MDT Will Hold Final Public Meeting to Discuss Culbertson Corridor Planning Study

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) is holding the final informational meeting on the Culbertson Corridor Planning Study on Thursday, Au-

sess improvement options for the rectangular area around the town of Culbertson, which includes a 4-mile segment of U.S. 2 (between reference post 642.8 and reference post 646.8) and a 5mile segment of MT 16 (between reference post 86.6 and reference post 88.6 north and between reference post 0 and reference post 3 south of Culbertson). The corridor study is a planning study and not a design or construction project. Improvement options, including an alternate route around Culbertson, were evaluated based on engineering and environmental data as well as input from the oversight committee and local officials. Through analysis and screening, fifteen improvement options and one alternate route were identified as having the potential to address transportation concerns within Culbertson. The Public Draft of the Corridor Study will be made available on August 10, 2012 for review and comment. "I'm starting this program to help prepare children for kindergarten," says teacher and Executive Director, Michelle Sletvold. 

Additional CRP Practices Authorized for Emergency Haying and Grazing

USDA's North Dakota Farm Service Agency, with concurrence of the State Technical Committee, has authorized emergency haying and grazing on certain otherwise ineligible CRP practices for 2012. Due to continued drought conditions across the state, emergency having and grazing will now be allowed on practices CP8A, CP23, CP23A, CP25, CP27, CP28, CP37 and CP41.

All emergency having and grazing provisions will apply to these practices as they apply to other practices, including:

Authorization must be received from the producer's local FSA office;

A modified conservation plan that includes having and grazing requirements must be obtained from NRCS;

Only 50% of a field may be hayed;

Current Elevation 2235.6 ...

Livestock may only be grazed at 75% of the stocking rate:

Vegetation stands must be fully established;

A 10% payment CRP payment reduction will be assessed.

Additional restrictions may apply. Producers interested in emergency having or grazing of CRP acreage should contact their local county office for additional information.

Breastfeeding Benefits Infant & Mother

Many new mothers contemplate whether they should breastfeed their infant. Some feel embarrassed by this or may feel that it just seems unusual. However, there are large benefits associated with breastfeeding, not only for the infant, but for the mother as well. Breast milk is exactly designed to be what your infant needs and cannot be reproduced by formula. It is also completely free.

First and foremost, infants benefit greatly from breastfeeding. Breastfeeding directly benefits the infant's nutrition, gastrointestinal function, immune system, psychological well-being, and may improve neurodevelopmental outcomes compared to those who were formula-fed. Human milk may have long-term benefits for your infant such as decreasing obesity, childhood cancers, adult cardiovascu-

lar disease, allergic conditions and diabetes mellitus. Not only does breastfeeding benefit the infant, but it also benefits the mother. Moms recover faster from childbirth, have reduced stress, enhanced weight loss, and can have a prolonged anovulation time (in other words, not ovulating, although this is still not a reliable method of birth control). Additionally, breastfeeding has long-term benefits - reduces breast and ovarian cancer, and may reduce cardiovascular disease and obesity.

To state this more plainly, breastfeeding is both the best thing for your infant and for you. All women should breastfeed unless using street drugs, certain other medications, or have certain diseases. You should ask your health care professional about any conditions or medications you may have or be taking that could harm your infant. Otherwise, breast milk is best.



However, like everything else in the consumption world, alcoholic drinks have been super-sized. Knowing the appropriate size for your personal alcohol consumption can help you be responsible and safe in your nights out. Standard beer size is 12 oz. of beer, (12oz can or bottle)...that frosty mug or tall glass and even that pitcher could put you over the limit...KNOW YOUR SIZE. Standard size for a glass of wine is 5 oz., the average wine glass is 12 oz. The wine glass should only be about 1/3 full for women and 2/3 full for men...BIGGER ISN'T BETTER. Standard size for 80-proof liquor is 1 1/2 oz. that's one shot glass of alcohol. BIG drinks can have BIG CONSEQUENCES.

Stay aware of the recommended amounts and sizes of your drinks, and you are on your way to responsible alcohol consumption. We can all enjoy alcohol safely, for our health and the safety of others.

Ft. Buford Hosts Special Weekend of Public Events

Fort Buford comes to life on Saturday, August 18, 2012, with living history and historical presentations. The Fort Buford site, located 22 miles southwest of Williston, is managed and maintained by the state's history agency, the State Historical Society of North Dakota.

Programs will be featured throughout the day. From 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., the Fort Buford Sixth Infantry Regiment Association of Williston will provide demonstrations on marching, a cannon drill, and history on the life of a frontier soldier in the late 1800s. Ann Marks of Jamestown will provide Dutch oven cooking demonstrations in the campground throughout the day. No food will be served to the public from these demonstrations.

At 3 p.m., Dale Marks of Jamestown, a member of the Twentieth Infantry, will present a program on small arms of the Civil War and the Indian Wars. Arch Ellwein will provide History Alive! Presentations portraying Vic Smith, champion buffalo hunter, at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 18 and Sunday, Aug. 19, at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. Ellwein is an advertising consultant and Williston-Sidney area actor and children's theater director. At the nearby Missouri-Yellowstone Confluence Interpretive Center, the Confluence Quilter will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. with a brown bag lunch.

On Sunday, Aug. 19, Bill Lowman, cowboy poet, will provide a presentation at 3 p.m. CDT at the Missouri-Yellowstone Confluence Interpretive Center. Lowman's pencil drawings are on display at the center throughout the month of August.

Fort Buford was established as a military post in 1866 to guard the trails west and serve as a major supply depot, functioning until 1895. When the fort was decommissioned in 1895, it included more than 100 buildings and structures. Today, in addition to the Field Officer's Quarters where Sitting Bull surrendered in 1881, only two other original buildings remain-the Officer-of-the-Day Building and the stone powder magazine. A nearby fort cemetery also still exists.

Duck Brood Index Up From Last Year

North Dakota's 2012 fall duck flight is expected to have twice as many birds as last year.

Mike Johnson, game management section leader for the State Game and Fish Department, said the fall flight esti-

mate is a combination of the breeding duck survey and the brood survey.

Results from the breeding duck survey in May indicated the duck index was up 16 percent from 2011 and exceeded the long-term average by 112 percent.

May water conditions were down 57 percent from 2011 and 6 percent from the long-term average.

The mid-July waterfowl production survey revealed the duck brood index was up 110 percent from 2011 and 155 percent above the long-term average. Average brood size was 6.9 ducklings, down 0.8 from last year. The long-term average is 7.1 ducklings per brood.

The water index in mid-July was down 48 percent from last year, but still 10 percent above the long-term average.

The index does not count every water body or duckling in the state. Instead, representative transects across the state are sampled each year. Over time, survey results provide biologists with trend information that allows annual comparisons of waterfowl production in the state.

HIP Certification Required for Migratory Bird Hunters

Migratory game bird hunters are reminded to register with the Harvest Information Program prior to hunting in North Dakota this fall.

HIP certification is required for all migratory bird hunters, regardless of age, before hunting ducks, geese, swans, mergansers, coots, cranes, snipe, doves or woodcock.

Hunter compliance is essential in order to obtain reliable national and regional estimates of annual harvest of all migratory game bird species. These estimates provide information biologists need to make sound decisions concerning hunting seasons, bag limits and population management.

Hunters who purchase a license through the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's electronic licensing system (gf.nd.gov) or instant licensing telephone number at (800) 406-6409 can easily get HIP certified.

Otherwise, hunters can access the department's website, or call (888) 634-4798 and record the HIP number on their fishing, hunting and furbearer certificate.

Those who registered to hunt the spring light goose season in North Dakota do not have to register with HIP again, as it is required only once per year. However, hunters must HIP register in each state for which they are licensed before hunting migratory game birds.

Block Management Information Available Aug. 15

For the 2012 hunting season, more than 1,260 landowners have enrolled about 8 million acres in Montana's Block Management Program.

The popular Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks program provides hunters with public hunting access to private land, and isolated public land, free of charge, while assisting landowners in managing hunting activities.

Information about specific Block Management Area opportunities will be available beginning Aug. 15 at all FWP offices and on the FWP website at fwp.mt.gov. Hunting Guides and most BMA maps will be available on the FWP website. Click "For Hunters," then click "Block Management."

While many BMAs do not require reservations, some do. Hunters can use the Hunting Access Guides to determine how permission is obtained for individual BMAs. BMA reservations may be made for some upcoming hunting seasons beginning Aug. 22. Others won't open reservation lists until later in this fall.

Additional tools to help hunters plan for hunts on Montana's 93 million acres of private and public land can be found on line at fwp.mt.gov. Click "Hunting," then click "Hunter Access."



as set out in section 16-4-203, MCA. If the protested application is for a transfer of ownership not involving a transfer of location, the grounds for protest are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA. Protest letters which do not provide the information described in this paragraph will not be considered valid protest letters. Only those grounds for protest raised in valid protest letters will be considered at hearing. An individual's testimony will be limited to the grounds for protest raised in that individual's valid protest letter. If the der artment receives a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(a), MCA, a hearing will be scheduled in Helena, Montana. If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(b), MCA, to determine public convenience and necessity, a hearing will be held in the county in which the proposed premises is located. All qualified protestors will be notified of the time, date and location of the hearing. Hearings are typically scheduled within 90 days following the protest deadline. If a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing are not received and all licensing criteria have been satisfied, the department may issue the license without holding a hearing.


