

Car Seat **Safety Clinic** to be Held March 11

It's a familiar routine: strapping your child into the car seat before you get behind the wheel—but, is your child really safe?

The Richland County Ambulance Service and Richland County Health Department will be hosting a Richland County Passenger Safety Seat Clinic on Saturday, March 11, 2017 at Sidney Health Center, in the ambulance garage from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. No appointment is necessary as it is on a first come, first-serve basis.

- During the clinics, the certified car seat technicians will:
- Check for correct installation
- Check your seat for recalls
- Check to make sure the seat matches your child's weight and age
- · Check to make sure the seat is positioned in your vehicle correctly
 - Answer safety seat questions

Montana law requires all children under age six and weighing less than 60 lbs. to be in an appropriate child safety seat or booster seat. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) recommends keeping children in their car seats for as long as possible before moving them to the next type of car seat. Many children are not tall enough to graduate from a booster seat to a lap and shoulder belt alone until they are at least 4'9" tall, which is about eight years or older.

Child passenger safety technicians in Montana report that about 75 to 80 percent—that's four out of five—of the car seats they checked are not installed properly. Take advantage of this local passenger safety seat clinic to make sure you and your children are traveling safe. Voll Elected Mayor of Watford City

Brent Sanford became the mayor of Watford City, just when the oil boom began. After taking his new post as Attorney General of North Dakota, his mayoral position needed to be filled. With Sanford's term originally not slated to be over until June of 2018, the mayoral office has been empty since he won election to the state-wide office in November. After a city-wide election, Justin

Voll was voted as the next mayor of Watford City. Voll, who has served as president of the First International Bank and Trust since July of 2015, was challenged by the owner of Watford Electric and a member of Watford City's Planning and Zoning Commission, Greg Schuetze. The votes became official after the canvassing board met on February 27. Final vote tallies show Voll winning over Schuetze, by a margin of 250 to 72.

Because the mayoral office has been vacant for several months, Watford City Council President and city Fire Department Chief, Phil Riely, took interim mayor responsibilities on December 9, until the seat could be filled by the citywide election that took place on February 21.

Upper Missouri River Paddlefish Lottery Tag Application Deadline March 30

Submitted by Montana Fish Wildlife & Parks Paddlefish anglers planning to fish in the Upper Missouri

River (From Fort Peck Dam to Fort Benton) will need to apply for an Upper Missouri River Paddlefish Tag. Applications are available to apply by mail, online at fwp.mt.gov, or by stopping by any regional or area FWP offices. Applications must be received no later than March 30, 2017. For 2017, a total of 1,000 tags will be available for the

drawing. Successful applicants may harvest a fish anytime during the season, from May 1 through June 15. The season will not be shortened if more than 500 fish are harvested during the season. Those anglers not successful in drawing a harvest tag will be issued a snag and release only license for the Upper Missouri River. Anglers, both resident and nonresident, are required to purchase a season fishing and conservation license prior to submitting their applications. Party applications (up to five anglers) are available. Additionally, anglers that did not participate in the tag

drawing that want to participate in the snag and release fishery can still purchase an Upper Missouri River Paddlefish Snag and Release License at any FWP office or online beginning April 10, 2017. As in the past, anglers may only select one area to fish for

paddlefish in Montana: Upper Missouri River (White Tag), Yellowstone River and Missouri River downstream of Fort Peck Dam (Yellow Tag), and the Fort Peck Dredge Cut archery only season (Blue Tag). Any paddlefish harvested anywhere in Montana must be reported to FWP within 48 hours of harvest. Mandatory harvest reporting can be completed by calling 1-844-668-5932.

Preschoolers Can Help in the Kitchen

NDSU Extension Service, McKenzie County

Imagine never cooking your own food. Consider a world where you are served every meal, at your table. Then, when you are finished eating, you get up and leave to do what your day requires of you.

This is the life many of our children experience, at least to age 3 or Beyond that, most children can help some way in food preparation, serving and cleanup.

"The Family Table," an initiative of The North Dakota State University Extension Service, has resources at www.ag.ndsu.edu/familytable to help you get your kids involved in family meals.

The expectations for young children might be to wash their hands and set some parts of the table. Or children might be required to carry the cold salad or ketchup to the table and, after the meal, carry their own dirty dishes to the sink or dishwasher. This is all under the watchful eye of the head chef, of course.

As parents, our job is to teach our children how to become respectful, self-sufficient adults and responsible citizens. The kitchen is the perfect place for these and many more lessons. Plus, we all have to eat, so why not make meal preparation a special time to talk, laugh, enjoy each other's company and learn valuable lessons, too?

Young children likely want to be near their favorite adults, especially around mealtime. Three-year-olds who know how to tear paper will be great with the salad greens. They are also in love with stirring. Perhaps healthful appetizers are your preschooler's specialty.

Your child can arrange and serve wheat crackers, cheese, fruit, cottage cheese, fresh vegetables and dips with pride.

Serving this type of appetizer helps keep all family members from

digging into high-carbohydrate and high-calorie foods while they wait for the oven timer to sound. Healthful appetizers can become the first course in a nutritious meal.

Even young children can learn to share the jobs and tools required in cooking. They quickly realize that putting together a meal takes ingredients and time, and people have to work to make that happen. Kids who grow up in the kitchen will begin to see connections between their food and its origin, including the importance of taking care of the Earth and its resources. They also will learn math skills and experience science first hand, right there near the kitchen sink.

Preschoolers who have the opportunity to practice working in the kitchen will learn to appreciate those times when someone does serve them their dinner. It can be a "first course" in learning to savor at the family table (www.ag.ndsu.edu/familytable). Join the challenge and sign up for an electronic newsletter with recipes and tips. Follow the program on Facebook for more tips, meal plans and ideas for getting conversations going during family meals.
