The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) released updated guidelines for employers that use information on criminal convictions or arrests in their hiring process. The use of background and credit reports in the hiring process requires employers to adhere to numerous requirements contained in the Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) and Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA) from disclosures to applicants to storage, destruction and security of the information. Failure to stay informed and in compliance can be a costly mistake.

The webinar, conducted by Steve Cape of Genius HR in Great Falls, will analyze and explain the EEOC guidance on the use of criminal records in the hiring process and the employer's responsibility to properly disclose that a background or credit report is going to be used in the hiring process. The Montana Department of Revenue provides assistance on individual income tax matters through its Internet website, call center, and statewide local offices. But did you know that they also have an income tax specialist who will offer state side training for the volunteers that enter tax returns?

Brian Olsen has been travelling the great state of Montana for nine years, meeting with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) folks and the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) to train the volunteers that assist the primarily elderly and/or lower income citizens of Montana with their tax returns. In addition to training the volunteers on tax preparation, Brian also meets with paid tax preparers and accountants to go over law changes, rule changes, and any recent legal decisions.

He typically trains in Helena, Billings, Butte, Missoula, Great Falls, Kalispell, and Bozeman, but has been known to make a side trip to a smaller area if he happens to be nearby, such as stopping in Stevensville after providing training in Missoula.


When asked why he performs this onsite training, Brian said "I like that it brings questions to us that the tax preparers see. The face-to-face interaction is great!"



Pertussis in Richland County

Richland County has another confirmed pertussis case (whooping cough) in an adult as of 12/19/13 which makes 10 for the year. The Richland County Public Health Department is working with health care providers, and other partners to identify close contacts and ensure that they are evaluated and treated as needed.

Pertussis is a contagious respiratory disease that in almost all cases can be effectively treated by a health care professional if identified early. Pertussis is spread through the air by coughing, and transmission is dependent on the closeness and length of contact. The disease is most serious in very young infants – especially those under the age of six months. Infants should be kept away from anyone diagnosed with pertussis or identified as a close contact of someone who has been diagnosed. Infants with any coughing illness should be promptly evaluated by their health care provider.

The Richland County Public Health Department's number one priority is to contain the spread of the disease. Health Department staff will identify close contacts of those who have been diagnosed with pertussis in order to lessen further spread of this disease. Mass treatment is not recommended or indicated at this time.

Pertussis begins with cold symptoms (runny nose, sneezing) and a cough. The cough continues which becomes much worse over one to two weeks and can last up to 6 weeks or more. Symptoms usually include a long series of coughs (coughing fits) followed by a whooping noise. However, older children, adults and very young infants may not develop the whoop. Coughing fits may also be followed by vomiting or turning blue. Immunized adults may have an irritating cough that does not go away even after using over the counter cough/ cold medication. There is generally no fever. The cough is more often worse at night or with activity and may cause fatigue. Anyone experiencing these symptoms or a cough that has lasted two weeks or longer should contact their health care provider.

The most effective way to prevent pertussis is through vaccination. Pertussis vaccine is available for persons over the age of six weeks. It is included in the Center for Disease Control and Prevention's recommended routine childhood immunizations schedule. It is also very important for adults to receive the vaccination as well. No vaccine is 100 percent effective and no community is 100 percent vaccinated. However, we do know that vaccines are the most effective tool we have to reduce transmission of pertussis and that even immunized children who get sick tend to have less severe symptoms than children who are not immunized.

Pertussis (Whooping Cough)

What is pertussis?

Pertussis, also called "whooping cough," is a disease caused by bacteria. Pertussis is usually mild in older children and adults, but it often causes serious problems in babies.

Who gets pertussis?

Pertussis is most common among babies, but anyone can get it. Pertussis can be hard to diagnose in babies, teens, and adults because their symptoms often look like a cold with a nagging cough. Babies often get pertussis from older children and adults. What are the symtoms of pertussis?

Pertussis begins like a cold, with a runny nose, sneezing, mild fever, and cough that slowly gets worse. After one to two weeks, the cough gets worse and usually starts to occur in strong "coughing fits." This type of coughing may last for six or more weeks. There is generally no fever during this time. In young children, coughing fits are often followed by a whooping sound as they try to catch their breath. After coughing, a person may have difficulty catching their breath, vomit, or become blue in the face from lack of air. The coughing spells may be so bad that it is hard for babies to eat, drink, or breathe. The cough is often worse at night, and cough medicines usually do not help reduce the cough. Between coughing spells, the person often appears to be well. Some babies may only have apnea (failure to breathe) and can die from this. Adults, teens, and vaccinated children often have milder symptoms that mimic bronchitis and asthma.

How is pertussis spread?

The pertussis bacteria live in the nose, mouth, and throat, and are sprayed into the air when an infected person sneezes, coughs, or talks. Other people nearby can then inhale the bacteria. Touching a tissue or sharing a cup used by someone with pertussis can spread the disease. The first symptoms usually appear within 5 days to 21 days after a person is infected.

Is pertussis dangerous?

It can be, especially for babies. Pertussis can cause breathing problems (apnea), pneumonia, and swelling of the brain (encephalopathy), which can lead to seizures and brain damage. Pertussis can also cause death (rarely), especially in babies.

How is pertussis diagnosed?

A doctor may diagnose a patient with pertussis because of their symptoms. To confirm the diagnosis, the doctor will swab the back of the nose for laboratory testing.

How is pertussis treated?

Antibiotics are used to treat the infected person and their close contacts. In addition, it is helpful to get plenty of rest and fluids. A person hospitalized with severe pertussis may need special treatments to help them through prolonged periods of coughing.

Can pertussis be prevented?

Yes. Pertussis may be prevented in household members and close contacts of a person with pertussis by treating them with antibiotics, even if they have been vaccinated. Vaccination of children in early infancy as well as adults may also prevent pertussis. Pertussis vaccine is given along with diphtheria and tetanus vaccines in the same shot. When possible, babies should be kept away from people who are coughing since most hospitalizations and deaths occur in children less than three months of age. Babies with any coughing illness should be seen by a doctor.

Is The Pertussis Vaccine Safe?

Yes, it is safe for most people. Pertussis causes about 10 deaths to 20 deaths each year in the United States. That is why experts recommend that all babies and children should

be given a full series of DTaP vaccine. Children 11 years and older and adults should receive a single booster dose of Tdap unless there is a medical reason not to receive the vaccine.

Montanans will have a number of opportunities to review and comment on 2014-2015 hunting regulation proposals by going on online now or by attending one of 43 public meetings beginning in January.

Last summer, FWP held seven meetings across the state and received nearly 1,200 comments that led to several new hunting season proposals.

At the meetings in January, FWP will present proposals to aid the recovery of Montana's declining deer populations by reducing hunting pressure on antlerless mule deer and white-tailed deer. Wildlife managers surmise Montana's deer numbers are in decline statewide due to a number of unique

circumstances-from the cyclical nature of mule deer populations to predation and disease and from drought to tough winter conditions. For the next two hunting seasons, with a few exceptions to address game damage issues, FWP proposes to: 1) convert general mule deer seasons to antlered-only; 2) eliminate most mule deer B, or antlerless, licenses; 3) eliminate white-tailed deer B licenses in Regions 4 and 6 and in most of Region 5.

Details on the proposed hunting regulations are available on FWP's website at fwp.mt.gov. Click "2014-2015 Hunting Proposals," where one can find a complete calendar of meeting times and locations, and additional information on each proposal. The proposals encompass hunting season dates and nearly every huntable species in the state, including antelope, black bear, bighorn sheep, bison, deer, elk, moose, mountain goat, mountain lion, and a variety of upland game birds.

Comments may be submitted at the local meetings, which are set for Jan 4-23, 2014 statewide, or online at fwp.mt.gov. Written comments may be sent to: FWP— Wildlife Bureau, Attn: Public Comment, P.O. Box 200701, Helena, MT 59620-0701. For questions not covered on the website, call 406-444-2612.

Comments are due by 5 PM on Jan. 24, 2014. The Fish & Wildlife Commission will adopt final regulations in February.

USDA Designates 31 Counties in North Dakota as Primary Natural Disaster Areas with Assistance to Farmers and Ranchers in Adjacent States

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has designated 31 counties in North Dakota as primary natural disaster areas due to losses caused by multiple disasters that include spring snowstorms, significant rainfall, unseasonably cool spring, frosts and freeze damage, flooding, ground saturation,

severe thunderstorms, hail damage, high winds, weather-related insects and diseases, and mid-summer drought conditions that began Jan. 1, 2013. and continues.

Those counties are: Benson, Grand Forks, McLean, Pembina, Bottineau, Grant, Mercer, Pierce, Burke, Kidder, Morton, Ramsev,

Burleigh, Logan, Mountrail, Renville, Cavalier, McHenry, Nelson, Rolette, Divide. McIntosh, Oliver, Sioux, Emmons, Stutsman, Towner, Traill, Walsh, Ward, Wells.

"President Obama and I are committed to ensuring that agriculture remains a bright spot in our nation's economy by sustaining the successes of America's farmers, ranchers, and rural communities through these difficult times. We're also telling North Dakota producers that USDA stands with you and your communities when severe weather and natural disasters threaten to disrupt your livelihood."

Farmers and ranchers in the following counties in North Dakota also qualify for natural disaster assistance because their counties are contiguous. Those counties are:

Adams, Dunn, Hettinger, Stark, Barnes, Eddy, LaMoure, Steele, Cass, Foster, McKenzie, Williams, Dickey, Griggs, Sheridan.

Farmers and ranchers in the following counties in Minnesota, Montana, and South Dakota also qualify for natural disaster assistance because their counties are contiguous. Those counties are:

Minnesota, Kittson, Marshall, Norman, Polk, Montana, Sheridan, South Dakota Campbell.

All counties and parishes listed above were designated natural disaster areas on Dec. 18, 2013, making all qualified farm operators in the designated areas eligible for low interest emergency (EM) loans from USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA), provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible counties have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. FSA has a variety of programs, in addition to the EM loan program, to help eligible farmers recover from adversity.

The Obama Adminis-



tration remains committed to helping the thousands of farm families and businesses struggling with natural disasters. Actions taken by Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack in 2012 to provide assistance to producers impacted by the drought included:

Extended emergency grazing on Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres, freeing up a record 2.8 million acres and as much as \$200 million in forage and feed for ranchers during a challenging time. Purchased \$170 million of pork, lamb, chicken, and catfish for federal food nutrition assistance programs, including food banks, to help relieve pressure on American livestock producers and bring the nation's meat supply in line with demand. Reduced the emergency loan rate, from 3.75 percent to 2.875 percent, as well as making emergency loans available earlier in the season. Allowing having or grazing of cover crops without impacting the insurability of planted 2013 spring crops. USDA worked with crop insurance companies to provide flexibility to farmers, and one-third of all policyholders took advantage of the extended payment period. Authorized \$16 million in existing funds from the Wildlife Habitat Incentive Program (WHIP) and Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) to target states experiencing exceptional and extreme drought. Transferred \$14 million in unobligated program funds into the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) to help farmers and ranchers rehabilitate farmland damaged by natural disasters and for carrying out emergency water conservation measures in periods of severe drought. Authorized having and grazing of Wetlands Reserve Program (WRP) easement areas in drought-affected areas where having and grazing is consistent with conservation of

wildlife habitat and wetlands. Lowered the penalty on CRP acres used for emergency having or grazing, from 25 percent to 10 percent in 2012. Simplified the Secretarial disaster designation process and reduced the time it takes to designate counties affected by disasters by 40 percent.

Additional programs available to assist farmers and ranchers include the **Emergency Conservation** Program, Federal Crop Insurance, and the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program. Interested farmers may contact their local USDA Service Centers for further information on eligibility requirements and application procedures for these and other programs. Additional information is also available online at http://disaster.fsa. usda.gov.

Secretary Vilsack also reminds producers that Congress has not funded the five disaster assistance programs authorized by the 2008 Farm Bill. These are SURE; the Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP); the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish (ELAP): the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP); and the Tree Assistance Program (TAP). Production losses due to disasters occurring after Sept. 30, 2011, are not eligible for disaster program coverage.








Kendra Iversen Places In Top Three In State Competition

Kendra Iversen, a Vocal Music Education from Sidney, Mont., was one of three Black Hills State University students to place in the top three in the collegiate composition category of the South Dakota Music Teachers Association (SDMTA) competition.

"I'm very proud of the work they've done," said Dr. Symeon Waseen, assistant professor of music. "I feel that this is the beginning of a strong tradition of composition here at BHSU. Composition is my passion, and I am very excited to share it with willing students in the region."

According to Waseen, composition students submit a work they have written to the composition chair who sends it to a judge. The judge then reviews the submissions and chooses the top in each age category

Raquel Sweat placed first. Sweat's piece was titled "Frive" and was a plano piece using the 20th century technique of quartal and quintal harmonies--harmonies that are based on the intervals of fourths and fifths.

"We all wrote our own pieces using a 20th century technique we learned in Advanced Music Theory II. We didn't have any rules and could use any instrument we

wanted. I wrote for piano, so I could play it myself," Sweat said. "I named my piece 'Frive,' which is like if the words four and five had a baby."

Jesse Dunaway placed second, and Kendra Iversen got an honorable mention.

Dunaway's piece "Messagejio de Dio," which is Italian for "The Message of God," started with two vocals and later was revised to four vocals for a full men's choir. Like Sweat, Dunaway also performed his piece himself along with some fellow students. Iversen chose BHSU students Matt Adair, music major from Sheridan, Wyo., and Kortney Brunner, music education major from Nisland, to perform her composition

"My piece was a piano and vocal piece," Iversen said. "I used the 20th century theme, with a lot of tone rose, serialism, and word paintings in my piece."

The collegiate composition category of SDMTA is a competition that provides opportunities for instructors and music students to gain recognition of their musical growth as an undergraduate or high school student. SDMTA holds student competitions every year. The competitions are for instrumental/vocal performance and composition.

"I am very thrilled that BHSU students received all of the top places for the competition," Sweat said. "Dr. Waseen is such an inspiration to all of us and is a wonderful instructor. When I came to BHSU, I was completely against composition and improvisation, but he helped us learn enough to feel confident in composing our own pieces. He has taught me so much about plano and theory, and it is because of him that I want to pursue my master's degree in music theory after graduation."
