

Builders' Association Panel: "Construction Market Cooling from Insane to Merely Crazy"

Close to 80 leaders from the Williston Area Construction and Real Estate Industry gathered on February February 19 to share their outlooks on the construction, housing and development markets for 2015 in the wake of the recent drop in oil prices. Mike Dolbec of Windsong Construction, John Sessions of Bakken Housing Company, Bob Horab of McCody Concrete Products, and Scott Meske, President of the Williston Area Chamber of Commerce participated in an open forum, moderated by Jim Rasche of Spec Ops Construction Services. The panel discussion was the featured presentation at the February General Membership Meeting of the Williston Area Builders' Association.

The combined value of the investments in the Williston area represented by the panelists is well in excess of several hundred million dollars as they laid bare their visions for the upcoming 12

Dolbec reported that the price of housing was holding steady in the face of various oil company slowdowns and that demand for new product has not abated. Sessions echoed that viewpoint but pointed out that even though rental rates are holding in response to demand, it may become necessary to include additional amenities in his projects as well as flexible lease terms. Both developers applauded the recent increase in FHA loan limits specific to western North Dakota in response to the strong demand for affordable housing. Norm McCloud, assistant to Sen. Heidi Heitkamp, also participated and explained the Heitkamp/Murkowski proposals in Washington, DC to raise the FHA loan limits as well as their support for urging oil exports to Mexico....both in the best interests of the Bakken Region.

Meske had an unusual description for the activity in the Bakken as slowing from "Insane" to merely "Crazy". The panelists all shared the view that the market slowdown was somewhat welcomed in that it gives the area economy a chance to "catch its breath" and reload for even greater opportunities in a more structured and organized environment. Horab explained that, as a life-long resident of the area, he has seen previous booms and busts. However, the difference for him this time is that the oil extraction infrastructure in place combined with the proven reserves in the ground, make it imminent for the oil industry to continue future development. He also reiterated that a "weed and feed" thinning out of the construction "non-performers" would be welcomed.

Bakken crude oil onboard train derailment in West Virginia

Second incident within days

MOUNT CARBON, WV: A train carrying more than 3 million gallons of crude oil from North Dakota's Bakken shale derailed in a snowstorm in an unincorporated area near Mount Carbon, West Virginia on Tuesday, February 17, 2015, shooting flames into the sky and evacuating hundreds of nearby residents from their homes.

At this time, it is unsure how many gallons out of the 3 million gallons of crude oil onboard spilled into a Kanawha River tributary. According to the train company, CSX, one homeowner was treated for smoke inhalation, but no other injuries were reported.

TIMMINS, ONT: Shortly before midnight on the Saturday prior to the Mount Carbon, WV derailment, another train carrying Bakken crude derailed in a remote area of Timmins, Ontario. In an emailed statement, Canadian National Railway (CN) spokesman Patrick Waldron, said "Seventy-one cars of the 100-car train have been safely moved away from the derailment site. Early site assessments indicate that at total of 29 cars are involved in the incident." He added "That same assessment indicates that seven cars of those 29 are involved in the fire." The cause of the incident wasn't yet known and is under investigation.

Critics on both sides of the Keystone XL Pipeline controversy voice their opinions of rail vs pipeline:

According to Department of Transportation records reviewed by The Associated Press, reports of oil leaking from railroad tank cars have increased from 12 in 2008 to 186 last year and trains hauling Bakken-region oil have been involved in major accidents in Virginia, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Alabama and Lac-Megantic,

Quebec, where 47 people were killed by an explosive derailment

in 2013. Daniel Kish, an Institute for Energy Research vice president, said in an interview that "trains remain a safe way to move oil" and that "the U.S. rail industry has met the demands of the recent domestic-energy boom," but he feels underground pipelines are a safer method of transport.

Kish states, "Any time you make more trips - whether its trains, trucks or buses - accidents increase... I'm not trying to scare people, but the records show that if you move more stuff there will be more problems." He adds, "But I have to say to myself: 'The fewer the number, the safer the transportation, which leads me to the pipeline being built."

Bob Deans, with the Natural Resources Defense Council, states "We've had 6,000 pipeline blowouts or leaks over the past

two decades." An article published on February 11, 2015 on www. thehill.com states "The House voted to approve legislation authorizing construction of the Keystone XL oil sands pipeline, setting up the first major veto of Obama's presidency. The White House has repeatedly said President Obama will veto the legislation, and Republicans do not appear to have the two-thirds majority in either chamber to override him. The only mystery left is when and how Obama will announce the veto."

Meanwhile, TransCanada Chief Executive Officer, Russ Girling, told reporters in Toronto in early February that the company is tired of waiting for a resolution of the Keystone XL delays. Their Canadian competitors, Kinder Morgan and Enbridge have begun building rail capacity.

Critics say the oil will move one way or another, but which transportation method will be used remains uncertain.

51.9 lb, RJ Engstrom, 4th place; Tribal College Debate To Expand Following Grant Renewal

BILLINGS - With the recent renewal of the Tribal College Debate Grant, RMC's debate team anticipates providing more opportunities for debating during the Spring 2015 semester.

"The Tribal College debate program hopes to expand to more colleges," said RMC's Associate Professor of Communication Studies Shelby Jo Long-Hammond. "We are currently in discussion with two other tribal colleges in eastern Montana for workshop sessions during this semester."

The RMC debate team has already been hard at work, spending the first week in February at Little Big Horn College for workshops and mini-debate sessions. Throughout the week, RMC debate team members conducted argumentation exercises with students from Professor Luella Brien's class at Little Big Horn College. Brien is the Professor of Communication Arts at Little Big Horn College.

During the workshops and mini-debates, RMC's debate team had the chance to engage with the students at Little Big Horn College about issues that were controversial on the reservation. They also explored some feasible and practical solutions.

The program is part of the Tribal College Debate Grant, which was awarded to Long-Hammond in April 2013. Long-Hammond received the \$34,000 grant to launch a pilot debate program, which began on tribal campuses, including Little Big Horn College, Chief Dull Knife College, and other tribal colleges. The grant was renewed in 2014 for another year and a half.

"Cultural engagement is really powerful," said Long-Hammond. Her hope is for this program to provide debate education and professional speaking at these tribal colleges, as they have a stake in many important social, political, and environmental issues. There are a number of political debates currently affecting Native American reservations in Montana, including coal and coalbed-methane mining, subsidies for agriculture, and many other environmental policies.

Long-Hammond believes that a debate network in these tribal schools will help provide an opportunity for college students to develop essential critical thinking and professional communication skills necessary for discussion of the political debates that confront these particular areas of Montana. "There is an importance to being able to discuss multiple political and environmental issues on the reservation, but many of the skills we practice are career preparation," said Long-Hammond.

Long-Hammond described how the Tribal College debate program has focused on the fundamentals of debate, including basic argumentation, critical thinking, and public speaking. "By taking out the structure of debate and making it more curricular, it is less intimidating," said Long-Hammond.


The workshops conducted at the tribal colleges focus on the importance of debate and argumentation education, with critical thinking exercises. They discuss the elements of a basic

argument and practice argument construction with different resolutions. During the week, the students work on refutation, fallacies, and engagement of arguments. Following the basic understanding of argument structure, students engage some of their ideas and arguments in a mini-debate.

"A new project we are working on for this semester is a debate tournament with Chief Dullknife College, Little Big Horn College, and RMC," said Long-Hammond. "With the tremendous support we have had from Luella Brien and Kate Bertin at each of these colleges, we feel that there is an established infrastructure to conduct a debate between our colleges. We anticipate a debate tournament toward the end of the semester."

The Tribal College Debate Grant was awarded by Open Society Institute through International Debate Education Association (IDEA), an organization that has been in existence for over 20 years and works with young people from all over the world. Long-Hammond is part of IDEA and has taught at camps in Bosnia, Slovenia, and Mexico. just to name a few.

Pesticide Certification Trainings Scheduled

By Warren Froliech

Every three years both private (farm operators) and commercial applicators must be re-certified to legally purchase and apply herbicides, insecticides, fungicides and fumigants. For private applicators the certification applies only to those pesticides that are classified as "restricted use". For commercial applicators certification is a "must" for all pesticides.

To assist in the certification process we have scheduled a training meeting for private applicators on Wednesday, March 18, 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. in conjunction with the KUMV TV Farm and Ranch Trade Show held at the Raymond Family Community Center. This training does not include fumigation which is different from the training for the application of herbicides, insecticides and fungicides.

That same day, March 18, a separate training for commercial and private applicators of fumigation materials will be held in the conference room of the Broadway Commons Building, 302 East Broadway, Williston, starting at 9:30 a.m. and ending around 2:30 p.m. Because the trainings on March 18 conflict for some

private applicators, another fumigation training is scheduled on Tuesday, March 24, 10 a.m. – 3 p.m., also in the Broadway Commons.

Commercial applicators of herbicides, insecticides and fungicides can be certified or recertified on Thursday, March 12, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. at the Ernie French Center located on the campus of the NDSU Research Extension Center located west of Williston approximately one mile west of the highways 2 and 85 junction.

Sometimes there is confusion between fungicides and fumigants. In brief, fungicides are used in the farm community to control diseases of plants whereas fumigants are commonly used to control insects in stored grain.

she will rapidly lose weight resulting in reduced performance of her calf and likely will negatively impact her fertility and ability to conceive in time to keep her on a 365 day schedule.

Because of the rapid fetal growth at this time, the daily nutrient allowance should increase 15 to 20 percent. Simply changing the components of the cow's ration from low quality roughages to higher quality feeds will often provide adequate upgrading of the cow's ration for the last trimester of pregnancy.

Protein and phosphorus needs increase 50 to 100 percent from mid-pregnancy to lactation. Daily calcium needs increase even more sharply, especially for high milk producing cows.

Feeding some grain to cows is a practical means of increasing both energy and protein intake. Roughly each pound of grain is equivalent to 2 to 2.5 pounds of good hay.

Undernourishment of cows during gestation often results in little change in calving success but usually results in longer postpartum rebreeding intervals and greater percentages of open cows the next year.
