Efforts Underway To Preserve Iconic J.K. Ralston Painting

The J.K. Ralston Preservation Committee is actively working to protect the iconic J.K. Ralston painting "General Sully at the Yellowstone" which is currently in the Nutter Building in downtown Sidney. Formerly the U.S. Post Office, the building is owned by Richland County and has housed multiple county entities over the years. It is now scheduled for some remodeling and potential new tenants.

Believing the arts were an important facet of life, the U.S. Department of the Treasury under President Franklin D. Roosevelt created the Treasury Section of Fine Arts under the Federal Arts Project to create art for federally owned structures such as post offices and U.S. Department of Interior headquarters in Washington, DC.

"General Sully at the Yellowstone" is one of two works Ralston created under the Federal Arts Project. "The Fate of the Mail Carrier" which he painted first, is at the main post office in Sturgis, SD. Ralston painted the Sidney piece in 1942, depicting a scene from the General Alfred Sully Expedition into Dakota Territory in 1864. As in all his art, the scenes were historically accurate accounts of real life events.

accounts of real life events. Ralston is one of Montana's greatest treasures. According to his grand daughter A'Lisa Scott, he was born near the family ranch near Choteau where his grandfather had settled in the 1800s, a place now called Ralston Gap. In the early 1900s, when he was about nine years old, his father homesteaded at Charlie Creek in eastern Montana. He grew up during the open range days and was part of the Pot Hound Pool, a group of four or more ranches which would band together to round up their cattle from a 250 square mile area. He had an incredible memory and soaked in all the stories told around the campfires.

Ralston was always an artist, painting in oils by the age of eight or nine. He was also a historian, painting real life events and activities. He

met his wife Willo in Miles City and they were married in 1923. They lived on the west coast for a few years where Ralston worked as a graphic artist but soon moved back to Montana. The family, now including two young children, moved back to the Charlie Creek ranch for a few years to help out when his father was ill. Imagine four adults and two children all living in a sod home in Eastern Montana! Scott's mother, Willo Marjorie (Margie) had strong memories of Charlie Creek and always said that's where she was from. The young family also lived in Fairview with Willo's family, the Arthauds, for three years during which time Ralston painted signs all over Eastern Montana for the Yale Oil Company.

In 1936, Ralston and his wife made the decision to dedicate their lives to his art and the family moved to Billings. He and his son built the log cabin which served as living and studio space in 1946. It is now part of the Western Heritage

Center. According to Scott, they were, at times, 'poor as church mice' and sold illustrated greeting cards with poems to survive. From those humble beginnings grew an artist and historian beloved throughout the country. Ralston was inducted into the Hall of Great Westerners at the National Cowbov and Western Heritage Museum in 1978 and the Montana Cowboy Hall of Fame in 2012. He died in 1987 at the age of 91.

Scott is passionate about preserving not just her grandfather's work, but the history of Montana which it represents. She believes we all need to be stewards of our communities and that our history needs to be recorded, learned and heard. The tragic loss of the 33 foot long Ralston painting during the fire at the Jordan Inn in Glendive in 2023 was devastating to Scott and the art world. The J.K. Ralston Preservation Committee had just begun talks with the owners about preserving the painting.

She is honored and

grateful that the Richland County Commissioners want to preserve the painting in the Nutter building. The commissioners are in phase I and, so far, have budgeted \$3600 for Nikki Bailey-Will, MonDak Heritage Center director, and member of the J. K. Ralston Preservation Committee, to work with a conservator in Colorado to evaluate the possibility of extraction of the painting. If feasible, the project is estimated to cost approximately \$100,000. Bailey-Will is also working with the J.K. Ralston Preservation Committee to locate grants to help pay for the project.

The commissioners also removed the 1931 Ralston painting "Buffalo Crossing the Missouri" from the courthouse during its remodel and relocated it to the MonDak Heritage Center for preservation. Having evolved from the original J.K. Ralston Museum, the MonDak has the largest public collection of Ralston art in the country according to Scott.

In the new McKenzie County Ag Expo Indoor Arena, Watford City, Stan Headings will be hosting the sixth annual Bares and Broncs Rodeo, March 23 at 7 p.m. Its the second year of being a PRCA sanctioned event. The rough stock rodeo features the best horses of five different stock contracting companies to be competed on by some of the best PRCA cowboys in the business.


This year, Stace Smith Pro Rodeo (Malakoff, TX), Burch Pro Rodeo (Gillette, WY), Brookman Pro Rodeo (Sidney, MT), J Bar J (Brockway, MT), and Outlaw Buckers Rodeo Corp. (Wainright, AB) will attend with 10-15 of their top horses, giving every cowboy a shot at a great ride on a top horse. Each contestant will get one horse, with the top 4 advancing to a short round. Thirty saddle bronc riders and thirty bareback riders, over half having been to the National Finals Rodeo and past world champions included, will thrill the crowd as they compete for the payout of over \$40,000.

The cowboys won't be the only World Champions in the building. Several horses who have graced the National Finals Rodeo and hold world titles will be filling the chutes at the Expo center, in its first time hosting at the new facility.

In between sets, Dusty Dickerson, Illinois, will entertain with her Roman riding performance as she has multiple times at the National Finals Rodeo, Tate Rhoads will be the rodeo clown for the evening and present the "fan of the night" moment, and crowd giveaways. Jesse Knudson will be coming from Wisconsin to announce and has performed the sound and music for the steer tripping event at the National Finals Rodeo. A concessions and bar will be offered, and there will be a VIP area for sponsors to enjoy the show.

Immediately following the rodeo, a live band featuring John Scalia and the Dirty Word will perform for those not quite ready to call it a night. REDC, Richland County Commissioners **Seeking Funds To Hire Consultant**

On behalf of the Richland County Commissioners, REDC Executive Director Leslie Messer applied for, and the county was approved for, a \$45,000 grant from the Big Sky Economic Development arm of the Montana Coal Tax Fund.

The Big Sky Development Fund was established in 2005 to fund qualified economic development projects. The fund receives 25% (12.5%) total of the remaining coal severance tax revenue after deposits in the coal tax bond fund. It provides grants and loans to local governments for economic development projects and certified regional development corporations for the purpose of creating good paying jobs for Montana residents, promoting long-term, stable economic growth, encouraging local economic development organizations and retaining or expanding local businesses.

Messer said she had been aware of the board and grants for many years but thought there had to be direct impact in order to apply. With all the recent changes in Richland County such as the loss of Sidney Sugars, half the coal mine, and power generation, now was the time to apply.

"The money will be used

to hire a consultant who will go to every community in Richland County and determine what they would like to see in terms of development. Maybe a tech firm, maybe an ag processing company? "We want to get an accurate pulse of where the citizens of today would like to focus new development priorities," Messer explained.

The Coal Board dollars were just the first part of Messer's big plan. She said that when MDU was closing the power generating plant, they kept asking what they could do to help the community transition. Nothing was asked for at the time but Messer recently asked for, and received, \$5000 to help pay for the consultant.

The next step is an application into the Economic **Development Administration** for a \$100,000 grant, REDC will be competing with ten other states for \$9 million in disaster relief funds. Richland County was declared a disaster after devastating straight line winds in 2020-21 but never received any assistance. The money is to be used for diversification and economic development

If fully funded by the EDA and MDU, Messer said REDC would seek requests for proposals the beginning of June, award the contract

Application Deadline For 2024 Paddlefish Tags On Upper Missouri **River Is March 22**

Snag-and-release licenses can be purchased

Glasgow - Paddlefish anglers planning to harvest a fish in the Upper Missouri River (between Fort Peck Dam and Fort Benton) need to apply for an Upper Missouri River paddlefish tag by 5 p.m. on Friday, March 22.

For 2024, a total of 1,000 tags are available for the drawing. A 2024 fishing license is necessary before applying, and applications can be submitted online at fwp.mt.gov or at an FWP office. Anglers have the option to apply individually or as a party (up to five people) and have the option to purchase a bonus point at the time of application. There is not an E-Tag available for this license, so it cannot be used with the MyFWP app.

Successful applicants may harvest a fish anytime during the season, which runs from May 1 through June 15. Those anglers not successful in drawing a harvest tag will be issued a snag-and-release license for the Upper Missouri and will not be eligible to purchase any other paddlefish tag. Drawing results will be available in early April.

Additionally, anglers who did not participate in the drawing but would like to participate in snag-andrelease, can purchase an Upper Missouri River paddlefish snag-and-release license at any FWP office, online or at any license provider throughout the season.

Anglers may select only one area to fish for paddlefish: Upper Missouri River (White Harvest Tag - 1,000 tags available through the drawing) from May 1 to June

15, Yellowstone River and Missouri River downstream of Fort Peck Dam (Yellow Harvest Tag- 1,000 fish quota) from May 15 to June 30, and the Fort Peck Dredge Cut archery-only season (Blue Harvest Tag) from July 1 to Aug. 31.

All harvested paddlefish must be immediately tagged and reported within 48 hours. Reporting options include: onsite check points where fish was harvested (such as Intake Fishing Access Site), self-reporting stations on the Upper Missouri and Fort Peck Dredge Cuts, calling 1-877-FWP-WILD or 406-444-0356, or online at MyFWP at fwp.mt.gov.

Paddlefishing Regulations to be Addressed

Helena - If you're interested in providing input on how Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks is crafting fishing regulations for the next two years, now is your chance. FWP is taking public comment and asking for ideas on initial proposals for the 2025-2026 Fishing Regulations.

The initial 64 proposals are online now and available for review and comment. Just go to fwp.mt.gov/aboutfwp/ public-comment-opportunities/fishing-regulations.

FWP is also looking for ideas for regulation changes that aren't captured in these initial proposals. To answer questions and get feedback on fishing regulations, FWP is hosting public meetings around the state. Staff will

regulation proposals that will go before the Fish and Wildlife Commission in October. The fishing regulations proposals that will be considered by commission will be available for public comment in August. The commission will adopt, amend or reject the proposals at its October meeting.

Montana's fishing regulations are split into three districts - west, central and east. Each district has standard regulations. Many of the proposals remove exceptions to district standards that are no longer biologically relevant. Others are intended to increase fishing opportunity, enhance conservation efforts for some species, reduce confusion or improve enforceability.

Specific statewide proposals include improving definitions of different types of hooks and adjusting regulations for cleaning and transporting fish.

For the Eastern Fishing District, proposals include clarification of paddlefish regulations because of the new fish bypass channel at Intake, the addition of a tag for paddlefish snagging opportunities in the Missouri River below Fort Peck Dam, regulations to conserve shortnose gar, and conservative crappie limits on Tonque River Reservoir.





DPHHS Urges Consumers To Discard & Not Purchase Recalled Cinnamon Products

Montanans advised to check their homes, discard recalled products

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is advising consumers to throw away and not purchase specific ground cinnamon products because samples of these products were found to contain levels of lead that may be unsafe.

One of these products, Supreme Tradition ground cinnamon, has been distributed at Family Dollar and Dollar Tree stores in Montana. These stores currently operate in the following counties: Beaverhead, Big Horn, Broadwater, Carbon, Custer, Dawson, Deer Lodge, Fallon, Fergus, Flathead, Gallatin, Glacier, Great Falls, Hill, Jefferson, Lake, Lewis & Clark, Lincoln, Madison, McCone, Musselshell, Missoula, Ravalli, Richland, Roosevelt, Sanders, Silver Bow, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Teton, Toole, and Yellowstone.

The FDA initiated a targeted survey of ground cinnamon products from discount retail stores and analyzed the samples for lead and chromium following the October 2023 recall of cinnamon apple puree and applesauce products due to elevated lead levels linked to the cinnamon in those products and the concern for lead

toxicity in children. Based on FDA's assessment, consuming these products could contribute to harmful levels of lead in the blood.

Montana state health officials said exposure to lead in the diet could contribute to adverse health effects, particularly for the portion of the population that may already have exposure to lead from other sources. Most people have no obvious immediate symptoms of lead exposure.

Children are more vulnerable to the health effects of heavy metal exposure than adults because they are still developing, making it especially important to avoid exposure. "If you are concerned

that you or anyone in your

family may have been exposed to lead, the FDA recommends you contact vour healthcare provider who may recommend testing your blood for lead," said Dr. Maggie Cook-Shimanek, Public Health Physician for the Department of Public

Health and Human Services. There is no safe level of lead exposure, but the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) uses a marker of 3.5 micrograms per deciliter to identify children with blood lead levels higher than most. City of Sidney Solid OBITUARIES **Waste Department Battles Garbage Disposal Issues**

The City of Sidney Solid Waste Department has been experiencing several cases of misuse and abuse of residential and commercial garbage disposal over the past few years. The following are a few bullet points of what residents and businesses need to know about proper disposal of their solid waste.

Garbage containers are for HOUSEHOLD REFUSE ONLY! Construction and landscaping debris are not to be placed in these containers. Homeowners and businesses are required to remove and transport this type of debris to the landfill themselves.

Residents who use "roll out" containers and have curb side pick-up need to place the container at the edge of the roadway by 7 a.m. and removed the container by 6 p.m. All roll out and large alley or commercial containers are to be left with the lids facing the alley or street. Homemade or makeshift containers are not allowed.

Extra containers are not allowed unless approved by the Public Works Depart-

Residents who use "roll out" container should track your container by the serial number found on each container. If the wind blows your container away, it is not the city's responsibility to find it!

Containers are to be placed well away from parked vehicles, mailboxes, or other objects with minimum of 3.0' clearance on ANY side of container. If more than one container is used, they must be separated by a minimum of 3.0' apart from each other.

Do not place items in containers that stick out above the lid. Flatten or cut cardboard boxes before placing in the container and keep the lids closed.

Animal, food, and ALL **HOUSEHOLD WASTE shall**

be wrapped in plastic bags before placing in containers.

Paint cans are acceptable if the contents of the can have been dried to solid

Residents are encouraged to bring lawn clippings, leaves and garden vegetation to the city's mulch pile located at 300 10th Ave. NE next to the city yard. NO TREES, BRANCHES OR KINDLING.

Homeowners and businesses are responsible for keeping the containers clean. The city departments will not clean the container

Residents shall make special arrangements with the Department to have appliances picked up if the resident is unable to complete this task themselves.

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS: fireplace or stove ashes; un-rinsed pesticide and herbicide containers; hazardous waste: flammables (solvents, oil, paints, fuels); corrosives (acids and alkalines); large amounts of cooking oil; car batteries; car, truck or vehicle parts, bodies, engines, fuel tanks, engine oil(s), grease, wheels or tires; Animal hides or carcasses; trees, limbs or branches; metal or iron items, bed frames etc..

If you have questions regarding acceptable wastes or container usage or to report someone for misuse, please contact the Department of Public Works at 406-433-2809. Our business hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
