

Sidney Wrestlers Prepare for Eagle Invitational





The defending state champion Sidney High School wrestling team is set to compete at the annual Sidney Eagle Invitational wrestling tournament at the Sidney High School Dec. 6-7. The tournament will begin on December 6 with a team dual tournament followed by the individual tournament beginning Friday night and concluding Saturday, Dec. 7.

Dual team wrestling on Dec. 6 will begin at 9 a.m. with the dual championship at 3:30 p.m. The individual tournament first round will begin at 6 p.m. Dec. 6. The quarterfinals will begin at 9 a.m. Dec. 7 followed by the semifinals at 11:30 a.m. and the finals at 4:40 p.m.

This year's tournament will include some of the top wrestling teams in the country. Attending are 30 schools from six states in various classes including returning champion teams from all three Montana classes, Idaho, Nebraska, South Dakota, Washington and North Dakota.

"Our goal is to win it this year," stated SHS wrestling coach Guy Melby. The Eagles placed second behind Idaho state champions Post Falls last year. Post Falls will be returning this year and most likely will be the team to beat. The Eagles have another top-notch team this year with four returning state champions.

Richland County **Commissioners Request** Secretarial and Presidential **Disaster Declarations for** Harvest Time Weather **Damage to Crops**

In a petition to Montana Governor Steve Bullock, Richland County commissioners have requested that he submit a request to the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture and the President of the United States for an agriculture related disaster declaration for Richland County. The Commissioners state, "the declaration would benefit the entire population of Richland County, contiguous counties and the county's wider economic trade area by making crop producers eligible for disaster programs, emergency assistance, and emergency loans, or by streamlining procedures for producers to access the programs."

Explaining the need for the declaration, the commissioners state, "During what should have been normal harvest time, Richland County experienced two major unseasonable snow storms, freezing temperatures, rains so frequent that crops seldom became fit for combining or digging before the next precipitation, and an accumulation of precipitation in a matter of weeks that approached the normal average annual rainfall."

Citing reports from Sidney Sugars, Safflower Technologies and Seigfreid Insurance Agency, the commissioners related a 6.9 million dollar loss to the sugar beet growers and a 30-50% quality loss on crops overall.

The commissioners also cited the fact that 47 of North Dakota's 53 counties have received designation as primary natural disaster areas. As a contiguous county, Richland County is eligible for relief in the form of emergency loans. In addition, declarations have been made for counties in Montana which are in proximity to Richland, with more petitions under way.

The petition was submitted to Governor Bullock's office on December 2, 2019.



Sidney Area Crafter Enjoys Holiday Shows

Sidney area crafter Betty Lee spends her holiday season visiting with customers while selling her homemade blankets, rugs, and toys at local craft and vendor show.

After retiring from 25 years of serving individuals with developmental disabilities in South Dakota, Betty and her husband moved to Sidney, where Betty picked up crafting as her full-time hobby. "I've always kind of been a crafty person. I like to see what I can make and what I can do," she said. In South Dakota, she made Christmas wreaths. mixing natural elements with man-made. "I'd take my dog for a walk at the cemetery and pick up pinecones, and pick up different little crafts at Hobby Lobby, and put them together," she said.

Now, Betty attends various area craft and vendor shows and even sells her

wares through Facebook, at Bettys Jean Blankets. Betty's main offerings are hand-made jean blankets, quilts, rugs, and crocheted toys. "I love making jean blankets with decals on them," she explained, adding "I do all different kinds of quilts, plain cotton with fleece on the inside, tie blankets." She also makes yarn rugs, which have been a hit with her customers.

Betty's most recent venture has been crafting Amigurumi crocheted toys. Amigurumi is the Japanese art of knitting or crocheting small, stuffed yarn creatures. The crocheted creatures are some of the most popular items on the online craft marketplace Etsy, and of course, through Betty's Facebook page. Betty's Jean Blankets shows an array of Amigurumi toys, ranging from animals to dinosaurs to unicorns to dolls, all crafted by hand.

All of Betty's items are

available at the local craft shows, including the St. Matthew's Craft Bazaar on December 6 and 7 at St. Matthew's Parish Center in Sidney, and the Jingle Mingle, a vendor show at the Event Center in Sidney on December 14. Though selling her crafts is her main objective, Betty enjoys visiting with people most. "I like to see the kids' and people's faces when they see my crafts, and when they know how much work goes into it and how long it takes. It's about making someone else's day," she said. Wild Flour Cafe & Bakery In Alexander **Hosts Lefse Making Classes**

When Thanksgiving and Christmas time rolls around, so does the lefse making. That is why this time of year, Wild Flour Cafe & Bakery in Alexander, North Dakota, is offering lefse-making classes to the public!

During the class, attendees will learn the step by step pro-

cess of making lefse. All materials necessary for making lefse will be provided, including long wooden turning sticks, big round lefse griddles, and special types of lefse rolling pins. The cost to participate is \$30 per person. Attendees will get lefse, a t-shirt, an adult beverage, and hands-on-experience making lefse.

Lefse is a traditional soft Norwegian flatbread made with

real or instant potatoes, flour, butter, and milk or cream. This Scandinavian treat is especially popular around the Christmas holidays. Many Scandinavian-Americans eat lefse primarily around Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Lefse may be a simple food, but it's tricky and labor-intensive to make. When the lefse dough is made, it is rolled into logs and then cut into 4-ounce portions and rolled into balls. Then the dough is rolled out on a round board with a pastry

During the class, the "rollers" equipped with a lefse board and

lefse rolling pin and cover, flatten the balls into near-perfect 14inch circles. Next, the grillers, using a special lefse stick, pick up the dough circle and gently lay it on a lefse griddle. The finished lefse is then placed on a cloth to cool and covered to keep moist.



US-2 Poplar Construction Winds Down

Poplar Roundabouts Substantially Complete

Poplar, MT -Two roundabouts on US 2 in Poplar are substantially complete, just in time for motorists to get the hang of them before winter driving. The roundabouts are part of the US 2 Poplar improvements aimed at enhancing safety and accessibility for all roadway users through the town of Poplar. Work on the roundabouts began this summer and construction is expected to be finalized by Spring 2020.

MDT District Administrator Shane Mintz said, "Driving in roundabouts might seem daunting at first, but they're really easy to get the hang of. All you have to do is slow down and look to your left, yield to cars and pedestrians in the roundabout, and travel counterclockwise around the circle to your desired street."

Because of their design, roundabouts dramatically reduce the frequency and severity of crashes. "Those factors combined with the ability to slow down vehicles traveling at high speeds make them a good fit for intersections like the ones in Poplar.

In addition to two new roundabouts, crews worked hard this summer to rehabilitate two miles of roadway surface through the heart of Poplar. Other improvements include a safer school crossing that features curb bulb-outs, pedestrian islands, and a flashing visibility beacon. Crews updated sidewalks and corners for ADA accessibility, installed new lighting to improve visibility for all users, and established a dedicated crosswalk near 6th Ave. E with another flashing beacon.

As this year's construction season draws to a close, here's what folks need to know about the work in Poplar.

The Kirn Rd. Roundabout is completely open, so motorists should no longer use the Kirn Rd. detour. The 5th Ave. Roundabout's south leg will be open this week. Its north leg will not be open until next year, because it does not yet connect to a road. This road is planned by the Tribe and will likely be built sometime next year.

Crews are still out and about doing some miscellaneous cleanup safety work for the winter months. Community members should remember that there are some areas where concrete was not poured this season, due to inclement weather. Gravel has been placed as a temporary filler in these areas, but folks should take care to note the slight change in elevation. Crews will work next year to pour concrete and asphalt in the areas that are temporarily filled with gravel. There are some remaining cleanup and landscaping tasks that crews will be working on in the spring as well.



Guest Speakers At Ag Summit Will Address Weather, Livestock And Irrigation Topics, Dec. 12, Sidney

Local research results ready to roll out in your fields will be featured at the upcoming third annual MonDak Ag Research Summit in Sidney, Thursday December 12. But that's not all. Several outside speakers are also planned to address timely questions producers have on our long term erratic weather patterns (10 inches of rain in September!) and what it means for spring planting, as well as feeding weather damaged grain to livestock, and tips on managing irrigation equipment.

Addressing the first two issues is Dr. Kevin Hyde, coordinator of the Montana Mesonet for the Montana Climate Office, Dr. Hyde builds out and maintains a statewide network of climate monitoring stations. He works directly with producers and managers to develop and implement education programs to grow understanding in how to use weather and soil moisture data to support agricultural decisions. Based out of the University of Montana in Missoula, Kevin currently teaches undergraduate coursework in Watershed Hydrology. Dr. Hyde will also address measurement and interpretation of soil moisture data and be available throughout the day to chat with participants.

Addressing livestock feeding of damaged grain is Dr. Janna (Kincheloe) Block, a Melstone, MT native, who served as a County Extension Agent in western Montana for several years after graduating from Montana State University. She has a Ph.D. in Ruminant Nutrition from South Dakota State University and has served as a North Dakota State University Extension Livestock Specialist based out of the Hettinger Research Extension Center since January of 2017. Her program there focuses on development and demonstration of livestock management strategies to optimize various production systems. Specific topics include feed sampling and analysis, ration formulation, mineral supplementation, and livestock business management. She also raises commercial Limousin cattle with her husband Ross on their family ranch near Midland, SD.

Of course, irrigation issues are another topic of continual interest in the Mon-Dak, and one, which will be addressed by Dr. Tom Scherer, Extension Agricultural Engineer and Associate Professor at North Dakota State University. Dr. Scherer has extensive experience with irrigation, water quality and subsurface drainage in the upper Great Plains and will be discussing scheduling and machine maintenance at the Summit. He has developed numerous educational aids, bulletins, circulars, demonstration units and also edits a monthly irrigation newsletter. He has performed over 300 irrigation pumping plant efficiency tests and checked the

uniformity of numerous center pivot sprinkler packages and has also helped develop four irrigation-scheduling applications including a GIS-based web application on the North Dakota Agricultural Weather

Network (NDAWN) website. Other quest speakers (TBD) will address the new American Harvest, Inc. CBD oil plant being developed in Sidney, along with Dr. Chengci Chen, Superintendent of the MSU Eastern Ag Research Center in Sidney, who will report on his research into hemp as a new crop option. Also planned is a special session for "urban farmers" with guidance planned in garden composting and propagation

tips for house plants. The Summit runs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Richland County Fairgrounds Event Center in Sidney, MT and is organized by the MonDak area's three ag research facilities North Dakota State University's Williston Research and Extension Center, Montana State University's Eastern Ag Research Center in Sidney. and the USDA Agricultural Research Service's Northern Plains Ag Research Lab, also in Sidney. The collaborative program focuses on "ready to use" research findings by the more than 20 scientists employed at the three facilities who have expertise in irrigated and dryland agronomy, plant pathology, soil science, plant and insect ecology, molecular biology, weed and insect biocontrol, and much more!

Sponsors for the event include the City of Williston, Sidney Sugars, Inc., Agri Industries, Montana-Dakota Beet Growers Association, American Harvest, Inc., and Cargill in Great Falls.

New Irrigation and Horticulture Programs

This year's Summit includes a new program structure with concurrent sessions targeting irrigated and dryland research in the morning and a new horticulture session and general ag talks in the afternoon. Altogether, 24 different research presentations are planned, along with two poster sessions featuring another 2 dozen ongoing research projects at the three host facilities. The researchers on those projects will be on hand to answer questions regarding their work.
