

Three years in the making, the 6 BROTHERS documentary is set to premiere on Prairie Public Television on Wednesday, February 26, at 8pm CT. Cooperatively produced between Daniel Stenberg and Prairie Public, the hour long documentary weaves together interviews, archival footage and letters sent during World War II, to show how a North Dakota family experienced the Great Depression and World War II. Further it touches on how their lives and experiences have helped to shape future generations. The six brothers include: Arnold (1912-1994), Cap (1914-2002), Chris (Daniel's grandfather) (1916-2006), Henry (1918-1945), Ray (1925-1999) and Selmer (1932-1941).

Those from McKenzie County that have interviews included in the documentary include Paul Bergem, Lillian Bergem, Jerald Leiseth, Carlyle Stenberg, Titus Stenberg, Neal Shipman, Elisa Thibodeau, Rick Lawlar and Miles Johnsrud. Tim Melby created original acoustic guitar music for it. Funding for the project came from the North Dakota Humanities Council and about 80 other businesses and individuals.

The Pioneer Museum of McKenzie County has been the fiscal agent for the project. Daniel is the son of Carlyle and Gayle of Watford City. He is a 2001 graduate of Johnson Corners Christian Academy and is currently living in Bismarck working as a Research Analyst for the

State of North Dakota.

Before premiering on Prairie Public, there are three free in-person screenings: Bismarck at 7:00PM CST, February 20, 2014, Butler Hall in the Gary Tharaldson School of Business at University of Mary; at 3:00PM CST, February 23, 2014, it will show in Livdahl Lounge in Frontier Hall at Williston State College; and February 25, 7pm at the Reiland Fine Arts Center at the University of Jamestown. It is also scheduled to show during the Watford City Centennial Celebration on June 27-28.

## Law Enforcement Officials Still Seeking Information in Case of Missing Kalispell Woman Foul Play Suspected in Valentine's Day 2013 Disappearance

State and local law enforcement officials are asking the public for leads again as the one year anniversary of a Kalispell woman's disappearance woman nears.

Last November, the Montana Department of Justice and the Flathead County Sheriff's Office sought information in the case of Nicole

Waller, 32, who left Fairview, Montana to return home to her three young children in Kalispell on February 14, 2013. When Waller didn't return, family members reported her missing; Waller's vehicle, a maroon 1999 Ford Expedition, was eventually found on the side of Highway 2 outside of Poplar. Although an extensive search was conducted, Waller was never found. One year later, Waller has still not been located, and investigators are asking anyone with information to contact them.

"While our news release last fall generated some good interest from the media and the public, we're still no closer to finding Nicole through any of the tips that were brought forward," said Agent Mark Hilyard of the Montana Department of Justice's Division of Criminal Investigation. "If someone out there has any information, no matter how inconsequential that person thinks it may be, it could be what we need to break this case open."

Although law enforcement officials won't go into details of the investigation, they are treating it as a homicide. Agent Hilyard references a number of factors that point to foul play, including Waller's abandoned car. "It appeared odd that Nicole's belongings, as well as her children's pet guinea pigs were still in the vehicle when it was recovered," Agent Hilyard said. "She's also had absolutely no contact with her family in the past year, which is also highly suspect."

Waller, also known as "Nicky," had brown hair and hazel eyes. She was 5'0" and weighed 165 pounds. To learn more, visit the Montana Department of Justice's Missing Persons page at http://app.doj.mt.gov/enforcement/missingpersons/ searchlist.aspx?NameLast=waller&ShowPhotos=on&-Search=Quick


# Sidney Schools Select Students of the Month








Trace Jones pins Butte Central's Clay Stillwagon in the first period to win his first state championship at #113. (Photos by Erin Graves)
