

Suicide Prevention Training

District II Alcohol & Drug Program will be providing a Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) at the Montana State Bank, 220 N. Main Street in Plentywood on Tuesday and Wednesday July 15th and 16th from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Training is free and provides continuing education credits for Law Enforcement, Licensed Addiction Counselors, Licenses Marriage Family Therapists, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, and Educators.

ASIST is a 2-day workshop designed to teach the skills to competently and confidently intervene with an individual at risk of suicide. Developed by Living Works Education, Inc., the workshop prepares Gatekeepers to integrate principles of intervention into everyday practice. The curriculum is divided into 4 learning modules: attitudes, knowledge, intervention and resources. Skills and principles are illustrated with case studies presented in videos and live dramatizations, role-play simulations, and discussions. Training Participants will be provided with Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training handbook, workbooks as well as networking opportunities with class participants.

The Training will be facilitated by certified ASIST Trainers Tim Anderson, Clinical Director for District II Alcohol & Drug Program and Tara Hubing, Counselor Circle Public Schools.






Gresh Jones turns his Cardinal Gibbons, Florida opponent and gets a 1st period pin in Orlando, FL. (Photo by Kari Jones)

Hail Insurance Deadline **Approaching - Purchase** Hail Insurance by Aug. 15

With some much needed rain falling across most of Montana, now is the time to evaluate your crop insurance needs. Montana farmers and ranchers can still purchase state hail insurance through August 15 by contacting the toll free number at (844) 515-1571 or visiting the website at http://agr.mt.gov/agr/ Programs/Commodities/HailInsurance/ to obtain forms.

With last year's record hail insurance claims, the Hail Board purchased reinsurance to ensure that any and all claims made by Montana producers covered by the state hail insurance program will be paid.

County Department of Revenue offices will no longer be processing new policies; instead they will be providing information to interested parties on how to begin the process. Forms are also available at Montana State University Extension Offices and Conservation District Offices.

At the request of producers and authorized by the State Legislature, the dry land hail insurance rate increased to \$75

per acre and \$114 per acre for irrigated land. The Hail Board also approved a five percent premium increase. Producers should contact the Montana Department of Agriculture to discuss coverage and rates.

Crestwood's Footprint Continues To Grow With Expansion Of The COLT Hub

EPPING, Strategically located in the heart of the Bakken and Three Forks shale plays, construction of the COLT Hub began in May 2011 and the facility went into service just one year later. Today the COLT Hub, owned and operated by Crestwood Midstream Partners LP, serves as a point of liquidity for the distribution of Bakken crude oil throughout North American markets by providing customers with crude oil storage and connectivity to the BNSF Railway Company and ties in with four major pipeline systems.

The COLT Hub brings in crude oil produced in Williams and McKenzie counties by pipeline and truck; provides crude oil handling, on-site blending and storage services through on-site tankage; and access to multiple downstream crude oil markets through pipeline and unit train loading capabilities. COLT also

provides pipeline services into and out of the rail facility through the COLT Connector, a 21-mile, bidirectional, crude oil transmission pipeline. This pipeline connects the COLT Hub to a point of interconnect with multiple existing and planned crude oil pipelines at Rangeland's Dry Fork terminal near the Beaver Lodge/Ramberg junction, eight miles south of Tioga, including interconnects to the Tesoro and Enbridge pipeline systems.

With 1.2 million barrels of crude oil storage and two 8,700 foot rail loops, the COLT Hub can accommodate 120-car unit trains and is now capable of moving up to 160,000 barrels per day

On May 6, 2014 Crestwood released their first-quarter earnings and gave this update: "During the first quarter 2014, we completed various COLT Hub and Arrow expansion projects that resulted in higher Bakken crude oil volumes being handled. We also acquired a crude oil and produced water transportation fleet based in Watford City, North Dakota, which added capacity for approximately 22,000 Bbls/ day of crude oil and water truck transportation volumes. This bolt-on acquisition further interconnects our Bakken value chain platform and complements the two crude oil unit trains we expect to receive in the first quarter

Loadings at COLT Hub in the second quarter are


expected to average 20-25% higher than the first quarter.

Having recently signed long-term agreements with BP Products North America, Inc. and with Statoil Marketing & Trading, the COLT expansion is supported. Crestwood expects to complete the installation of new release and departure tracks at the COLT Hub in the third quarter 2014, which will provide greater operational flexibility to their

customers and the BNSF Railroad. It will also improve utilization rates.

"We are keenly focused on growing our crude oil and NGL businesses," said Robert G. Phillips, chairman of Crestwood's general partner.

With so much current activity and planned nearfuture activity, we can expect to hear much more about Crestwood and their growing footprint in the Bakken.



From 11:30am to 12:30pm those involved with the grand parade will need to meet on State Street for parade registration; again, a centennial theme is encouraged.



Severt Sponheim Featured on 2014 Fairview Old Timer's Festival Button

The year 1914 gave way to pioneering moments; the first scheduled commercial flight took place with one pilot and one passenger, Babe Ruth made his Major League Baseball debut, the first traffic signal was installed. A little closer to home, the city of Fairview was established and Severt Sponheim was born.

The 68th Annual Fairview Festival kicks off Friday, July 18th and runs through the weekend. Severt Sponheim, celebrating his 100 year birthday on July 16th, was elected by Fairview Festival Committee to be represented on the 2014 Fairview Festival button

Severt was born at home in Cartwright, ND by a midwife, affectionately called Grandma Bergie. The oldest of three, he described his childhood as "happy". Time was spent hunting, fishing, swimming and playing baseball when not helping out on the family farm.

Cartwright, ND offered a mercantile, blacksmith, pool hall, delivery stable and 3 churches during Severt's early years. The only way to travel to nearby Fairview, MT was by cable ferry across the river. Kids in the neighborhood proceeded to complete their high school years in Alexander, ND as the cable ferry was not a reliable source of year round transportation. Severt stayed at home after elementary school to continue working on the family farm.

Childhood memories flowed as Severt talked about the "Wishing Book", the Hart-Parr Tractor, kerosene lamps, teams of horses and the Model T. A Sears Roebucks Catalog was called the Wishing Book. As Severt explained, "As you looked through the Sears catalog by kerosene lamp, we would say, 'wish I had this and wish I had that'; that is why it was called the Wishing Book."

Severt married the love of his life in 1938. Gunny and Severt had three children, 2 boys, Lyle and Dale, and a daughter, Arlene. They continued to live and farm in Cartwright. Through the years, they raised cattle, hogs, chickens and milk cows. Severt was known in the region as the "Community Mechanic", a "Jack of all Trades".

"When electricity was brought to the community it was like you came out of hell and into heaven", laughed Severt. Electricity made every aspect of life a little easier. Homes were furnished with one single light bulb and one outlet. Severt's talent of "Jack of all Trades" and his love of reading led him to be a self taught electrician. He then proceeded to help out friends and neighbors by wiring additional outlets and lights in their home.

Severt described himself as "kind of wild" in his younger years and shared stories of making dynamite while working in a coal mine with a friend, sitting on the drill box, jumping off running to the tractor when it arrived at the end of the field. He would turn the tractor around and then jump out of the tractor back to the drill box. He stated, "I lived this many years because I always had a guardian angel with me when I would pull crazy stunts. Also, I eat oatmeal every morning. That's the secret to a long life."

Severt worked on the farm and ran the tractor up until he was in his 90s. His passion for reading made him a world wide traveler through books. Three books Severt always had in his

home were the Bible. National Geographic, and the Smithsonian. "Life is too short to read fiction" is one of Severt's quotes his kids and grandkids cherish.


A poet, a farmer, an electrician, a plumber, a husband, father, grandfather - Severt Sponheim continues to support his friends and family and the town of Fairview through his knowledge, generosity and love of life. His only regret is not learning to play an instrument. Though, I would disagree. As we wrapped up the interview with Severt he belted into song, "The Strawberry Roan" by Marty Robbins. His voice, a strong tenor –a God given talent, the best instrument there is.





Fairview History

From Courage Enough by Ralph Chase, Mildred Gardner, Flora Heinle, Chester Hillman, Marj Johnson and Aneta Vitt

Lewis Newlon was the founder and promoter of Fairview. He was born December 15, 1878 at Lincoln, Nebraska, but to him, Montana was his home. He came to what was to be Fairview in 1903. He built a claim shack which was a bit larger than most claim shacks, It had five rooms and was built of sod. It was the first house built on the townsite of Fairview.

Even in that early day, Lewis Newlon had in mind the building of a town. The lay of the land was of such as to encourage railroad building, In 1903, about the time he built his residence he also established himself in the mercantile business. His store was finished before his home and was known as the Farmers Store:

In 1907 a competitor built a store and it was the first competitor in his tine of business. In 1907 he sold his store and turned his entire attention to the development and growth of Fairview. He platted three blocks in the line of his homestead, bordering on the Dakota line, as a townsite and gave it the name of Fairview. This was in January 1904, and at that time he offered a business lot at one dollar to anyone who would erect a place of business. The offer stimulated building to some extent but the town's growth continued slowly.

Various lines of industry were begun in the Fairview area before the coming of the railroad, which brought a real boom to the area. Mr. Newlon gave a gift of 96 acres of land to the railroad to be used as a right-of-way.

January 4, 1912 the first steel was laid into the town of Fairview. Within a week traffic with the outside world was carried on by rail. One of the business houses erected was occupied by Maxson Mercantile. He became a stockholder in the Delaney

Bank, later called First National Bank. The Albert Hotel Company was formed at this time and this was to be one of the outstanding hotels in the area for many years.

In the year 1913 the City of Fairview was incorporated and Lewis Newlon was elected the first mayor and served in that capacity for three years. He was succeeded by Dr. Perkins.

Fairview grew rapidly during the time and had two doctors at one time, a dentist, a lawyer and a thriving drug store along with other business places.

Industry had a part in the growth of Fairview as well. The Gedney Pickle Company was established there in 1925, a creamery and cheese plant in 1924 and Blue Rock Products was established in 1913.




