

## Sidney Fire Dept Annual Breakfast June 1

Once again, the Sidney Volunteer Fire Department is preparing for our annual fundraiser. We will be hosting our 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Free Will Breakfast at the Fire Hall on Sunday June 1, 2014 from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. The breakfast will consist of French toast, sausage, scrambled eggs, juice and coffee. The fire department will also have an open house that morning, which will include different demonstrations and truck rides for kids of all ages.

The Sidney Volunteer Fire Department not only responds to fire calls in Sidney, but all of Richland County. We are proud of the fact that the Sidney Fire Department is an all volunteer fire department, and is able to operate on a limited budget. Each year, more than 2,000 hours are donated for training and maintenance and more than 5,000 man hours are spent responding to fires and other emergency calls.

We now have a foundation for the fire department. The Sidney Fire Foundation is a tax exempt organization under Section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; therefore your contribution is fully tax deductible. In addition, if you have a corporation or partnership and you designate your contribution as a permanent endowment fund contribution, you may qualify for federal a 20% tax credit for state tax purpose in addition to the deduction for federal tax purposes. The Montana tax credit is a very beneficial tax break as you receive a 20% tax credit. With the maximum state tax rate being 6.9%, you may get an additional 13.1% tax benefit. To take advantage

of this tax credit, please issue the check out of your passthrough entity payable to the Sidney Fire Foundation and designate your contribution to go to the permanent endowment fund. If you have any questions regarding this foundation, please feel free to call Ken @ (406) 433-2092.

That song will be included on Bob's forthcoming CD, (due out in mid-summer) and Trish's painting will be used for the cover.

## Parent Café: Active Parenting of Teens







## **Sidney Health Center Prepares** to "Go Live" with New Electronic **Health Record** System

Sidney, Montana (May 23, 2014) - Sidney Health Center has partnered with Sanford Health to provide patients with an integrated state-of-the-art electronic health record (EHR). The agreement provides Sidney Health Center with access to the industry's most advanced electronic health records system, Epic.

Sidney Health Center is scheduled to convert from the current Meditech system to the Epic software system at 12:00AM on June 1, 2014. The conversion to Epic will allow Sidney Health Center to meet federal guidelines for the secure use and sharing of health information. Epic, also known as One Chart, allows providers, nurses and other medical professionals a seamless means of collecting, storing and accessing a patient's medical information. This is a tremendous win in the community for exchanging information in the safest, most efficient way possible.

Over the next few weeks, patients may experience longer wait times as staff is becoming accustomed to the new system. In addition, all patients will need to have their insurance cards on-hand to ensure the data is entered correctly in the new system going forward. To assist through the transition, several Sanford Health IT employees will be on-site working beside Sidney Health Center staff to provide support and assistance as needed.

Sanford Health offers various levels of affiliation including associated, managed, leased and owned. With the associated level selected for IT services, Sidney Health Center will continue to operate as an independent, locally-owned hospital and is enthusiastic about the positive opportunities this collaboration will bring in responding to the community needs.

Clinical and business operations staff in the hospital and clinic settings has been training for the past two months to prepare for the impending transition from Meditech to Epic (One Chart).

"Implementing a software system of this magnitude in a rural health care setting would not be feasible without a coordinated effort," said Rick Haraldson, Sidney Health Center CEO. "Sanford Health has implemented their computer software system in 36 healthcare facilities throughout the Midwest region. We are excited to be able to bring the best technology to the residents of the MonDak region and allow them to access to their patient health information 24/7."

The new system will allow patients to sign up for My Chart, which allows them to connect to their personal medical information when it is convenient for them. Medical information will be easily accessible through Sidney Health Center's website in a secure portal managed by Sanford Health. Patients will be able to review immunizations, allergies, summaries of recent visits to the doctor and current health concerns.

## **Risk It**" Campaign

Almost 50 law enforcement agencies across the state are adding patrols for the "Click It, Don't Risk It" high-intensity traffic enforcement period May 19 through June 1. Motorists throughout Montana should be aware of heightened enforcement.

The national seat belt campaign is timed to reach motorists as the summer travel season begins around Memorial Day. Increased seat belt use is key to preventing crash deaths and injuries—especially among teens and young adults. People age 15 to 29 accounted for 40 percent of the severe injuries and 26 percent of the fatalities resulting from motor vehicle crashes in Montana in 2012. Those age 18 to 25 are the group with the highest fatality crash rate in Montana over the last ten years—a rate fueled by the fact that 85 percent of the fatalities in this age group were not wearing a seat belt, or not wearing it properly, at the time of their crash.

Overtime patrols for traffic safety enforcement are funded by the Montana Department of Transportation. High-visibility enforcement is one of the overall strategies employed in Montana's Vision Zero—working together to eliminate deaths and injuries on Montana roadways. In addition to enforcement, Vision Zero also emphasizes education, engineering of safer roads, and support for emergency medical response. #VisionZeroMT



## **Richland County is Accepting ECP Applications** for Flood Damage **Emergency Conservation Program (ECP)**

Application Deadline is May 30, 2014

Submitted by Tammy Lake Richland County has been approved to implement the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) due to floods. Producers need to file an ECP application with the FSA before starting work on land damaged by flood water. **Emergency Conservation Pro**gram is a cost share program which assists producers with damage caused by excessive rain and the floods that have occurred. Signup for the program began on May 1, 2014 and ends May 30, 2014.

A producer qualifying for ECP assistance may receive cost-share levels not to exceed 75% of the eligible cost of restoration measures. The **Richland County Committee** has been approved for the following conservation practices to correct damage due to the flood:

EC1 - Removing Debris from Farmland: Practice is used for removing debris from farmland. A typical example of this is taking debris off cropland and fences.

EC2- Grading, Shaping, Releveling, or Similar Measures: Practice is used for grading, shaping and leveling land that has been damaged by the flood and is returned to agricultural use. Example -Land has erosion caused by flood and leveling of the land is needed to restore it.

EC3- Restoring Permanent Fences: Practice corrects damage to fences caused by the flood. Example - Fences in water gaps which have been washed out due to the high water

The Office of Consumer Protection at the Montana Department of Justice wants to alert you to a message involving eBay accounts.

Yesterday, eBay Inc. announced that the company asked all eBay users to change their eBay passwords due to a cyber attack that compromised a database containing encrypted passwords and other non-financial data.

The database included eBay customers' name, encrypted password, email address, physical address, phone number and date of birth. However, after conducting extensive tests on the networks, there is no evidence

of the compromise resulting in unauthorized activity for eBay users, and no evidence of any unauthorized access to other financial or credit card information, which is stored separately in encrypted formats. Likewise, the file did not contain Social Security, taxpayer identification or national

identification information. WHAT TO DO:

The belief is that changing passwords will help protect eBay users and is an information security best practice for everyone.



# OUTDOORS Be Courteous at Boat Ramps

Boaters are reminded to exercise patience and plan accordingly when heading to a lake or river this summer.

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department receives a number of complaints every year about overly aggressive behavior at boat ramps. A few simple reminders will help ensure a fluent transition when launching and loading a boat.

Launching

Don't pull onto ramp until your boat is ready to launch.

Prepare for launching in the parking area. Remove covers, load equipment, remove tie downs, attach lines and put in drain plug, before backing onto the ramp.

When ready, pull into line to launch. Wait your turn. Be courteous.

It takes at least two people to efficiently and courteously launch a boat: one to handle the boat and one to take care of the tow vehicle.

Loading

Don't block the loading area with your boat until your tow vehicle is ready to load. Wait until you are clear of the launch area to unload gear.



As soon as your trailer is in the water, load and secure your boat to the trailer.

Remove boat and trailer from the water as quickly as possible.

Get clear of the ramp. Pull into the parking area to finish securing your boat and unload gear.

## **Anglers Reminded of Nongame Fish Regulations**

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department reminds anglers and others taking carp and other nongame fish that a license is required, and hook-and-line, archery equipment and Other regulations included.

Legal archery equipment is any bow to which an arrow is attached by a line and equipped with a harpoon style point or





spears are the only legal methods of take. Snagging nongame fish is illegal.

In addition, enforcement chief Robert Timian said anglers must properly dispose of the fish. "Leaving dead fish on the shoreline or in the water is considered a littering violation," Timian said.

Game wardens and other law enforcement officers have the authority to cite persons for this violation, Timian said, with the minimum penalty a \$100 littering violation and the maximum a Class B misdemeanor which can bring up to a \$1,000 fine and possible loss of fishing and hunting privileges.

## Fishing for Free June 7-8

North Dakota anglers are reminded they can fish for free June 7-8.

That is the weekend North Dakota residents may fish without a license. All other fishing regulations apply.

Refer to the 2014-16 North Dakota Fishing Guide for season information.

Legal spear equipment is any manually powered shaft with barbed points. The spear head shall not exceed 12 inches in width.

Use of night vision equipment or electronically enhanced light-gathering optics, including all lights used for locating and shooting at fish, is legal.

## Some North Dakota Lakes Suffer Winterkill

North Dakota Game and Fish Department fisheries biologists said despite colder-than-average winter temperatures, not many lakes experienced a fish kill.

Fisheries management section leader Scott Gangl said biologists investigated winterkills at 11 lakes so far this spring, with only a few considered significant enough to affect the quality of fishing this spring.

Lakes that appear to have suffered a significant kill include Leland Dam (McKenzie County), Island Lake (Rolette County) and the State Fair Pond (Ward County).

Fisheries personnel already restocked these lakes with hatchery raised fish, or fish transported from another lake. Gangl said while the State Fair Pond will have catchable fish this summer, fish stocked in Leland Dam and Island Lake will take 2-3 years to be of a catchable size.

Some of the lakes that experienced a minor kill were too insignificant to affect fishing.

Anglers can contact the local Game and Fish Department fisheries district offices to get more information on the status of these lakes, or to report fish kills that may not be on the list.


