DRWA is a rural water project being created to service an 11,000+ square mile project area in Eastern Montana. The project area includes the towns of Circle, Richey, Jordan and Fairview; the unincorporated towns of

Where not defined by county boundaries, the service area is bound on the North by the Missouri River, on the West by Fort Peck Lake and the Musselshell River, on the South by arbitrary East and West alignment and on the East by the Yellowstone River and the Montana-North Dakota bor-

The majority of the users do not have access to a quality of water needed for a healthy existence. The treatment of water is costly and sometimes complicated depending on what is in the water. A regional rural water system like Dry-Redwater Regional Water Authority will allow rural users to have access to a reliable, safe, high quality water supply.

Dry-Redwater Regional Water Authority (DRWA) has been working toward Federal Authorization. Unfortunately the process is extremely slow and cumbersome.

DRWA is a part of the first rural water projects to be included in the Rural Water Act of 2006 (enacted in 2010). The Bureau of Reclamation recently informed DRWA of their expectation for a final design to be drawn up prior to approving our project for construction. As a result, we need to have our final design completed to move forward with the process

with the process.

If you are interested in becoming a part of DRWA please contact us immediately. We need you to complete the necessary forms and submit your good-intention fee to be included in our final design. If water lines in our preliminary design do not have enough users those lines may be omitted from the final design.

Any users wishing to be a part of DRWA must have this completed before February 28, 2013. If we do not have enrollment forms and a good intention fee from you by then you will not be considered a part of the initial project construction.







Rising land values, strong commodity prices and high production costs have made it more difficult for operators and landowners to successfully determine appropriate farmland lease arrangements. The workshops are offered to help landowners and renters identify and manage the risk associated with rental agreements.

Dwight Aakre and Andy Swenson, Extension farm management specialists, and Willie Huot, Grand Forks County Extension agent, will be the main presenters.

One of the topics is a historical perspective on farmland values and rents.

Concepts and practical examples of how to determine equitable rents also will be presented. The main session will help participants better understand different rental arrangements, such as cash rent, share rent and flexible cash rent.

There will be a session on how producers can improve their land rental negotiations by enhancing the communication process with landowners. This includes the use of resumes, portfolios and frequent communications to keep landowners informed and educated about their operation and vision for a particular tract of land

Trashy Tuesday Event Scheduled for January 15

The Recycling Advisory Committee would like to announce the next Trashy Tuesday. The Trashy Tuesday event is being held at Richland Opportunities Inc. (ROI) workshop on January 17 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. ROI's address is 1100 Silurian Lane in Sidney. The events are sponsored by volunteers who give their time to ensure that recycling can occur in lieu of throwing the listed material away. Items being accepted on the 17th

1) Corrugated cardboard- This type of cardboard has ridges and spaces in the box. Types of boxes not accepted include single sheet material like cereal, pop cases, or cracker boxes.

2) Office paper- Office paper can include all junk mail, envelopes, colored paper. Types of paper not accepted are neon colored material, cardstock and manila envelopes.

3) Newspapers and magazines - This includes the "slick" advertisement sheets and magazines/catalogs that have a thickness up to one inch.

4) PETE Plastic #1 bottles- This plastic is generally clear and includes pop, juice, dish soap and water bottles and peanut butter jars. The chasing arrow sign with a 1 at the base of the bottle indicates this plastic type.

5) Plastic bottles #2-#7 – These bottles include milk jugs, pill, laundry detergent, and hair product bottles. The chasing arrow sign with numbers 2-7 indicates the plastic types and # 2-7 must be sorted separately from #1 plastic.

*Please rinse out all bottles, especially milk jugs, as the bottles become moldy, and this becomes a health and safety concern. Trashy Tuesday events cannot take Styrofoam, yogurt containers or other containers that do not have a neck, threads and a cap. Caps should be removed from all bottles. The public is encouraged to presort all materials as the event is a self sort process.

Recycling saves energy by reusing already processed materials. By recycling one aluminum can, the energy saved can run a 100 watt bulb or a TV running for four hours. Twenty recycled cans may be made with the same amount of energy that it takes to make one new can and using recycled cans takes 95 % less energy than making new cans. In 2005, 54 billion cans were recycled saving energy equivalent to

15 million barrels of crude oil, America's entire gas consumption for one day. By comparison, it takes 24 million gallons of crude oil to make one billion water bottles and this amount of crude would fuel 30,000 cars for a year. Recycling one ton of plastics saves 7.4 cubic yards of landfill space, basically the size of a walk-in closet. Every ton of recycled paper saves approximately 4 barrels of oil, 4,200 kilowatt hours of energy and enough energy to heat and air-condition the average North American home for almost 6 months. Paper and cardboard together make up approximately 73% of the landfill space in America and once covered paper does not disintegrate. The facts which support recycling are overwhelming as energy and landfill space are impacted by recycling. In 2008, Richland County diverted only 2.4% of its waste through recycling efforts, while the rest of Montana recycled 18% of their waste. We invite the public to collect for this event and plan to recycle materials every three months. Remember Trashy Tuesday on January 15th and "toss it our way." 



Commodity Groups Part of 2013 Wheat Show

Warren Froelich, NDSU Extension Agent

Some of 16 experts scheduled to speak during this year's National Hard Spring Wheat Show will include representatives of four commodity groups who work hard to make sure there is profitability in providing the crops they represent. All are scheduled to report to area producers on Tuesday afternoon, February 5.

Doug Opland and Deanna Weise, President and Executive Director respectively, of the U.S. Durum Growers Association will share efforts of that organization to maintain the dominance of that crop in North Dakota. North Dakota ranks as the number one durum producing state of the nation. Although durum is grown in about every corner of the county, the bulk of the crop is produced in North Dakota.

Dan Wogsland, Executive Director of the North Dakota Grain Growers Association, will spend time discussing growing concerns of transporting all agriculture commodities to the major market terminals.

Representing the North Dakota Wheat Commission will be Jim Peterson, Marketing Director of that organization. The primary wheat crops grown in North Dakota are hard red spring and durum. Profitability of both are highly dependent on export sales. Approximately one-half of the hard red spring wheat must find an export market each year. Durum also is highly dependent on export sales. There have been years when two-thirds of North Dakota's production has reached foreign shores. Peterson will share how our wheat is stacking-up in today's wheat market. Based on recent quality reports on the 2012 crop I expect he will have a positive message.

Three members, lead by Karen Hertsgaard, from the Institute of Barley and Malt Sciences Department at NDSU, will discuss the importance of malt barley quality factors and explain how gust malts and especially beers are made. With the help of other staff of the institute, including Jimenez Diaz and Jaidev Sehrawat, those of us attending will be treated to a sampling of several beers.

Rental Agreements Often on Cash Basis

At this time of year many land lease agreements are negotiated. Judging from the many calls received throughout the year I think most agreements are made on a cash basis. Like many other things in life there are pros and cons.

For the landowners, cash renting requires little to perhaps no managerial input thus reducing the possibility of friction between the landowner and operator concerning management decisions. It also eliminates the concern over accurate division of crops and expenses or the need to be involved in marketing. Cash rent also reduces the amount of

paperwork from the fact the landowner no longer is required to fulfill crop insurance and Farm Service Agency obliga-

On the negative side for the landowner there may be tax management and Social Security issues, loss of income if there is a surge in crop prices and the possibility of contracting with a poor farm manager.

As with the owner, cash renting does offer advantages. Cash renting allows the renter a relatively free hand in making management decisions. There should be more incentive to strive for higher yields and increased net profits. The renter should be the sole beneficiary of unusually high yields and/

The obvious negative to cash renting is the increased risk of assuming all costs of production and the gamble with mother nature and the market.

To establish a greater balance of all the pros and cons of cash renting, university economists have been encouraging the concept of establishing cash rents that can be flexed on the basis of yield or price or both. The concept requires a greater dialogue between landowner and renter, thus it did not gain much traction until recently when wheat suddenly quadrupled in price. Although I think a majority of rental agreements remain at a single value per acre, I am having more landowners and renters reference the use of some form of a flexible agreement.

Just recently the North Central Farm Management Ex-

tension Committee released a new publication which offers several ideas which are intended to assist the landowner and renter in striking a better balance of opportunities and risks. In addition to some good reading, the publication includes a generic cash farm lease. 




