
Bolken has been involved in some sort of travel or tourism ever since college, making him the best candidate for the position. Bolken, with his wife and son, moved back

Sidney Health Center Welcomes First Baby of 2013

Jayson David Charles Black Dog was the first baby born at Sidney Health Center in 2013. Marissa DeMarrias and Ceejay Black Dog of Fort Kipp welcomed their baby boy on January 4 at 12:48 p.m. He weighed 7 pounds 4.4 ounces and measured 20.5 inches long. Jayson joins two brothers, Ronnie and Thomas.

For being the first baby born at Sidney Health Center in 2013, Jayson and his parents received a gift basket full of baby items valued at more than \$200 from the Sidney Health Center Volunteers

Although Jayson was the first baby born in 2013, 2012 was a busy year for the obstetric department. In the past year, 146 babies were delivered at Sidney Health Center averaging 12 babies per month. Seventy-two of the babies were girls while seventy-four were boys.

The Sidney Health Center obstetric and newborn units feature Labor, Delivery, Recovery, Postpartum (LDRP) rooms. These rooms are equipped with Jacuzzi



tubs and Hill-Rom birthing beds. During labor, options for pain medication are offered. A trained and experienced OB and Nursery Staff is available 24 hours a day.

The obstetric department also offers a One-Day Childbirth Class four times per year. Instructors, Joyce Schulz, RN and Katharine King, RN will review the following topics: relaxation, anatomy and physiology of

childbirth, types of delivery, anesthesia, breast feeding and child care. The session is free of charge; however, donations up to \$25 are gladly accepted to cover expenses.

Join the American Red Cross in Celebrating National Blood Donor Month

Throughout the month of January, the American Red Cross celebrates the contributions of thousands of volunteer blood donors in Montana who give the gift of life with every blood donation.

January has been designated National Blood Donor Month to raise awareness of blood donation during the time of year when blood supplies often fall to their lowest levels. Donations traditionally decline

during the post-holiday season, due to busy schedules and inclement weather which can prevent people from keeping donation appointments. At the same time, the need for blood remains constant in the early months

Giving blood is a way to support the community by helping to ensure that a stable inventory is available for premature babies, cancer patients, or the many people who suffer accidents and other illnesses which may

require transfusions. National Blood Donor Month not only honors those who give blood each year, but is also a time to educate and encourage new donors about the importance of giving blood. Blood has a shelf life of only 42 days, and, therefore, must continually be replenished. Donors can give blood every 56 days, or up to six times a year.

Each day, the Red Cross in Montana collects approximately 155 units of blood to distribute to patients at approximately 30 hospitals and transfusion centers in Mon-

Any healthy person age 18 (or age 16/17 with signed parental consent) or older and weighing at least 110 pounds may be eligible to donate blood. Valid identification is required for all blood donations.

All eligible donors are asked to schedule an appointment to donate blood at the Richland County community blood drive on January 22nd from 12-6 p.m. at St. Mathews Parish by calling 1-800-695-7258 or visit redcrossblood.org.

NOAA Reps To Discuss **Upcoming Weather** Possibilities For NE Montana In ARS Brownbagger

The USDA-Agricultural Research Service's Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory (NPARL) in Sidney will open its 11th winter Brown Bagger series at noon on Friday, Jan. 18th with a special weather "preview" presentation by Dr. William Martin and Brad Mickelson with the National Weather Service Office in Glasgow, MT. The event is open to the pub-

Entitled "Near-Term and Long-Term Weather Possibilities in Northeast Montana," the presentation will review current expectations for the weather and climate of Northeast Montana including near-term climate predictions for the next couple seasons, and what might be expected to result longer-term from global warming. The Weather Service duo will also look at the extremes of what could happen, based on events of the historical past.

Dr. Martin is the Science and Operations Officer at the National Weather Service Office in Glasgow, MT; and Mickelson is a forecaster with that same office.

This kickoff presentation for NPARL's 2013 Brown Bagger series will be held in the lab's Tech Transfer Room on Friday, Jan. 18, from noon to 1 p.m. The lab is located at 1500 N. Central Avenue in Sidney, MT.





According to a press release, Continental Resources, Inc. has completed the acquisition of 119,218 net acres in the Bakken field, primarily in Williams and Divide counties, North Dakota, from Samson Resources Company for \$649.3 million in cash, subject to post-close adjustments. The acquisition includes production of approximately 6,500 barrels of oil equivalent per day (Boepd), of which 82 percent is crude

Continental Resources Successfully Completes Initial Test Well In Third Bench Of The Three Forks Reservoir In The Bakken Field

According to a press release, Continental Resources, Inc., a top 10 petroleum liquids producer in the United States, announced today it successfully completed the first horizontal well to test the third bench (TF3) of the Three Forks zone in the Bakken field of North Dakota and Montana.

Continental has been a pioneer in the discovery and

development of the Three Forks reservoir in the Bakken field. They were the first to demonstrate incremental reserves from the First Bench in 2008 and the first to establish commercial production from the Second Bench, lower than the First, in 2011. Establishing production from the Third Bench is yet another significant milestone in the growth of the Company's assets in the world-class Bakken oil field. If the unit in

the Third Bench continues to perform in line with the Second Bench, it will be the first well to establish commercial production in the third bench.

The unit is the first in the Bakken field to have wells producing from three separate horizons the Middle Bakken, First and Second Benches.

Continental estimated in late 2010 that the Bakken field would eventually yield 24 billion barrels of oil equivalent (Boe), based on technology available at that time. This estimate included 20 billion barrels of oil and 4 billion Boe of natural gas, and assumed 577 billion barrels of original oil in place in the Bakken and First Bench. With the addition of oil found in the lower Three Forks benches, Continental now estimates the field has 903 billion barrels of original oil in place, a 57 percent in-





IRA Charitable Rollover Extended

The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 has a short window of opportunity to make a qualifying distribution for calendar year 2012.

The IRA charitable rollover, which was renewed on January 2, 2013, allows individual taxpayers older than 70 ½ years to donate up to \$100,000 from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) and Roth IRAs to charitable nonprofits without having to treat the withdrawals as taxable income.

The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 extends for 2012 and 2013 the IRA rollover giving incentive, which expired at the end of 2011. The legislation will continue to allow individuals 70 ½ years and older to give up to \$100,000 from their IRAs to charitable nonprofits without being taxed on their contributions. The law retroactively restores the tax incentive by permitting eligible individuals to give their mandatory distributions taken in

December 2012 or January 2013 to charities like the Foundation for Community Care and apply the rollover to their 2012 tax filing.

If you took your IRA with-drawal in December 2012, and are interested in making a tax-free gift, we encourage you to speak with your tax professional or Staci Miller at the Foundation for Community Care by calling 406-488-2273 or stopping by our office at 221 2nd Street NW, Sidney, MT.

Protests will be accepted from residents of the county from which the application originates, residents of adjoining counties, or residents of adjoining counties in another state if the criteria in subsection (4)(d) are met.

Each protestor is required to mail a separate letter that contains in legible print, the protestor's full name, mailing address, and street address. Each letter must be signed by the protestor. Protest petitions bearing the names and signatures of more than one protestor will not be considered. Protest letters must provide the trade name, or applicant name associated with the license being protested for identification purposes. Protest letters must contain a clear statement of the writer's intent to protest the application. The grounds for protest of an application for a new license are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA for denial of a license, and public convenience and necessity as set forth in section 16-4-203, MCA. Protest letters which do not provide the information described in this paragraph will not be considered valid protest letters. Only those grounds for protest raised in valid protest letters will be considered at hearing. An individual's testimony at hearing will be limited to the grounds for protest raised in that individual's valid protest letter.

If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(a), MCA, a hearing will be scheduled in Helena, Montana. If the department receives a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(b), MCA, to determine public convenience and necessity, a hearing will be held in the county in which the proposed premises is located. All qualified protestors will be notified of the time, date, and location of the hearing. Hearings are typically scheduled within 90 days following the protest deadline.

If a sufficient number of protests to require a hearing are not received and all licensing criteria have been satisfied, the department may issue the license without holding a hearing.
