Messer Receives Ambassador Of The Year Award

The Montana Ambassadors, a group of businessmen, educators and professionals that seek to further the best interests of the State of Montana, has selected Leslie Messer, Richland Economic Development (RED) executive director, as this year's recipient of the Ambassador of the Year Award. The Ambassadors chose Messer based on her dedicated work with businesses and individuals involved with the Bakken development and in the growth of eastern Montana to thrive and expand.

Her selection for this prize came as a shock to Messer. "I am absolutely completely surprised by this," she comments. "I am truly humbled by this honor."

Messer received this recognition in part because of the incredible progress and the accomplishments RED has made during 2011, along with the dedication and commitment RED has demonstrated to the community and for economic development. Messer and the RED board have an impressive list of successes for this past year.

"We provide business assistance to the area," Messer points out. "The majority of my time is spent in

consulting work for emerging businesses that are looking at our area. We've had a very busy year. In 2011, we had over 60 developers walk into the office, we've had 35 small business consultations for people interested in starting up new businesses, we've had two new industries expanding to Richland County, and we've awarded three revolving loans for local businesses."

She continues, "I had membership discussions with 100% of our members, listening to what they had to say. Lack of employees is the number one concern, and lack of housing is No. 2. We also need to encourage people to shop locally to keep businesses here."

Messer also notes that in 2011, three hotels began construction in Sidney. "There has been over three years of work on these hotel projects," she says. "It's been an amazing year to bring three hotels to fruition."

RED has also written to the Department of Motor Vehicles to request more help with the licensing process, and it facilitated two roundtable discussions to bring local businessmen together with Congressional members to discuss area needs and issues.

Messer and RED will

continue their efforts in the coming months and years. "This award isn't the culmination of my efforts," Messer remarks. "This is all a part of the blessing of having this position. RED intends to keep moving forward and to work with the resources we have available to improve our area."

She concludes, "If I can get up every morning and do the best I can to make a difference for my future grandchildren, that's all I can ask."

Messer has served as executive director of RED for the past ten years.

She will receive her award during the annual meeting and conference of the Montana Ambassadors, scheduled for March 22-23 at the Crowne Plaza, Billings.

DPHHS: It's Not Too Late To Vaccinate Against Influenza

Influenza season has arrived in Montana and most regions of the state are reporting confirmed cases, according to the latest information from the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS).

Recently reported cases of confirmed illness in several counties across the state has heightened concern among public health officials as Montana begins to enter the most active part of the influenza season. Influenza season typically peaks after the holidays, in January and February. Health officials are letting people know there is still time to get vaccinated.

"We are seeing a recent increase in the number of cases reported and we are just entering the worst months," DPHHS Director Anna Whiting Sorrell said. "However, there is still time to get

vaccinated and protect yourself and those around you from becoming ill."

DPHHS and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommend an annual influenza vaccination for everyone older than six months of age as the best way to protect against flu viruses. "There is still plenty of vaccine available, and it isn't too late to get vaccinated," said Lisa Underwood, DPHHS Immunization Section supervisor. "Protection against influenza viruses can decline over the course of a year, so even people who received a flu shot last year should get vaccinated again this year."

While everyone over six months of age can benefit from influenza vaccine, it is particularly important for individuals with asthma, diabetes, heart conditions, or any chronic health issues to protect

themselves. DPHHS reports that people with chronic health issues have a higher risk of developing problems or dying if infected with influenza. "It's important for people with these chronic health problems to avoid any strain on their immune systems or complicating their medical conditions," Underwood said. "Those at risk, and those who care for them, should get a flu shot to prevent influenza from making things worse."

This year's seasonal influenza vaccine provides protection against the same virus strains as last year, including protection from the H1N1 influenza virus strain that caused the 2009 influenza pandemic.

daycare provider, you will want to check out the school readiness backpacks at Your Library. The backpacks include puzzles, games, books and toys that can help your kids learn important concepts like the alphabet, numbers, colors, animals, healthy habits, nutrition and fine motor skills. Self-Service Center Opening At Sidney Post Office

Customers will now have 24/7 access to many mailing services

To aid customers too busy to make a trip to the post office during regular business hours, a Self-Service Ship and Mail Center (SSSMC) will be installed at the Sidney Post Office. Beginning Feb. 15, the interactive kiosk will enable customers with a credit or debit card to purchase stamps, and weigh and mail cards and packages 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

"Self-Service Ship and Mail Centers provide easy access to postal products and services just as ATMs provide easy access to banking services, but without the fees," said Sidney Postmaster Brandi Lien.

Employees will help

guide customers through the process of using the center. SSSMCs do not accept cash, only debit or credit cards, to dispense stamps and postage in any amount for Express Mail, Priority Mail, First-Class Mail and Parcel Post services. They also provide mailing information, ZIP Code lookup, Certified and Insured Mail, Return Receipt, Delivery Confirmation and other services.

The SSSMC employs a touch screen and numeric keypad for customers to select products and services and receive postal information. A convenient parcel slot next to the center accepts packages up to 12 inches high by 14 inches deep by

20 inches wide.

"With the boom in business in our region, it can be tough for folks to schedule a trip to the Post Office into their busy day," said Lien. "We are now able to offer 24/7 access to our most popular services. I'm confident our customers will love that convenience."

“Bug Detective” To Discuss Crop Pest Management At ARS BrownBagger

A former pet shop manager, zoo keeper and now ARS scientist will share his insights into successful management of crop pests using ecological principles on Friday, Feb. 17, as part of the USDA-ARS Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory's (NPARL) 2012 BrownBagger series.

Dr. Jon Lundgren, ARS' North Central Agricultural Research Laboratory entomologist, Brookings, SD, will discuss “Using ecological principles to manage pests: A case study involving the corn rootworm.” The one-hour session begins at noon and is open to the public.

Dr. Lundgren says that some of the biggest threats to our nation's crops aren't found on the top of the plants, but rather are harbored in the soil. The corn rootworm is a classic example and Lundgren uses it to help focus attention on what's going on in the “bug eat bug” world beneath the soil surface and how to harness that biodiversity to aid good insects and curb bad ones in farmers' fields.

According to Lundgren, “Generalist predators are diverse and abundant in most cropping systems, and help farmers by reducing the need for insecticides. But often, these predators cannot keep key pests at low levels. This result is due, in part, to our farming practices,” he says. In his talk, Lundgren will address “how conservation programs can be helpful in reducing a key pest while still taking in a successful crop.”

Lundgren's research work has earned him several awards and the moniker the “bug detective” in ARS circles. His most recent honor includes the 2010 Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers, which recognizes individuals in the pursuit of innovative research at the frontiers of science and technology.

Sidney Fellowship Baptist Church: From The Oil Field To The Mission Field

Small gestures of empathy and kindness can go a long way toward improving the quality of life for those finding themselves in hard times. It can even create award winning programs that work to better the quality of life for community members finding themselves in the middle of a whirlwind of expansion and turmoil during the Bakken oil boom.

The Fellowship Baptist Church, Sidney, recently received the "Ready Montana Award" from the Governor's Office of Community Service, the Montana Commission on Community Service and First Lady Nancy Schweitzer.

The purpose of the award is to recognize people of all ages and backgrounds who, through their dedication and commitment to community service, have greatly enhanced civic life in the area.

"Someone locally nominated us for the humanitarian relief efforts we are doing to help with the influx of people," said Jordon Hall, pastor and church member.

Several awards are given out in each category. In particular, the Ready Montana Award is for service specifically related to disaster services, emergency preparedness and emergency response.

The church continues to provide showers to those without running water, food to the hungry through its food banks and is serving as an emergency warming station for those left out in the elements without heat.

The warming station provides people who find themselves without heat a place to warm up until their heat is turned on or propane is available.

Brad Moore knows firsthand how important this program is for some community members. In July 2009, he was one of the needy. "I came here to work in the oil field and I was promised the moon. When I got here I couldn't even find a place to live. I stayed in a tent from July to November and I relied on the church for showering and heat," he said.

Back in 2008, Moore was driving a long haul load as a truck driver when he was in a severe accident. After surviving, he wanted to get

involved with helping others and that was when he found the church.

He was invited to use the church for showering, heat and food. He also found compassion from people who were complete strangers that later became friends. "He was one of our regulars I guess you could say and we decided we would invite him to participate in the program

by helping others who needed use of our facilities. He started coming down to unlock the facility for others in need and really got on board with the program," Hall said.

Through the church's outreach committee, five or six volunteers collaborate and take turns opening the church up for people in need. Moore is an active member

of the outreach committee.

Today, Moore is a jailer at the Richland County Justice Center. When he isn't working, he's at the church volunteering his time and helping others who are in situations similar to the one he once experienced.

The humanitarian program originally started as a way to help people who were here working on the beet farms during harvest. But once the oil boom began rapidly impacting Sidney these past several years, it became obvious the need expanded far beyond the short harvest season.

The church uses a mobile six-shower unit they borrow from the Montana Southern Baptist Convention, Billings. The trailer is located on site and only removed when it is needed for disasters. Last spring, it was used during the flooding and taken to the Crow Reservation and Minot. During the winter it can't be used because of the freezing temperatures and during that time people use the four showers located inside the church.

The mobile showers will return in the spring.

The church is currently feeding between 10 and 15

families each week through food pantry efforts.

This summer, the church has plans to collect totes, blankets and clothing to offer in addition to their other services.

"We do all of this because it's important. We want the community to know that we love them and we want to be hospitable to people whether they are from Richland County or just traveling through," Hall said.

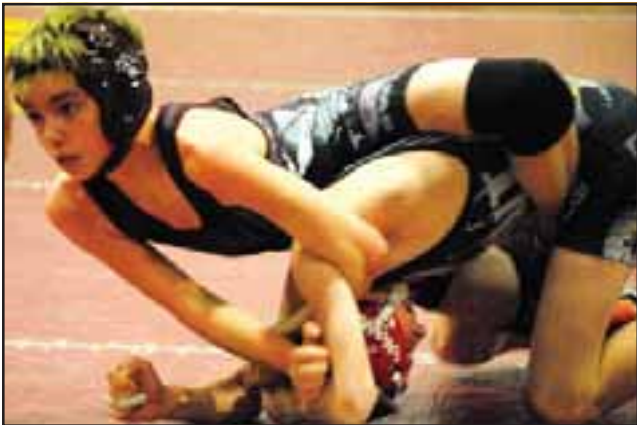
Nonresident Any-Deer Bow Licenses Available

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department will have 682 any-deer bow licenses available to nonresidents in 2012. However, pending the final proclamation, antlerless mule deer may not be legal to harvest within a large area of western North Dakota.

The deadline for applying is April 1. A lottery will be held if more applications are received than licenses available. If licenses remain after April 1, they will be issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Applicants can apply together as a party. A separate check is required for each application.

The nonresident any-deer bow application is available at the Game and Fish website, gf.nd.gov. The application must be printed and sent in to the department.

The number of nonresident any-deer bow licenses available is 15% of the previous year's mule deer gun license allocation. The Game and Fish Department issued 4,550 mule deer licenses in the 2011 deer gun lottery.
