Pre-registration is requested by Tuesday, April 1 to give a food count, but is not required for attendance.

Community members are invited to attend an evening of discussion about local issues, specifically underage drinking and alcohol abuse.

The meeting will include a panel discussion with members from the following agencies: Watford City Police Department, McKenzie County Sheriff's Department, McKenzie County Healthcare Systems, McKenzie County Social Services, McKenzie County District #1 Superintendent of Schools, McKenzie County Ministerial Association, and McKenzie County District Court. Community members will leave with an understanding of Watford City's substance abuse prevention plan and ways to get involved in local efforts.

"It is great to see the community coming together to take action," said Jesse Wellen, Watford City Assistant Police Chief.

According to the 2013 Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 71% of Watford City high school students reported having at least one drink of alcohol on one or more days during their life. In the past 30 days, 40% of the Watford City high school students reported they had at least one drink of alcohol on one or more of the past 30 days.

Public Invited To Discussion On Energy, Keystone Pipeline





Spring Turkey **Drawing** Held, Licenses Remain

The 2014 spring wild turkey lottery has been held and hopeful hunters can check individual results by accessing the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website at gf.nd.gov.

More than 600 licenses remain in 11 units. The governor's proclamation allows a maximum of two licenses, and hunters who did not apply in the first drawing are also eligible.

Licenses remain in unit 06, Bowman County; unit 13, Dunn County; unit 19, Grant and Sioux counties and portions of Morton County; unit 25 McHenry County and portions of Pierce and Ward Counties; unit 31, Mountrail County; unit 40, Rolette County and portions of Bottineau, Renville. and Pierce counties; unit 44, Slope County; unit 45, Stark County; unit 47, Eddy, Foster, Kidder, Sheridan, Stutsman and Wells counties; unit 51, Burke County and portions of Renville, Bottineau and Ward counties; and unit 99, Mercer and Oliver counties.

Licenses are issued on a first-come, first-served basis beginning March 19. Applicants can apply online, or print an application to mail at the Game and Fish website. In addition, applications can be requested by calling (701) 328-6300. Only North Dakota residents are eligible to apply.

The spring turkey season opens April 12 and continues through May 18.


Results of 33rd Annual Quilt Show at MHC

Life of a Lady Landman

"Not many people are familiar with the term "landman" and attempt to correct me to "land woman". Landman is a gender neutral term and I am completely comfortable with that."

Fourth generation Montanan, Nicole Gorham from Billings says she comes from a long line of

"I am following in my father's footsteps as he has been a landman since the first boom of the 80s. He would lay out his maps on the floor and my sister and I would help him to color tracts, so I can claim that I have been in the industry most of my life."

After graduating high school, Nicole went to work with her father in the Powder River Basin when the coal bed methane play was very active. "He threw me right

summer as soon as he felt I was ready. He and I worked together off and on while I was going to school and continued after I graduated [college] in 2005."

Interestingly enough, Nicole's educational path into the oil patch was anything but ordinary. She started at MSU Bozeman in the field of genetics and biotechnology. However, Nicole explained, "My lack of study skills caught up with me by my third year and a graduate level microbiology class pushed me over the edge." In order to stimulate both hemispheres of her brain, Nicole said, she began taking classes in art, philosophy and religion. After being made aware of a new program by one of her favorite instructors, Nicole became a member of the first graduating class with the Science, Environment, Technology, and Society option in the History field.

The life of a landman isn't something everyone is cut out for. Nicole says that landmen are often left to ride the tide of a resource play, spending many hours on the road, in courthouses, and in hotel rooms. And since most landmen work as contractors, a life in this career is likely to involve a lot of travel, chasing resource plays and available contract jobs as they become available. But for Nicole, the landowners, flexibility, and freedom to work from home and schedule her own hours, make it

Today, Nicole owns her own

business in Sidney, NRG, which she says was created out of necessity in 2011.

Nicole explained that at NRG, "Our clients range from local landowners to major oil and gas companies. A landowner may seek advice on a contract that an oil company has offered him. We keep a good pulse on oil and gas activities in the Bakken and beyond."

NRG assists land and/or mineral owners in understanding legal terms in their leases or agreements, and when mineral ownership is called into question, NRG can provide clarification of ownership.

"For oil and gas companies, we can handle nearly every need they may have from running the mineral title and contacting the current mineral owners of record to obtain leases, to meeting with the landowners to work with them to place well locations on their property," said Nicole. She feels confident that her skill set and experience in the field give her company a leg up on newer competition especially.

Because NRG represents both companies in the industry, and the land or mineral owners, Nicole says, "We are able to remain sensitive to the needs and perspectives of both. We feel that this results in better communication, and an end product that fulfills the needs of all parties involved."

When asked about working in a male dominant field, Nicole said, "Some clients prefer to hire women as they make excellent landmen. Their work is often neater and more precise. Also, when it comes to negotiations, women tend to be more personable. The feminine aspect is an absolute asset for a landman."

In addition to owning her own business, Nicole serves as the President for the Montana Association of Professional Landmen, an organization centered on networking, education, and accountability for landmen within the state. According to Nicole, there are approximately 200 active members including both company and field landmen.

When asked which regulatory and/or policy issues were most pressing to landmen, Nicole responded passionately about licensing. Much of what landmen do in working with title comes easy to a realtor or an attorney who are required to maintain education credits to work in their field: landmen, however, are not held to that same standard, explained Nicole, adding that many in her field support the status quo. Nicole, on the other hand, says that she believes licensure for landmen adds accountability, and holds all to the same professional standards and ethics.

Like any career, working in the oil and gas industry comes with its share of tradeoffs.

"I was living with my sister in Missoula for a while and opted to refer to my job as a title examiner,

leaving off the oil and gas part. Doing that avoided pre-judgment

from uninformed individuals." Nicole's reluctance to share the details of her job with just anyone reflects the polarized and controversial nature that has come to define the petroleum industry, in spite of its many contributions, economic and otherwise.

"I generally enjoy what I do," said Nicole. "However, the entrance of an oil and gas play means different things to different people. For those that see it as a blessing and a needed source of income or the realization of the dream of their parents and grandparents before them, my job is a dream. Others see its presence as a burden and would prefer the time before oil was found in their town. "

Nicole seeks to combat negativity about the work she does by trying to help people see how their role plays a part in the greater picture of prosperity for their community and our nation as a whole. To those who voice opposition to the industry, drilling, or people like Nicole, she offers this advice.

"Step back and see that change has always occurred, and to place judgments of "good" or "bad" is failing to see the big picture. Yes, things are certainly different. Before the boom, Sidney subsisted on sugar beets, coal and cattle. None of that has changed. In fact, some farmers and ranchers who were once barely able to make ends meet are now able to maintain their

lifestyle due to the supplemental oil income. However, with those checks come the traffic, the dust, and the increased price of goods. Over time the trucks will lessen, along with the dust, and the prices will adjust. Patience is required."


In speaking with Nicole about the rise in anti-fracturing (aka "fracking") movements across the country and their effect on public policy, she offered the following explanation.

There are people who love the availability of abundant and affordable energy present in our country, but would prefer it to happen in someone else's backyard. Those protesting the drilling of the Beartooth front deem that land to be somehow more sacred or worthy than northeast Montana. But each person loves his home with his whole being. We all have to do our part."


When asked what she'd be doing had she not followed in her father's footsteps, Nicole responded, "I began the Master's program for elementary education as I genuinely enjoy working with children. However, I found that I have become accustomed to the lifestyle and freedom that being a landman affords me, so I swallowed three semesters of grad school loans."

What does her future hold? Within ten years, Nicole plans to have children, a home with a place for chickens, a huge garden, and river access, but adds, "Where that will be, only time will tell."

Department of Revenue **Convenes Local** Government

Advisory Council Submitted by Ted Brewer

In an effort to enhance the working relationship that the Department of Revenue has with local government officials, Revenue Department Director Mike Kadas has convened the Local Government Advisory Council. The group's initial meeting will be held on Monday, April 7, 2014, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Mitchell Building, 125 North Roberts, in Helena.

The Advisory Council will provide recommendations to Director Kadas and the Department of Revenue for how the department can better serve Montana's communities. Issues the council may tackle include departmental communications with local governments, shared revenue sources, annual certification of taxable values, newly taxable property and so on.

"It's important that the department hear from the communities we serve and make sure we're doing all we can to enhance our work there," Kadas says. "The members of the Advisory Council all have insight into what makes their communities and local governments tick. That kind of knowledge is invaluable to the department."

The Advisory Council consists of 11 people recommended by Director Kadas and appointed by Governor Bullock. They all have proven expertise over issues regarding governance, taxation, finance and budgets in local governments, schools, and tribes.

Those 11 include Carol Brooker, Sanders County Commissioner; Kim Buchanan is Treasurer of Gallatin County; Greg Chilcott, Ravalli County Commissioner; Paulette DeHart is Treasurer of Lewis and Clark County; Jerry Jimison, Mayor of Glendive; Doug Kaercher, Finance Director/City Clerk of Havre; Carole Lankford, Tribal Council Vice Chair of the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes; Donnie McVee, Business Manager of Laurel School District #7-70; Betty Romo, Roosevelt County Treasurer; Christina Volek, Billings City Administrator; and Jason Wiener, Missoula City Councilman.

The Advisory Council's term will last for two years.





Eight Tips to Get Your Lawn Mower Ready for Spring

(BPT) - With spring just around the corner, now is the perfect time to tune up your lawn mower for the season ahead. A yearly tune-up is important to ensure all parts of your mower are functioning properly and safely. Use these eight tips to rev up your engine and get your mower ready for

1. Read the operator's manual. Before operating your lawn mower, always read the operator's manual in its entirety to ensure safe and proper use of the equipment. Also be sure you understand and follow all instructions and are familiar with all the controls and functions. It's best to keep your manual in a safe place in case you need to reference it at any time.

2. Check your fuel. Fuel can go bad in as little as 30 days and bad fuel can result in a sputtering engine or prevent the mower from turning over. If the fuel has a strange odor or has become thick and viscous, it's best to drain it. Once you've drained the gas, fill the tank with fresh fuel. Check your operator's manual for information on the right fuel type for your mower as using improper fuel can damage your equipment.

3. Lubricate the throttle and moving parts. Leftover grease and oil can harden while your mower sits during the winter. To help loosen the hardened oil, apply a light lubricant on the narrow spring of the throttle. If you

have a mower with adjustable heights, make sure to lubricate the lever as well as any other moving parts.

4. Clean the air filter. Air filters shield your engine from dirt and can easily become clogged with oil and debris. This can prevent oxygen from entering the engine, resulting in coughs and sputters. It's recommended you replace your air filter every season for best engine performance. To clean a washable foam filter, soak it in warm, soapy water and squeeze it dry. If your unit uses a cardboard or paper filter, simply replace it.

5. Check and change the oil. Always check the oil level before using your mower, and be sure to change the oil filter and add new oil after using your mower for about five to eight hours. Running a motor on low oil can lead to low compression and can burn out the engine. Overfilling, however, can damage the seals. In this case, remove the oil plug, drain the old oil and refill the engine with the oil amount and type indicated in your opera-


6. Install a new spark plug. Spark plugs are inexpensive and should be replaced once a season. Over time, they can become rusted and corroded, and a fouled or corroded plug won't spark at all. Remember to always remove the spark plug wire before servicing. When removing the old one, check the spark plug

cable for signs of damage or rust. Do not clean or reuse old

spark plugs. 7. Inspect blades. A dull blade will cause grass tips to turn brown, and weakened grass blades are prone to pests and disease. If your blades are bent or dull, replace them with new blades to deliver a clean cut, optimum performance, increased life for your equipment and professional-looking results for your lawn. However, always replace parts with original equipment manufacturer (OEM) pieces that are specifically made for your machine to maximize performance and results.

8. Replace the belt or battery. Always be sure to clean any debris, leaves or grass clippings from under the deck to prevent rust and corrosion. If you own a self-propelled unit and the belt is heavily worn or shows signs of cracking, replace it immediately. If you have a unit with an electric start, however, make sure your battery didn't drain over the winter. Check your operator's manual for specific instructions for charging or replacing your battery.

Getting your mower in optimal shape is crucial for a well-maintained lawn and a safe season.





Andrea and Dick Davidson purchased their home north of Sidney 21 years ago. It was dark and outdated even then. Today, they have a beautiful, bright living space with all the latest features. Spring Into Health With These Tasty Snack Recipes

(BPT) - Healthy food that also tastes good is always in vogue and now it's getting a spring makeover.

The theme of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (AND) National Nutrition Month (R) this March is "Enjoy the Taste of Eating Right." As spring approaches and fitness routines move outdoors, AND reminds you that healthy snacks can fuel a workout, get you through the day and taste delicious.

"It's easy to get stuck in a rut with snacks," notes Becci Twombley, director of sports nutrition at the University of Southern California and ambassador for the American Pistachio Growers. "Spring is a time for renewal - cleaning out closets, setting new goals and making a fresh commitment to health and nutrition. Just as it's important to switch up your exercise routine every few weeks, you want to experiment with different snack combinations and have fun with your food. You'll be more likely to stick with a healthy routine if you keep it interesting."

Twombley's "snacks from scratch" involves some creativity. Try one of her snacking experiments below if you need a snack makeover this spring.

1. Pick one protein-based ingredient and think about different ways to eat it as a snack. Twombley often recommends pistachios as a performance snack for exercise because, calorie-for-calorie, pistachios pack more protein than most common snacks. Additionally, a serving size of pistachios is

49 nuts (more than any other tree nut), which provides 6 grams of filling protein and 3 grams of fiber for only 160 calories

Research at the University of Toronto and Pennsylvania State University suggests that eating about 1.5-2 ounces of pistachios (about 20 percent of calories) per day helps curb the rise in blood glucose after a meal and lowers blood pressure, blood triglycerides and LDL-cholesterol, all of which, in turn, lower the risk for metabolic syndrome and heart disease. Researchers at Loma Linda University found that high tree nut consumption was associated with a lower occurrence of obesity and metabolic syndrome, decreasing a person's risk for cardiovascular

disease, diabetes and stroke.

2. Work backwards. Think about your favorite snacks, and then experiment with different ways to add new proteins to that snack. For instance, Twombley loves the portability of sport bars, but not the lengthy ingredient list that can accompany some store-bought brands. Instead, Twombley encourages her athletes to make their own sport bars. The Pistachio Sport Bars recipe below combines the protein power of pistachios with energizing carbohydrates and allows you to control the ingredients in your own

kitchen

3. Get creative with the ultimate snack duo: protein and fiber. Rather than buying a traditional trail mix, make your own mix of pistachios and your favorite dried fruit. Mix pistachios with air popped popcorn for a satisfying and filling post-workout snack. Or make your own easy and portable American Pistachio Fruit Chews, which combine a mixture of fresh and dried fruit and pistachios.

 1/3 cup brown sugar
 3/4 cup crisp oat flakes

Directions:
Chop the pistachios
coarsely and banana chips

coarsely and banana chips finely. Partly crush the cornflakes. Cut the pears and apricots into small cubes.

Heat the honey and sugar over a double boiler until the honey and sugar are well combined. Mix in the pistachios, banana chips, cornflakes, pears, apricots and oat flakes. Spread the mixture in a square dish lined with baking paper (9 1/2 x 9 1/2 inches), approximately 1/2 inch deep, and press well into dish. The bars can also be formed individually and then be put on a baking tray lined with baking paper.

Bake the mix in a pre-heated oven at 350 F for about 10-15 minutes. Cut into bars of

approximately 1 1/2 x 2 inches and leave to cool on a tray.
