The North Dakota Game and Fish Department's Becoming an Outdoors-Woman program has openings for "Hike the Maah Daah Hey Trail" June 21-22.

Montana Documentarians

Tales of the oil patch reach Billings like rumors of an exotic, far-off destination: stories of rags to riches, expansive housing developments, rising crime, infrastructure bursting at the seams, and all-time low unemployment. Residents and visitors are often met with a set of predictable questions: "What's it like? Is it really how they say it is?"

These questions are at the heart of a newly launched multimedia documentary project titled the "High Plains Heritage Project." It's about spending time getting to know people living in the areas affected by the Bakken oil boom, and sharing their experiences through photos, videos, and the written word. Only in the moment of change will it be possible to capture the nostalgia of the past, the fleetingness of the present, and the suspense at guessing what the future holds.

The project will culminate in a full-length documentary to be completed in the fall of

Peter Tolton, Stan Parker, and Jessica Jane Hart, three of the four team members, are Montana natives who have seen the effects of the boom spread across their home state. They are joined by Tarek Fouda, a seasoned radio journalist based out of Brooklyn, NY.

The four will spend three weeks filming during June

2014, releasing daily content to a website —highplainsheritage.com — so that viewers can experience the stories

alongside the team.

"It's so much more than a documentary," Parker said.
"Everybody out there has a story, and we want our audience to feel like they're meet-

ing all of these people, too."

The project is about community, and the team is seeking community support through Kickstarter to fund the effort. Contributors to a Kickstarter campaign are called "backers," and it's not a donation because they all get something in return. For the High Plains Heritage Project, perks include digital downloads, DVD copies, fine art photography, underwriting opportunities, and more.

With Kickstarter, it's all or nothing. If the funding goal isn't met by the deadline (typically about 30 days), the backers get their money back, and the project gets none of the money. The deadline for the High Plains Heritage Project is June 5.

"What I love about Kickstarter is that it makes a total grass-roots effort like this possible," Parker said. "When a crowd-funded project succeeds, it's because people saw the value in it and were willing to chip in to make it

happen."

Preserving history is another part of the mission, and backers have the opportunity

to help with that mission right from the get-go. For every DVD copy pre-sold with the Kickstarter campaign, one copy will also be donated to a school, library, museum or

historical society in the region.

Reconstruction Project Planned for a Section of Montana Highway 200 Through

Fairview

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) would like to notify the public and seek comments on a proposal to reconstruct about 1.9 miles of Montana Highway 200, through Fairview, MT in Richland County. The project begins south of Fairview, at reference post (RP) 62.3 and extends through town for 1.9 miles ending at the North Dakota border at RP 64.2. Proposed work will include the following: • At the beginning of the project (RP 62.3), there will be major rehabilitation of the pavement to Second Street in Fairview. Rehabilitation will consist of new plant mix surfacing or concrete pavement, new storm drain system and replacement of existing sidewalks and curbs in poor condition. • From Second Street to the end of the project (RP 64.2) the road will be completely reconstructed. The new asphalt surfacing will be finished with a seal & cover (chip seal) and the road will receive upgraded pavement marking, signage and rumble strips where appropriate. The project is tentatively scheduled for construction on completion of all project development activities and availability of funding. At this time, no new right-of-way is anticipated; however relocation of utilities will be required. 





This site works closely with the Williston CVB and Chamber of Commerce as well as with the Fairview, MT Chamber of Commerce to market the site. These organizations' websites, along with the Sidney, MT Chamber website, carry the site's programs, open hours, and other information. Most of the oil field businesses have joined the Chamber so the information is disseminated to them. The

site has also worked with Target Logistics and other housing companies from the oil field to provide information to residents about the site. Attendance has grown despite the fact that hotel rooms in the area are still hard to come by for tourists. This is a true family destination and the workers are glad to know of a place they can bring their families. Information at local day care centers, the Tourism rest stop program, and TV and radio spots, and social media round out the marketing for the site.

Activities in the summer include tours of historic Ft. Buford, living history during the summer encampment, the opening and closing ceremonies at the fort, History Alive presentations, a permanent exhibit gallery and a temporary or changing exhibit gallery. Year round activities nclude monthly concerts, Quilting at the Confluence (now concentrating on Civil War quilts), and Ft. Buford History Book Club. The site has great walking paths along the river with interpretive signs that talk about the flora and fauna of the area, as well as the historic significance of the confluence area of the Missouri and Yellowstone rivers.

Special activities include an Easter Egg hunt in the spring, paddlefish seminars at the start of the paddle fishing season in May conducted on site by North Dakota Game



and Fish, school tours of the site, and in the fall, a cemetery walk where the dead come back to life to tell their stories from the Fort. The historic site is working with local Boy Scout troops with activities to help the scouts earn badges and with Eagle Scout hopefuls to complete projects. The site is involved in Project WET - Water Education for Teachers. A seminar held on site introduces the importance of water in everyday life to students and a weeklong seminar for teachers gives them information to use in the classroom.

The site works closely with Ft. Union Trading Post National Park, ND Game and Fish Department, and the MT Historical Society as well as other local museums and historical groups.

Fort Buford is usually the first or the last place people visit in North Dakota. They are one of the reasons the state has as good a reputation as it does. For this and for showing the oil field workers North Dakota's quality of life, Fort Buford and the Missouri-Yellowstone Confluence Interpretive Center deserve to be North Dakota's Attraction of the Year.







DPHHS Urges Caution Regarding Rabies Exposures

State and local public health officials remind Montanans to be aware of the risk for exposure to rabies this time of year when the likelihood of interactions with wild animals increases.

"Be smart this spring and summer and take time to learn a few basic tips that will protect you and your family," said Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) Director Richard Opper.

To avoid possible exposures, keep the following rabies prevention tips in mind:

Do not feed or handle wild animals, especially bats. Teach children never to touch wild animals or handle bats, even dead ones. Ask children to tell an adult if they see or find a bat.

Vaccinate dogs and cats against rabies. All dogs and cats should have a current rabies certificate.

Bat-proof your house. Close all outside openings larger than 3/8" in the walls, roofs, and floors. Put screens on all windows, doors and chimneys to prevent bats from entering.

Watch for abnormal wild animal behavior. Most wild animals are not seen during the daytime. If you see one and it is acting strangely, leave it alone and contact your local health department or animal control agency.

If you or your child has any contact with a bat, or are bitten or scratched by any wild or stray animal, please do the following: Wash any bite or wound with soap and water.

Contact a health care provider or public health department for appropriate follow-up.

In the summer of 2013, there were hundreds of reports of animal bites in Montana, including over 40 encounters between bats and people. During the same period, 20 of the 200 bats and 13 of 25 skunks submitted to the Department of Livestock's Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory tested positive for rabies.

Rabies is not limited to wild animals; in the same year two dogs and one cat also tested positive. People who may have been exposed generally receive a series of shots that can range in cost from \$2,000 to \$7,000 per person.

Rabies can be a fatal disease that affects the nervous system of humans and other mammals. The rabies virus is carried in the saliva of infected animals and is usually transmitted to people and other animals from the bite or saliva of a rabid animal.

Although exposures can occur anytime, spring and summer are the seasons when most exposures occur as humans and animals emerge from the long Montana winter. Although skunks are the most common four legged animals infected with rabies

in Montana, the majority of reported human exposures result from bats.

Because bat bites can be difficult to detect, it is important that any physical contact with a bat be brought to the attention of a health care provider or public health officials for a risk assessment. Bats found in homes, especially sleeping areas, are a concern because sleeping people, small children, or pets may not be aware or unable to report an exposure. "It is important to consult with health authorities if you find a bat in your home," Opper said.

In addition to protecting yourself, it is important to protect pets. "We urge people not to approach or feed wild or and stray animals and never touch a bat," said Elton Mosher of the DPHHS Communicable Disease and Epidemiology Bureau. "Protect yourself, your pets and the community by getting your animals vaccinated and don't touch wild animals.'

Officials remind anyone who may have been exposed not to destroy the animal that may be responsible. It may be possible to observe or test the animal to rule out rabies and eliminate the need for treatment. Contact your local health department or animal control for instructions on what to do.

State Game and Fish Department ANS Coordinator Fred Ryckman said there are more than 400 recreational fishing waters across the state, making it imperative

for watercraft owners to obey regulations.

"It is the same message year after year, but that just shows how important it is to keep our waterways free of unwanted species," Ryckman said. "Full public participation and compliance is critical if we want to ensure ANS is not transferred from one lake to another.'

Current law states all water must be drained from watercraft prior to leaving a water body, including livewells. This means fish, including bait, cannot be transported in a livewell containing water. However, bait buckets and/or any container of 5 gallons or less in volume can be used to transport legal live baitfish or other bait in water. All other fish species may not be held in water and/or transported in bait buckets/containers when away from a water body. Transportation of fish in or on ice is allowed.

In addition, no aquatic vegetation, or parts thereof, shall be in or on watercraft, motors, trailers and recreational equipment when out of water. Time out of the water needed to remove aquatic vegetation at the immediate water access area is allowed.

All built-in structures to boats, including livewells and bait compartments, and containers (bait buckets) used to transport legal live bait, must also be free of aquatic vegetation.

North Dakota Paddlefish Snagging Season to Close

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department announced today that the state's 2014 regular paddlefish snagging season will close at 10 p.m. Central Daylight Time, Sunday, May 18, to protect the population level of the fish. However, snaggers are reminded that Sunday is a snag-and-release only day.

The 2014-16 fishing proclamation allows for the Game and Fish director to close the snagging season early if it appears more than 1,000 paddlefish will be harvested. Fisheries chief Greg Power said it's been another successful year. "The unique thing is that half the harvest was large, presumably old females,"

Power said. "Relatively high water levels perhaps contributed to the harvest of so many females."

An additional four-day snag-and-release season will begin Monday, May 19 and run through Thursday, May 22. Paddlefish snaggers with an unused paddlefish tag can continue snagging during the additional snag-and-release season, but must release all fish immediately. Snaggers who already used their tag on a harvested paddlefish are not allowed to participate in the additional snag-and-release period.

Beginning Monday, snag-and-release is legal only in that area of the Missouri River starting on the north shore from the Confluence boat ramp then east (downstream) one-half mile, and that area of the Missouri River starting on the south shore from the Confluence with the Yellowstone River then east (downstream) one-half mile (both areas will have boundary signs).

Paddlefish snagging is allowed only from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. (CDT) during each day of the additional four-day season. The use or possession of a gaff on snag-and-release days is illegal.

Fish & Wildlife Commission to Consider Wolf Stamp Donation

Among a full agenda to consider at its May 22 meeting in Fort Peck, a late addition now includes potential commission direction for a voluntary wolf conservation stamp or decal for anyone to make a contribution to Montana wolf management.

If approved, FWP would initiate rulemaking to define a voluntary wolf conservation

stamp and how donated funds would be allocated to specific wolf conservation efforts. That process would include opportunity for public comment.

The commission meeting will begin at 8:30 a.m. on May 22 at the Fort Peck Hatchery in Fort Peck, 277 Highway 117. The public may also participate via video conference from FWP regional offices and FWP's headquarters in Helena.

Fueling a Fleet Vehicle for Only 70 Cents Per Gallon - Is This Possible?

It's definitely possible and Mark Wald and Blaise Energy are proving just that.

North Dakota native and co-founder of Blaise Energy formed the company to provide alternatives to flaring. "When oil is extracted from this state, the byproduct or natural gas (NG) comes up with the oil. You can store the oil, truck it off or rail it off but if there's not a pipeline readily available to capture the gas, it gets flared and we try to provide an alternative to flaring."

Wald recently told KX-News in Bismarck, "That gas needs a home and it's our view that the best place to start is right here at home and use that gas locally or even on site - whether it's power generation or powering fleets, or pulling out the NGLs and trucking them to market. It'll be a combination of those that ultimately, I think will put the flare out."

Blaise Energy generates electricity from the captured gas and then delivers that electricity back in to the electrical grid which is used to power homes and businesses. Not only are they reducing flaring and creating electricity, but



they've recently started converting their fleet of service vehicles over to CNG in an effort to service their fleet of natural gas generators in the Bakken with service vehicles that also run off of natural gas. Blaise converted the vehicles themselves as they expand their existing knowledge of how natural gas is used in stationary power generation to how to use that gas as a transportation fuel. They have been using the vehicles daily since February with great success and are in the process of installing a CNG compressor in their shop which will enable them to create their own motor fuel for approximately 70 cents per gallon.

Wald feels this is an interesting twist on solutions to flaring in the form of driving additional options for that gas produced in the Bakken by fleets operating in the Bakken.

"CNG has a lot of opportunity as a transportation fuel, however there is only one CNG fueling station in the state and it's in Dickinson," states Wald. "We are trying to bridge the gap. We wanted to get experience using it as transportation fuel ourselves and have successfully been doing so. We proved it! We made it make sense on a fleet of only 2 vehicles.

Blaise Energy Uses Well Head Gas to Power First Commercial CNG Production Plant in the Bakken Demonstrating Alternative Uses for Flare Gas

Blaise Energy announced they are using flare gas to supply the electrical power for a major oil operator producing CNG fuel. Blaise successfully paralleled five natural gas powered generators providing one megawatt of power for the oil operator's CNG compressor. The CNG alternative fuel is being used to power bi-fuel generators at drilling rig sites reducing the oil producer's diesel costs and site emissions. The project also demonstrates how large gas volumes, contributing to the massive flaring in the Bakken, can be monetized and reduced. Blaise's gas

powered paralleled generation equipment automatically adjusts power output to meet the plant's load demand and on-site electrical loads using proprietary equipment set-up and configuration. Blaise CEO, Mark Wald,

said, "We have long been evangelizing the use of alternative solutions to reduce flaring in the Bakken and are excited to be utilizing this otherwise wasted resource to power this project." Blaise supplies a critical

component for an end-to-end well head gas utilization solution which consumes approximately 850,000 cubic feet of well head gas per day. The configuration

can be scaled to over 1.1 million cubic feet per day which is more than the average individual flare size of the largest 200 flares in the Bakken comprising 60% of flared gas. There are over 3,000 flares burning in the Bakken.

Mr. Wald emphasized, "This is a highly repeatable modular solution that can be deployed at individual well sites as needed and scaled to address specific gas volumes and mixes."

These solutions capture gas when there is no existing gathering pipeline or when the existing infrastructure is already at capacity and cannot move the gas to local plants or regional pipelines. "We converted our own field service trucks to run on CNG Bakken gas at about 25% of our previous fuel costs," said Wald.

The North Dakota Department of Mineral Resources and oil and gas industry group associations indicate 29% of the gas in North Dakota is flaring and over 50% of gas flared in the Bakken is connected to a gas pipeline gathering system.

The North Dakota Humanities Council is also sponsoring book discussions in communities across the state focused on "Dakota."

"When Sherry called and asked if North Dakota wanted to partner on this project, I was thrilled," said Brenna Gerhardt, executive director of the North Dakota Humanities Council. "When it was written, Norris's book represented the Dakotas to the nation, and it still does. When I travel and tell people I'm from North Dakota, I often have people ask me if I've read "Dakota." Revisiting her book is a lot like looking in the mirror and thinking, 'Is this how people see us?' I'm curious to see if people will agree with the picture she paints of us or find it

as appealing as people from outside our borders do."

Norris is an award-winning poet, writer, and author of The New York Times bestsellers "The Cloister Walk," "Amazing Grace: A Vocabulary of Faith," "The Virgin of Bennington" and the 2014 One Book, "Dakota: A Spiritual Geography." "Dakota" is a former New York Times Notable Book of the Year and was selected at the time of its printing as one of the best books of the year by Library Journal.

The San Francisco Sunday Examiner and Chronicle calls Norris "one of the most eloquent yet earthbound spiritual writers of our time."
