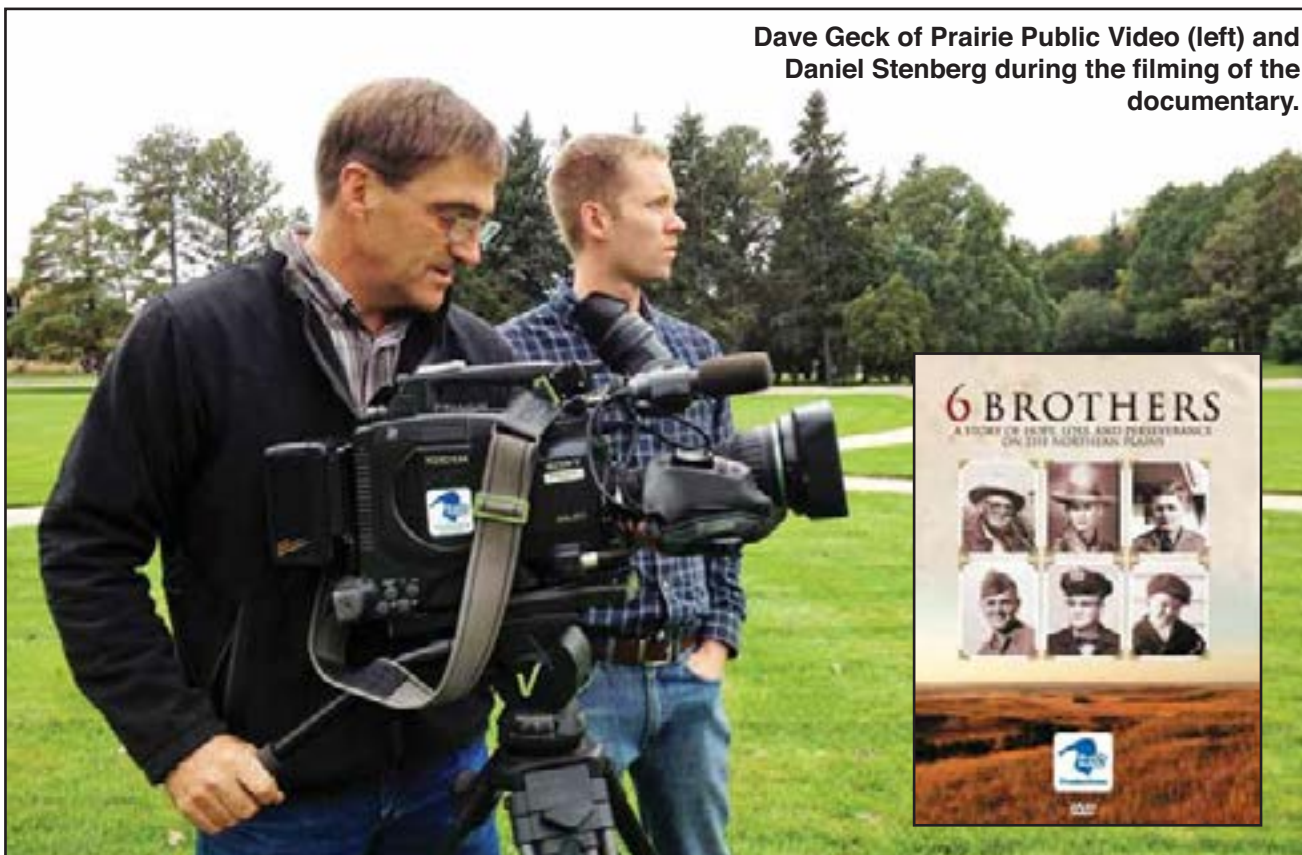

6 BROTHERS Documentary Set To Premiere Feb. 26

Second Annual Cattlemen's Ball This Saturday

Three years in the making, the 6 BROTHERS documentary is set to premiere on Prairie Public Television on Wednesday, February 26, at 8pm CT. Cooperatively produced between Daniel Stenberg and Prairie Public, the hour long documentary weaves together interviews, archival footage and letters sent during World War II, to show how a North Dakota family experienced the Great Depression and World War II. Further it touches on how their lives and experiences have helped to shape future generations. The six brothers include: Arnold (1912-1994), Cap (1914-2002), Chris (Daniel's grandfather) (1916-2006), Henry (1918-1945), Ray (1925-1999) and

Selmer (1932-1941).

Those from McKenzie County that have interviews included in the documentary include Paul Bergem, Lillian Bergem, Jerald Leiseth, Carlyle Stenberg, Titus Stenberg, Neal Shipman, Elisa Thibodeau, Rick Lawlar and Miles Johnsrud. Tim Melby created original acoustic guitar music for it. Funding for the project came from the North Dakota Humanities Council and about 80 other businesses and individuals.

The Pioneer Museum of McKenzie County has been the fiscal agent for the project. Daniel is the son of Carlyle and Gayle of Watford City. He is a 2001 graduate of Johnson Corners Christian Academy and is currently living in Bismarck working as a Research Analyst for the

State of North Dakota.

Before premiering on Prairie Public, there are three free in-person screenings: Bismarck at 7:00PM CST, February 20, 2014, Butler Hall in the Gary Tharaldson School of Business at University of Mary; at 3:00PM CST, February 23, 2014, it will show in Livdahl Lounge in Frontier Hall at Williston State College; and February 25, 7pm at the Reiland Fine Arts Center at the University of Jamestown. It is also scheduled to show during the Watford City Centennial Celebration on June 27-28.

Law Enforcement Officials Still Seeking Information in Case of Missing Kalispell Woman

Foul Play Suspected in Valentine's Day 2013 Disappearance

State and local law enforcement officials are asking the public for leads again as the one year anniversary of a Kalispell woman's disappearance woman nears.

Last November, the Montana Department of Justice and the Flathead County Sheriff's Office sought information in the case of Nicole Waller, 32, who left Fairview, Montana to return home to her three young children in Kalispell on February 14, 2013. When Waller didn't return, family members reported her missing; Waller's vehicle, a maroon 1999 Ford Expedition, was eventually found on the side of Highway 2 outside of Poplar. Although an extensive search was conducted, Waller was never found.

One year later, Waller has still not been located, and investigators are asking anyone with information to contact them.

"While our news release last fall generated some good interest from the media and the public, we're still no closer to finding Nicole through any of the tips that were brought forward," said Agent Mark Hilyard of the Montana Department of Justice's Division of Criminal Investigation. "If someone out there has any information, no matter how inconsequential that person thinks it may be, it could be what we need to break this case open."

Although law enforcement officials won't go into details of the investigation, they are treating it as a homicide. Agent Hilyard references a number of factors that point to foul play, including Waller's abandoned car. "It appeared odd that Nicole's belongings, as well as her children's pet guinea pigs were still in the vehicle when it was recovered," Agent Hilyard said. "She's also had absolutely no contact with her family in

the past year, which is also highly suspect."

Waller, also known as "Nicky," had brown hair and hazel eyes. She was 5'0" and weighed 165 pounds. To learn more, visit the Montana Department of Justice's Missing Persons page at <http://app.doj.mt.gov/enforcement/missingpersons/searchlist.aspx?NameLast=waller&ShowPhotos=on&Search=Quick>



Sidney Tendokan Taekwondo Celebrates 30 Years

White. Yellow. Orange. Green. Purple. Blue. Brown. And eventually, black.

If you ask any student at the Sidney Tendokan Taekwondo dojang the progression of belt colors they can earn by mastering the Korean style of martial arts, they can tell you. It's been that way for the past 30 years and on Feb. 22, together, they will celebrate this accomplishment of longevity with a small tournament, followed by an open house.

The afternoon event will begin at 1:00 p.m. and include some friendly competition with their sister school, Williston Taekwondo and Judo Academy, located in Williston. From 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. there will be cake and refreshments.

"I enjoy watching the students grow. A lot of them get involved in taekwondo because they aren't big enough for football or fast enough to play basketball. It's inspiring when after a few years of martial arts, they grow into those other sports and excel," said Mike Bergh, owner and instructor.

The dojang opened in 1984 when Paul Speck and his wife Patsy, then of Williston, began coming to Sidney twice a week to offer instruction. Two of their first students were Mike Bergh, who today is a 6th degree black belt and Gary Tescher, a fourth degree black belt. In

1988 when the couple moved to Colorado Bergh took over and kept the doors open. In 1989, they moved the dojang to its current location on North Central Ave. Prior to that, classes were held anywhere they could find a spot large enough for the students to practice.

While the students are taught by Bergh and some assistants, they study under Master Instructor, Jae Ho Park.

Today Bergh has the assistance of David Albrecht, who began as a student at the age of seven, back in 1986. He is a 3rd degree belt. His son, Dylan, 6, also attends the dojang as a green belt. "Taekwondo is a sport that builds good character and self-esteem in youth. It gets them in the mindset of following directions and provides them with an outlet for their energy," Albrecht said.

Each year students attend tournaments that take place throughout the state. Since its inception, a number of students have made it to the junior national and national competitions that take place across the country.

"Over the years people have asked me why I haven't gone to a larger city to teach the sport. I like the small town atmosphere and I enjoy having the independence to teach the way I want to," Bergh said. Bergh is originally from Kindred, N.D, and began his instructions there

under Moo Yung Yun, in 1978 in Fargo.

He teaches his students that marital arts are about much more than fighting. They are about learning how to defend yourself while building self-esteem and confidence. "Sometimes just having the knowledge to defend yourself is what keeps you from fighting. Bullies don't pick on people they know are going to hit them back. I've had students defend themselves and say they were afraid to tell me because they thought I would be mad, so I had to clarify my beliefs that sometimes it comes to that," he said.

Berg started taekwondo at the age of 16 when he was in high school as a way to stay active after he graduated. "I had always been told taekwondo was a sport you could do forever in order to keep getting exercise on some kind of level," he recalled.

"I love the dynamic of teaching both boys and girls and watching them work together. It's funny because there aren't many girls who are intimidated by the boys and there aren't many boys who haven't been hit pretty hard by the girls," he joked.

The dojang currently has about 40 students, eight of which are black belts. Most new students begin classes the beginning of the school year and following Christmas vacation.

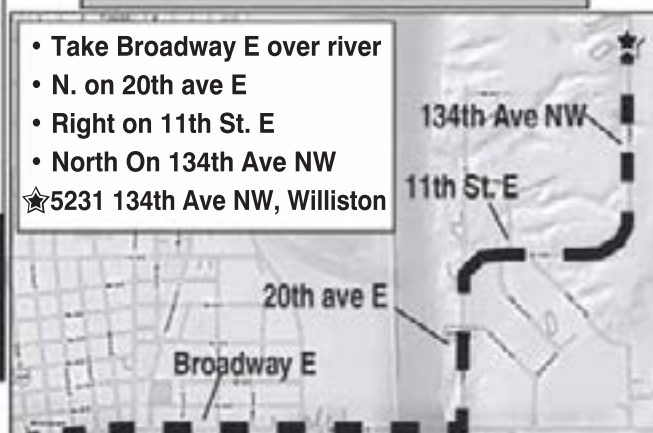

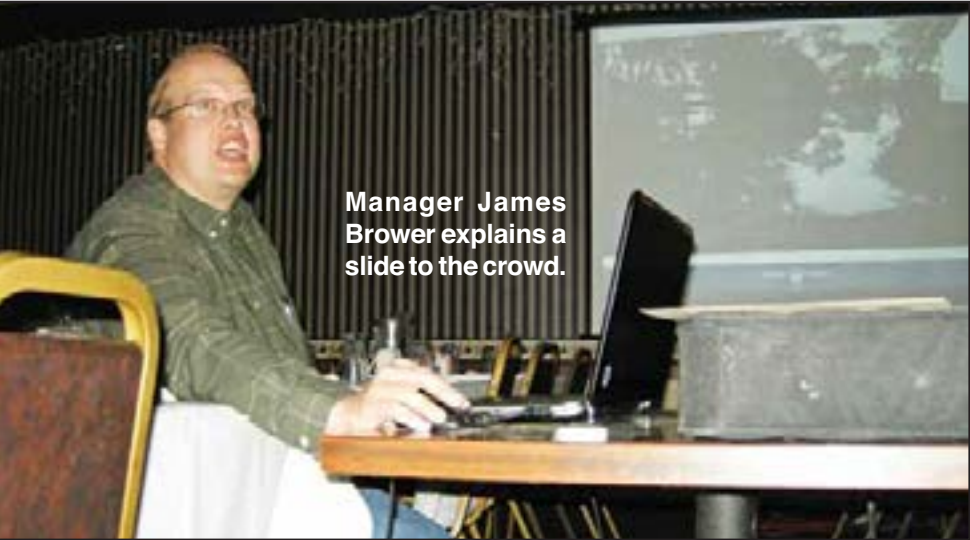

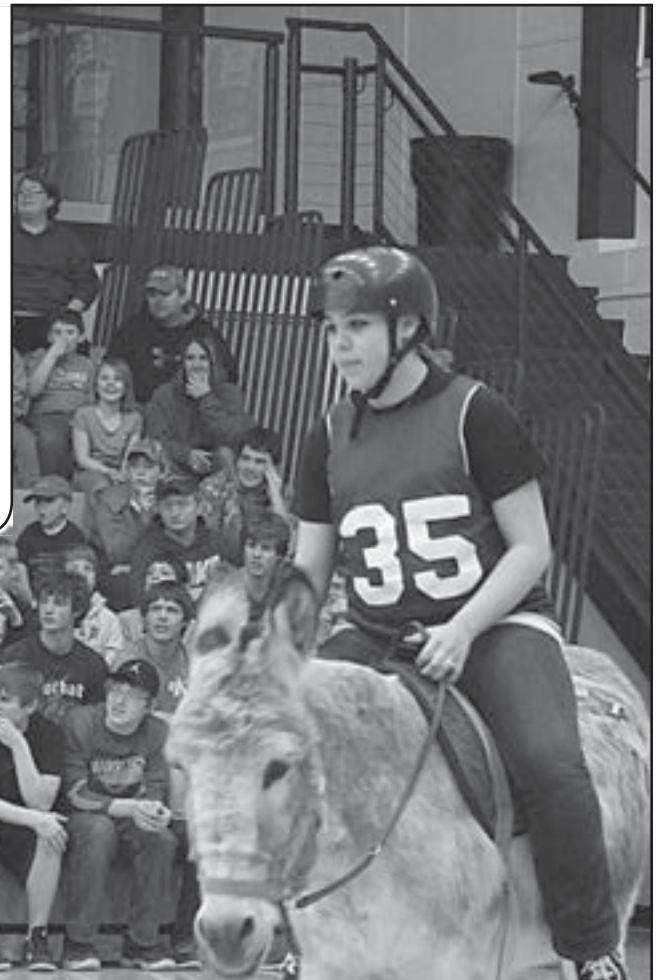
