





# Montana FSA Reminds Montana Honey Producers of Dec. 3rd NAP Deadline for 2013 Honey Crop; All 2013 Acreage Reporting Deadlines

Bruce Nelson, state executive director for USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Montana, urges Montana honey producers who want to purchase 2013 coverage through the Noninsurable Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) to do so before the sales closing date of Dec. 3, 2012.

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of noninsurable crops when low yields/grazing loss, loss of inventory or prevented planting occur due to normal disasters.

Honey is the only 2013 Montana NAP crop with a Dec. 3, 2012 sales closing date.

All other NAP crops (except honey and value loss crops) have a NAP application sales closing date of March 15, 2013. "Purchasing a crop insurance policy is an easy way for

producers to practice risk management," Nelson said. "The 2012 crop year has proved that natural disasters can directly affect the profitability and recovery of agricultural operations."

In order to meet eligibility requirements for NAP, crops must be noninsurable, commercially-produced agricultural commodity crops for which the catastrophic risk protection level of crop insurance is not available. If the CAT level of insurance is available for a particular crop, type, and intended use in the county, then in all cases NAP cannot be offered within that county for any practice of that crop (irrigated, non-irrigated, summer fallow, and continuous crop). For a complete list of eligible NAP crops by county, contact your FSA county office. In the event of a natural disaster, NAP covers the amount of loss greater than 50 percent of the expected production based

The service fee is the lesser of \$250 per crop or \$750 per producer per administrative county, not to exceed a total of \$1,875 for a producer with farming interests in multiple

# **Storytelling** in the Oil Patch

Writing Workshops Nov. 7 & 21

An organization in North Dakota believes it's just as important to harvest the stories coming out of western North Dakota as it is to capture the natural resources there. To achieve their goal, the North Dakota Humanities Council (NDHC) will send two professional writers with North Dakota roots to communities directly affected by the recent oil boom to host writing workshops exploring the ways oil is transforming the landscape and culture.

According to NDHC director Brenna Gerhardt, "Nothing is more important to a culture than its stories. They are the vehicles for transferring history, values and ideas from one generation to the next. Stories can endure for thousands of years, but oil development has a limited lifespan."

The "Our People. Our Places. Our Stories.," writing workshops will allow residents of the Bakken the ability to share and preserve their stories under the guidance of professional storytellers Debra Marquart and Taylor Brorby.

A native of Napoleon, Debra Marquart is a profes-

sor of English at Iowa State University. A performance poet, Marquart is the author of two poetry collections: Everything's a Verb and From Sweetness. Her memoir, The Horizontal World: Growing Up Wild in the Middle of Nowhere, was published by Counterpoint Books in 2006. It received the "Elle Lettres" award from Elle Magazine and the 2007 PEN USA Creative Nonfiction Award.

In the seventies and eighties, Marquart was a touring road musician with rock and heavy metal bands. Her collection of short stories, The Hunger Bone: Rock & Roll Stories draws from her experiences as a female road musician.

Hunters' Most Common Hunting Violations

Every hunting season some individuals unwittingly or knowingly violate the state's game laws.

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks officials urge hunters to review Montana's hunting rules and regulations to ensure they act within the law and that they recognize when others violate the hunting regulations and related laws.

Any violation afield can be reported to TIP-MONT at 1-800-TIP-MONT (1-800-847-6668). You can also report a violation online.

Here are some of the most common game violations: Failure to obtain permission from landowners before hunting on private property.

Wasting part of a game animal suitable for food.

Failure to properly validate a license/tag or to securely fasten the tag in a visible manner to a game animal immediately after it is taken and before it is moved or transported from the kill site.

Taking game from the wrong hunting district.

Using someone else's tag on a game animal you killed, or tagging a game animal that someone else killed.

Shooting game animals on or from any public highway or public right-of-way.

Taking game without a license or the proper permit.

Failure to validate a big game tag.

Not leaving evidence of the sex or species of the game animal attached.

FWP encourages hunters to protect the future of their sport by hunting responsibly and reporting hunting violations to the toll-free 1-800-TIP-MONT (1-800-847-6668) number or report a violation online.



2. Mark the joint right below the nail as well as the knuckle joint by carving out tiny horizontal wedges of cheese, as pictured.

3. For the fingernails, slice a green bell pepper into 3/8-inch-wide strips. Set the strips skin side down on your work surface and trim the pulp so that it's about half as thick. Then cut the strips into ragged-topped nail shapes and stick them in place at the ends of the fingers with dabs of cream cheese.

4. Wrap 4 pieces of dough around each hot dog and 1/4 slice of cheese to look like "bandages." Make sure to stretch the dough to completely cover the hot dog. Approximately a 1/2 inch from the end of each hot dog, separate "bandages" so the hot dog shows through for the "face". Place wrapped hot dogs (cheese side down) on an ungreased large cookie sheet. Spray dough lightly with cooking spray.

# Board, Leiseth and Christoferson Reappointed

Governor Jack Dalrymple has appointed Duane Hanson of West Fargo to the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's advisory board.

The governor appoints eight Game and Fish Department advisors, each representing a multi-county section of the state, to serve as a liaison between the department and public.

Hanson is a financial advisor, West Fargo city commissioner, and avid hunter and angler, and fills the expiring term of Loran Palmer, Wahpeton, in District 5, which includes Cass, Ransom, Richland, Sargent, Steele and Traill counties.

In addition, the governor recently reappointed District 1 advisory board member Jason Leiseth, Arnegard; and District 6 advisory board member Joel Christoferson, Litchville, to another term.

Four members of the advisory board must be farmers or ranchers and four must be hunters/anglers. Appointments are for a term of four years. No member can serve longer

Advisory board members host two public meetings, held each spring and fall, to provide citizens with an opportunity to discuss fish and wildlife issues and ask questions of their district advisors and agency personnel.

### **CWD Surveillance Continues**

The State Game and Fish Department will continue its Hunter-Harvested Surveillance program during the 2013 hunting season, by sampling deer for chronic wasting disease and bovine tuberculosis from 13 units in North Dakota. In addition, all moose and elk harvested in the state are eligible for testing.

Samples from hunter-harvested deer taken in the eastern portion of the state will be tested from units 1, 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, 2E, 2F1, 2F2, 2G, 2G1, 2G2 and 2L. In addition, deer will be tested from unit 3F2 in the southwest.

Every head sampled must have either the deer tag attached, or a new tag can be filled out with the license number, deer hunting unit and date harvested.

Visit the Game and Fish website for a list of businesses participating in the surveillance program.

CWD affects the nervous system of members of the deer family and is always fatal. Scientists have found no evidence that CWD can be transmitted naturally to humans or livestock.

The Ag Department at Williston State College is getting ready for the 4th annual Carcass Challenge. Students in the program take calves donated from area livestock producers to Hovde Feedlot in Arnegard, feed them the same rations, and weigh and process them monthly and study the data. When they are ready to be processed, they are brought to Prairie Packing and sold as quarters, halves, or wholes. The proceeds fund the Ag Ambassador program.

The Ag Ambassador program helps communicate the importance of agriculture in our area. "Students interested in agriculture will go out in a leadership fashion and promote agriculture," said Kim Murphy, Ag instructor at WSC. "It's agriculture advocacy.'

Those interested in donating a calf to the Carcass Challenge have from now until December 30th to do so. In addition to supporting the Ag Ambassador program, a donation has many benefits for livestock producers, including gaining valuable data on the genetics of their calf. "When they are processed, we take the data and get quality grades on the carcasses," said Murphy. "We give out awards for the best gainer and the overall best carcass data.'

Awards are given out during a special event hosted by the Ag Department called "Cowboy Christmas." This year's event will take place on December 7th. It is open to the public and donors receive free tickets to the event. Cowboy Christmas will include a prime-rib supper and live entertainment, and the National Finals Rodeo will be shown live on the big screen.

Awards will be given out for last year's donors.

# **Development Will Provide Affordable Housing For Medical Personnel In Williston**

Gov. Jack Dalrymple and representatives from Mercy Medical Center and the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) today celebrated the completion of Mercy Heights Apartments, a new complex in Williston that will provide affordable housing for medical personnel. The \$11 million project received a \$1 million allocation from the North Dakota Housing Incentive Fund (HIF), reserving 20 units for low- to moderate-income households.

"The completion of Mercy Heights Apartments is a great example of the progress we are making through public-private partnerships promoted by the Housing Incentive Fund to address North Dakota's affordable housing needs," said Dalrymple. "Providing affordable housing for essential services employees and those on fixed incomes is critical as we continue to address the impacts of rapid growth and enhance the livability of our communities.'

Located at 301 2nd Street East in Williston, the modern four-story building has 66 apartments, underground tenant parking, and main floor commercial space. Twothirds of the rental units are expected to be occupied by Mercy Medical Center em-

According to Mercy Medical Center President Matt

Grimshaw, the recruiting and retaining of quality healthcare staff has been difficult in recent years, with the lack of affordable housing a key issue. The medical facility established a long-term approach to address its housing needs by developing Mercy Heights Apartments. The complex is expected to make it easier to fill vacant positions at Williston's hospital.

"To address the staffing challenge, Mercy began planning for a permanent solution to our housing needs, and with the support of our parent organization, Catholic Health Initiatives, and the State of North Dakota, it is now a reality," said Grimshaw.

Mercy Heights was one of 24 housing projects selected by the state for development assistance in 2011/12. HIF contributions from Gate City Bank and American State Bank & Trust Company of Williston supported the state's funding commitment of \$1 million for the project.

"With the demand for development resources growing, more local, state and private dollars are needed to address North Dakota's affordable housing needs," said Jolene Kline, NDHFA acting director. The agency administers HIF.

The state legislature reauthorized HIF during the 2013 legislative session, giving NDHFA a \$15.4 million general fund appropriation and the authority to issue up to \$20 million in state tax credits to further capitalize the program. NDHFA has made conditional commitments to 18 new HIF projects so far. The agency will announce more commitments in November.

To support new projects, NDHFA needs to fully capitalize the new fund by Dec. 31, 2014. Contributions to HIF can be directed to a specific project or community. More information on the program is available online at www. ndhousingincentivefund.org.

In addition to the Mercy Heights Apartments, Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI) has made significant commitments to the communities it serves in western North Dakota. With recent expansions at Mercy Medical Center and the construction of a new hospital campus in Dickinson, CHI has invested \$150 million in the region. 

# **WSC** Foundation **Apartments House Essential Service Workers**

The Williston State College (WSC) Foundation today celebrated the successful completion of the first phase of the WSC Foundation Apartments, a 74-unit complex that houses essential service workers including WSC, state, city and school district employees, and Bethel Lutheran staff.

"I applaud the vision of the foundation staff and board in developing this unique project to provide housing for essential service employees and to ensure a steady workforce for the region," said Gov. Jack Dalrymple, who attended today's open house. "They stepped outside the box to bring additional affordable housing opportunities to the region and to ensure that the critical needs of this growing community were covered."

To ensure that apartment rents would be affordable for low- to moderate-income households, the \$11.2 million project received a \$1 million allocation from the North Dakota Housing Incentive Fund (HIF) and an interest rate buy-down through the Bank of North Dakota's FlexPACE

program. HIF contributions from Gate City Bank and U.S. Bank supported the state's funding commitment. HIF is administered by the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA). The North Dakota Industrial Commission, consisting of Dalrymple as chairman, Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring and Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem, oversees the agency.

"Providing adequate housing for our workforce is one of North Dakota's greatest challenges," said Jolene Kline, NDHFA acting executive director. "With the demand for development resources growing, more local, state and private dollars - like the HIF contributions made by Gate City Bank and U.S. Bank - are needed to address North Dakota's affordable housing needs."

WSC will break ground on the second phase of the housing development as soon as the building permits are approved. Phase II will provide 74 additional apartments with 43 of those units reserved for essential service workers.


In August, NDHFA made a conditional commitment of

\$3 million in HIF funding to phase II. That funding commitment will need to be capitalized by contributions from state taxpayers. Contributors receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit for contributions. Contributions can be targeted to a specific project or community. "We are grateful for the support the project received from the State and community; the support has allowed us to lower rent for all units which has been a game changer when hiring at WSC," said Terry Olson, WSC Foundation director.






