath, and permanent discoloration of teeth.

Through With Chew week is sponsored by the Richland County Health Department and the Partnership for Promise Coalition. Are you ready to call it quits from smokeless or spit tobacco or any other type of tobacco? The Montana Tobacco Quit Line is a free service available to all Montanans who would like to quit using smokeless or other tobacco products. ## **Beef-It's What's For Breakfast?**

You've heard the timeless slogan, "Beef-It's what's for Dinner," but have you considered how eating beef can support your overall health and well-being all day long?

A large body of scientific evidence shows that many people would benefit from eating more protein at every meal, not just dinner. The majority of protein is consumed at dinner, at 42%, then lunch, at 28%, and the least at breakfast, at just 16%. Increasing your protein intake at each meal, including breakfast, may help you meet your daily protein needs, build a strong and healthy body, and contribute to weight loss.

Adding more heart-healthy beef at each meal, even breakfast can help. Lean beef cuts have less than 10 grams of fat, and some cuts of beef are as lean as a 3-ounce skinless chicken thigh. Beef contains vitamins B6 and B12, which helps to maintain brain function; zinc, which helps to maintain a healthy immune system, and riboflavin, which helps convert food into fuel.

Aim for 25-30 grams of protein at each meal, which will keep you feeling full and may prevent overeating. One 3-ounce serving of beef provides about 25 grams of protein, the equivalent of 3 cups of quinoa, or almost 2 cups of black beans.

Thanks to better breeding and feeding, as well as improved

trimming practices and a focus on health, more than 60 percent of whole muscle beef cuts in the grocery store are considered lean. When choosing lean cuts, look for the words "round" or "loin" in the name of the cut, as this is a telltale sign of lean cuts, according to the industry resource "Beef. It's What's for Dinner". Popular lean beef cuts are top sirloin, top loin steak, round roast, and 95% lean ground beef. Choose beef products with the least amount of visible fat, called marbling, and trim visible fat before cooking.

Incorporating beef into every meal can be a daunting task. However, there are lots of healthy, hearty recipes for adding beef to breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Beef roasts and other large, lean cuts can be put on salads, sandwiches, wraps, and tacos for lunch throughout the week, paired with fruits, vegetables, and low-fat dairy. Ground beef can be made into muffin-tin mini meatloaves for perfect portions, slow-cooked with beans for chili, or mixed with broth and vegetables for hearty soup. For breakfast, try steak and egg tacos, or beef cornbread muffins. For a snack, test out different brands of beef jerky.





#### Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers

The Montana Public Service Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. CenturyLink's basic local service rates for residential voice lines are \$23.50 per month and business services are \$32.00 per month. Specific rates will be provided upon request.

CenturyLink participates in a government benefit program (Lifeline) to make residential telephone or broadband service more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. Eligible customers are those that meet eligibility standards as defined by the Federal Communications Commission and state commissions. Residents who live on federally recognized Tribal Lands may qualify for additional Tribal benefits if they participate in certain federal eligibility programs. The Lifeline discount is available for only one telephone or broadband service per household, and can be on either wireline or wireless service. Broadband speeds must be 18 Mbps download and 2 Mbps upload or faster to qualify.

A household is defined for the purposes of the Lifeline program as any individual or group of individuals who live together at the same address and share income and expenses. Lifeline service is not transferable, and only eligible consumers may enroll in the program. Consumers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain a Lifeline discount can be punished by fine or imprisonment and can be barred from the program.
