



Peace Officers Honored in Sidney



Life Light Christian Watford City

Local law enforcement gathered on Wednesday, May 15, to remember their fallen members and salute those who serve. Following the honor guard posting of the colors and formation by the Sidney Police officers, the Richland County Sheriff's Officers and support staff, Captain Mark Kraft explained the origins of the memorial event and gave some statistics.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week.

Nationwide, 21,500 law enforcement officers have died from various causes since 1791 when record keeping began, with 40 so far this year. In Montana, 129 officers have been lost.

Richland County Sheriff John Dynneson recognized the two officers who ended their watch in the line of duty in Richland County: Sheriff's Deputy George Eikhoff who was killed in an automobile accident in 1962 while transporting someone to the hospital; and Fairview Police Chief Orville Sharbono who was killed while serving a warrant. He said the purpose of the service was to show utmost respect to those individuals and their families.

The bell was tolled seven times, the first six for those who have responded, served, protected, sacrificed and suffered. The seventh signaled the loss of life.

"Taps" and "Amazing Grace" by bagpipers concluded the moving ceremony.



Williston, ND: After 22 years managing Fort Union Trading Post, Andy Banta has announced his retirement as of May 31. Andy began his 41+year career as a volunteer Park Ranger at Grand Canyon National Park, and made stops at Rocky Mountain National Park, Fort Laramie National Historic Site, Badlands National Park, and Fossil Butte National Monument. His work included natural resource management, law enforcement, and interpretation prior to becoming the Superintendent at Fort Union.

While it is unusual for a park manager to remain in one park for this long, Andy attributes his tenure here to the outstanding park staff and positive community support. The partial reconstruction and the ongoing success of Fort Union Trading Post is the result of community efforts. Of special note are the Friends of Fort Union and Fort Buford, The Fort Union Cooperative Association, The Fort Union Muzzle Loader Association, The Williston Convention and Visitors Bureau, The City of Williston, and North Dakota Tourism

North Dakota Public Service **Commission Discusses New McKenzie County Pipeline**

The North Dakota Public Service Commission held a public hearing to discuss a possible new pipeline. The meeting was held on May 17 at the Little Missouri Grille and Suites, and was attended by approximately ten people including three of the North Dakota Public Service Commissioners, some private company representatives, local officials, and at least one legislator. There were about ten people present, not counting Public Service Commission staff and attorneys.

The public meeting was held to receive input on a proposed 10.2 mile pipeline designed to transport natural gas liquids. The proposed pipeline would begin at the Targa Badlands Little Missouri Gas Processing Plant and would end at a facility planned by ONEOK, called the Demicks Lake Pipeline.

The planned Pipeline would be approximately a 12inch steel pipe which could move up to 20 thousand barrels per day, and could transport ethane, propane, butane, isobutane mix, and gasoline.

The purpose of the hearing was to provide an opportunity to comment by the public, as a part of the consideration of Public Service Commissioners in their role of providing oversight over such project

The Roundup spoke to Pat Fahn, who serves in the North Dakota Public Service Commission Office, who was able to answer questions on

behalf of the Public Service Commissioners, Brian Kroshus, Julie Fedorchak, and Randy Christmann in their absence, who at the time of publication were unavailable

for further comment. According to Fahn, who serves as the Director of the Public Utilities Division for the Public Service Commission, the pipeline is an uncontroversial addition to pipeline infrastructure in McKenzie County. He explained the plans for the pipeline.

Fahn explained, "NGO means 'natural gas liquids.' The commission is required to hold a hearing in the county where the project is taking

The meeting, which lasted about two and a half hours, discussed the 'ins and outs' of the pipeline, but there was nothing unique or controversial about this pipeline project, according to the Fahn. Fahn also explained the location of

the pipeline doesn't traverse any controversial property.

Fahn said, "The pipeline will not traverse any rivers or public occupied land. There are one or two residents, that used to be man-camps, that are near the pipeline, but probably shouldn't present any kind of problem." Fahn was clear to emphasize that the North Dakota Public Service Commission doesn't approve pipeline projects, but only approves the location for pipeline projects. Other agencies, like the McKenzie County commissioners, would have to give necessary permits if the pipelines cross public properties or roads. The pipeline does propose to cross beneath Highway 25 south of Watford City.

The North Dakota Public Service Commission does plan on releasing their decision to the public soon, according to Fahn.

Fishing Regulations **Scoping Survey Available Online**

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks invites anglers and other interested parties to participate in a survey regarding changes to the 2020 fishing regulations. The survey is available at http:// fwp.mt.gov/fish/publicComments/regsScoping.html.

The survey is part of a public scoping process to review fishing regulations and identify potential issues with fisheries. This review happens every four years.

Public input is vital to crafting fishing regulations, said Eric Roberts, FWP fisheries management bureau chief. We evaluate how a regulation may impact a fishery biologically, angling opportunities for the public and the regulations social acceptability.

This initial scoping process runs through June 21, 2019. FWP staff will then formulate tentative proposals to present to the Montana Fish & Wildlife Commission in August. Additional public comment on tentative proposals will be collected this fall and the final regulations will be considered at the October commission meeting.

Some of the ideas now being considered by FWP include: Changing the largemouth and smallmouth bass limits on some waterbodies in the Western Fishing District;

· Allowing single-point lures only on the Middle, North and South Forks of the Flathead River; · Implementing a hoot owl restriction on the Ennis Dam to

Mouth stretch of the Madison River that would prohibit fishing between 2 p.m. and midnight from July 1 through Aug. 31; · Establishing no limit or mandatory harvest of northern pike

and standardizing the daily walleye limit on the Missouri River from Holter Dam to Black Eagle Dam;

• Requiring ice fishing shelters to be removed from the ice by at least March 1 in the Eastern Fishing District;

 Allowing bow and arrow harvest of Chinook salmon from Oct. 1 through Nov. 30 on Fort Peck Reservoir.

Anglers and others are invited to participate by reviewing these and other FWP ideas - and by contributing additional ideas of their own. Comments can be submitted online or at public meetings that will soon be scheduled in each FWP region.

Keep Your Distance From Young Or Injured Wildlife

Each spring, Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks receives several calls from people who have picked up deer fawns or other wildlife.

FWP advises against this practice for several reasons. The agency does not accept. hold or rehabilitate deer and elk because the animals rarely survive the stress of captivity, and because of concerns with the spread of disease. So FWP's likely response would be to tell people to leave the animals alone or return them to where they were found.

While people mean well, they may not understand that their intervention could possibly kill the animal or cause injury to it or to themselves. Good intentions can lead to dire consequences.

Every spring, FWP receives calls from good-in-

tentioned people who pick up great horned owls that have bailed out of the nest before they can fly. This is a natural part of their life cycle. The adult owls monitor these young, providing them with food until they can fly — usually just a couple of days. People can help best by not touching the owls and by keeping pets restrained.

In a high-profile case in Yellowstone National Park last summer, a bison calf was picked up and transported by tourists who believed it had been abandoned. The calf ultimately had to be euthanized because it couldn't be reunited with the herd and continued to approach people and vehicles.

If You Care, Leave Them

To prevent outcomes like this, FWP emphasizes that all wildlife species and their young should be left in the wild. If you see a young animal alone or injured, whether a goose or a grizzly, keep your distance. It is illegal to possess and care for a live animal taken from the wild.


Animals often thrive without human intervention, and their odds of surviving in the wild are much greater if they are left alone. Once young animals are picked up by people, they usually can't be rehabilitated. People handling wildlife also may injure themselves or the animal, or habituate it to humans, potentially causing problems if the animal is released back into the wild.

Understanding Nature It's natural for deer, elk and other animals to leave their young alone for extended periods of time. What appears

to be an orphaned animal may not be, but chances are the mother will not return while humans are present. Fawns are seldom orphaned, but if they are, another doe may add them to the group. In 8 to 10 days, a fawn will have the appropriate gut flora and can survive on its own by nibbling grass. Young fawns have no body odor, which lessens their appeal to predators. Their spots also help to camouflage them while their mothers stash them to feed.

If you take dogs into the field, be sure to keep your dog under control, especially in the spring when newborn wildlife is most vulnerable. Pet owners can be cited, and dogs that harass or kill wildlife may, by law, have to be destroyed.

World "No Tobacco" Day

Tobacco Day, May 31, 2019, is on the negative impact tobacco has on people's lung health, from cancer to chronic respiratory disease. I think most everyone realizes by now that smoking and second hand smoke is unhealthy for everyone, but what about electronic cigarettes? E-cigarettes come in many flavors that contain a chemical called diacetyl. When this chemical is heated and inhaled it causes a scarring of the tiny air sacs in the lungs resulting in the thickening and narrowing of the airways. This causes coughing, wheezing and shortness of breathe. This is often called "popcorn lung."

According to the Campaign for Tobacco - Free Kids, Juul e-cigarettes have skyrocketed in popularity among youth across the United States since being introduced in 2015, leading to what public health officials have call a youth e-cigarette "epidemic". In 2018, e-cigarette use among high school students rose by 78 percent, and more than 3.6 million middle and high school students used e-cigarettes an alarming increase of 1.5 million students in one year.

Several factors have contributed to Juul's rising popularitv with teens



fit in a closed hand. · Juul comes in flavors that appeal to youth, including mango, fruit, creme, mint, menthol and cucumber. Research shows that flavors play a key role in youth use of tobacco products, including e-cigarettes.

· Juul appears to deliver nicotine more effectively and at higher doses than other e-cigarettes, increasing users' risk of addiction. The manufacturer has claimed that each Juul "pod" (cartridge of nicotine liquid) contains as much nicotine as a pack of cigarettes. However, research has found that many young Juul users don't know the product always contains nicotine, and many teens call use of the product "juuling," indicating they may not realize it is an e-cigarette or tobacco product.


