Richland County 4-H Raising Money for New Fair Booth

Richland County 4-H clubs are holding fundraisers to earn money to build a new food booth at the Richland County Fairgrounds. The fundraising efforts are already underway and they include selling brand boards, memorial plaques and various other fundraising events conducted by the 4-H clubs in the area.

The brand board fundraiser consists of a square foot (12 inch by 12 inch) board on which area ranchers can place their personal brand. Each brand costs \$50 and will be displayed at the 4-H food booth.

The memorial plaques are sheets of stainless steel metal with engraved names and faces of a former 4-H member or leader that someone wishes to honor. The cost of each plaque is \$300 and they will be displayed on a commemorative wall at the booth as well.


Richland County 4-H club leaders ask everyone to submit their information for the plaques and the brand boards as soon as possible so they can be ready to be displayed at this year's fair taking place July 31 – August 3.

Additional funds for the new fair booth will be raised by various fundraisers conducted by area 4-H clubs. For example the Forever Buds will be working the concessions at the Neal Hermanson Memorial Ranch Rodeo taking place June 22 in conjunction with Sidney's Town & Country Festival.

As a freshman Jalyssa Gorder came into her season jumping 10 feet. She didn't understand the significance of how rare this was until she got a taste of a little accomplishment finishing 2nd in the division and 4th at state. Watching her teammate Vanessa Bawden, someone who became a role model to her for years to come, win the title that year, she knew exactly where she wanted to be. She started setting goals for herself, knowing she wanted to continue being successful in this sport she found a strong love for. Jalyssa then went on to win her division the next year and finished 2nd in the state as a sophomore. Jalyssa describes that 2nd placing as something that she knew would drive her and motivate her for years to come. As a team Sidney took 3rd place that year.

Jalyssa began setting even more goals for herself knowing she now wanted to finish her high school career a two-time state champion. As a junior, she cleared a

personal best height of 11'6" winning both her division and state. She was a little more disappointed with her finish this year as a senior, not hitting that mark but winning again her division and state and becoming a two-time state champion vaulter. Sidney also earned a 2nd place finish as a team.

Jalyssa said that she struggled quite a bit with her events due to the weather and canceled meets this year, wishing they could have had a little more of a season. Due to this struggle, she had some breaking points through out her season but knew she had to look past those if she wanted to be successful at the end of her season. Jalyssa is now looking forward to what is to come. She signed with the University of Montana in February and is excited to vault at the college level. Jalyssa had it

narrowed down to University of Montana, University of North Dakota, and Montana State University. She never knew it was going to be such a challenge. "I was hoping to get some sort of a sign telling me where to go, but I never necessarily received that. It was one of the hardest decisions I ever had to make and I just have to believe I made the best decision for me," Jalyssa stated.

Jalyssa would like to thank her track and field team, especially both her relay teams who created a lot of great memories for her these last four years. She is excited to see the track team excel in the future. She wishes not only the track team good luck, but also the girl vaulters as they continue the Sidney vaulting tradition. As she will be competing in college she knows that she can't help but to follow them

closely. She would also like to thank her friends and family for their amazing support, especially her parents Shane and Lisa, and her grandparents Tod and Susan. It was a great asset to her to have a dad who is a coach himself. Jalyssa says "my dad didn't need to say much, he just knew exactly what I needed to hear as an athlete and always encouraged me right when I needed it most." Jalyssa also knows she wouldn't be anywhere if it wasn't for her incredible coaches. "I especially can't thank my vaulting coach Steve Yockim enough. How do you thank someone who has changed the course of your life? He gave me a future in vaulting. And to him and all the Sidney Track and Field coaches, I am proud to be one of your many state

champions," states Gorder.

Annual Dryland Field days set for June 20-21 at Froid, Sidney Research Farms

Two back-to-back dryland field days highlighting research being conducted at farmsites near Froid and Sidney are on tap for Thursday and Friday, June 20th and 21st.This year's lineup for the two annual tours includes several shared topics. so if you have to miss one event, you can still catch much of the information at the

Joint Field Day Talks:

Headlining both events are two workshop presentations, the first a sprayer calibration workshop for local producers and the second a brief recap of the March 5th "Pipeline Reclamation Workshop" held in Sidney this past winter. Richland and Roosevelt County Extensions Agents Tim Fine and Ann Ronning will conduct the calibration workshops, for which pesticide points are pending. ARS Plant Ecologist Erin Espeland will provide the recap of the pipeline reclamation workshop with a special emphasis on grazing and weed management.

Also speaking at both events are ARS scientists working with pest insect species. ARS Entomologist Dave Branson will give an update on this year's grasshopper outlook, while ARS

Insect Ecologist Tatyana Rand will discuss alfalfa weevil, which posed significant problems for several producers this past year.

Field Day Times, Locations:

The annual Froid Research Farm Field Day is set for Thursday, June 20th at the farmsite located 8 miles north of Culbertson on MT Highway 16. Registration is at 1:00 pm. All the day's speakers and topics are listed below. The tour concludes with a free steak dinner at 5:00 pm sponsored by the Sheridan and Roosevelt County Conversation Districts. Other event sponsors include the Sheridan and Roosevelt County Extension offices, and the USDA-ARS Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory (NPARL) in Sidnev. The fifth annual Sidney

"Dryland" Field Tour will be held Friday, June 21st, from 9 am to noon at ARS' Research Farm located about 4 miles north of Sidney along MT Highway 16. Old Man Afraid of His Horses chose his son's names by experiences he had during Hanbleceya (vision quest ceremony) at Grey Horn Butte (known as Devil's Tower).



She is a mom, a grandma, a professional, an entrepreneur and she runs.

It started with the 50/50/50 Club (50 marathons in 50 states before age 50). Two friends and Fairview natives, Staci Miller and Patience Lam Hurley were looking to achieve a fitness goal, do some traveling and have fun. That was three and half years ago...to date, they have successfully completed marathons in 14 states, spent a year on a roller derby team and participated in multiple obstacle course challenge runs. Staci has taken on the R3 endeavor twice (rim to rim to rim of the Grand Canyon). Patience launched the 100 pushups a day challenge and together they discovered through their adventures that they are in charge of "Running Life"!

On June 15th, Staci Miller will be conquering her first ultra marathon; a 50 mile trail run through the Bighorn Mountains in Wyoming. Patience, and Staci's dad Tom Miller, will be her on-site support crew.


thon. "Actually, when I registered, I was going to sign up for the 50k. But, my luck, I procrastinated and the 50k was full so I registered for the 50 mile event instead. What's another 20 miles, right?!"

The Bighorn Mountain Wild and Scenic Trail Run begins at 8800 feet on the Jaws Trailhead outside of Lovell, WY and continues for approximately 50 miles through panoramic views, seas of wildflowers, canyons and an abundance of wild life. The maximum elevation is 9357 feet with an overall gain of 4232 feet. There are a total of 12 aid stations along the trail, 6 of them manned with a required check-in and check-out system. The race must be completed within 15 hours and ends at Scott Park in Dayton, WY.

Staci's training schedule started the week of February 11th and consisted of an increasing number of miles ran each week with cross training 2-3 times a week. "The training has been challenging," stated Staci. "Until lately, the weather has made it difficult to run outside and the treadmill is extremely boring after the first hour." In addition to exercise,

Staci has followed a strict diet of high protein, fresh fruits and vegetables. "The support I have had from family and friends has been wonderful. Though, I'm pretty sure they think I'm a little off my rocker for attempting this run."

Since Staci has family residing in Arizona, South Dakota and Germany, she started a blog to share the process of her training. Staci stated, "There are three things I hope people find in my blog – 1. Each of us is capable of more than we think possible. 2. The only things in life you regret are risks not taken. 3. You are in charge of RUNNING your LIFE". Kochia Resistance to Popular Herbicides Moving Westward

Weed resistance to popular herbicides is a growing concern amongst those of us involved in producing crops for the world's growing population. I have not heard many crop growers in this region share resistance problems but kochia resistance to glyphosate (Roundup) and fluroxypr (Starane) is moving westward. Just a few years ago high levels of resistance were documented in southern Minnesota. Last year, there was widespread concern in eastern North Dakota that glyphosate was not killing

Last fall NDSU researchers collected around 80 seed samples of kochia from around the state. These were germinated and treated glyphosate or fluroxypr. Results from a non-replicated run indicated that 12 percent of samples had at least one plant that regrew after 3x glyphosate (Roundup PowerMax) and 25 percent of samples had a survivor produce new branches after 2x fluroxypr (Starane Ultra). The number of surviving plants ranged from 1 to all plants within these samples.

Kirk Howatt, Research Weed Scientist, and Rich Zollinger, Extension Weed Specialist, are leading the research at NDSU designed to find ways to reduce weed resistance to herbicides. Their first run of three greenhouse studies to characterize kochia response to fluroxypr has been completed. Observations indicate about 8xthe level of resistance to fluroxypr is present in five or six of the 80 samples. Two other samples with survivors are responding quite similarly to the susceptibility check and may not be statistically different once a second run is completed.

Weeds typically are easier to kill when plants are smaller but many have observed that very small, or "puffball", kochia are difficult to kill with any herbicide, including glyphosate. One greenhouse trial demonstrated that fluroxypr was most effective when applied to one to two inch tall kochia. Most kochia smaller than this survived and regrew, while larger kochia showed herbicide symptoms and also had less kill of plant foliage.

The research does show growers experiencing kochia resistance glyphosate and fluroxypr still have some herbicide opounce/acre or Gramoxone/ Paraquat with MSOadjuvant was very effective in treating kochia that was two to three inches tall. Only a few larger plants produced regrowth. Aim had good activity but again larger plants were not completely killed and regrew quickly. Application of fluroxypr with dicamba as in the premix Pulsar improved activity compared with fluroxypr alone. Plants were still green but with very little new shoot production.

Surprisingly, Atrazine at .38lb active ingredient per acre was variable in effectiveness as individual kochia plants were either completely dead or unaffected. Kochia has become resistant to Atrazine in other regions of the country but has not been documented in North Dakota. With low Atrazine rates used in North Dakota and use primarily in corn, it was thought that Atrazine resistance to kochia would be delayed for many years. Howatt and Zollinger encourage corn growers to watch for kochia escaping atrazine treatment and welcome notification.

HPPD herbicides used in corn (Callisto, Impact, and Landis) may not kill kochia if used alone and is the reason NDSU recommends adding atrazine to these and most other POST applied herbicides used in corn.

Howatt and Zollinger promise to continue their work in combating kochia. They feel that combinations of effective active ingredients (herbicides) will be necessary to control kochia, especially at locations where herbicide resistance has occurred and where kochia is taller than desired at appli-
