"Was a Farmer, had a 'HOG,' and BINGO was his Name O!"

Actually Sidney Gymnastics Center (SGC) will have 20 hogs, or one should say 20 hams PLUS door prizes, drinks, popcorn, and baked goods at its "Ham Bingo Night" gymnastics center addition fundraiser scheduled April 8, 2 p.m. at the Central School gym in Sidney.

SGC is a parent run 501 3c organization in Sidney, MT, dedicated since 1989 to providing Richland County and the surrounding areas with an opportunity to experience a high quality gymnastics experience. Beginning with its "Tumble Toddler" program for age walking to age 3, continuing with a 3 to age pre-kindergarten "Tumble Bugs" class, "Tumble Bugs BIG" for kindergartners, beginning-intermediate-advanced classes for elementary through high school age, and an award winning competitive team; SGC continually strives to provide gymnastics movement education at a very affordable price.

SGC is bursting at the seams with gymnastics students these days, and is looking to double its current facility size from 5,000 to 10,000 square feet with a 100 x 50 foot addition, costing \$650,000. Coach Pat McWilliams talks about the enrollment history at SGC and the current need for the addition:

"In the 90s and through the middle 2000s, the gym had an enrollment of 150 to 160 students. In the late 2000s and into the early tens, the enrollment had slipped down to 60 to 80 students. When my wife Jan and I started teaching at SGC in 2011, only about 60 kids were taking classes. Over the last several years we have seen significant increase. SGC began hitting the 200s in enrollment with the school year 2014, and had over 300 students taking classes the 2015-1016 school year. We've had about 230 come through the program so far the 2016-2017 school year."

With this growth has come crowding. With only 3700 of SGC's 5000 square foot facility available for actual gymnastics equipment, things can get pretty tight, with some classes having over 40 students in them. Building an addition would have a number of advantages for SGC students and parents.

One of the greatest advantages would be the ability to open up more classes, and have classes available with a later start time to benefit those families with two working parents. Another advantage would be the opportunity to run several different types of classes simultaneously; for example a pre-school class, and elementary age class, and a team workout all operating at the same time.

Other advantages include the addition of locker rooms, an improved parent viewing area, and an area dedicated solely to pre-school gymnastics classes.

An additional significant advantage of the addition would be the ability to add new equipment such as a "foam pit." A gymnastics "pit" is a large 6' deep hole with a trampoline bed 3' down, filled to the top with foam cubes. A pit would open up a lot of fun activities for all classes, pre-school through elementary, as well as provide the competitive team with the ability to train more difficult skills. If one visits a "Trampoline Gym" such as can be found in Minot and Billings, one will see foam pits in use by all age children.

SGC would like to invite all Richland County (and beyond!) to come to our Ham Bingo Night on April 8, 2 p.m. at the Central School Gym. Be prepared to enjoy a festive night of Bingo, door prizes, refreshments and all around good clean fun while helping SGC move closer to its goal of a 5000 square foot addition to its current facility.



Bees, Beekeeping Focus of ARS **BrownBagger Friday**

Bees in your backyard and bees as a business are the focus of the next BrownBagger presentation at the USDA-ARS Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory in Sidney this coming Friday, April 7. Ring in spring with this timely talk by Beth Eiring of the Montana Department of Agriculture.

Eiring's presentation is entitled "Beekeeping From a Regulatory Perspective," and will include a look at beekeeping in Montana (numbers, sites, and the various types of beekeeping), the regulations and what they look like when applied on the ground. She will also discuss what she has found in the state as a regulatory official, as well as providing a bit of general beekeeping advice. Her talk will be held Friday from Noon to 1 pm at the Sidney ARS lab, 1500 N. Central Avenue.

Eiring works in the Nursery and Apiary Programs for the state of Montana Department of Agriculture. Beekeeping is big business in Montana, which typically ranks in the top five states in the U.S. for honey production. The Montana Department of Agriculture registers all non-hobbyist apiary sites in the state. Registration for hobbyists is voluntary.

Eiring has been with the state for the last 9 years but has been happily working in the green industry with plants for 20 years! She currently resides in Helena and loves any and all outdoor activities such as rafting, backpacking, gardening, skiing, and, of course, beekeeping.







MSU To Host Annual Agricultural Research Center Field Days Across Montana

The public is invited to attend free annual field days across Montana to tour and learn about the people, places and projects involved with agricultural research at Montana State University's College of Agriculture and Montana Agricultural Experiment Station or MAES. Five research stations across the state and a local Bozeman campus farm will each host a field day this summer.

"Statewide field days are a longstanding tradition where we invite the public to tour our facilities, meet our faculty and staff and learn about trends and progress in agriculture research that hopefully makes a difference in their lives," said Barry Jacobsen, associate director of MAES. "What's most important about field days is that they serve as an opportunity for statewide producers, farmers, ranchers and agribusiness to share successes and challenges face-to-face with faculty scientists and learn about what the university is doing in response to those challenges and needs. It's a chance for faculty and stakeholders to engage as an agricultural community and for the university to get feedback on what we need to be focusing on.'

Field days include facility tours, explanations of research projects and results and

a chance for citizens, producers, legislators and agribusiness representatives to speak with MSU scientists and Extension agents.

State Health Officials Offer Zika Prevention Tips For Travelers

This time of year, many Montanans will be traveling to and returning from Mexico, the Caribbean, and Central or South America after enjoying some fun in the sun.

State and local public health officials are reminding Montanans these are also areas where mosquitos that carry Zika virus are active.

Officials are reminding travelers to these areas to protect themselves from Zika virus and to take the necessary steps upon their return.

Risk of Zika infection, transmitted primarily by mosquitos and sometimes through sexual contact, can be minimized by following simple precautions when traveling to an affected area. Fortunately, Montana's mosquitoes are not capable of spreading the Zika virus.

"Savvy travelers know that preparation is essential for a great trip, and today that involves bringing mosquito repellent, dressing to prevent bites and using condoms if you are planning to have sex," said Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) epidemiologist Christine Mulgrew.

Most people who get infected by Zika virus will not get sick. Although rare, severe com-

plications have been linked to Zika virus infection. Of primary concern are the cluster of birth defects that occurs in about 4% of babies whose mothers had a Zika infection during their pregnancy. Pregnant women and women wanting to become pregnant are advised to avoid traveling to regions where Zika infected mosquitos are common.

Public health officials state that pregnant women who traveled to an area with Zika are recommended to have a Zika test performed upon return, even if no symptoms occurred. Just like any medical test, the Zika test needs to be ordered by a healthcare provider. Testing at the Montana Public Health Department Laboratory is available at a minimal cost for all pregnant women who may be at risk of Zika. To date, no Montana pregnant woman has had a positive

of Zika in the Americas, over 200 Montanans returning from trips have sought testing for Zika. Of these, 10 Montana residents were diagnosed with a Zika infection after visiting a country where Zika infected mosquitos are common. They were diagnosed by their health care provider after developing

Since the identification

symptoms of Zika infection that included rash, fever, arthralgia and red eves.

"If you have these symptoms during or after your trip, see your healthcare provider to get a Zika test," Mulgrew said.

Although not common, Zika virus infection can be transmitted to sexual partners. If you have traveled to an area with Zika, use condoms for at least 8 weeks (women) or 6 months (men) after travel to protect your sex partners from Zika. If you have traveled to an area with Zika and have a pregnant partner, use condoms correctly every time you have sex, or do not have sex for the entire pregnancy.

The primary way to prevent Zika infection while vacationing is to use an EPA registered insect repellent to prevent mosquito bites. Zika virus is carried by certain species of Aedes mosauitos. These mosauitoes tend to thrive in warmer and wetter climates than in Montana. They are aggressive, bite in the day and night, and can live indoors as well as outdoors.

viding them with skills such as individual and leadership development, personal growth, career preparation, and application of learning through the activities they participate in.



A letter with multiple signatures will be

What are valid protest grounds? The protest may be based on the applicant's qualifications listed in 16-4-401. MCA. or the grounds for denial of an application in 16-4-405, MCA. Examples of valid protest grounds include: (1) the applicant is unlikely to operate the establishment in compliance with the law; (2) the proposed location cannot be properly policed by local authorities; and (3) the welfare of the people in the vicinity of the proposed location will be adversely and seriously affected.

How are protests submitted? Protests must be postmarked to the Department of Revenue, Office of Dispute Resolution, P.O. Box 5805, Helena, Montana 59604-5805 on or before May 8, 2017.

Depending on the number of protests and the protest grounds, a public hearing will be held in Helena or Bainville. All valid protestors will be notified of the hearing's time, date and location. Hearings typically are scheduled within 90 days. A protester's hearing testimony is limited to the grounds in the protester's letter. Following the hearing, the Department of Revenue will notify the public whether the license transfer is approved or denied.


