Sidney Fire Dept Annual Breakfast June 1


The Sidney Volunteer Fire Department not only responds to fire calls in Sidney, but all of Richland County. We are proud of the fact that the Sidney Fire Department is an all volunteer fire department, and is able to operate on a limited budget. Each year, more than 2,000 hours are donated for training and maintenance and

more than 5,000 man hours are spent responding to fires and other emergency calls.

We now have a foundation for the fire department. The Sidney Fire Foundation is a tax exempt organization under Section 501 (C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; therefore your contribution is fully tax deductible. In addition, if you have a corporation or partnership and you designate your contribution as a permanent endowment fund contribution, you may qualify for federal a 20% tax credit for state tax purpose in addition to the deduction for federal tax purposes. The Montana tax credit is a very beneficial tax break as you receive a 20% tax credit. With the maximum state tax rate being 6.9%, you may get an additional 13.1% tax benefit. To take advantage

of this tax credit, please issue the check out of your pass-through entity payable to the Sidney Fire Foundation and designate your contribution to go to the permanent endowment fund. If you have any questions regarding this foundation, please feel free to call Ken @ (406) 433-2092.

Cowboy singer/songwriter Bob Petermann will be strumming guitar and singing his special brand of authentic ranch-raised music, surrounded by the galloping horses and bucking bulls that reside within the paintings of western artist Trish Stevenson. This creative collaboration will be presented on Thursday, May 29, 2014 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. (CDT) at the James Memorial Art Center in Williston, North Dakota.

Bob, who hails from the remote area of Cedar Creek in Wibaux County, Montana, was raised in a family of musicians. It was his older brother Ernie who initially taught chords to the eager, eight year old at the time. Bob now runs the family ranch with his wife Kay, when he is not traveling the West performing at venues such as the National Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Elko, Nevada. He has several recordings to his credit and has compiled a book of his poetry.

Trish, who lives near Savage, Montana, shows her paintings nationally with current exhibits in Connecticut, Idaho,

Kentucky, Montana and at the North Dakota Cowboy Hall of Fame. She has been featured in Art Horse Magazine and Western Horseman and is a member of the Oil Painters of America, the Blue Buffalo Artists and the Pastel Society of the Northern Rockies.

This is not the first time these two artists have created together. Years ago, after hearing Bob sing in Medora, North Dakota, Trish painted a night scene of the cowboy strumming by the campfire, soothing the cattle in the background. That image ended up on the cover of Bob's CD called "Takin' Up Slack". Trish is currently working on a painting inspired by a new song Bob has written called, "Dance in the Round Corral". That song will be included on Bob's forthcoming CD, (due out in mid-summer) and Trish's painting will be used for the cover.



Sidney Health Center Prepares to “Go Live” with New Electronic Health Record System

Sidney, Montana (May 23, 2014) – Sidney Health Center has partnered with Sanford Health to provide patients with an integrated state-of-the-art electronic health record (EHR). The agreement provides Sidney Health Center with access to the industry’s most advanced electronic health records system, Epic.

Sidney Health Center is scheduled to convert from the current Meditech system to the Epic software system at 12:00AM on June 1, 2014. The conversion to Epic will allow Sidney Health Center to meet federal guidelines for the secure use and sharing of health information. Epic, also known as One Chart, allows providers, nurses and other medical professionals a seamless means of collecting, storing and accessing a patient’s medical information. This is a tremendous win in the community for exchanging information in the safest, most efficient way possible.

Over the next few weeks, patients may experience longer wait times as staff is becoming accustomed to the new system. In addition, all patients will need to have their insurance cards on-hand to ensure the data is entered correctly in the new system going forward. To assist through the transition, several Sanford Health IT employees will be on-site working beside Sidney Health Center staff to provide support and assistance as needed.

Sanford Health offers various levels of affiliation including associated, managed, leased and owned. With the associated level selected for IT services, Sidney Health Center will continue to operate as an independent, locally-owned hospital and is enthusiastic about the positive opportunities this collaboration will bring in responding to the community needs.

Clinical and business operations staff in the hospital and clinic settings has been training for the past two months to prepare for the impending transition from Meditech to Epic (One Chart).

“Implementing a software system of this magnitude in a rural health care setting would not be feasible without a coordinated effort,” said Rick Haralson, Sidney Health Center CEO. “Sanford Health has implemented their computer software system in 36 healthcare facilities throughout the Midwest region. We are excited to be able to bring the best technology to the residents of the MonDak region and allow them to access to their patient health information 24/7.”

The new system will allow patients to sign up for My Chart, which allows them to connect to their personal medical information when it is convenient for them. Medical information will be easily accessible through Sidney Health Center’s website in a secure portal managed by Sanford Health. Patients will be able to review immunizations, allergies, summaries of recent visits to the doctor and current health concerns.

Seat Belt Enforcement Hits High Gear - Annual "Click It, Don't Risk It" Campaign

Almost 50 law enforcement agencies across the state are adding patrols for the "Click It, Don't Risk It" high-intensity traffic enforcement period May 19 through June 1. Motorists throughout Montana should be aware of heightened enforcement.

The national seat belt campaign is timed to reach motorists as the summer travel season begins around Memorial Day. Increased seat belt use is key to preventing crash deaths and injuries—especially among teens and young adults. People age 15 to 29 accounted for 40 percent of the severe injuries and 26 percent of the fatalities resulting from motor vehicle crashes in Montana in 2012. Those age 18 to 25 are the group with the highest fatality crash rate in Montana over the last ten years—a rate fueled by the fact that 85 percent of the fatalities in this age group were not wearing a seat belt, or not wearing it properly, at the time of their crash.

Overtime patrols for traffic safety enforcement are funded by the Montana Department of Transportation. High-visibility enforcement is one of the overall strategies employed in Montana's Vision Zero—working together to eliminate deaths and injuries on Montana roadways. In addition to enforcement, Vision Zero also emphasizes education, engineering of safer roads, and support for emergency medical response. #VisionZeroMT

Richland County is Accepting ECP Applications for Flood Damage

Emergency Conservation Program (ECP)
Application Deadline is May 30, 2014

Richland County has been approved to implement the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) due to floods. Producers need to file an ECP application with the FSA before starting work on land damaged by flood water. Emergency Conservation Program is a cost share program which assists producers with damage caused by excessive rain and the floods that have occurred. Signup for the program began on May 1, 2014 and ends May 30, 2014.

A producer qualifying for ECP assistance may receive cost-share levels not to exceed 75% of the eligible cost of restoration measures. The Richland County Committee has been approved for the following conservation practices to correct damage due

to the flood:

EC1 - Removing Debris from Farmland: Practice is used for removing debris from farmland. A typical example of this is taking debris off crop-land and fences.

EC2- Grading, Shaping, Releveling, or Similar Measures: Practice is used for grading, shaping and leveling land that has been damaged by the flood and is returned to agricultural use. Example - Land has erosion caused by flood and leveling of the land is needed to restore it.

EC3- Restoring Permanent Fences: Practice corrects damage to fences caused by the flood. Example - Fences in water gaps which have been washed out due to the high water.

Cost-share is calculated up to 75% of the actual costs,

after they are adjusted based on the age of the fence.

Age of fence: Allowable actual cost factor

0-5 years old 100% of computed cost-share

6-10 years old 75% of computed cost-share

11-30 years old 60% of computed cost-share

Over 30 years old 0% of computed cost-share

EC4 - Restoring Conservation Structures and Other Installations: Practice restores conservation structures and installations damaged by the flood. Example - Restoration of ditches and other permanently installed systems destroyed by the flood.

Eligibility for cost share assistance is based on a minimum of \$1,000 of eligible damage. All requests for cost share are subject to the avail-

ability of funds. Producers are encouraged to provide the FSA office with the following data at the time of application: Location of the damage and extent of the damage, such as length of fence, time needed to remove debris, damage to land or conservation structures with estimates of costs to repair. Please call the office at (406) 433-2103 to schedule an appointment.

The Office of Consumer Protection at the Montana Department of Justice wants to alert you to a message involving eBay accounts.

Yesterday, eBay Inc. announced that the company asked all eBay users to change their eBay passwords due to a cyber attack that compromised a database containing encrypted passwords and other non-financial data.

The database included eBay customers' name, encrypted password, email address, physical address, phone number and date of birth. However, after conducting extensive tests on the networks, there is no evidence

of the compromise resulting in unauthorized activity for eBay users, and no evidence of any unauthorized access to other financial or credit card information, which is stored separately in encrypted formats. Likewise, the file did not contain Social Security, taxpayer identification or national identification information.

WHAT TO DO:

The belief is that changing passwords will help protect eBay users and is an information security best practice for everyone.

How to change your eBay password:

Log into your eBay account

Click on your name in the top left corner, and select

Account Settings

Now click "Personal Information." You should see an option to "edit" your password.

It's a good idea to use different passwords for different online accounts.

Van Hooks Arena hosted two sold out Kerry Kuhn Horsemanship Clinics, May 19 – 23 and May 24- 25. Kerry Kuhn holds group clinics several times throughout the year at locations around the country. In order to cover more topics as progress and interest allows, each clinic group is limited to 12 riders and their horses. The #1 goal in each clinic is to develop a positive, willing attitude in both horse and rider without worrying about making mistakes. Riders will have an opportunity to learn new concepts and to see how others approach and resolve problems.
Born in Medicine Lodge, KS in 1975, Kuhn had an immediate love for horses. At the age of 12, Kuhn started his first two year old colt with the help of his grandfather, Dale Lukens. Growing up, he spent many days working horses and gathering cattle for local ranches with his grandfather. His passion for horses and

training started at a young age, motivating him to learn as much as he could about communicating with horses. In high school, Kuhn competed in rodeo as a calf, team and steer roper. He also spent several years training young thoroughbreds at a local racetrack.
Since the mid 90s, Kuhn has held horsemanship demonstrations and clinics all across the United States and Canada. His longtime dream of having a weekly TV series came true in January 2013 when his first episode of "Ridin' Horses with Kerry Kuhn" aired.
Kuhn comments on his website, "I have spent my whole life working with horses. As I look back on all the horses I have ridden since I was a kid, each one was a stepping stone for me. I'm sure I messed more of them up in the beginning then I helped, but they all helped me see more of what I was missing. This TV series is a wonderful tool for me to share what I have learned over the years, and help people see that horsemanship can be as

easy as you let it be."
