# McKenzie Co. Community Foundation (MCCF) Awards Grant

The McKenzie County Community Foundation gave out \$3,800 in grants in December 2017. Recipients were: Save the Maah Daah Hey, Pioneer Museum/McKenzie County, Summit Counseling and Long X Arts Foundation. These grants were made possible with key gifts from area donors.

Grant requests totaled \$13,300 on \$78,100 of county-wide projects. "We wish we could have done more for the many wonderful projects that were submitted," says Marcia Hellandsaas, MCCF committee chair, "but we are working to grow the endowment for our community, so in future years, we can become a bigger responder to area service needs that improve our quality of life."

MCCF is a permanent endowment established on 10/14/2010 to help improve the quality of life in McKenzie County. Each year earnings of the fund are awarded as grants to priority projects. MCCF is a component fund managed by

the North Dakota Community Foundation which has served ND communities for over 40 years and manages over 600 charitable funds from around the state.

Donations to the fund from local or out of state can be given as memorials, from estates, or outright gifts, and may qualify for the North Dakota Income Tax credit of 40% if they are paying ND income tax.

# **Grazing Workshop Slated For January**

Cell Grazing, dormant season grazing, swath grazing, crop residue grazing and bale grazing, everything you need to know about grazing. Steve Kenyon, Green Pastures Ranching Ltd. will be in Sidney on January 17 to speak about these grazing alternatives. The workshop will begin at 9:30 a.m. at Richland County MSU-Extension Meeting Room, 1499 N Central Ave, Sidney, MT. Cost to attend will be \$20 which will include lunch.

Steve Kenyon runs a custom grazing business in the Westlock, Alberta area under the name of Greener Pastures Ranching Ltd. He on average manages about 1000 head of livestock on 3000 acres of leased land. By using extended grazing techniques, he is able to pasture cattle year round. This is accomplished by using a combination of intensive cell grazing, dormant season grazing, swath grazing, crop residue grazing and bale grazing. Steve has become well respected in the agriculture community for his business management and innovative ideas.

Steve has been teaching sustainable grazing management for more than ten years and has been a keynote speaker at many conferences and seminars throughout Canada and the U.S. He is a writer for the Stockman Grass Farmer magazine and also for the Canadian Cattleman Magazine. He is also the author of "The Calendar of the Year Round Grazier". Steve has a very energetic personality, which compliments a very down to earth common sense approach to farm business management. Yet he is still just a producer and presents in a very honest and straightforward style. Steve has developed and instructs the "Year Round Grazing Systems" Agricultural Business Management Course. This three-day course includes a human resource component, economics, finances, grazing principles, cell design and pasture rejuvenation. This course will take you right into design and planning of a year round grazing system

The Mission statement of Greener Pastures is "Economic Sustainability for Generations" It is important to provide an enjoyable, profitable and sustainable business for future generations. Steve believes that to be profitable in the long term, you must use sustainable agriculture practices. You have to work with nature, not against her. Greener Pastures is an environmentally sustainable ranch that improves the land. The focus is to maintain an effective water cycle, carbon cycle, nitrogen cycle and mineral cycle. Our wildlife habitats and riparian areas need to be preserved. The health of our soils and our soil organisms needs to be understood and protected in order to ensure that our agricultural businesses remain profitable and sustainable.

While attending workshops and conferences with his wife, they met farmers and scientists who taught them to change the way they looked at farming. This led to their journey towards soil health and regenerating their farmland. Learning about soil biology and how soil functions, has renewed their passion for farming, and improved the farm's productivity.

Brendon Rockey of Rockey Farms in Center, Colorado, raises specialty potatoes and quinoa on 500-acres under irrigation at 7,600 feet above sea level using a biotic approach. Brendon chooses to use biological inputs like companion crops, livestock, green manure and flowering strips instead of synthetic fertilizers, herbicides, fungicides and insecticides. Biotic management supports a healthy, diverse pollinator population as well as a healthy farm and healthy consumers. # **Health Department Administrator Co-Authors Peer Reviewed Publication**

Richland County Health Department's administrator Judith LaPan recently co-authored an article in the peer-reviewed journal Impact Assessment and Project Appraisal, evaluating strategies for conducting impact assessments in areas affected by oil development.

The study is a case-study of Richland County's experience implementing the Mobilizing for Action Through Planning and Partnerships, or MAPP, process. The MAPP process is a framework for community needs assessment and strategic planning. Richland County has implemented the framework through the Communities in Action (CIA) process.

The CIA process has been in place for more than a decade, and is an umbrella program to organize local service providers, volunteers, and community groups focused on improving quality of life in Richland County. The focus of CIA through the MAPP process is to identify community needs, plan actions strategically, and build connections between people and organizations to implement strategies to improve quality of life.

The case study sought to answer the question: Does the MAPP process provide a useful template for impact assessment in energy boom contexts, and in what ways?

The authors first determined whether the MAPP process aligned with current impact assessment best practices. They found that both frameworks focus on the importance of relevant and actionable data, as well as efficiency, and both prioritize

In the evaluation of CIA, LaPan and co-authors conducted four activities: a Ripple Effect Mapping exercise with the CIA steering committee; stakeholder interviews with leaders who held prominent roles in CIA; Town Hall meetings around the county to solicit input on current issues and feedback on CIA; and a document analysis detailing the group's history, process

The Communities in Action process has been in place since 2005, when, in response to the changing economic atmosphere and emergence of oil and gas activity in Richland County, a group of 15 leaders formed the CIA steering committee. Steering committee members represent a breadth of community group, including the health department, library, hospital, and local governance, among other participants. The group conducted the first robust set of local assessment activities, which informed a "Quality of Life" profile in 2007. From then on, quality of life assessments were conducted regularly, and "State of the Community" conferences were held to identify changing needs and priorities in the area.

The authors had several conclusions about the efficacy of the CIA process in the context of rapid oil development, including that the process helped to maintain the regular provision of services to the population during a time when most were "doing damage control", during the height of the oil boom. The authors found merit in further investigating the MAPP process as an applicable model for evaluating the impacts of oil and gas development because of its alignment with best practices, opportunities for monitoring and mitigating issues, and relevance in negotiation challenges specific to oil and gas development.




