The 12th Annual Parade of Trees Auction Joins the Winter Wonderland Celebration at the Shops at Fox Run

There won't be any voting on this year's donations but a silent auction bid sheet will be located with each item; the auction will be held at 4:00 pm in Reynolds and will close out the day's Winter Wonder-

land Celebration.

Winter Wonderland activities will begin at 11:00 am on the 29th and include ponyrides, a children's carnival, non-profit food vendors and horse drawn wagon rides around the grounds. Santa will make his entrance at noon and kids can have their pictures taken with him from 1-3pm at Reynolds.

Petitions Presented at Fairview School Board Meeting

Petitions signed by 270 individuals were presented to the Fairview school board last Tuesday night, asking for the reinstatement of principal Reuben Moreno.

On September 10, Moreno was placed on paid administrative leave by superintendent Kloker citing insubordination. Following disagreements with the head football coach, Moreno had given a verbal resignation as assistant football coach on September 5. At the regular school board meeting on September 9, he asked to rescind that resignation, which was denied.

Board chair Randy Skov allowed approximately 10 minutes for public comment. Questions and comments concerning the placement of principal Moreno on administrative leave included disruption to the students, as well as the effects on principal Moreno's family in a small community like Fairview. Skov replied that it was a clear cut deal, that it was done, and asked the public to "trust that we're doing what's best". He also stated that he had not read the letter from Kloker to Moreno.

A concern was also raised about the school paying for continuing education for 6 employees, which was not addressed.

After confusing comments from Skov about "the board's decision" and "the superintendent's decision", a board member later confirmed that no action has been taken by the board concerning the placement of principal Moreno on administrative leave.

In a telephone interview, Dennis Palmer, deputy superintendent of the Montana Office of Public Instruction explained that since the action is a labor issue, there are no rules that govern schools. He stated that typically a school board would need to meet in either a regular or special meeting at which time the board would take the action of placing someone on administrative leave. Only the school board has the authority to hire and fire personnel. Whether the leave is paid or unpaid is also a decision typically made by the trustees since they are in charge of finances. Even though Palmer said he had heard of trustees giving power to the superintendent to make those decisions, he said it is abdicating their own authority as trustees to do so, since that also gives the superintendent authority to govern his own actions.

The next Fairview school board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, December 9 in the boardroom.

Tax Management Tips to be Offered

The NDSU Extension Service and Internal Revenue Service are offering a series of Income Tax Management for Ag Producer meetings. The meetings will be presented at 11 sites across North Dakota through North Dakota Interactive Video Network (IVN) on Tuesday, December 2nd from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. In Williston, it will be held in the conference room of the Broadway Commons Building located at 302 East Broadway.

This program, in its 24th year, provides an excellent opportunity for agricultural producers and tax preparers to learn and ask questions about tax management alternatives while there is still time to implement year-end tax management decisions.

There will be updates regarding federal income taxes. The regulations governing repairs and capitalization and reporting with 1099s will be explained. The net investment income surtax and other tax consequences of the Affordable Care Act as premium tax credits, shared responsibility payments and the impact on HRAs and HSAs will be detailed. Examples of scams posing as IRS will be given. Farm transition planning strategies will be explored along with a session on managing income deferral and prepaids.

Program topics include federal income tax update, net investment income surtax and grouping, repair expense rules, repair expense reporting, transition planning, health insurance premium tax credits, shared responsibility payments, impact of Affordable Care Act on HRAs and HSA', income deferral and prepaids, tax planning ideas for 2014 and beyond.

The Stroke Recognition Award is sponsored by the Cardiovascular Health Program within the state health department. The Recognition Award singles out Critical Access Hospitals that demonstrate that they have the infrastructure and commitment to provide high quality care for patients with acute stroke. Receiving the Stroke Recognition confirms that Sidney Health Center meets high standards related to the

utilization of evidence-based stroke order-sets and protocols, laboratory and radiology services available 24/7 and administrative commitment to treating acute stroke patients.

The Stroke Recognition
Award was launched in 2011,
and Sidney Health Center
is one of only nine Critical
Access Hospitals in Montana
to receive the recognition. Requirements for the recognition
include tracking and reporting
key stroke outcomes, using
outcomes data to initiate quality improvement activities and
coordinating regular healthcare provider stroke trainings.

Stroke is the leading cause of adult disability and is a leading cause of death in Montana. Last year, over 2,000 Montana families were

directly impacted by the devastating effects of stroke. Symptom recognition and timely, high quality treatment are important factors in reducing death and disability from stroke.

Know the signs and symptoms of stroke: sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, sudden trouble seeing, sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding, sudden loss of balance or coordination, sudden severe headache with no known cause.

2015 Wheat Show Hi-Lites

NDSU Extension Agent - Williams County

The 62nd Annual National Hard Spring Wheat Show will focus on a variety of issues but much emphasis will be given to strategies of preventing Fusarium head blight (SCAB) and marketing this year's crops which are heavily infested with scab and vomitoxin. These issues will be discussed by Dr. Senay Simsek of the Northern Crops Institute, NDSU Crop Quality Specialist and Grain Marketers.

Another hot issue on the agenda is grain transportation. Dan Wogsland, Executive Director of the Northern Grain Growers Association will give us the latest details on efforts to bring balance to get grains to milling and export destinations.

Consumer issues including gluten intolerance and food fads are at the top of this year's agenda along with new durum varieties and crop salinity tolerances.

The keynote speaker is Dr. Mike Boehlje of Purdue University. One of his presentations will focus on a possible cyclical downturn of agriculture income. He is concerned about the fall or a possible decline in exports due to the decline of economic

growth in China and India. He also feels farmers can expect interest rates to rise steadily during the balance of the decade. The U.S. farmers export products equal to approximately 25%

The world has put more land under the plow and he feels this and other factors could cause agricultural land values to drop as much as 15%

Of course during his three-hour presentation Dr. Boehlje will present other information that is for certain to influence our production decisions in the near future.

During the Williams County Farmers Union luncheon attendees will learn how they can easily be advocates of the business of farming. Also, the Williams County Farmers Union has secured a great speaker who will talk, sing, and make us laugh and cry. This presentation by Mark J. Lindquist is titled "Passion! 8 Steps to Find Yours".





Great American Smokeout Nov. 20

The American Cancer Society marks the Great American Smokeout on the third Thursday of November each year by encouraging smokers to use the date to make a plan to quit, or to plan in advance and quit smoking that day. By quitting even for one day, smokers will be taking an important step towards a healthier life, one that can lead to reducing cancer risk.

Tobacco use remains the single largest preventable cause of disease and premature death in the US, yet about 42 million Americans still smoke cigarettes, approximately 1 in every 5 adults. As of 2012, there were also 13.4 million cigar smokers in the US, and 2.3 million who smoke tobacco in pipes. And even more disturbingly, more than a quarter of a million youth who had never smoked a cigarette used electronic cigarettes in 2013, according to a CDC study published in the journal Nicotine and Tobacco Research. These, most likely, will be tomorrow's tobacco users.



Sidney native and 2002 high school graduate Nicole (DeVries) Rowley was recently elected as Missoula County Commissioner; one of three County Commissioners, Rowley's six year term begins with anticipation for the changes that she hopes to make in the office.

"I really feel that I can do more for the county," Rowley said of her decision to campaign. "My hope is that I can get the county to move forward."

Negotiations with the county can be lengthy and undecided, hindering the bureaucratic process and stagnating progress. Rowley is confident in her abilities to "streamline the regulatory process" while maintaining good relations between government, busi-
