April, Alcohol Awareness Month

Snowbirds to Fly May 22

April is Alcohol Awareness Month, a nationwide campaign intended to raise awareness of the health and social problems that excessive alcohol consumption can cause for family, friends and our community.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention:

Binge drinking is about more than just the number of binge drinkers. The amount and number of times binge drinkers drink are also important to address.

Age group with most binge drinkers: 18-34 years

Age group that binge drinks most often: 65+ years

Income group with most binge drinkers: more than \$75,000

Income group that binge drinks the most often and drinks most per binge: less than \$25,000

Most alcohol-impaired drivers binge drink.

Most people who binge drink are not alcohol dependent or alcoholics.

More than half of the alcohol adults drink is while binge drinking.

More than 90% of the alcohol youths drink is while binge drinking.

Binge drinking costs everyone

In a recent study drinking too much cost \$746 per person, in the US. These costs include health care expenses, crime, and lost productivity.

Binge drinking cost federal, state, and local governments about 62 cents per drink, while federal and state income from taxes on alcohol totaled only about 12 cents per drink.

Drinking too much contributes to over 54 different injuries and diseases, including car crashes, violence, and sexually-transmitted diseases.

The chance of getting sick and dying from alcohol problems increases significantly for those who binge drink more often and drink more when they do.

So what is "Binge Drinking"? For men: drinking 5 or more alcoholic drinks within a short period of time or for women: drinking 4 or more drinks within a short period of time.

So what can you do? Drink in moderation if you do drink. The US Dietary Guidelines on alcohol consumption recommend no more than 1 drink per day for women and no more than 2 drinks per day for men for those over 21. Pregnant or nursing women, those on medication and underage youth should not drink alcohol. NEVER DRINK AND DRIVE!

The Canadian Snowbirds will return to Sidney May 22.

The Sidney-Richland Airport will be hosting an open house which will offer a free air show on May 22. Starting off the 2013 season, the Canadian Snowbirds, an aircraft demonstration team, will be performing their air formations in Sidney as a "muck up" of their their Sunday performance getting cancelled due to high winds at the airshow three years ago.

The Snowbirds began back in 1971, following the 'Golden Centennaires' who flew formations for Canada's centennial year in four years prior. After a few years, they were made an official unit of the Canadian Forces.

The Snowbirds fly basic pilot-training aircrafts, which can reach speeds of 470 miles an hour. All members of the Snowbirds are personnel of the Canadian Forces who have accumulated many years of military experience. They are selected based on their skill and experience and go through a rigorous series of try-outs to check their proficiency in formation flying. With a third of the pilots rotating out through a three year period, the team trains the new members in.

The Snowbirds fly approximately 70 shows a year at 50 different locations across North America. This causes the unit to be traveling for six months out of the year. In those six months, they will return to their home base about four times for a couple days in order to do maintenance.

In order to get the Snowbirds at a venue, applications

must be put in two years in advance. This makes this scheduled appearance in Sidney almost unheard of. For more information on the Canadian Snowbirds please go to their website at: www.snowbirds.dnd.ca.

Suicide Intervention Training Workshop Available

District II Alcohol and Drug Program of Sidney will be conducting an Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) in Glendive on Monday and Tuesday April 29th and 30th from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day. Training will be held at the Glendive Medical Center's Carney Conference Room located at 202 Prospect Drive in Glendive.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) provides participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to recognize persons at risk of suicide and to undertake appropriate management or referral of individual. Suicide and non-fatal suicidal behaviors,

ranging from gestures to suicide attempts, are far more common than most people realize. Almost everyone will come into contact with suicidal behaviors in some significant way during their lifetime. Many people are trained to administer first aid to someone having a heart attack, but very few people know emergency first aid for preventing suicide.

The ASIST workshop will deal directly with attitudes about suicide prevention. On the first day of the training, participants will learn how to recognize those persons who might be at risk by identifying a number of different signs and indicators. Some of the major warning signs of suicide include sudden changes in behavior or

personality, previous suicide attempts, suicidal statements which express a desire or intention to die, and feelings of depression, helplessness, hopelessness, isolation, and loss. One of the most important first aid skills to have is the ability to ask directly about the suicide intentions of someone you are worried about. Skill development exercises and community networking activities will take up the entire second day of the workshop.

ASIST training is provided free of charge by District II Alcohol & Drug Program in an effort to build the necessary capacity within community members to identify signs of someone in crisis and intervene appropriately to get the help that is

needed.

The training is open to the public; however gatekeepers such as teachers, school counselors, medical and mental health professionals, law enforcement, substance abuse treatment counselors, prevention and faith based professionals are encouraged to participate. Training will be facilitated by certified ASIST Trainers, Tim Anderson, Clinical Director District II Alcohol & Drug Program, and Tara Hubing, Counselor, Circle Public Schools with 14 continuing education credits available for counselors, educators and law enforcement. Registration is necessary as class size is limited. To register, please contact Ronda Welnel at District II Alcohol & Drug Program at 433-4097 or email rwelnel@hotmail.com.

Lead Paint Certification Training Offered

Montana and North Dakota have many homes built before 1978 which may contain lead-based paint. Companies and contractors in all states doing work on these homes and some other buildings are required to be trained and EPA Certified. To become certified, contractors can now take a training offered by MSU Extension in Sidney, MT.

Common renovation, repair, and painting activities that disturb lead-based paint can create hazardous lead dust and chips which can be harmful to adults and even more so to children. The term renovation covers all activities done for compensation that disturb painted surfaces including most interior and exterior repair, remodeling, painting and maintenance activities. But with careful work practices and thorough clean-up, renovations can be done safely. EPA's Lead Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule (RRP Rule) lowers the risk of lead contamination from home renovation activities. It requires that companies performing renovation, repair, and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities and pre-schools built before 1978 be certified by EPA and use certified renovators who are trained by EPA-approved training providers to follow lead-

safe work practices. Training, certification, and work practice requirements in the Renovation, Repair and Painting Rule were effective April 22, 2010. Non-compliant contractors may be fined up to \$37,500.00 per violation.

To provide the EPA RRP training and certification, the MSU Extension and Health Department of Richland County are hosting the 8 hour certification class on June 4th at the Richland County Extension Office (1499 N Central Ave, Sidney, MT 59270). The class begins at 7:30 AM and ends at 6:30 PM with a break for lunch. The cost of the certification is \$200.00 per person. Refreshments will be provided. The class will be taught by Mike Vogel, MSU Extension Housing and Environmental Health Specialist and EPA Approved Training Provider. Since the RRP Rule went into effect Vogel has trained over 2000 contractors throughout Montana and U.S. One training certifies for 5 years.

Pre-registration and payment are required by May 23rd. State-rate hotel rooms are reserved for participants who register before May 4th.

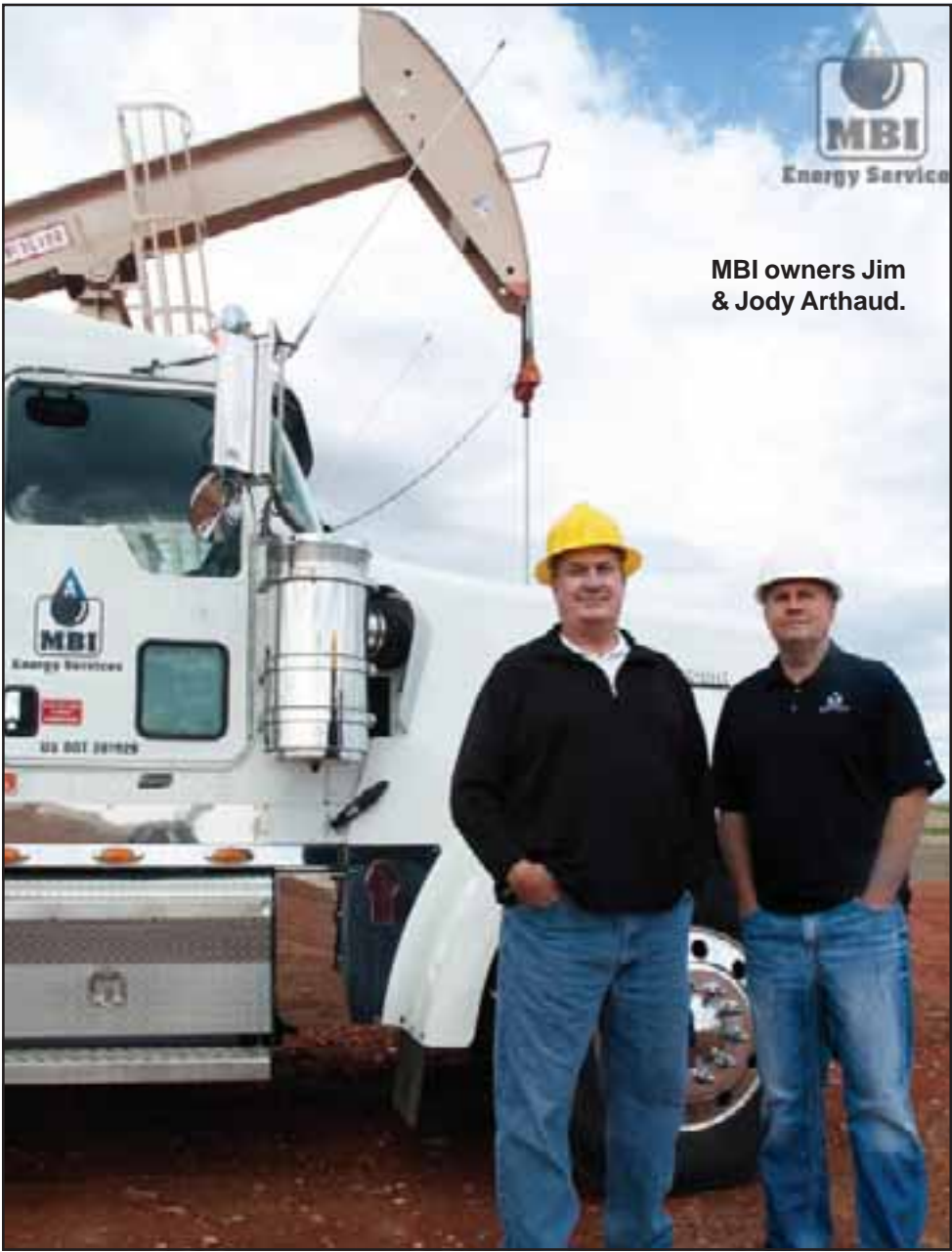
