



All youth who enrolled in 4-H and are ages 8 (by September 1 of 2018) to 18 and like the sport of archery are invited to participate in the 4-H Badlands Roundup District Archery Match in Watford City on Saturday, January 26. The event will be held at the Rough Rider Event Center. Doors open at 8:45 am with the first flight starting at 9:30 am CT for beginners and juniors. Flights will be held throughout the day with the last flight starting at 1:45 pm CT. Shooters need to arrive one half hour prior to the start of their flight. They will shoot for approximately one hour (except for seniors) and can leave following that.

Two bow divisions are offered: freestyle unlimited and bare bow. Here is a breakdown of divisions:

Beginner, junior and senior bare bow – shoot six ends (rounds) of five arrows at an 80-cm target at 15 yards for a maximum score of 300

Freestyle beginners and juniors – shoot six ends of five arrows at a 40-cm target for a maximum score of 150

Senior freestyle – shoot 12 ends of five arrows at a single bull target at 20 yards for a score of 300

The cost to participate is \$15.00.



Health Department to Hold Accreditation Reception

The Richland County Health Department will hold a reception to celebrate the achievement of PHAB National Public Health Accreditation on Thursday, December 20.

The national accreditation program works to improve and protect the health of the public by advancing and ultimately transforming the quality and performance of the nation's state, local, Tribal, and territorial public health departments. The Richland County Health Department is one of fewer than 200 health departments that have thus far achieved accreditation through PHAB since the organization launched in 2011. The Richland County Health Department joins Missoula, Gallatin, Lewis and Clark, Cascade, Yellowstone and Flathead Counties in becoming accredited.

The reception will be held at the Community Services Building, located at 1201 West Holly, in Sidney. A ribbon cutting by the Sidney Chamber of Commerce will mark the beginning of the Department's accredited period, and will take place at 1:30 p.m.

Positive Influenza Cases in Richland County

Richland County's flu season has begun, just as we enter the holiday season of family gatherings! There has been one positive Influenza B case and one positive Influenza A case tested locally during the past week. No one has been hospitalized and neither received a vaccination for this influenza season. The lab results were sent for confirmation by MT Public Health Laboratory in Helena.

Richland County Health Department wants residents to know that there is time to get a flu shot from the Health Department, a local healthcare provider or your choice of pharmacy.

The symptoms of influenza include a sudden onset of fever, chills, fatigue, body aches, neadache, chest discomfort and a cough. A person may experience all or most of these symptoms. You may catch influenza or the "flu" when you breathe in the virus from someone else's cough or when you touch a surface with the virus on it (such as a phone or faucet) and then touch your nose, mouth or eyes.

The risk of infection from influenza is higher in crowded public areas and living guarters. People begin to show symptoms within a week of being exposed to the virus.

Vaccination remains the best prevention for influenza and influenza-related complications. Influenza vaccine is recommended for everyone from ages 6 months and older.

People who have any chronic health condition, such as diabetes, heart disease, cancers, immune suppressed, pregnant, and other compromised lung/respiratory diseases are at higher risk of complications from influenza illness and are strongly urged to get yearly influenza vaccinations. Please speak to your healthcare provider for specific questions related to your medical condition.

In addition to vaccination please take precautions to limit the spread of disease, including:

· Wash your hands thoroughly and frequently;

· Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing

· Stay home from work, school, daycare and large gather-

ings when you're sick;

· Get plenty of rest; and

· Eat nutritious foods and drink plenty of fluids.

Vaccinations are given Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday from noon to 4:30 pm at the Richland County Health Department located in Community Services Building. No appointment is needed but you may call 433-2207 for more information.


