Watford City Heritage Day Sept. 16

Watford City will be hosting their 23rd Annual Heritage Day Sept. 16. Events will be held at the McKenzie County Heritage Park and North Dakota Oil Museum, 904 2nd Ave. SW, Watford City. The day will start at 11 a.m. with opening ceremonies and food service starting immediately after. They will be serving BBQ burgers, pulled pork sandwiches, and hot dogs. There will be several other food and goods vendors, and have openings for additional vendors should any be interested.

At 12:30 p.m., the educational entertainment will begin with an old-time school marm teaching a class. A belt-driven sawmill and shingle mill demonstration will follow at 1 p.m. The threshing machine demonstration, then a stationary hay baler, will have a coin toss into the resulting straw for the attending children. The blacksmith demonstration, costume contest, vendors and games will last throughout the day.

A cake walk, followed by a pie eating contest will start at 3:30 p.m. At 4:30 p.m., they will announce the silent auction winners, and end the day out at 5 p.m. with a closing ceremony.

The McKenzie County Heritage Park and North Dakota Oil Museum is open Memorial Day-Labor Day, and available to the public for family picnics and reunions. They also have a media center and kitchen available to rent for parties and meetings! Their hours are Wednesday through Saturday, 10 a.m.-6 p.m. and Sunday 1-5 p.m.

Barn Dance Fundraiser Sept. 16

Martha's Place, a non-profit organization established to develop a home-like environment for the residents in eastern Montana, will be holding a barn dance Saturday, Sept. 16, at the Richland County Fairgrounds. It will be a fundraiser for the construction that needs to be done to bring the future hospice into existence.

On Aug. 9, 2022, a ribbon cutting for a new non-profit hospice house, just south of Sidney, tasked with providing the dying with a safe and supportive environment for them to move to the other side.

Martha Nugent and her husband, Richard Garcia, were living in Texas when she felt God gave her a vision that she would build a hospice called Martha's Place. She has a passion for the elderly and the dying so she chose a career encompassing her interests. They moved to Sidney in 2020 for her work and joined St. Matthew's Catholic Church. In 2021, a fellow parishioner approached Martha and her husband. He had just purchased a large house at an auction and said he wanted to do something for the elderly with it and thought of them. Richard and Martha, both felt it was God providing for what He wanted her to do. The work was started and, on June 27, 2022, the non-profit paperwork was

finally accepted by the IRS.
Martha's Place will be available to anyone who chooses not to die in a facility regardless of social status or ability to pay. So far, the project has been paid for by fundraisers, donations, and grants.

The barn dance will be held in the cattle barn at the fairgrounds starting at 5 p.m. Cimarron Band from Billings will be playing live music. The Cattle-Ac will be providing food and drinks. There will be a mechanical bull, live, and silent auctions. Martha's Place wanted to offer special thanks to Bakken Balloon for their balloon decorations as well as Ryan and Nicki Bell for the haybales.

Four admission tickets for the National Finals Rodeo 2023 in Las Vegas, NV, Dec. 7-16, 2023 at the Thomas and Mack Center are being raffled off as an additional fundraiser. Raffle tickets will go on sale Monday, July 17-Sept. 15, at Wild Cat Trucking, Sidney. Raffle tickets will also be available for purchase at the Barn Dance until 8 p.m. The winner will be announced at the Barn Dance at 9 p.m.

Our mother was born on the Albertson family farm four miles south of Foxhome, MN, on Jan. 30, 1930. Her parents were Lawrence and Elizabeth (Lipovsky) Albertson. This was the beginning of the depression; times were

hard, and the family lived with her grandparents. The old farmhouse was full to the brim with parents, grandparents, a single uncle, a married uncle with his wife and new baby, and Mom's 15-year-old twin aunts.

Eventually her dad found work off the farm and the family moved, living in several places around Fergus Falls and Breckenridge, MN, over the years. The family grew and she became the oldest of seven children.

Mom graduated from Breckenridge High School in 1947 and enrolled in teacher's college in Valley City, ND. It was during her time in Valley City, ND, while working part time to help with school expenses, that she was given the nickname "Sandy" by an employer, Ralph Pomeroy (Earl Pomeroy's father). This was the moniker that stuck with her the rest of her life.

North Dakota had an "earn as you learn" program that allowed her to start teaching that fall while earning her normal school certificate. Mom was only 17 when she began teaching at the Dexter country school in eastern North Dakota.

After hearing that teachers were paid higher wages in Montana, Mom applied to schools there. At the age of 18 she took a train traveling west, and in Williston boarded the "Galloping Goose" headed for Sidney and the start of a new life.

She was picked up in Sidney by a neighbor, Chris Sorenson, and taken around the community to meet some of the students and their families. Their last stop was at the Ler farm. Although this family had no kids in school, the coffee pot was always on. This is where she met her future husband. Harold was sitting on a pile of gravel, where they had been making cement, and emptying the dirt out of his shoes.

Never one to let grass grow under her feet, Mom got a summer job with Farmers' Union as their educational director. That fall she began teaching at the Larsen School northwest of Savage. Two of her cousins, Chloe Houchen and Rita Wilson, soon joined her in teaching at rural schools in Richland County. The three cousins remained close for the rest of their lives.

Mom had always wanted to live on a farm and was eager to participate in farm life. Before they were married, Harold asked her to come with him to look at a horse that she described as very large. After the deal was done, the question of getting the horse home was raised and Dad revealed his plan. Mom would ride it home bareback, because it would "do them both some good."

Mom and Dad were married on Sept. 18, 1949, in Fergus Falls, and then moved into an apartment in Sidney. Mom worked at JCPenney and Harold worked at the sugar factory. After the sugar campaign was over, they moved to the farm to start a long career in crops, cows, chickens and kids.

Mom became a homemaker, substitute teacher, 4-H leader, Sunday and Bible school teacher, and farmer's helper. A creative writer, she came up with poems, skits, and stories for a wide variety of occasions. She loved to read and did everything with a book in one hand.

It seemed that Mom was always busy and active. Her numerous hobbies included raising fancy chickens, baking cakes for weddings and special occasions, crocheting, sewing, making guilts, recovering and refinishing furniture. embroidery, gardening and dabbling in rosemaling and decorative painting. She loved to entertain and engage with people. When her kids were grown, she volunteered with Friends of the Library, Council on Aging, Trails and Rails, and the MonDak Heritage Center, was active in Senior Citizens and her church, and tested and trained census workers.

Her faith was very important to her. She called her doilies her worry strings; crocheting kept her hands busy, and she prayed as her fingers moved. As she read, she would often memorize Bible verses and hymns; she was adamant about singing all the verses in church.

Mom loved her role as Gramma Sandy. She had seven grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren; each and every one was her favorite and felt completely loved and accepted.

Mother was always a bright spot in our lives, and we will be forever grateful for her cheerful presence, her dedication, the sacrifices she made for us, and the good example she set. She will be deeply missed.





Flu Myths. .Busted!

There are so many myths about the flu and the flu shot all over the internet, so in preparation for the Drive Thru Mass Flu Shot Clinic at the Richland County Fire Hall on Thursday, Sept. 29, we've busted a few myths wide open.

Many people claim they avoid the flu shot because it makes them sick. However, flu shot vaccine does not contain any live virus, so

it actually can't make you sick with the flu. The vaccine contains inactivated virus, which means that once it's in your body, your immune system can learn to respond to components of the virus, so that if you do come across the real flu virus, your body will be prepared. Because vaccines are designed to evoke an immune response, it is common to have injection site soreness or a slight fever, but these symptoms shouldn't last long. The Vaccine Information Sheet, offered during your vaccination clinic visit, explains potential risks and reactions.

Some others say they don't bother with the flu shot because it's not effective. Though the vaccine isn't 100% effective in avoiding the flu, it will help to avoid hospitalization should you contract influenza. Of the 214 cases of the flu last season in Richland County, 13 people were hospitalized for influenza. Getting the annual flu shot can help you minimize the risk of hospitalization and death.

If you're considering skipping the flu shot this year because you exercise and eat healthy, reconsider your decision. The flu virus doesn't discriminate, and even healthy people can become infected. The flu virus can be spread when a sick person sneezes, coughs or talks, or spread by surfaces shared by both sick and healthy people, like doorknobs in public, bathroom faucet handles, and shopping carts. You may lose income due to days off from work, or may face more serious consequences of the flu, such as hospitalization or death.

There are many reasons to get your flu shot this flu season. If you have questions or need help with the decision to get you and your family vaccinated against the flu, contact the Health Department at 406-433-

The Richland County Health Department will be holding its annual drive-thru mass flu shot clinic at the Richland County Fire Hall in Sidney on Thursday, Sept. 28, from 10 a.m.-6 p.m. The Drive-Thru Clinic will serve adults only, and offers both regular and high-dose flu shots. No other shots will

be given during the clinic. No COVID-19 vaccine will be given. No appointment is needed. Flu shots cannot be given to those who have animals in their vehicles. Children may be in the vehicle, but may not receive flu shots. Private insurance, Medicare and Medicaid will be billed for those who bring their insurance cards. Follow traffic signs to enter the Fire Hall from the north side.

Flu shots are available for those six months and older at the Richland County Health Department during normal clinic hours by appointment, from 10 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Monday-Wednesday. Additional clinic hours are the second Wednesday until 6 p.m., and the third Thursday of the month, from 10 a.m.-12 p.m. and 1-4 p.m. by appointment. 
