Shoebox Recipient Coming to Sidney

This year, during Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church's Vacation Bible School, the church is proud to present Kimheang Vance. Kimheang is a former Operation Christmas Child shoebox recipient who is coming to share her story.

Every year, Shepherd of the Valley holds a Vacation Bible School during the first few weeks in June. This year it will be June 6-10. They try to do a mission project every year during VBS. Last year, they raised about \$4,000 for Jesus Film Harvest Partners. This year they plan to raise enough money to pack 200 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. I spoke with Karen Huskamp, Pastor Huskamp's wife and head of this year's VBS program, about it and she told me she wanted more. Since the project was to help fund Operation Christmas Child she wanted to get someone who had benefited from the program to come speak but it would not be easy. They are called Full Circle Speakers and are not usually sent to speak in small communities because of the low population density. Shepherd of the Valley's VBS is very popular, however, and they are expecting 200 kids this year. Huskamp sent out her request. The very next day she got a callback. She said, "I'm excited. It's a privilege to get somebody here." Kimheang Vance will be coming Wednesday, June 8. The church is holding a community BBQ that evening from 5-6 p.m, and Vance will speak at 6:30 p.m. The event is free and everyone

According to Samaritan's Purse's website, www. samaritanspurse.org, Operation Christmas Child was started in 1990 by a couple in the United Kingdom by

the name of Dave and Jill Cooke. In 1993, the Cookes merged their project with Samaritan's Purse and expanded their reach to over 28,000 children in just that year. Fast forward to 2021 and 10,505,155 shoebox gifts were packed and sent out to awaiting children. Collection week varies from

year to year but in 2022

from Nov. 14-21, shoebox gifts will be collected in the United States and 10 other countries to be handed out in over 170 other countries and territories. Shepherd of the Valley is one of the many collection sites here in the United States. Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church is located at 211 E. Holly St., Sidney.

Richland County Special Planning Board Meetings To Be Held, First Since 2020

Tuesday, May 24, and Wednesday, May 25, will be the first time the Richland County Planning Board has met since January, 2020.

Both meetings will be held in the Nutter Building conference room, 123 West Main St., Sidney.

The meeting is long overdue. The planning board is mandated to meet four times a year but, like so

many other things, their usual plans were disrupted by COVID-19. January, April, July, and October are the months they usually meet but the Governor's directive made it so that local governments did not need to follow certain deadlines provided in state law and regulations. Between the directive and the lack of business that required planning board attention because of it, the planning board did not resume regular meetings until the board was fully reappointed due largely to expired terms.

The first meeting Tuesday starts at 7 p.m. It will consist of elections, comments on the elections, and swearing-in of new members. They will have petitions and communications from the audience as well. Then there will be time for the

disclosure of any conflicts of interest, general discussion of planning activities, an update from Contract Planner Joel Nelson, Land Solutions, LLC, and reports from the planning board committees. The meeting the next day starts much earlier, at 1 p.m. After the swearing-in of new members who were not at the first meeting and public comments, will have the usual disclosure of any

conflicts of interest, then a training by MACo Counsel Karen Alley and Contract Planner Joel Nelson. The training will be on ethics, ex parte communications, public participation, 2021 land use updates, and the subdivision review process. Nelson will give a mock subdivision review and the training will be wrapped up.

Pooch Receives Above And Beyond For Fairview Award

Calling her "unprecedented in her activities for the Fairview Schools and highly motivated to help the community in any way possible," the members of Fairview's FFA nominated Vanessa Pooch for the Above and Beyond For Fairview award which was presented to her by Chamber member Kerry Finsaas at the recent FFA banquet.

The nomination letter stated that "there is one person who has done extensive work for the Fairview community, motivating the younger generation, promoting mental health and increasing our kids' self - worth, all while challenging our youth to fulfill their potential. The area Vanessa is most recognized for is her participation in the Fairview FFA program. She has taken time out of her life to coach, manage, and even counsel the Fairview youth. In her six years as advisor, she has grown the program to 24 students. This approximates 20% of the entire student population, an unprecedented level for any intracurricular activity. It's through her dedication and selfless service that the program has become recognized statewide as a leading chapter."

The nomination went on to say, "Outside the FFA program, she has become more than an advisor to the youth of Fairview. She has worked with students to understand the importance of setting achievable goals and work for those accomplishments. She has become such an influence on these youth that they will forever be touched by her leadership. Even after graduating, she stays in touch to counsel and assist the individuals as they learn to navigate the world beyond high school."

"She has taught the students the importance of community development and has worked with them to achieve community health. One example of such development is the "Thank a Farmer" program where the chapter would prepare and distribute meals during the sugar beet harvest. The Fairview FFA program also improves the community by construction of benches at Sundheim Park, helping to serve meals at MonDak Ag Days, and doing community cleanup days."

"As you can see, Vanessa Pooch is a strong pillar of this community that

deserves the best we have to give her. One way to honor her is to present her with this prestigious award."

Pooch grew up on a farm near Farwell, MN helping her family raise corn and soybeans and operate a feedlot. After watching her older brother participate in FFA, she knew she wanted to be a part of it and started in 8th grade. She raised her own market steers and showed cattle in 4-H and FFA throughout high school. She remained a member through the second national convention as she attended college at South Dakota State, receiving the prestigious American FFA Degree, which is achieved by only 2% of members, at the first convention. She worked with South Dakota FFA and their state convention, mostly behind the scenes, coordinating contests and photographing events.

After receiving her degree in Agricultural Business, she got her first job as an agriculturalist at Sidney Sugars where she worked for eight years, completing nine beet harvests. Wanting to continue her involvement with FFA, she quickly reached out to the Sidney program about an alumni association, catching the attention of principal Dan Peters who contacted her to become the interim advisor after the departure of the Sidney Advision. "I was able to step in and keep the momentum going for the students for about four months," Pooch said.

Meanwhile, a group of Fairview students was pushing the school board to revive their FFA program, and some parents suggested that Pooch might be willing to fill the position. The first meeting with students was held in January 2017. "It was supposed to be an interim position. I'm still there," Pooch said with a smile. "FFA is near and dear to my heart. There's no compromise on having FFA or not."

The first year, there were only seven or eight members but that has grown to an active group of 24. "Any chapter has to have growing years and patience for the students to see what the program is all about," Pooch explained. "Now the students are showing the fun projects that their hard work has enabled them to do. We work hard and we play hard."

Sometimes the hard work doesn't seem very

important, like putting an apple in hundreds of lunch bags, until the member sees a farmer tear up when he receives that bag as part of the Thank a Farmer activity. So many other service projects may seem the same until the member sees the benefit, and really enjoys the outcome. Pooch said it's really hard work from the beginning of the school year until the Montana FFA Ag Expo in November when the members participate in competitions where they rely on each other and trust each other to make it through. They have fun at the expo, which ends with a dance and just enjoy themselves.

As well as their many other service projects, FFA paired up with FCCLA in the Trash Dash through Recycle Montana. In two hours, the groups picked up 40 lbs. of trash plus a bunch of recyclables which were given to ROI. The effort won them a pizza party plus the prize for best PPE, fluorescent vests.


Celebrating Seniors In Richland County May 20





Gorder & Holst Running For District 2 Commissioner

In three weeks Richland County voters will be able to vote for a District 2 Commissioner. The term of the current commissioner, Shane Gorder, expires on Dec. 31 of this year. Two men are running for the position. Shane Gorder is running for another term, while Brian Holst is seeking his first.

Richland County is divided into three districts. Voters from each district can vote one commissioner into office. The three commissioners combined form Richland County's Board of County Commissioners. According to the Montana State Legislature on their website, www.leg.mt.gov, "the board of County Commissioners has jurisdiction and power under such limitations and restrictions as are prescribed by law, to represent the county and have the care of the county property, and the management of the business and concerns of the county in all cases where no other provision is made by law". The Commissioners not only have to address the concerns of the district they represent, but they also must band together and represent Richland County as a whole before the state legislature in Helena. They supervise the other county officials, assessing, collecting, safekeeping, managing,

or disbursing public revenue

for family to return to or call home." Gorder and the other commissioners plan to continue on the way they have for his last two terms. They are currently working with Savage School on their drinking water issues. Lambert needs updates to their lagoon and water system as well. They have also been working with the Sidnev/Circle Subdivision to complete their water system, sewer system, streets, curbs, and guttering. The work for that is set to start this summer. They have also been asked by the Thiel Subdivision to assist them with their drinking water conditions. Gorder and the other commissioners are discussing helping with the Dry Redwater Project in the northwest from Culbertson to Highway 201 to bring water to parts of the county. He plans to continue as he has. Gorder is a Sidney native who worked with the road department, driving heavy equipment for 7 1/2 years. Before he was a county commissioner Gorder had served the community through different organizations. He helped build steer pens, mend, and put up fencing as a 4-H Leader. He also helped plan the decorative sidewalk

in Veteran's Memorial Park as part of a project he did as part of the Chamber's Leadership Class.

Brian Holst is seeking his first term of office. He has been the co-owner of J & L Fencing and Pitliners for the past 30 years. Holst says he likes to run things like a business. He said about the county's revenue, "You shouldn't spend it all at one time." During a recent speech, speaking of all the new government buildings, "All these new buildings will need maintenance in the foreseeable future. That being said, they are not assets, they are liabilities that will need repair at the taxpayer's expense. We have the money now but will we always? I think we need to save some of our money for the future, and not spend it all." He also said he wanted to see property taxes lowered, and if not, at least steady. He also said, "I've always thought people should be taxed as little as possible." Holst also spoke of MACo having too much power and wanting more transparency among the commissioners.

Both candidates are running as Republicans. The winner of the primary will run unopposed in the Nov. 8 general election.






