# Richland County Conservation and Weed District Annual Meeting 

Submitted by Julie Goss
Richland County Conservation and Weed District will hold their annual supper on December 5, 2013. Supper will be served at 6:00 pm at the Richland County Event Center. Highlighting this year's event will be Jon Reiten, MT Bureau of Mines and Geology discussing his findings on Phase 2 of the Lower Yellowstone Ground Water Reservation-Development Potential of Buried Channel Aquifer in Richland County, Montana. Jon has been collecting data on this aquifer since 2005. His talk will focus on the potential of the aquifer for development.

Mandi Nay, Coordinator for Dry-Redwater Rural Water Authority (DRWA) will be updating the audience on the progress of the DRWA in Richland County.

The Conservation District will share some of the success stories of Richland County's cost share program. The cost share program will be continued in 2014. The deadline for 2014 applications is February 28 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, 2014. Applications are available at the Conservation District. A new service the conservation district will be offering is the availability of purchasing biological control for some noxious weeds. Students from Lambert High school will share some of their experiences with the Envirothon and Lambert's Launch It Program.

The Conservation District will be presenting their award for Cooperator of the Year for 2013. Kenneth and Pam Arneson were chosen to receive the award this year. Kenneth and Pam have implemented several conservation practices on their ranch. The have planted the cropland back to grass using pollinator friendly mixes, native mixes and tame grass mixes. With the help of the conservation districts they planted trees for a livestock shelterbelt and renovated a windbreak. Kenneth and Pam actively work on controlling the noxious weeds on their acreage. With the development of a spring they were able to install 4700 feet of pipeline and four water tanks. The stockwater pipelines and 9000 feet of new wildlife friendly fence enable them to manage their calving to occur during times when the nutritional forage is available. They are also actively involved in monitoring their rangeland and rotate the feeding areas in the winter months. By working with Texas A\&M's NUTBAL program they are able to monitor the nutrient conditions in their cattle's diet to determine if the current diet is sufficient to meet the performance goals they have set. Using the Conservation Districts cost share program they were able to purchase and install tanks for winter watering facilities and livestock shelters. The conservation district is proud to name them the 2103 Co-operators of the year.

To register, click on the online services tab, and "online course enrollment" under the hunter education heading. Class es are listed by city, and can also be sorted by start date. To register for a class, click on "enroll" next to the specific class, and follow the simple instructions. Personal information is required.

Individuals interested in receiving a notice by email when each hunter education class is added can click on the "subscribe to news, email and text alerts" link found below the news section on the department's home page. Check the box labeled "hunter education class notification" under the education program updates.

State law requires anyone born after December 31, 1961 to pass a certified hunter education course to hunt in the state Hunter education is mandatory for youth who are turning 12 years old, and children can take the class at age 11.

# DPHHS Offers Holiday Food Safety Tips

Food is an important part of many holiday celebrations. The Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) offers these reminders to help ensure the holiday season is free of illness from food.

Holiday food safety has six basic components:

1. Wash hands
2. III people should not handle food
3. Cook food thoroughly
4. Keep hot food hot and cold food cold
5. Clean countertops and food utensils
6. Separate raw animal foods from other foods
"Following these basic tips will go a long way in making sure your family and friends are served safe food during holiday season," said DPHHS Director Richard Opper. "However, if you cannot recall these items, the important thing to remember is: When in doubt, throw it out!"

The following list provides information on common topics related to day-to-day and holiday food safety:

Washing hands
Washing hands is essential in preventing many types of illnesses, since hands often become contaminated with harmful bacteria and viruses. Just because hands do not appear dirty does not mean they might not be contaminated.

This means hands should be washed before handling food, and especially when switching between handling raw animal foods and foods that are ready-to-eat, such as salads, vegetables, fruits and breads

Illiness
People that have, or recently had, illness symptoms should not handle food. This is especially true if the person has, or recently had: vomiting, diarrhea, infected cuts, fever, jaundice or fever with sore throat.

Safe cooking
To be safe, thoroughly cook foods. Thorough cooking means heating the internal temperature of the food to least $165^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ (Fahrenheit). To measure the internal temperature, use a metal-stem thermometer and insert it into the thickest portion of the meat or poultry. Metal-stem thermometers are available at most grocery stores

Public health authorities recommend that turkey stuffing not be cooked inside the turkey. Cooking stuffing inside the bird increases cooking time, increases the risk that the stuffing and turkey will not be thoroughly cooked and dries out the meat on the exterior of the bird. Be safe; cook the stuffing separately from the bird.

Proper thawing
Thaw frozen turkeys, poultry, fish and meats in the refrigerator to prevent growth of harmful bacteria. Alternatives to thawing in the refrigerator are to thaw food under cold, running water or as part of the cooking process.

Public health authorities do not recommend thawing food at room temperature

Thawing at room temperature presents the opportunity for harmful bacteria to multiply in numbers that may cause illness, If any part of the food increases to a temperature of $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or greater for a significant period of time. However, thawing at room temperature may be safely done, if the exterior of the
food stays at or below $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$
Handling leftovers
Place leftover foods in the refrigerator within one hour of serving, if you plan on keeping the food. If there are leftovers, cool them from hot to cold within 6 hours or less. Hot means $135^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or greater; cold means $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or less.

The hot-holding food temperature should not be confused with the cooking temperature. Some harmful bacteria, such Salmonella often found in poultry, are not killed at the hot-holding food temperature. This is why thorough cooking is important to avoid a possible illness from food.

Vacuum packaging leftover cooked meats and cooked poultry is not encouraged, due to the increased risk of botulism poisoning

Consume or discard refrigerated leftovers within one week. Frozen foods should be consumed or discarded within six months.

Proper food holding temperatures
Hot foods should be kept hot at $135^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ or greater, until served. Cold foods should be at or below $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$.

Homemade pumpkin pies should remain refrigerated until served.

Careful cleaning
Countertops, knives and other food utensils should be cleaned after contacting raw animal foods.

Cleaning these surfaces reduces the chances of cross-contamination between raw poultry, raw meats or raw fish and foods that are ready to eat, such as salads, vegetables, fruits and similar foods. Use a bleach/water mixture for cleaning at a concentration of one cap of unscented bleach per gallon of water.

A better alternative to prevent cross-contamination is to process raw animal foods on a cutting board used exclusively for one purpose. For example, a cutting board used to slice raw vegetables should be used only for that purpose. If this is not possible, thoroughly clean the surface between uses.

Food storage
In refrigerators, keep raw, animal foods below or away from other foods that are ready-to-eat. Separating raw food from ready-to-eat foods will reduce the chance of cross-contamination, which can transfer harmful microorganisms from one food to another.

Transporting food
When transporting foods that normally require refrigeration, keep in cooler or insulated bag to ensure the food stays at or below $41^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$.

## Smoking Increases Stroke Risk Up To 4 Times

There are many reasons not to smoke, or quit if you do. One of the biggest reasons is that it decreases the risk of stroke. Smoking cigarettes significantly increases the likelihood of stroke.

Stroke is a life-changing health event, a leading cause of death and a primary cause of serious, long-term disability in adults. Two of three stroke survivors will have some disability, and many will require care by others for the rest of their lives.

The two kinds of stroke are defined by the way blood flow to an area of the brain is disrupted. Ischmeic stroke is caused by a blood clot that plugs a blood vessel. Smoking roughly doubles the chances of ischemic stroke. Smoking quadruples the chances of hemorrhagic stroke, caused by rupture or leaking in a blood vessel. Women who smoke have an even greater risk of hemorrhagic stroke than do men who smoke.

The chemicals and poisons in cigarette smoke have many harmful effects on blood and blood vessels. Smoking contributes to build-up of fatty substances in the carotid artery, the main artery in the neck that delivers blood to the brain. Commercial tobacco smoke also:

1. Raises blood pressure, a major risk factor for stroke. 2. Damages the lining of blood vessels and weakens artery walls.
2. Makes the blood thicker and more likely to clot.
3. Constricts blood vessels throughout the body, slowing blood flow.
4. Reduces the level of good cholesterol (high density lipoprotein).
5. Speeds up hardening of the arteries.

The more a person smokes, the greater their risk of stroke. Secondhand smoke increases the risk of stroke for nonsmokers, too. Importantly, exposure to cigarette smoke multiplies the dangers from other risk factors, which include family history, diabetes, high blood pressure and high cholesterol. Women who smoke and use oral contraceptives greatly increase their risk of stroke.

The health benefits of quitting smoking begin immediately. The Montana Tobacco Quit Line provides coaching and other support to help Montana residents stop using commercial tobacco. Help is free at 1-800-QUIT-NOW or 1-800-784-8669.
