E-rase your E-waste set for Sept 8-9 in Sidney; CRT Recycling in Williston This Weekend

Save the date! E-rase your E-waste organizers in Sidney have announced the dates for their annual fall collection event: Friday and Saturday, Sept. 8-9. MonDak area residents are invited to bring their damaged and outdated electronic equipment to the event for free recycling. Now in its 13th year, E-rase your E-waste has recycled more than 427,000 pounds (213 TONS!) of electronic waste through 2016!

In announcing the fall collection date, organizers also reported that restrictions on recycling of certain items remain in place for the Sidney event, particularly regarding CRT monitors / TVs.

"Unfortunately, our e-cycler is still unable to take any monitors or televisions with cathode ray tubes," event co-chair Jackie Couture noted. "But most other electronic devices are being accepted." Those include computers and their components (printers, scanners, keyboards, flat screen monitors, etc.), cell phones, cameras, VCRs, cable TV boxes, fax machines, copiers, stereos, game boys and specialized electronic equipment used in businesses such as hospitals, law enforcement, manufacturing and even the oil field.

Option for recycling CRTs

There will be more information on the Sidney event coming soon, Couture said, but noted in the meantime that those with CRT monitors to recycle can properly dispose of them at another recycling event set for Williston this coming weekend. "They're able to take the CRTs there," she said, "but there is a charge running from \$20 to \$40 depending on the size of the monitor or television."

"We're letting everyone know about the ongoing restrictions on CRTs for our Sidney event now so that area residents with CRT monitors or TVs can take advantage of the recycling effort in Williston if they wish," Couture said. "Our goal in developing "E-rase your E-waste" has always been to encourage and facilitate proper recycling of waste electronics to protect our environment and human health."

The Williston event is being hosted by North Dakota Recycling Services at 409 1st Street West in Williston. Event times are Friday, Aug. 25 from 9 a.m.-6 p.m. Central time and Saturday Aug. 26 from 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

Dr. Kessler Receives **Hospitalist Certification**

Dr. Jerome Kessler, of Sidney MT, has recently passed the "Focused Practice in Hospital Medicine" certification exam. This completes a three year process. The program and exam are sponsored by the American Board of Internal Medicine.

Physicians who specialize in this area are referred to as "hospitalists," which is a term that was coined in 1996. The push to have additional training in this area is based on several factors: medical science has become more complex; hospital patients are a lot sicker than they used to be; and many hospital illnesses involve more than one body system. Hospitalists treat and coordinate care for a wide variety of heart, lung, kidney, nervous system, metabolic issues, perioperative medical care, and infection problems.

The Society of Hospital Medicine (SHM) addresses quality of care issues. Recent studies show a 21% drop in hospital complications and a 15% drop in hospital mortality during the same time period that hospital medicine guidelines have been implemented. Hospital Medicine certification requires that the candidate complete over 100 maintenance of certification points in a 3-year time period. An applicant must also provide documentation that he has over 3000 hospital care encounters in a 3-year period, provide hospital letters of support (from the CEO and Chief of Staff), hold a valid state medical license, be a member of a hospital staff, and pass the 10 hour national board exam.

Dr. Kessler is now certified in four areas: internal medicine, hospital medicine, geriatrics, and family medicine. Kessler has now taken and successfully passed 14 different national board certification and re-certification exams, with four of these completed within the past 4 years.

Dr. Kessler's says: "I love the art and science of medicine. Keeping up to date helps me provide the best possible care for patients. Training and certification in these medical areas is especially important when you practice in a smaller community.'

U.S., Canadian And Mexican Farm **Groups Support Modernized NAFTA**

American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF), The Canadian Federation of Agriculture (CFA) and Mexico's Consejo Nacional Agropecuario (CNA) sent a joint letter to Canadian, United States and Mexican government officials reiterating their calls that NAFTA re-negotiations should aim to modernize the agreement, rather than dismantle it.

CFA President Ron Bonnett, strong in his support of the agreement, says that, "NAFTA has boosted the incomes of millions of farmers and has facilitated the development of profitable export markets.'

In their discussions, the three Presidents agreed on the need to build on the original agreement's success by looking for ways to increase trade volumes.

Arthritis Affects More People In Rural Communities

Over 1 in 3 adults that live in rural areas have arthritis and of those adults, approximately half report having a daily limitation due to their arthritis. Attending an arthritis exercise class or a self-management education workshop is proven to help individuals manage their arthritis symptoms and to reduce activity limitations from arthritis.

Arthritis symptoms keep thousands of Montanans from engaging in daily routines. "The goal of the Montana Arthritis Program is to help reduce pain, decrease activity limitations, improve physical abilities, and increase confidence to help people manage their arthritis," DPHHS Director Sheila Hogan said. "This program has helped many Montanans with their arthritis and we want to continue to help Montanans to reduce and relieve their arthritis symptoms through these classes."

Heather Welch, the DPHHS Montana Arthritis Program Manager states that these classes are open to everyone. "Most of the arthritis exercise classes and the self-management workshops are free to attend but there are scholarships available if a site does charge a fee. We do not want cost to be a barrier for anyone to attend one of these beneficial programs."

- 3. Further alignment of sanitary and phytosanitary measures using a science-based approach.
- 4. Elimination of non-science based technical barriers to
- 5. Revisions that reflect technological advance since implementation such as digital trade, etc.

Farmers have increased productivity and improved their competitiveness to address the rapidly growing demand worldwide for healthy and sustainable food products. 
