Environment Council Puts Rules Limiting Radioactive Waste Back On Track

The Montana Environmental Quality Council has reversed course to let safeguards for disposal of radioactive waste go into effect.

The Department of Environmental Quality had proposed rules setting a limit of 50 picocuries per gram for TENORM waste accepted in Montana landfills. TENORM is naturally occurring radioactive material with technologically elevated radioactivity. TENORM comes to Montana mostly from the oilfield in North Dakota. The 50 pCi/gm level is consistent with science reports, North Dakota's rule, a stakeholder work group, and over 2,400 public comments.

The proposed rules were about to go into effect when suddenly they were placed on the agenda of EQC for its April 2020 meeting. EQC sidetracked six years of citizen work in the DEQ rule making process. Apparently favoring a quadrupled radioactivity level of 200 pCi/gm, it voted 10-to-6 to file an objection to the proposed rules. The objection delayed the rules going into effect. Had EQC continued its objection at its May meeting, sidetracking would have become permanent derailment.

Richland County Commissioner Duane Mitchell had worked in the stakeholder-working group for favorable rules. Commissioner Shane Gorder and Richland County Civil Attorney Tom Halvorson testified in Helena for consistency with North Dakota to prevent Montana from becoming a dumping ground for out-of-state TENORM and for notice to local government of TENORM spills for the safety of local responders. Commissioners Loren H. Young, Mitchell, and Gorder filed written public comments supporting public safety.

After six years of seesawing work, Richland County could support DEQ's proposed rules. When EQC sidetracked the effort, the Commissioners worked intensively to move the proposed rules back onto the main track.

The Commissioners had Civil Attorney Halvorson prepare a 20-page "Background on TENORM Disposal Rulemaking," documented with 70 footnotes to dispel misinformation given to EQC about what had happened during the rule making process and focus on the science of involved. The Background was distributed to all EQC members, EQC staff, DEQ staff, many news organizations, and others.

The Commissioners filed two public comments highlighting key information from the "Background." They submitted letters to the editors of nine Montana newspapers informing the public and inviting participation. They filed a Freedom of Information request for communications between the Montana Petroleum Association and EQC.

Two editorials by Civil Attorney Halvorson were published in the Billings Gazette, The Montana Standard, The Roundup and the Sidney Herald.

Senator Mike Lang deserves credit for his actions in EQC's May 27, 2020 meeting. He acknowledged the extensive work by many people over the long rule making process. He said most of the questions that existed in the April meeting had since been answered. This demonstrated a commendable openness to receive and genuinely consider new information. Sen. Lang moved to withdraw the objection. The Council voted 13-to-2 in favor of the motion, which means the objection is withdrawn and DEQ may proceed to finish the process of putting the rules into place.

Fairview FFA Member Elected As Montana State FFA Parliamentarian

Allyson Young, a recent graduate of Fairview High School, has been selected to serve as the 2020-2021 Montana State FFA Parliamentarian.

Young joined FFA as a high school freshman and has been a member of the Fairview FFA Chapter ever since. She comes from a long line of FFA alumni: her grandfather, dad, and brother were all FFA members, which ultimately inspired her to become a member.

Over Young's four years of membership, she has participated in many FFA competitions, leadership conferences/camps, and has implemented several projects within her chapter. "Many projects that I have done have been service projects, but my senior project, Presents for Paws, came to me through an idea I had at the Washington Leadership Conference. I collected donations at a home basketball game of pet food, blankets, toys, and other miscellaneous items to donate to the local veterinary clinic to distribute to those fostering animals in the area. Another project was the "Thank A Farmer Breakfast," which entailed the chapter getting together and assembling breakfast burritos and snack bags to deliver to the local beet farmers and truck drivers during the harvest season as a way to express our gratitude for what they do."

Young explained that her favorite part about FFA is the amount of opportunities the organization provides for members along with all of the friendships, connections, impact, and memories that she has made.

When Young was asked how FFA has impacted her life, she responded with, "How hasn't FFA impacted my life? FFA has shaped me into the person I am by challenging me to dig deeper and take every opportunity to create the best version of myself. Now that I have been selected as the 2020-2021 State Parliamentarian, my life will change with new responsibilities that I am excited to have. I am especially excited to work with my new team to hopefully make an impact on members like we have been impacted and to show them the vast expanse of opportunity FFA holds."

Young recalled, "At my very first state convention - after watching the 2016-2017 team on stage during the session and throughout the convention, I decided I wanted to be a state officer. I remember after the final session telling my advisor, Vanessa Pooch, that I wanted to be a state officer. She turned back to me with a smile and said, "Okay, I'll hold you to that."

And it turns out that Pooch did hold her to that - when Young's name was announced as one of the 2020-2021 Montana State Officers - Vanessa Pooch, Fairview FFA Advisor, was very excited. NWNDCF Relief Fund Grants Exceed \$70,000

Williston, ND - The Northwest North Dakota Community Foundation (NWNDCF) has awarded grants from the Relief Fund to organizations supporting human services and access to food in Williams, Divide, McKenzie, and Mountrail counties as a result of COVID-19 and energy industry pressures. This grant allocation brings the total committed from the Relief Fund to \$71,000 through 26 individual grant applications.

The most recent grant awards total \$5,000 and reflects the priorities of food security and access to personal care products:

- \$1,000 to the YWCA: Funds will be utilized to support access to personal care products, specifically diapers, by parents and families in need. Through monthly "diaper drops" in Stanley, Watford City, Williston, and Crosby, diapers will be distributed throughout western North Dakota.
- \$2,000 to the Out in Faith Bakken Oil Ministries (Williston): Funds will be utilized to continue providing food,

personal care products, and emergency care items (phone cards, transportation, and limited housing for individuals in transition) to individuals and families in need throughout Williston.

• \$2,000 to Community Connections: Funds will be utilized to provide ongoing services and support through their Lunch Connections (LC) program and People in Crisis Support (PICS) program. The funds will allow Community Connections to meet the rapid changes being presented and help them find alternative ways to meet the increasing needs.

"While we don't know how long this temporary economic crisis will last, we do know that we continue to see - week after week - the growth in need across our region. As we continue our weekly grantmaking, we invite organizations and community groups working to better the lives of our friends and neighbors to submit an application to support their cause," remarked Ward Koeser, NWNDCF Board of Directors president. "We hope to continue funding organizations and groups undertaking worthwhile relief and recovery work throughout our region for as long as we are able."

MSU Extension Discusses Distribution Of Personal Belongings After Death

Bozeman — After a person's death, the matter of dividing up their personal belongings can become a complicated matter. According to Montana State University Extension, the Montana Uniform Probate Code allows a person to create a separate list in his or her will that specifies the distribution of personal belongings such as jewelry, china, firearms, photos and more.

"The list cannot include cash, stocks and bonds, mutual funds, other intangible

personal property, or real estate, because those items have titles," said Marsha Goetting, MSU Extension family economics specialist. "The list is not a part of the will but separate from it. The list must identify both items and the persons to receive them with reasonable certainty."

The list may be prepared before or after writing a will. It can be handwritten or typed and must be signed and dated. As new possessions are acquired, individuals can update the list, which should be kept with the will so the personal representative can distribute items to intended recipients.

Pondera County Extension agent Wendy Wedum suggested individuals who are ready to part with some items share them with family members before death. She also suggests talking to relatives and find out which items hold special memories for them.

"Transferring personal property can be a time to celebrate your life, share

memories and stories, and continue traditions and family history," Wedum said. "Sharing stories about special objects helps your family members understand their past, discover another aspect of their family and appreciate the real accomplishments of their ancestors."

Wedum and Goetting added that individuals should keep in mind the sentimental value of belongings may be different depending on the recipient's age. For instance, a grandfather's journal may not appeal to his young grandchild but might be treasured by his daughter or granddaughter in her 40s.

What You Should Know

The TBID (Sidney Tourism Improvement District), may not be a common name that you hear. However, regardless of the size of the group, they are a powerful entity that works closely with event coordinators all over Sidney, providing financial contributions to community functions. The local TBID board is contrived of the general managers of hotels located in Richland County. Brandon Taylor leads the way as the groups' president, operating the Lone Tree Inn, Richland Inn and Suites, and the Best Western Golden Prairie Inn as general manager, with Jaimie Dishon as assistant general manager. Shelle Mayes assists Taylor as TBID group vice president, operating the Mainstay Suites as the general manager. Corinne Crowe, Candlewood Suites general manager and TBID group current treasurer. They are exceptionally passionate about watching events that they contribute to grow year after year.

In 2012/2013 the Sidney Chamber of Commerce and the City of Sidney worked together to create a city resolution establishing the Sidney Tourism Business Improvement District. The group collects money by charging each paid room night in the market a fixed \$1.50 tax. At the end of each quarter, hotels report the tax collection to their governing body; the City of Sidney. The money that is collected will stay within the Richland County area now and in the future, to ensure that con-

tinued events in our region bring tourists, which helps to sustain local businesses, such as hotels, restaurants, small businesses, etc.

Since the TBID's inception, this group has singlehandedly paid out close to \$400,000 in grants. The TBID is a proud contributor of local events, and enjoy assisting in bringing money into the local economy, even though they move quietly behind the scenes. In 2019, the TBID's largest contributions were; MT Tavern Association, \$15,000; Richland Youth Hockey (Damon McLaughlin Tournaments), \$13,000; Sidney AAU Wrestling (Brodie Gorder Memorial), \$3000; Sidney MT Chamber of Commerce (Bakken Brew Fest), \$5000. In 2020, the group has paid out \$11,700. Even though these numbers are strong, the funding has not come easy during the Covid-19 pandemic and the fall of oil and gas, causing tourism and business movements to decline. This is one of the many struggles that the group faces along with upcoming events being cancelled. The hotels depend heavily on these events as well as high movement of business executives and staff from outside the area to be able to redistribute the money back to the community.

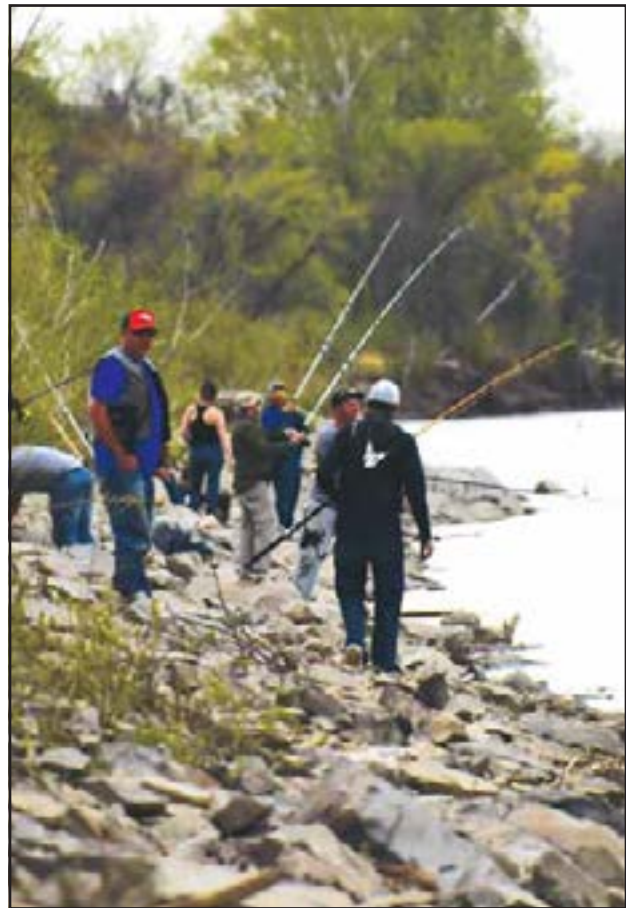

Montana FWP To Open Offices, Visitor Centers To Customers June 3

As the state moves into Phase 2 of Gov. Steve Bullock's Reopening the Big Sky Plan, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks offices and visitor centers will open to the public June 3. FWP offices have been closed since late March due to Montana's COVID-19 pandemic response. As the public returns, strict adherence to Phase 2 guidelines will be critical: stay at home if you feel sick, make sure to frequently wash and sanitize your hands, and maintain at least six feet of distance from other people. FWP front offices around the state will be set up to help facilitate these simple guidelines, including marking floors to help keep people spaced out, providing hand sanitizer for customers, and glass dividers between front counter staff and customers. "We're looking forward to having our customers back in our regional and local lobbies and visitor centers," said FWP Director Martha Williams. "We've worked hard to prepare our buildings to keep our public and staff safe." Please note that many FWP employees are still working remotely, so for business beyond front desk license purchases and other related information, please plan to reach out to the appropriate staff member directly by phone or email or ask front desk staff for contact information. ND Game and Fish to Open Offices June 8 by Appointment Only

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department will open offices June 8 to public access by appointment only, and under the low risk phase guidelines established by North Dakota Smart Restart. State facility occupancy must remain below 50%, therefore most Game and Fish staff will continue to work remotely. COVID-19 wellness screening will be required upon entering the building, and wearing a mask or cloth face covering is encouraged. Physical distancing must be followed. Personal appointments will only be available for those who can't receive help by phone or online. Hunters, anglers and water recreationists are reminded that all hunting and fishing license purchases, boat registrations and lottery applications are conducted online.
