### **COVID-19 Update Richland Co.**

COVID-19 UPDATE: The Richland County Health Department is announcing two additional active case of COVID-19 in Richland County residents. This brings the total case count to 12. Five of the total cases are recovered, and seven are active. The recent cases are as follows:

Case 12: A male in his 30's who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing and contact tracing has begun. The individual was symptomatic.

Case 11: A female in her 60's who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing, and contact tracing has begun. The case was identified through contact tracing, and had been undergoing quarantine when symptoms developed.

Health Department staff has identified many close contacts of the active cases and continue to make contact tracing calls daily. Close contacts will be asked to be tested.

Case 10: A male between the ages of 0 and 9 who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing, and contact tracing has begun. The case was identified through contact tracing.

Case 9: A female in her 40s who is not hospitalized and is isolating at home. The case investigation is ongoing, and contact tracing has begun. The case was identified through contact tracing

Take the following steps to aid in the contact tracing process and protect yourself and your family:

- Please have your voicemail set up and cleared so that you can receive messages.
- Do not go in to get tested unless you hear from the Health Department or are asked to do so.
- · Limit your contact with others. Avoid large group gatherings. Wear a mask when social distancing is difficult.
- · Monitor yourself and family members for the development of COVID-19 symptoms, including a new/sudden dry cough, shortness of breath, body aches, sore throat, fatigue and a fever of 100.5 or greater. If you are experiencing these

symptoms, contact your healthcare provider. Continue to practice COVID-19 precautions, including staying home when you are sick, monitoring for symptoms, washing your hands, and cover your cough. Vulnerable populations, including those over 65 and those with compromised

immune systems, should continue to shelter in place. The COVID-19 Information Line remains open and staffed. A knowledgeable public health staff member can answer your questions by calling 406-433-6947.

Currently, they have instructors from Florida, Tennessee, Idaho, North Dakota and California.


The Sunrise Festival of the Arts connects local and regional artists, craftspeople and authors with shoppers and

### **Drug-Free Communities Launches** Coalition, Social Media Campaign

The Richland County Health Department received funding for the Drug-Free Communities grant at the end of last year. This 5-year grant provides the capacity for engineering a new project that focuses on youth substance use prevention.

Here is a brief update of grant activities as it gets off the ground.

The grant established a new coalition, a group by the name of "The Dry Society". We would like to invite the youth, particularly middle and high school students, as well as interested parties to attend and provide feedback about projects and ideas. Meetings are being held twice a month on Wednesdays at 2 p.m. in the Community Service Building (check our Facebook for the most recent information).

Youth substance use is a complicated issue. There are many avenues for prevention and substances to target. However, the coalition has decided to focus on youth consumption of alcohol. Youth alcohol use has been indicated to be an important cultural community issue. When the CHA (Community Health Assessment) was completed in 2018, Eighty-one per cent of Richland County viewed alcohol abuse as a community problem. Particularly, binge drinking is of concern. Binge drinking was chosen as a focus area because the area youth and community members selected

it as a primary concern. Unfortunately, our county has very high rates of binge drinking. According to the 2018 PNA (Prevention Needs Assessment), 42% of high school seniors reported binge drinking in the past two weeks compared to only 27% at a state level. The Dry Society will be addressing the community needs at large rather than narrowing in on substance use niches. By targeting the youth in general, we are hoping to facilitate a cultural shift away from the use of substances as a coping mechanism.

Our little slice of Montana can help stop our youth from using substances by taking a proactive approach and offering information about the risks, the consequences and providing safe alternatives to drinking. Our community believes strongly in supporting our kids and that's what The Dry Society is all about.

Our first major project is implementing a social media awareness campaign. We have built a Facebook group, an Instagram and a Snaphchat. We will be providing more information about the effects of substance use on youth as well as providing alternative activities and ways to get involved with the coalition.



### **What Does** It Mean To **Be Released** From COVID-19 **Isolation?**

COVID-19 isolation is recommended for active positive cases. Isolation means that a sick person is asked to stay at home, away from others, to prevent the spread of the disease. Exposed or positive household members may spend time together. Individuals in isolation may also spend time outdoors. Active cases must wear a mask if going out in public is absolutely necessary.

Individuals who were named as close contacts are considered exposed, and are asked to be tested and quarantine. The quarantine lasts 14 days past the last exposure. During this time, the individual will monitor their health for the development of COVID-19 symptoms. If symptoms do not develop during this time, the individual is released from quarantine by the Health Department, and may return to

Active cases of COVID-19 are considered recovered and released from isolation when the following criteria are

- · The individual has been free of a fever for more than 72 hours; AND
- · More than 10 days have lapsed since the first onset of symptoms; AND

Respiratory symptoms have improved.

All three criteria must be met to be released. Richland County Health Department representatives contact active cases to conduct a health and symptom check daily. Individuals are released by the Richland County Health Officer based on these daily health checks, which assure the criteria for release are met. Recovered individuals must also meet any requirements put forth by their employer, which may include a negative test result.

Recovered cases are no longer deemed infectious, and do not pose a risk to the public. Recovered cases are free to return to normal activities, including work, day care, church and recreational activities.

All Richland County residents should continue to protect themselves from COVID-19 by staying home when you are sick, monitoring for symptoms, washing your hands, and cover your cough. Vulnerable populations, including those over 65 and those with compromised immune systems, should continue to shelter in place.

According to the Montana Highway Patrol Fatality Crash Report, in 2019 there were 184 fatalities in motor vehicle crashes. With Fourth of July festivities wrapping up in the evening or late at night, more vehicles will be on the road when it's dark.In 2019, 75 people died in Montana due to motor vehicle crashes during the nighttime hours.





## **EGT Adds Shuttle Train Loading** Capabilities in Sidney, MT

## **Use Your Freedom To Choose** A Sober Ride For 4th Of July

As part of the Vision Zero goal, MDT reminds Montana to plan ahead for a sober ride

Helena, MT - For many Montanans, the 4th of July marks the mid-point of summer. A time to relax with family and friends and enjoy the natural beauty of our state - with a few fireworks thrown in for good measure. Of course, there is nothing wrong with this, as long as you don't add alcohol and driving to the mix.

The Montana Department of Transportation (MDT) reminds all Montanans that impaired driving puts everyone at risk. Summer weather, clear roads and longer daylight hours can give drivers a false sense of security, leading them to make unsafe and sometimes deadly driving decisions.

Over the last decade (2010-2019), 48% of all fatal crashes and 45% of all serious injury crashes in Montana occurred between June and September – the period of time known nationally as the "100 Deadliest Days." Historically, the 100 Deadliest Days in Montana has represented 50% of the annual roadway fatalities involving an impaired driver.

"We know more people are on the road in the summer and with fewer people flying to vacation destinations this year, we expect even more people to be driving around Montana during the summer," said Mike Tooley, Montana Department of Transportation director. "Montana's daily vehicle miles traveled (DVMT) is 22% higher during the 100 Deadliest Days and make no mistake, this is a deadly

Director Tooley encourages everyone to plan ahead if they are going to drink on the 4th of July. This can include designating a sober driver, using a ride share service, calling a taxi, asking a sober friend to hold your car keys for the evening or just staying where you are overnight. It is illegal in Montana to drive with a BAC (blood alcohol content) of .08 or higher and the consequences include a DUI charge, having your license revoked, mandatory classes, possible jail time and up to \$10,000 in fines. Unfortunately, the cost for the choice to drive impaired can even be serious injury

"Every fatality on Montana roadways involving impaired driving is preventable," added Director Tooley. "Use your freedom to make the right choice for you, your loved ones





### **Operation Dry Water**

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department will again participate in Operation Dry Water as part of a nationally coordinated effort to increase knowledge about the dangers of boating under the influence. The goal is to reduce the number of accidents and deaths associated with alcohol and drug use on state waterways.

ODW weekend, July 3-5, is the national weekend of heightened enforcement effort directed at boating under the influence laws and recreational boater outreach.

While informing and educating boaters about the hazards and negative outcomes associated with boating while under the influence of alcohol or drugs is a year-round effort, on ODW weekend the Game and Fish Department's game wardens will be focused on the water, informing boaters about safe boating practices, and removing impaired operators from the water.

A feature story on ODW weekend is included in the June issue of the North Dakota OUTDOORS magazine.

Tips to staying safe on the water:

- Boat sober alcohol use is the leading contributing factor in recreational boater deaths. Alcohol and drug use impair a boater's judgment, balance, vision and reaction time.
- Wear your life jacket 85% of drowning victims nationwide were not wearing a life jacket.

Take the online boating safety education course – 71% of deaths nationwide occurred on boats where the operator had not received boating safety instruction.

## **Fungus That Causes White-Nose Syndrome Found In Eastern Montana**

Samples taken from bridges in three eastern Montana counties have tested positive for the fungus that causes white-nose syndrome (WNS) in bats. The presence of the fungus - Pseudogymnoascus destructans (Pd) - was confirmed in Daniels, Richland and Fallon counties but does not necessarily confirm the presence of the disease. The samples were tested by the USGS National Wildlife Health Center in Madison, WI. National Health Center and Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks staff are closely monitoring the situation and further testing will be conducted.

"We are disappointed but not at all surprised at this finding," said FWP's Nongame Wildlife Management Bureau Chief Lauri Hanauska-Brown. "As the fungus and this deadly disease have moved across the states we knew it was only

Pd is a powdery white fungus that grows on the skin of hibernating bats, often on the face - hence the name "white nose." The fungus causes a number of problems, one of which is that it irritates bats, causing them to arouse early from hibernation and search for water and food. Food is obviously scarce in winter, and this early arousal can exhaust fat stores that bats need to survive the winter.

"We are hopeful that Montana bats will not be hit too badly by this disease as we know they are an incredibly important part of our ecosystem with their voracious appetite for pesky insects like mosquitoes and agricultural pests,' Hanauska-Brown said. Last month the North Dakota Game and Fish Depart-

ment reported a cluster of Myotis lucifugus (known as the "little brown bat") deaths from WNS just over the Montana border. Of the 20 dead bats, six were submitted to the USGS National Wildlife Health Center in Madison, WI, for analysis. The bats all tested positive for Pd and WNS.

WNS has been in North America since at least 2006, killing an estimated 6.7 million bats. It has been confirmed Photo submitted

in 35 states and seven Canadian provinces. It can wipe out entire colonies of bats and has caused dramatic population declines in eastern states.

FWP has temporarily prohibited the capture of all live bats due to unknown risks of COVID-19-infected humans inadvertently transferring the virus to bats. To substitute for sampling of live bats, biologists are collecting bat droppings at eastern Montana roosts. WNS is not known to affect humans, pets, livestock or other wildlife.

FWP asks anyone who sees a sick or recently deceased bat or group of bats not to handle them but to notify health officials or state biologists, who can provide further guidance. ## Department Of Mineral Resources Set To Confiscate Abandoned Wells In ND

In a news release on June 19 the Industrial Commission of North Dakota announced the approval of orders from the Department of Mineral Resources to confiscate abandoned wells in North Dakota.

The press release stated, "A hearing was held on June 10 to review and consider confiscation and plugging of over 350 wells in the state. At the hearing more than 70 additional

wells were identified as likely to be orphaned by mid-July."

\$33.2 million in federal CARES Act coronavirus relief funds was secured and provided to the Department of Mineral Resources. These funds are specifically designated to be used for plugging abandoned wells.

The release also states, "The next step will be to receive the Budget Section's final approval for an additional \$22 million that was allocated for CARES

Act funding during the June 18 Emergency Commission meeting. This additional funding is to be used for the reclamation of confiscated well and facility sites that is projected to maintain 300 additional oil and gas service sector jobs to complete the work.'

What is the method of plugging a well?

3-02-03-34. METHOD OF PLUGGING. All wells shall be plugged in a manner, which will confine perma-

nently all oil, gas, and water in the separate strata originally containing them. This operation shall be accomplished by the use of mud-laden fluid, cement, and plugs, used singly or in combination as may be approved by the director. All casing strings shall be cut off at least three feet [91.44 centimeters] below the final surface contour, and a cap with file number shall be welded thereon. Core or stratigraphic test

holes drilled to or below sands containing freshwater shall be plugged in accordance with the applicable provisions recited above. After plugging, the site must be reclaimed pursuant to section 43-02-03-34.1.

Ron Ness, North Dakota Petroleum Council president, states, "These are legacy wells, many drilled in the '60s, '70s, '80s and '90s. They haven't produced oil for at least one year and all of them were at 9 barrels a day or less." He adds, "Once plugged, these wells will no longer be available to produce. In addition, by plugging these older non-productive wells, it may add life to the aging oil fields in these rural communities. Keeping the more productive wells and fields alive and economic also keeps the option for future enhanced oil recovery utilizing carbon dioxide from North Dakota's lignite coal industry."

Who will be doing the

work? Katie Haarsager, Department of Mineral Resources, PIO, states, "We will be bidding out packages for the plugging work... We are estimating this will take around 500-600 oil and gas sector employees to somehow be involved in the plugging of these wells."



How long will it take to plug all the wells?

"This is a big task and the work on the wells is planned to begin July 15. Utilization of the Care Act funds require the work to be completed and paid by Dec. 30, 2020," states Ness. "The state is working with oilfield service companies and taking bids, there are many companies and employees eager to work."




