## **Intense Efforts Underway To Deter Impaired Driving, Drive Sober Or Face Serious Consequences**

The holiday season means celebrations with family and friends. It also means intense efforts by law enforcement to encourage sober driving and get impaired drivers behind bars. Law enforcement agencies throughout the state will increase patrols during the holiday period from Dec. 16 through Jan.1. County sheriffs, city police and the Montana Highway Patrol are urging motorists to drive sober and ask their friends and family to drive sober, too.

'Montana's new traffic safety goal "Toward Zero Deaths' leaves no room for impaired driving," said Mike Tooley, Montana Department of Transportation Director. "Strong enforcement of Montana's impaired driving laws is an important part of achieving this goal and saving lives."

A change in Montana's DUI laws this year provides added reason for drinkers to think twice before getting behind the wheel. The new law allows judges to look back ten years to add penalties for a second DUI. The previous look-back period ended at five years.

"The law is designed to crack down on multiple DUI offenders," said Attorney General Tim Fox. "Occasional drinkers could also face potentially stiffer penalties based on their record."

Both Director Tooley and Attorney General Fox encourage everyone to have transportation arranged before the celebrations begin. Designate a sober driver, arrange for a sober friend for transport to and from the event, or even stay the night at the party location. If you choose to walk keep in mind potential extreme weather and make sure you have a safe route that avoids traffic.

Citizens can also play a part in keeping dangerous drivers off the road by calling 9-1-1 immediately. Law enforcement patrols follow up on these tips.

Funding for overtime law enforcement is provided by the Montana Department of Transportation as part of an overall goal to reduce motor vehicle deaths and injuries. Find out more about planning for a safe ride home and the penalties for DUI at www.plan2live.mt.gov.

hurt anyone's feelings. He is a great example to others. He's always smiling. Recognition of this award is well deserved and Sidney middle school is lucky to have you.




**Zach Sommerfeld**







## Fish House Regulations Winter anglers are reminded that any fish house left

unoccupied on North Dakota waters must be made out of materials that will allow it to float.

A popular question this time of the year is if campers qualify as legal fish houses. The answer is the same for any structure taken on the ice - if it's left unattended, it must be able to float; if it's not able to float, it must be removed when the angler leaves the ice

Other fish house regulations include:

Fish houses do not require a license.

Occupied structures do not require identification. However, any unoccupied fish house must have the owner's name, and either address or telephone number, displayed on its outside in readily distinguishable characters at least three inches high.

Fish houses may not be placed closer than 50 feet in any direction to another house without consent of the occupant of the other fish house.

Fish houses shall be removed from all waters by midnight, March 15, of each year. They can be used after March 15 if they are removed daily.

Anglers should refer to the 2012-14 North Dakota Fishing Guide for winter fishing regulations.

## Wheat Show to Feature "Best of the Best"

The 2014 National Hard Spring Wheat Show has taken on a different look with the incorporation of NDSU's Best of the Best in addition to several other keynote speakers and the ever-popular Bread Fair for

area 5<sup>th</sup> grade students.

The Best of the Best will offer some of the leading issues facing today's wheat growers. For example Dr. Fabian Menalled, Extension Crop Weed Specialist of Montana State University, will share the latest informa-

tion on herbicide resistant Kochia and other weeds, status and strategies for control. Another best topic "Latest of Fungicide and Diseases in Wheat" will be discussed by Andrew Friskop, NDSU Plant Pathologist. Shana Pederson, Area Extension Specialist and Joel Ranson, NDSU Extension Agronomist will close out the morning meeting with "Wheat After Corn, What Do I Need to Know?" and "Key to Better Durum Yields, What Did We Learn in 2013?"

Following the noon lunch sponsored by the Williams County Farmers Union, several speakers will give four hands-on demonstrations on a rotational basis. These demonstrations will include in-field sensors, factors impacting emergence and early seedling growth, soil salinity and nitrogen additions.

The demonstrations will be followed by Frayne Olson who will present his market outlook for 2014. Frayne is the NDSU Crop Marketing Economist. A panel of growers and industry leaders will share their views regarding trends and preferences of the barley industry. Other topics for the afternoon include successfully adding soybeans as a rotational crop with wheat by Greg Endres, NDSU Area Extension Agronomist; and "Can Cadmium Levels in Durum be Managed" by Joyce Eckhoff who is a research agronomist at the Eastern Montana Agriculture Research Center of Sidney, Montana.

Also on the afternoon agenda are reports of the U.S. Durum Growers Association and Dustin Johnsrud, Area Director of the North Dakota Wheat Commission.

After an evening supper, participants will hear Michael Baron, well known estate planning consultant and CEO of Great Plains Diversified Services. Michael will discuss "The Weight of Wealth: Is It Really Worth It?" He believes many people involved in agriculture and with oil revenues suddenly find increased valuation of their assets overwhelming. This situation causes confusion which often produces a confused person who fails to do anything, including planning. Michael intends to provide ideas for good planning that will provide stability for generations to come and remove the weight of wealth from the consciousness or sub-consciousness of those involved.

Michel will start the next day showing how LLPs and LLCs are tools which can be used. He will give a summary of when, where, why LLPs and LLCs are used to see if this is of any benefit to you.

Another keynote speaker for the Wheat Show is Elizabeth Hagen. She has wonderful presentations to help people to become more focused, get more done in less time, have more momentum, confidence and success. Elizabeth started a professional organizing speaking

business in February 2000 in South Dakota. She is a certified professional organizer, and a past National Board Director for the National Association of Professional Organizers. Besides authoring several books she was the recipient of the 2010 Los Angeles Organizing Awards Best Organizer as Coach or Mentor Award.

A special treat for those attending the Recognition Luncheon will be Steve Stark, a well known performer and Illustrator. He will present an illustrated history of North Dakota Agriculture.

Completing the day will be John Nowatzki, NDSU Ag. Machine Specialist, who will talk about the use of "Remote Sensing Drones and Sensors- Will They Be Useful in Agriculture?" He will be followed by several industry representatives showing new technologies useful in crop production systems.

Also included in the Wheat Show is the popular Photo Contest that includes divisions for the novice and advanced photographer. The event will also feature a number of commercial exhibits along with the very popular Bread Fair which has given thousands of fifth grade students the opportunity to learn how to make bread and learn where their food comes from.

The three day event will take place in the Grand Williston Hotel. More information can be obtained from the NDSU Extension Service-Williams County by calling 701-577-4595.












## Land Use Regulations Series — Did you Know

RV/mobile home parks, work camps to be reviewed by local cities and counties.

People from all over the United States are coming to the Bakken region looking for work and a place to live. Many who travel here bring their campers to live in while they seek employment and look for a place to call home. Oil companies and other businesses are also trying to secure temporary housing for their employees.

A few years ago Richland County did not have many recreational vehicles (RVs) in the area; there was only the seasonal traveler.

Due to the overwhelming number of RVs coming into the area, many community members provided a space for those looking for a place to park their unit. By doing this some people within the community have unknowingly violated Montana State Law and our local regulations.

Currently, according to the County's Subdivision Regulations (section VII), when a parcel is used for an RV/mobile home park or work camp it is to be reviewed as a subdivision. When creating a park or camp the land remains under single ownership, while the spaces are rented.

The Board of Richland County Commission has adopted Temporary Workforce Housing Zoning Regulations that require minimum health and safety standards for man camps, crew camps, work camps, or crew housing facilities. Workforce housing facilities may include the use of skid units, travel trailers, recreational vehicles, campers, mobile homes, park models, modular homes or any combination of these. When approved and issued a Temporary Workforce Housing Conditional Use Permit is valid for up to five (5) years. At least 30 days prior to the expiration date the applicant may apply for renewal of the permit. According to both regulations, plans must be submitted prior to creating, renting, or leasing out any spaces.

If you have a space or spaces that you would like to rent out (or have already rent-

ed out) the law may require review through our subdivision or temporary workforce housing regulations. Please contact the Office of Richland County Planner with any questions at 123 W Main ST, Sidney, MT 59270 or call (406) 433-6886

The Richland County Attorney's office has hired a Compliance Officer, Terry Murphy, to ensure RV/mobile home-park and work camp operators are in compliance with Montana State Statutes and local regulations. Mr. Murphy is working with landowners to help them gain compliance. Please contact the County Planner Office with any questions how to stay in compliance with these regulations.

## **DEQ** Issues "No Further Action" Letter on **Cowry Pipeline**

The Montana Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) issued a "no further action" letter on December 2. 2013, following successful cleanup of a release of crude oil from an abandoned Cowry pipeline north of Sidney, Mont.

In August 2012, Cowry Enterprises reported a release of approximately 10 barrels of crude oil from an inactive pipeline that was being tested. The oil surfaced in a barrow ditch, then traveled 75 feet downhill to the Lower Yellowstone irrigation ditch. The irrigation ditch was closed at the time but did contain water. Cowry and their consultants responded to the release by cleaning up oil with vacuum trucks, absorbent materials, steam cleaning and excavation of contaminated soil.

"Cowry was very responsive in cleaning up the spill," says Laura Alvey, DEQ project officer. "They were very good about doing everything that needed to be done to ensure it was cleaned up to DEQ

DEQ and Richland County officials inspected the site and oversaw confirmation sampling of surface water and sediments from the ditch and from soils. Sampling either did not detect crude oil in the water and soil, or the concentrations were well below any applicable screening level or standard that indicates the site was successfully cleaned up.

Cowry Enterprises remains responsible for reclaiming any property that may have been damaged by the cleanup work.

## **DEQ Launches Hazardous Materials Notification Program**

Responders to emergencies involving hazardous materials will now be able to use a web-based data center to access instant information about facilities where hazardous chemicals are used or stored.

"Minutes matter in any emergency so having this information available at or even before an incident can save the lives of our professional and volunteer emergency responders", said Tracy Stone-Manning, Director of the Department of Environmental Quality. "E-Plan will also enhance the safety of company employees and citizens near these facilities".

The DEQ decided this year to begin using E-Plan for EP-CRA (Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act) chemical storage reporting. E-Plan was developed and funded by EPA and Homeland Security at the University of Texas at Dallas. E-Plan is used by state agencies, local governments, and fire departments for emergency response at hazardous chemical facilities. The system is used for incident pre-planning, management of hazardous chemical site information and risk and vulnerability analysis.

E-Plan collects and makes available hazardous materials reports, called Tier II reports, filed by chemical plants, refineries, pipelines and hazardous material storage facilities easily avail-

able 24 hours a day. Montana and the EPA worked with E-Plan administrators to enter all facility data from 2012 annual reports so the data is up to date for 2013 annual reports. Almost 1,200 Montana facilities are entered into the system and are ready to be accessed by emergency responders.

"E-Plan is a step in the right direction", said Patrick Lonergan, Gallatin County Emergency Manager, "The result will be a much more efficient process for both government and the companies filing reports."

E-Plan also makes it easier for industry to file their required reports. Before E-Plan, companies were required to submit reports to individual states. The information was submitted by hard copy, email or faxes and then stored. Now companies can simply enter or upload their reports to E-Plan.

In addition to Tier II data, E-Plan makes available other important information instantly, such as: Maps of the area surrounding a fixed facility showing schools, hospitals, other Tier II reporting facilities, etc., Facility Emergency Response Plans, Facility diagrams and building floor plans, and Material Safety Data Sheets.

## MSU Extension Has New Publications Addressing Weeds

Montana State University Extension has released two new publications, one to identify weed seedlings and one to answer frequently asked questions about herbicides and noxious weeds to help Montana's farmers and ranchers keep weeds in check.

The first publication, "Weed Seedling Identification Guide for Montana and the Northern Great Plains," includes descriptions of seedling shape, leaf arrangement, attachment and surface, as well as identification tips and a picture of the mature plant.

"Many weed identification tools focus on conspicuous traits of mature plants, but this guide is unique in that it covers key features of seedlings and juvenile plants, which are often very difficult to identify," said Jane Mangold, MSU Extension noxious weed specialist.

The 160-page, spiral-bound, color guide features 73 species, including 60 broadleaf and 13 grass species. The introduction includes basic tenets of weed management and terminology with graphics.

"This is a powerful tool for rapid and accurate identification of weeds, enabling farmers and ranchers to make weed management decisions when the weeds are most vulnerable," said Fabian Menalled, MSU Extension crop weed specialist. "Weed seedling identification is essential to a successful weed management program."

The Montana Department of Agriculture's Noxious Weed Trust Fund, Montana Wheat and Barley Commission, MSU Extension Integrated Pest Management and the Western Integrated Pest Management Center have collaborated to provide the first 2,500 print copies at no charge. There is a limit of five free copies per customer. To order a hard copy, or access an electronic version of the guide, contact Montana State Univer-


The second publication, "Herbicides and Noxious Weeds: Answers to Frequently Asked Questions," is a 10-page, color brochure that presents an overview of commonly asked questions focused around the use of herbicides to control noxious weeds on non-crop sites, such as rangelands and pastures, forests and roadway rights-of-way. The free bulletin is produced by the Montana Noxious Weed Education program, with funding by the Montana Department of Transportation, USDI-Montana/Dakotas Bureau of Land Management and USDA-Forest Service Region 1.

## Mayor Smelser Urges

Sidney Mayor Bret Smelser has sat on the Oil and Gas Commission for seven years. In those 7 years, he has done impact talks half a dozen times. As soon as there is word that there might be a new play, people assume it's going to be a major play and then you start to hear "not in my backyard".

Smelser would like some common sense put back into the process. At last week's Oil & Gas

Commission meeting, he had the opportunity to try to put some common sense into a protest concerning an exploratory well near Belfry, Mont. He

If we drill in one area. we should be able to drill in another area. Common sense says we have the oil here in Richland County and we give the state over half the revenue.

Minerals are owned by someone who has the right to extract them. Common sense says, if other locations don't want oil production, those districts should be written out of receiving oil and gas funds from the state.

Common sense says the distribution should be fair, and it is currently not fair for cities and towns.

"Hydraulic fracturing


wrecking the environment is an old argument," Smelser said. "Water and land are valuable to all parts of the state. I'm tired of hearing 'not in my backyard'. Take the oil revenue stream out then."

He continued, "The well near Belfry is an exploratory well. The protest was an overreaction. If it leads to a commercial well, the infrastructure is already in place in Billings. It is an insult and an injustice to those of us who are producing the oil and gas. There needs to be a fair playing field and a way to say that if you don't like oil and gas, don't take our money. At the end of the day, people need to think about the distribution of funds. Those oil and gas revenues have been propping up schools throughout the state of Montana. If a community doesn't want drilling, it is not fair for them to receive funds from those of us who are dealing with the impacts."

Smelser is confident that eventually, the legislature will provide relief for the cities and towns which are dealing with the oil impacts. "At some point, the governor needs to sign a bill. Whether we get federal mineral royalties or a portion of the tax revenue, the longer we wait, the further behind we get."

Although Smelser's term as Mayor of Sidney will end December 31, he will continue to serve on the Oil & Gas Commission for at least another year and will continue to try to bring some common sense into the discussion.

"We've had a lot of success matching deer hunters with landowners," said NDGF Director Terry Steinwand. "We hope the Coyote Catalog works out just as well."

NDDA officials estimate livestock producers in North Dakota lost more than \$1 million last year to coyotes. At the same time, coyotes are a popular furbearer species for hunters and trappers.

"I encourage landowners, especially farmers and ranchers who have problems with coyote depredation, to sign up for the Coyote Catalog," said Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring. "Hunting and trapping are valuable tools in managing these predators."

Goehring and Steinwand said the U.S. Department of Agriculture Wildlife Services should be the first contact for landowners experiencing coyote depredation of livestock.

Landowners can sign up on the NDDA website at www. nd.gov/ndda/coyote-catalog. Required information includes county and contact information.

Hunters and trappers can sign up at the NDGF website at www.gf.nd.gov.

Periodically throughout the winter, hunters or trappers will receive information on participating landowners, and they can then contact landowners to make arrangements.

Although the Coyote Catalog does not guarantee a good match for every participating landowner or hunter, Goehring and Steinwand said it has great potential to focus hunting or trapping pressure in areas where farmers and ranchers are experiencing coyote depredation problems.

Anyone who registered for the Coyote Catalog in the past must register again to activate their names on the database.

The Coyote Catalog will remain active through March 31, and then start up again next winter.





## **Small Conversations** Can Make A Big Impact

Holidays – we are busier than ever before, and planning ahead for the approaching holiday festivities adds additional stress that impacts our routine and rhythm of daily life. It's not exactly a convenient time for having a serious conversation with your teen about topics such as underage drinking. Some parents might think that battling underage drinking is a futile effort, but studies show that parents who adopt a zero tolerance for underage drinking were the top reason that teens don't drink.

Holiday parties often increase the opportunity to use alcohol and other drugs. Opportunities for underage drinking rise dramatically when students are not in school or structured activities. Underage drinking is a leading contributor to death from injuries, which are the main cause of death for people under age 21. The month of December is National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention month.

To help keep your kids safe and prevent alcohol and drug-related tragedies, here's some advice for parents:

Talk to your teen ahead

of time and prior to any holiday parties, and be clear in your expectations that they are prohibited from drinking and using illegal substances.

Recognize and anticipate that well meaning adults may attempt to "bend the rules" as a treat or gesture of affection. Have ample amounts of non-alcoholic drinks and foods, and dispose of all unfinished beverages so kids are not drinking the leftovers.

Be a model for conscientious behavior. Have a plan for those who drink too much and make sure your guests do not drink and drive.

If your child is going to a party at a friend's house, phone ahead and make sure there will not be any alcohol beverages available.

Short, frequent discussions can have a real impact on your child's decisions about alcohol. Lots of little talks are more effective than one "big talk."

Sitting down for the "big talk" about alcohol can be intimidating for both you and your child. Try using everyday

opportunities to talk- in the car, during dinner, running errands and even holiday shopping, or while you and your child are watching TV. Having lots of little talks takes the pressure off trying to get all of the information out in one lengthy discussion, and vour child will be less likely to tune you out.

Remember that the conversation goes both ways. Although talking to your child about your thoughts about alcohol is essential, it's also important to hear their point of view. Give your child the opportunity to ask you questions, and listen to what they have to say. Children who have parents who listen to their feelings and concerns are more likely to say "no" to
