Arnegard Fire Department Fights Blaze at PDQ Restaurant

On Aug 14 at 9 p.m. the Arnegard Fire Department responded to a report of smoke coming from the kitchen area of the PDQ. Upon arrival they found heavy smoke coming from the southwest corner of the building. We deployed lines and made dynamic entry on the west side knocking the fire down very quickly. Firefighters kept the blaze contained to the kitchen area although there was smoke throughout. They called for tender assistance from Watford City Fire and they sent 2 heavy engines with 10 firefighters of their own. We started taking turns doing overhaul and got the rest of the hot spots taken care of. The last Arnegard unit cleared the scene at 3:30 a.m. on Aug. 15. Authorities direct traffic on the bridge on Hwy 58

By Michele Seadeek According to Detective Caleb Fry of the Williams County Sheriff's office, a search team was dispatched shortly after the call came in on August 17 that a possible jumper had leapt from a bridge in western Williams County on Hwy 58 early that afternoon. McKenzie County Sheriff's Department, Williams County Sheriff's Department, Fairview Police Department, Richland County, MT EMS and Fairview Fire Department personnel were on scene.

After initial ground and aerial searches didn't find anyone, a dive team was brought in that evening to search the waters. The dive team ran sonar robots in the water and did not find anything.

Detective Fry believes that "if the individual jumped from the bridge they may have had time to get to shore and leave the area before emergency teams arrived on scene. As of now there haven't been any missing persons reports placed or any body found. However, if additional information is brought forth, the investigation will continue." If you have any information regarding this event, please contact the Williams County Sheriff's office.





MDA to Hold Waste Pesticide Disposal Events In September

Annual events have collected over 638,000 lbs. of waste pesticides

Helena, MT - The Montana Department of Agriculture's annual Pesticide Disposal Events will be held in several locations across Montana during September. The collection events will be held September 17 in Wolf Point; September 18 in Sidney; September 19 in Miles City; and September 20 in Billings. The annual events have collected more than 638,000 pounds of waste pesticides since it began in 1994.

The program was designed to help individuals dispose of any pesticides that

are unusable as originally intended and cannot be used for any other purpose. This allows participants to dispose of waste pesticides in an environmentally responsible way and helps protect Montana's ecosystems and groundwater, as well as families, pets, livestock and drinking water.


The department asks that participants pre-register online by September 9, 2019, before the collection events, so products can be managed safely and efficiently. Those interested in having their waste pesticides recycled should visit the

website at: https://agr.mt.gov/ Pesticide-Waste-Disposal.

There is no charge for the first 200 pounds of material. Amounts over 200 pounds are assessed at \$1 per pound. A higher fee may apply to pesticides with dioxins or dioxin precursors.

Government Affairs Creates New Group To Help With Drug Epidemic

During the most recent Sidney Chamber government affairs meeting held Wednesday, Aug 14, members discussed action to address the drug problem the area is facing.

With increased drug use being a problem nationwide, Sidney is no exemption from that. Methamphetamines, narcotics and more have become a problem for the area.

"One problem we face is that when trying to recruit professionals or getting young families to our area, they see in the news all the drug related issues Sidney is facing and it makes it hard to get them to want to move here," said Chamber of Commerce executive director Bill Vander Weele.

While there's a lot of work to be done to completely fix the situation, government affairs committee members are being realistic in what they are aiming to do.

"We know we can't fix the issue, but we want to do something to help," said city clerk and treasurer Jessica Redfield.

In an attempt to get as much help as possible, the government affairs committee is recruiting local public figures and groups to form a new group to battle the drug problem Sidney is facing.

So far they have the support of the Sidney Police Department, Richland County Sheriff's Office, Fairview Police, Judge Luke Savage, Sidney High School Principal Brent Sukut and the Coalition Against Domestic Violence.

"We're trying to get the support of city and county law

enforcement, Mental Health and schools," Vander Weele said.

Redfield said they hope by involving the schools, they can reach student council to get the opportunity to hear and see things from the students prospective.

"I believe as community leaders that we need to come

together and try to make a plan to inform the public about the issues we have in Richland County," Sidney Mayor Rick Norby said. "We have to figure out a way to combat the drug issues we have in our communities."

Recently, U.S. Rep. Greg Gianforte, R-Mont., visited Sidney to address local issues with area leaders. Vander Weele referenced that meeting saying that Gianforte made the point that the drug epidemic isn't just a Sidney problem, it's a problem everywhere.

"We don't know the answer to fixing the problem, but we're taking steps to address the issue," Vander Weele said.

West Nile Virus Confirmed In Mosquito Samples In Three Montana Counties

Important to take steps to avoid mosquito bites, state health officials say

State and local public health officials are reporting the season's first West Nile Virus (WNV) detections with three counties reporting positive mosquito samples. Cascade, Sheridan and Yellowstone counties have all had a positive mosquito sample for WNV. To date, no cases of WNV have been identified in a human but the detection of WNV in Montana is a reminder of the importance of avoiding mosquito bites.

Most people who become infected with WNV experience no symptoms but 1 in 5 develop a mild illness, with symptoms such as headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea or a rash.

Other individuals, fewer than 1 out of 150, may become severely ill with encephalitis or meningitis (inflammation of the brain or surrounding tissues). Most people recover completely, but fatigue and weakness can last for weeks or even months.

Communicable Disease Epidemiologist, Erika Baldry states. "Late July and early August is when we typically see WNV activity pick up here in Montana. Our season can begin as early as July and because it can take some time to become ill, we can receive reports of ill individuals as late as October."

There is no available treatment for WNV infection other than supportive care. Individuals who develop any of these symptoms should see their healthcare provider. Detection of WNV in mosquito samples is a good indication that WNV is in Montana. WNV is a vector-borne disease meaning that for individuals to become infected they must be bitten by an infected mosquito.

DPHHS reminds Montanans to take precautions and protect against WNV by following the 4 Ds of prevention.

The 4 Ds of West Nile

1. DEET: Use insect repellent such as DEET or picaridin.

2. Drain: Drain standing water around your house to prevent mosquito breeding.

3. Dawn/Dusk: Mosquitoes are most active during dawn and dusk. Stay inside or take precautions to prevent mosquito bites during these times.

4. Dress: When possible, wear long sleeved shirts and pants to protect yourself from







Tentative Changes for Eastern Montana Fishing Regulations include:

• Increased Sauger daily & possession limit on the Yellowstone River, upstream of Forsyth, from one daily and two in possession to two daily and four in possession.

• Reorganize Paddlefish regulations for simplicity, clarity and comprehension.

• Change definition of "snagging" to eliminate snagging Paddlefish while trolling from a boat.

Bass length limit at Hollecker
Pend in Glanding

Pond in Glendive.

Anglers are invited to participate by reviewing these and other FWP proposals and contributing comments. Comments can be submitted online or at public meetings. A single public meeting has been scheduled in Region 7 at 7 p.m. on Tuesday August 27 at Dawson Community College's Ullman Center, room 102 in Glendive (300 College Dr.).



Social Security (SSA) Impersonation Scam Impacting Montanans Across The State

Two weeks ago a man in Havre gave out his Social Security number to a scammer. This morning a woman in Great Falls became another victim. Calls are being received across the state of Montana by persons pretending to be Social Security Administration employees. The intent of these calls is to steal the victim's identity and/ or money directly from their bank account.

The calls often sound official and are designed by con artists to get around their victim's logic and caution by creating a sense of urgency and fear. Various versions have been reported throughout Montana: claiming the recipient's Social Security number has been suspended due to suspicious activity; talking about enrollment in the Medicare prescription drug program; or offering a lower-cost health plan if some-

· If you do answer the phone, do not press one, do not engage in dialogue about your personal life, and do not under any circumstances give out your Social Security number, your Medicare number, your bank account number,

your birthdate or any other personal information.

If you suspect someone of impersonating the Social Security Administration, call the SSA OIG Fraud Hotline at 1-800-269-0271 with caller's alleged name, telephone number, time and date call was made, and information requested by the caller. If you have given out personal information, call your local Montana SMP at 1-800-551-3191.

Montana SMP is a statewide program designed to educate consumers about healthcare fraud, waste and abuse prevention. Missoula Aging Services administers the program throughout the state.




