Montana FSA Reminds Montana Honey Producers of Dec. 3rd NAP Deadline for 2013 Honey Crop; All 2013 Acreage Reporting Deadlines

Bruce Nelson, state executive director for USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Montana, urges Montana honey producers who want to purchase 2013 coverage through the Noninsurable Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) to do so before the sales closing date of Dec. 3, 2012.

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of noninsurable crops when low yields/grazing loss, loss of inventory or prevented planting occur due to normal disasters.

Honey is the only 2013 Montana NAP crop with a Dec. 3, 2012 sales closing date.

All other NAP crops (except honey and value loss crops) have a NAP application sales closing date of March 15, 2013. "Purchasing a crop insurance policy is an easy way for

producers to practice risk management," Nelson said. "The 2012 crop year has proved that natural disasters can directly affect the profitability and recovery of agricultural operations."

In order to meet eligibility requirements for NAP, crops must be noninsurable, commercially-produced agricultural commodity crops for which the catastrophic risk protection level of crop insurance is not available. If the CAT level of insurance is available for a particular crop, type, and intended use in the county, then in all cases NAP cannot be offered within that county for any practice of that crop (irrigated, non-irrigated, summer fallow, and continuous crop). For a complete list of eligible NAP crops by county, contact your FSA county office. In the event of a natural disaster, NAP covers the amount of loss greater than 50 percent of the expected production based

on the approved yield and reported acreage.

Eligible producers can apply for coverage using form CCC-471, "Application for Coverage". Producers must file the application and service fee by the Dec. 3rd deadline (for Honey). The service fee is the lesser of \$250 per crop or \$750 per producer per administrative county, not to exceed a total of \$1,875 for a producer with farming interests in multiple counties.

For more information on sales closing dates and NAP, contact your FSA county office.

2013 Acreage Reporting Deadlines for Honey and Other Crops

Montana honey producers are also reminded of an upcoming acreage reporting date for the 2013 honey crop which is part of the four new acreage reporting dates of a national initiative to align acreage reporting dates between FSA and Risk Management Agency (RMA).

Producers must file acreage reports to their FSA office on or before the following deadlines to be considered timely-filed:

- TODAY, Nov. 15, 2012: Apiculture, Perennial Forage, Pasture, Rangeland and Forage (PRF), Native and Tame Pasture, Fall Wheat (HRW) and all other Fall-Seeded Small Grains
- Jan. 2, 2013: (or 30 days after placement of colonies) Honey covered under NAP
- Jan. 15, 2013: Cherries, Established Stand Alfalfa Seed, Fall Alfalfa Seed
- July 15, 2013: Spring Alfalfa Seed, Barley, Canola, Corn, Dry Beans, Dry Peas, Flax, Forage Seeding, Mustard, Spring Oats, Potatoes, Safflower, Sugar Beets, Sunflowers, Spring Wheat, CRP, and all other crops

These are also the same dates for these crops to be reported to crop insurance agents when carrying federal crop insurance.

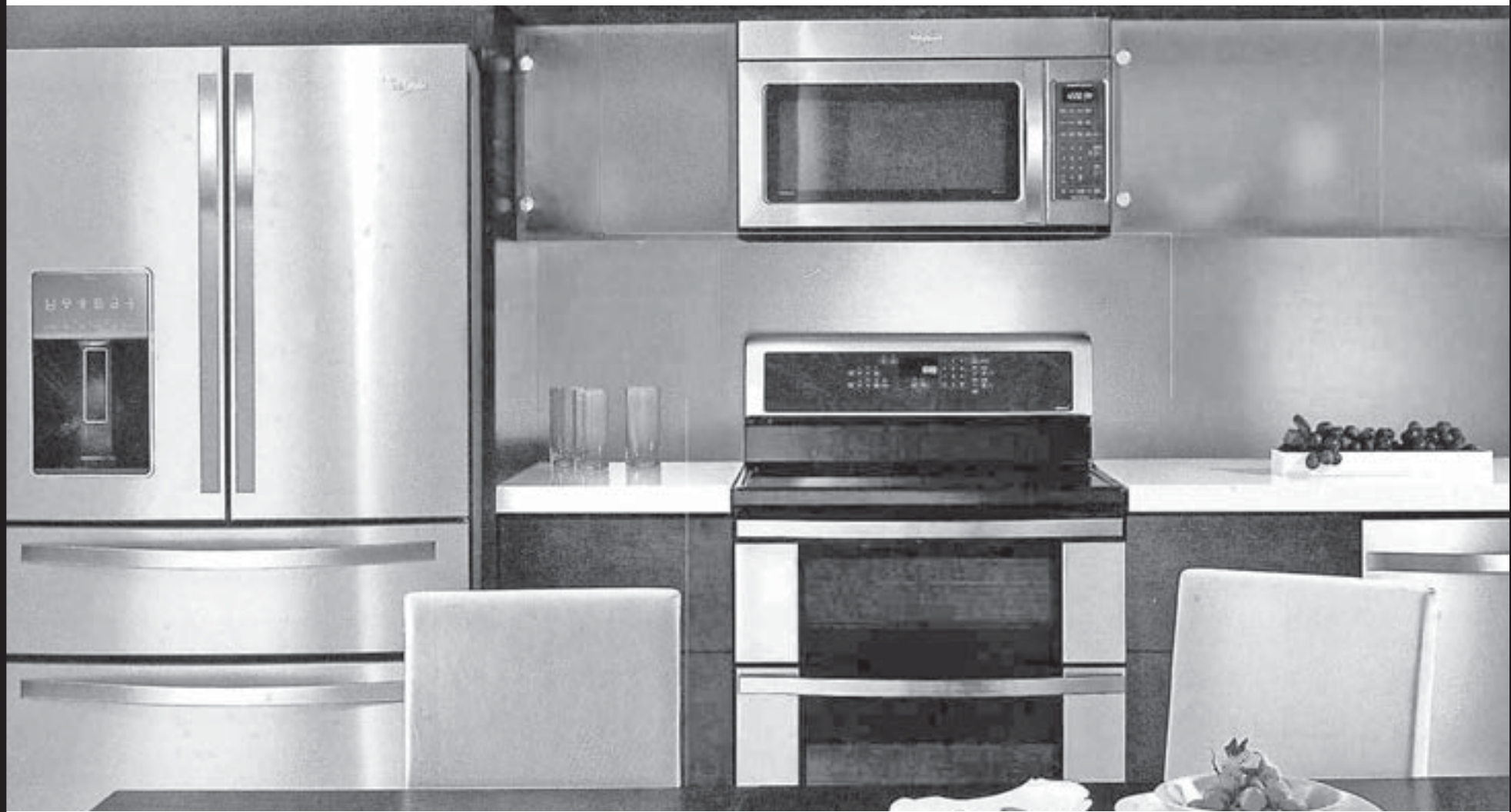

Storytelling in the Oil Patch Writing Workshops Nov. 7 & 21

An organization in North Dakota believes it's just as important to harvest the stories coming out of western North Dakota as it is to capture the natural resources there. To achieve their goal, the North Dakota Humanities Council (NDHC) will send two professional writers with North Dakota roots to communities directly affected by the recent oil boom to host writing workshops exploring the ways oil is transforming the landscape and culture.

According to NDHC director Brenna Gerhardt, "Nothing is more important to a culture than its stories. They are the vehicles for transferring history, values and ideas from one generation to the next. Stories can endure for thousands of years, but oil development has a limited lifespan."

The "Our People. Our Places. Our Stories." writing workshops will allow residents of the Bakken the ability to share and preserve their stories under the guidance of professional storytellers Debra Marquart and Taylor Brorby.

A native of Napoleon, Debra Marquart is a profes-

sor of English at Iowa State University. A performance poet, Marquart is the author of two poetry collections: Everything's a Verb and From Sweetness. Her memoir, The Horizontal World: Growing Up Wild in the Middle of Nowhere, was published by Counterpoint Books in 2006. It received the "Elle Lettres" award from Elle Magazine and the 2007 PEN USA Creative Nonfiction Award.

In the seventies and eighties, Marquart was a touring road musician with rock and heavy metal bands. Her collection of short stories, The Hunger Bone: Rock & Roll Stories draws from her experiences as a female road musician.

A native of Center, Taylor Brorby is a writer based

in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Taylor has received grants and fellowships from Hamline University and St. Olaf College. His work has appeared on Minnesota Public Radio, in the journal Rock, Paper, Scissors, Augsburg Fortress Press, in newspapers, and The Huffington Post, where he writes on education.

Finished stories generated during the workshops will appear on the NDHC website. The NDHC will also publish a special issue of On Second Thought magazine in the summer of 2014 that will print the best stories generated at the workshops.

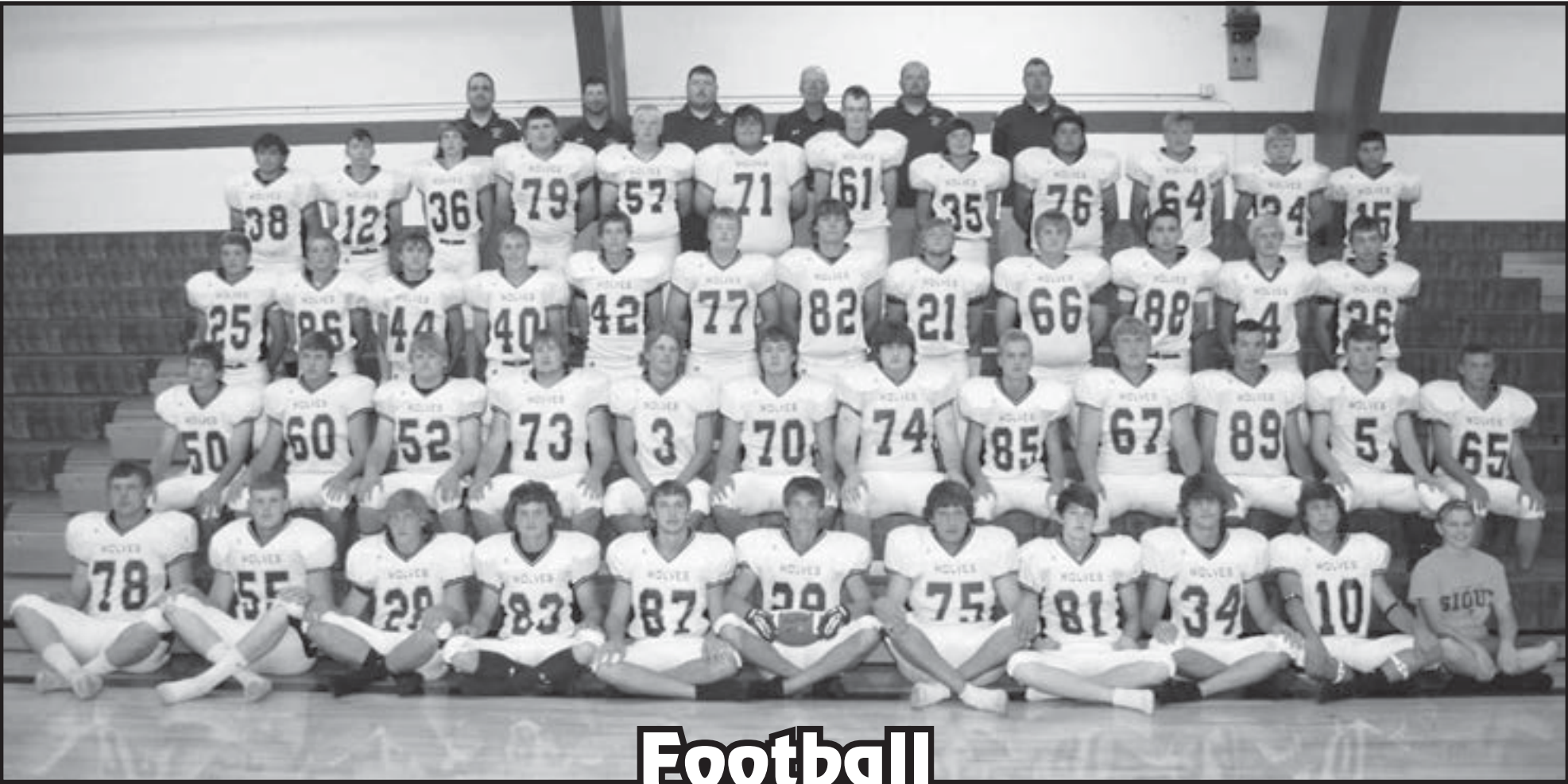

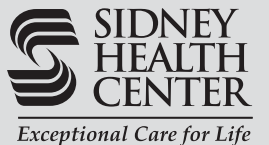

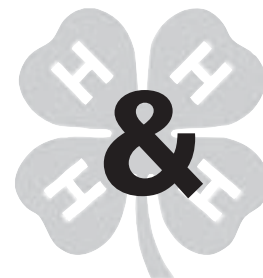

Hunters' Most Common Hunting Violations

Every hunting season some individuals unwittingly or knowingly violate the state's game laws.

Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks officials urge hunters to review Montana's hunting rules and regulations to ensure they act within the law and that they recognize when others violate the hunting regulations and related laws.

Any violation afield can be reported to TIP-MONT at 1-800-TIP-MONT (1-800-847-6668). You can also report a violation online.

Here are some of the most common game violations:

Failure to obtain permission from landowners before hunting on private property.

Wasting part of a game animal suitable for food.

Failure to properly validate a license/tag or to securely fasten the tag in a visible manner to a game animal immediately after it is taken and before it is moved or transported from the kill site.

Taking game from the wrong hunting district.

Using someone else's tag on a game animal you killed, or tagging a game animal that someone else killed.

Shooting game animals on or from any public highway or public right-of-way.

Taking game without a license or the proper permit.

Failure to validate a big game tag.

Not leaving evidence of the sex or species of the game animal attached.

FWP encourages hunters to protect the future of their sport by hunting responsibly and reporting hunting violations to the toll-free 1-800-TIP-MONT (1-800-847-6668) number or report a violation online.

Happy Halloween

The word Halloween is of Christian origin and it dates back to about 1745. It means “hallowed evening” or “holy evening”. Typical Halloween activities include trick-or-treating, carving pumpkins into jack-o'-lanterns, bobbing for apples, watching horror films, attending costume parties, decorating, lighting bonfires, telling scary stories, playing pranks and visiting haunted houses.

As a family, it's important to do things together, to create lasting memories. Halloween is a great opportunity to do just that. With a little creativity, teamwork and maybe even a little elbow grease you can help to create a ghoulishly good time for your entire family.

Halloween costumes can be made with little or no money – some examples include:

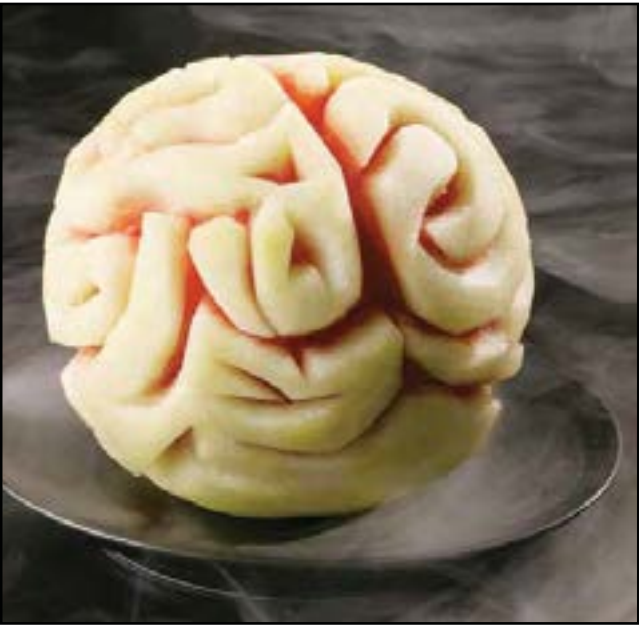
- All white clothing = angel
- All white clothing with a yellow circle on your shirt = Egg
- All Black clothing = black cat or a bat
- All Red clothing = devil, red M&M or skittle (use tape for the M on the shirt!)
- Jeans and a flannel shirt = A cowboy
- Pajamas = a baby
- Sports uniforms and equipment – basketball, hockey, soccer, golf, soft ball or baseball player
- Branches, brown paper bags, string, glue – scary Halloween Tree

You could also set up a costume swap with friends and neighbors, or take a trip to your local Salvation Army, Goodwill or thrift store.

Of course Halloween wouldn't be Halloween without the treats. Below are some fun treats you can make with your family.

Melon Brain

- What you'll need
- 1 small seedless water-melon
- How to make it
- 1. Use a vegetable peeler to remove the entire green



Melon Brain

- rind, exposing the inner white rind.
- 2. Slice off the bottom of the melon to create a flat base that will keep it from rolling. With a toothpick, outline squiggly furrows that resemble the folded surface of a brain.
- 3. Finally, carve narrow channels along the tracings with a sharp paring knife (a parent's job) to expose the pink fruit beneath the rind.

Cheesy Fingers

- What you'll need
- Mozzarella string cheese
 - Green bell pepper
 - Cream cheese



Cheesy Fingers

- How to make it
- 1. Wearing plastic gloves or sandwich bags over your hands to keep the cheese as smudge-free as possible, use a paring knife (parents only) to cut each string in half and then carve a shallow area for a fingernail just below the rounded end of each half.

- 2. Mark the joint right below the nail as well as the knuckle joint by carving out tiny horizontal wedges of cheese, as pictured.
- 3. For the fingernails, slice a green bell pepper into 3/8-inch-wide strips. Set the strips skin side down on your work surface and trim the pulp so that it's about half as thick. Then cut the strips into ragged-topped nail shapes and stick them in place at the ends of the fingers with dabs of cream cheese.

Crescent Mummy Dogs

Ingredients



Crescent Mummy Dogs

- 1 Can (8 oz) Pillsbury® refrigerated crescent dinner rolls or 1 can (8 oz) Pillsbury Crescent Recipe Creations® refrigerated seamless dough sheet
 - 2 ½ slices American cheese, quartered (2.5 oz)
 - 10 large hot dogs
 - Cooking spray
 - Mustard or ketchup, if desired
- Steps
- 1. Heat oven to 375°F.
 - 2. If using crescent rolls: Unroll dough; separate at perforations, creating 4 rectangles. Press perforations to seal. If using dough sheet: Unroll dough; cut into 4 rectangles.
 - 3. With knife or kitchen scissors, cut each rectangle lengthwise into 10 pieces, making a total of 40 pieces of dough. Slice cheese slices into quarters (1/2 slice cheese, cut in half).
 - 4. Wrap 4 pieces of dough around each hot dog and 1/4 slice of cheese to look like “bandages.” Make sure to stretch the dough to completely cover the hot dog. Approximately a 1/2 inch from the end of each hot dog, separate “bandages” so the hot dog shows through for the “face”. Place wrapped hot dogs (cheese side down) on an ungreased large cookie sheet. Spray dough lightly with cooking spray.
 - 5. Bake 13 to 17 minutes or until dough is light golden brown and hot dogs are hot. Use mustard to draw facial features.

Hanson Named to Advisory Board, Leiseth and Christoferson Reappointed

Governor Jack Dalrymple has appointed Duane Hanson of West Fargo to the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's advisory board.

The governor appoints eight Game and Fish Department advisors, each representing a multi-county section of the state, to serve as a liaison between the department and public.

Hanson is a financial advisor, West Fargo city commissioner, and avid hunter and angler, and fills the expiring term of Loran Palmer, Wahpeton, in District 5, which includes Cass, Ransom, Richland, Sargent, Steele and Traill counties.

In addition, the governor recently reappointed District 1 advisory board member Jason Leiseth, Arnegard; and District 6 advisory board member Joel Christoferson, Litchville, to another term.

Four members of the advisory board must be farmers or ranchers and four must be hunters/anglers. Appointments are for a term of four years. No member can serve longer than two terms.

Advisory board members host two public meetings, held each spring and fall, to provide citizens with an opportunity to discuss fish and wildlife issues and ask questions of their district advisors and agency personnel.

CWD Surveillance Continues

The State Game and Fish Department will continue its [Hunter-Harvested Surveillance program](#) during the 2013 hunting season, by sampling deer for chronic wasting disease and bovine tuberculosis from 13 units in North Dakota. In addition, all moose and elk harvested in the state are eligible for testing.

Samples from hunter-harvested deer taken in the eastern portion of the state will be tested from units 1, 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, 2E, 2F1, 2F2, 2G, 2G1, 2G2 and 2L. In addition, deer will be tested from unit 3F2 in the southwest.

Every head sampled must have either the deer tag attached, or a new tag can be filled out with the license number, deer hunting unit and date harvested.

Visit the Game and Fish website for a list of businesses participating in the surveillance program.

CWD affects the nervous system of members of the deer family and is always fatal. Scientists have found no evidence that CWD can be transmitted naturally to humans or livestock.

WSC's Ag Department Prepares for 4th Annual Carcass Challenge

The Ag Department at Williston State College is getting ready for the 4th annual Carcass Challenge. Students in the program take calves donated from area livestock producers to Hovde Feedlot in Arnegard, feed them the same rations, and weigh and process them monthly and study the data. When they are ready to be processed, they are brought to Prairie Packing and sold as quarters, halves, or wholes. The proceeds fund the Ag Ambassador program.

The Ag Ambassador program helps communicate the importance of agriculture in our area. "Students interested in agriculture will go out in a leadership fashion and promote agriculture," said Kim Murphy, Ag instructor at WSC. "It's agriculture advocacy."

"When they are processed, we take the data and get quality grades on the carcasses," said Murphy. "We give out awards for the best gainer and the overall best carcass data."

Awards are given out during a special event hosted by the Ag Department called "Cowboy Christmas." This year's event will take place on December 7th. It is open to the public and donors receive free tickets to the event. Cowboy Christmas will include a prime-rib supper and live entertainment, and the National Finals Rodeo will be shown live on the big screen.

Awards will be given out for last year's donors.

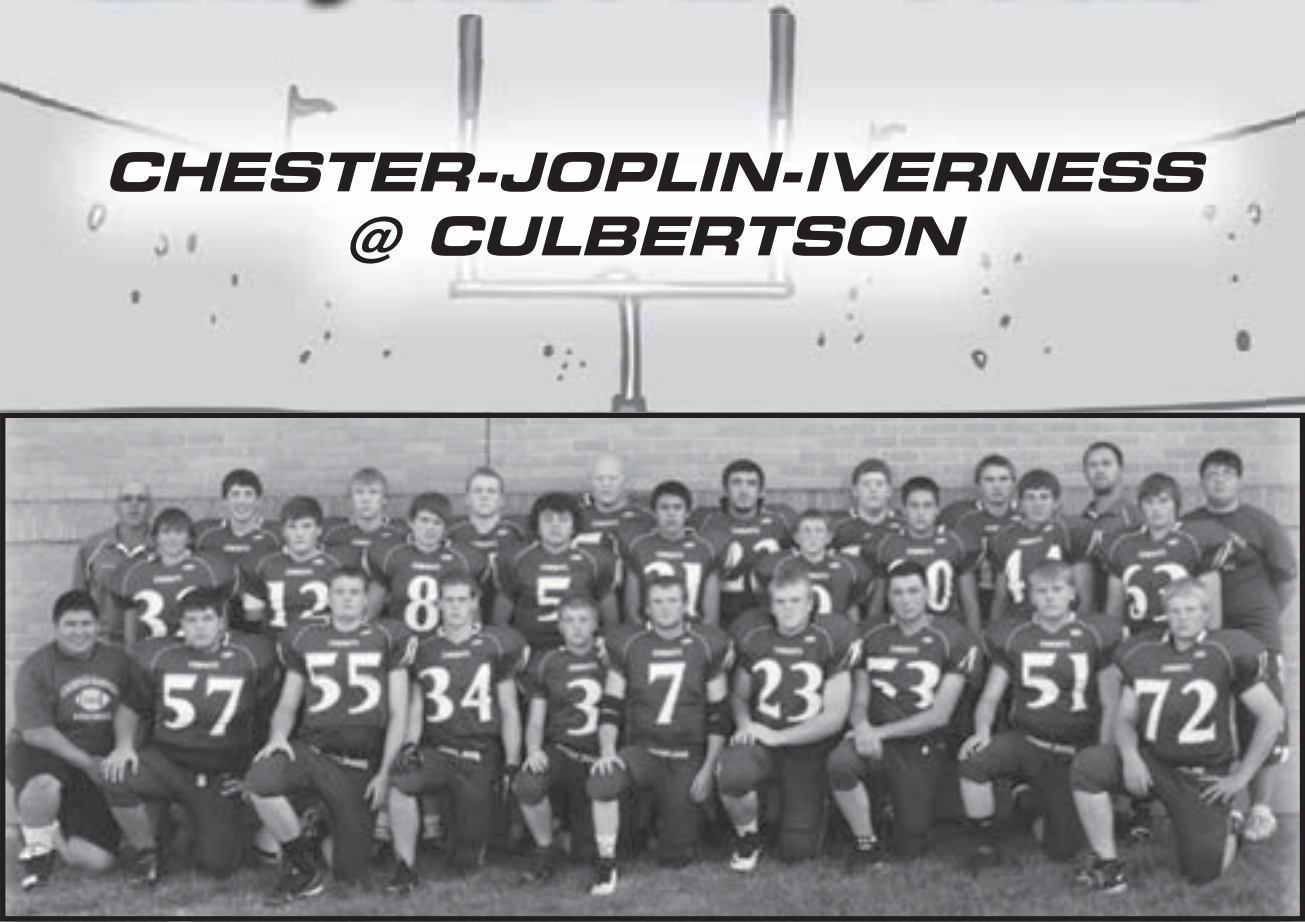

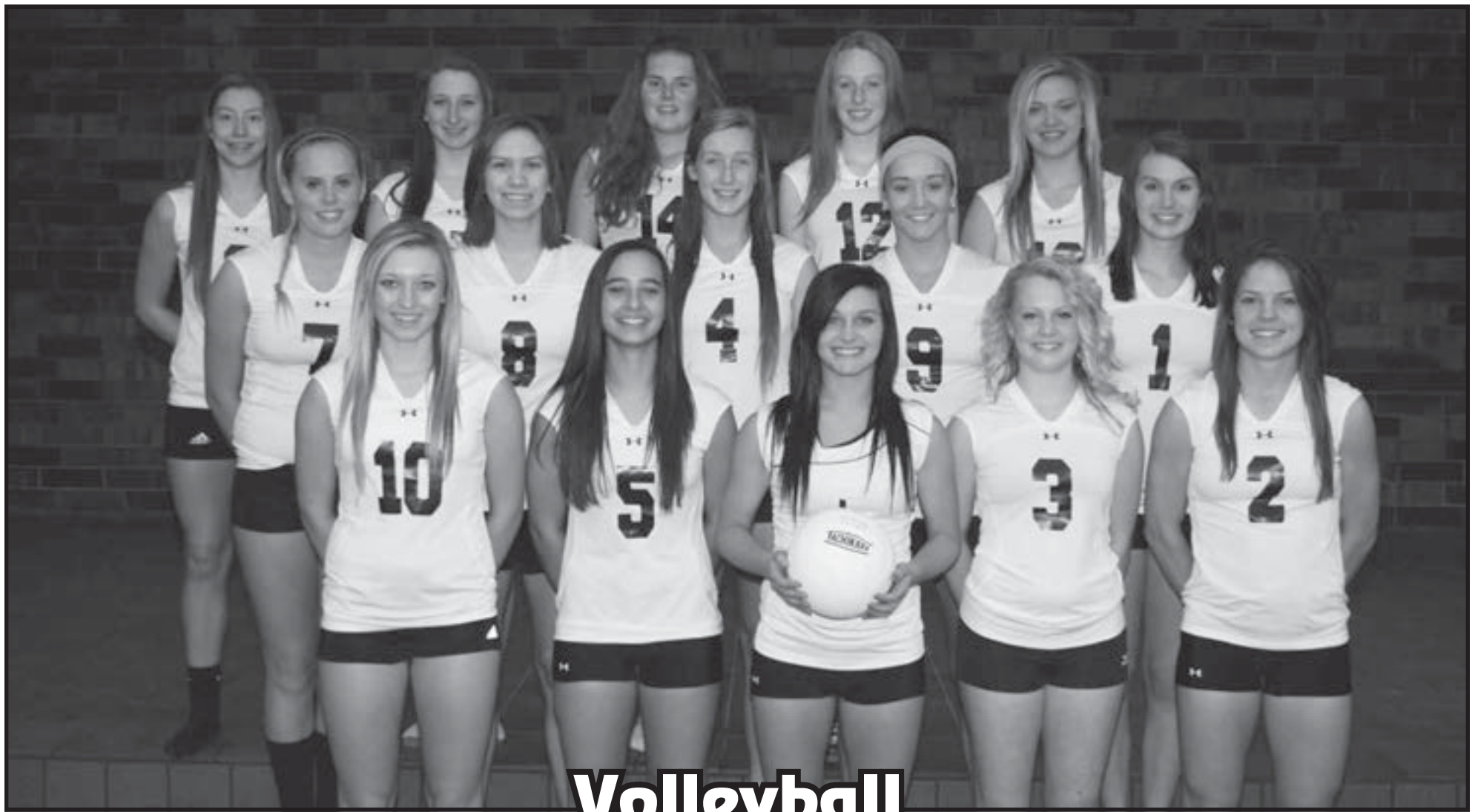

WSC Foundation Apartments House Essential Service Workers

The Williston State College (WSC) Foundation today celebrated the successful completion of the first phase of the WSC Foundation Apartments, a 74-unit complex that houses essential service workers including WSC, state, city and school district employees, and Bethel Lutheran staff.

“I applaud the vision of the foundation staff and board in developing this unique project to provide housing for essential service employees and to ensure a steady workforce for the region,” said Gov. Jack Dalrymple, who attended today’s open house. “They stepped outside the box to bring additional affordable housing opportunities to the region and to ensure that the critical needs of this growing community were covered.”

To ensure that apartment rents would be affordable for low- to moderate-income households, the \$11.2 million project received a \$1 million allocation from the North Dakota Housing Incentive Fund (HIF) and an interest rate buy-down through the Bank of North Dakota’s FlexPACE

program. HIF contributions from Gate City Bank and U.S. Bank supported the state’s funding commitment. HIF is administered by the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA). The North Dakota Industrial Commission, consisting of Dalrymple as chairman, Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring and Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem, oversees the agency.

“Providing adequate housing for our workforce is one of North Dakota’s greatest challenges,” said Jolene Kline, NDHFA acting executive director. “With the demand for development resources growing, more local, state and private dollars - like the HIF contributions made by Gate City Bank and U.S. Bank - are needed to address North Dakota’s affordable housing needs.”

WSC will break ground on the second phase of the housing development as soon as the building permits are approved. Phase II will provide 74 additional apartments with 43 of those units reserved for essential service workers.

In August, NDHFA made a conditional commitment of

\$3 million in HIF funding to phase II. That funding commitment will need to be capitalized by contributions from state taxpayers. Contributors receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit for contributions. Contributions can be targeted to a specific project or community. More information on HIF is available online at www.ndhousingincentive-fund.org.

“We are grateful for the support the project received from the State and community; the support has allowed us to lower rent for all units which has been a game changer when hiring at WSC,” said Terry Olson, WSC Foundation director.

The WSC Foundation is a nonprofit agency that partners with the college in building relationships with alumni, donors, and surrounding communities; generating financial support; funding student and faculty development scholarships; and leading capital expansion to develop a thriving, state-of-the-art campus.

NDHFA is a self-supporting state agency that finances the creation and rehabilitation of affordable housing across North Dakota.
