Sidney Health Center Expanding the Walk-In Clinic Hours

Sidney Health Center is expanding the walk-in clinic to include weekdays starting after the first of the year. The Weekday Walk-In Clinic will be located in the Medical Arts Building near the hospital ER entrance on 12th Avenue Southwest. The clinic will be open four days out of the week with evening hours on Thursdays.

Jesse Belville, Physician Assistant, was recently recruited to expand the service. Mr. Belville joins the medical staff with several years experience working in urgent care settings as well as emergency. He plans to start seeing patients in the Medical Arts Building beginning January 7.

The desire to expand the walk-in clinic hours beyond Saturday mornings has been a goal of the facility for quite some time. Feasibility, designated clinic space and staffing concerns were among reasons for the delay in expanding the service sooner. The Saturday Walk-In Clinic that is run by a rotating schedule of providers has remained busy since opening two years ago.

"With volume in the ER nearly doubling over the past few years, we felt it was necessary to expand the walk-in clinic hours to help accommodate those seeking a sameday appointment for non-emergent care," stated Rick Haraldson, CEO.

To start, hours of the Weekday Walk-In Clinic will be 7:00AM - 4:00PM Monday and Tuesday, closed Wednesday, 11:00AM - 7:00PM Thursday and 7:00AM - 4:00PM Friday. The Saturday Walk-In Clinic will continue to be located in Suite 110 from 9:00AM - 12:00PM.

Like area facilities, Sidney Health Center will be implementing upfront payments in the clinic and hospital setting in 2013. Payment will be due at the time of service when visiting the Weekday Walk-In Clinic including co-pays and self-



Positive Influenza Case in Richland County

Richland County's flu season has begun with a positive Influenza A case tested locally on December 3rd, 2012. The preliminary results will be sent to the MT State Public Health Lab for confirmation. The person was not vaccinated with influenza vaccine.

Vaccination remains the best prevention for influenza and influenza related complications. Vaccination is recommended for all children ages 6 months and older. Persons who have any chronic health condition (diabetes, heart disease, cancers, immune suppressed, pregnant, have compromised lung/respiratory diseases, etc.) are at risk of complications from influenza illness and are strongly urged to get yearly influenza vaccinations.

Richland County Health Department wants residents to know there is still time to get a flu shot from the health department or check with their local healthcare provider.

In addition to vaccination please take other precautions to help limit the spread of the disease, including: Wash your hands thoroughly and frequently, especially after contact with anyone who may be ill;

Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing;

Stay home from work, school, daycare and large gatherings when you're sick; Get plenty of rest; and

Eat nutritious foods and drink plenty of fluids.

Symptoms of influenza include sudden onset of fe-

ver, severe body aches, chest discomfort & cough, chills, fatigue. Occasionally a sore throat & stuffy nose may be included. Influenza is spread person to person through close contact.



He attended schools in Sidney, Montana and graduated from Sidney Senior High School in 1989 where he wrestled for the Sidney Eagles. As a Sidney Eagle, Darren was a proud member of the 1989 State of Montana Wrestling Champions. He attended Montana State University, University of North Dakota-Williston, and the University of Mary.

On December 28, 1990, Darren enlisted in the North Dakota Army National Guard. On May 25, 1995, Darren went active duty with the Army and was stationed at Fort Lewis, Washington. While in Washington, Darren met and fell in love with Adrienne and her three daughters Celina, Kayla, and Alexis. On August 2, 1997 they were married and shortly thereafter had a son, Eric Paul Linde.

Darren was so funny. Everyone who knew Darren, knew he was always smiling and laughing. Darren never had a bad day. He always saw the glass as half full and always had a great story to share. The family's nickname was the "Six Happy Linde's" and that was how they lived their lives.

Darren returned to Montana and enlisted in the Montana Army National Guard from September 1998 to September 2002; and again in July of 2005 through March 2006, when he then transferred back to the North Dakota Army National Guard. From June 4, 2007 through May 21, 2008, Darren was deployed to Iraq with the 164th HQ's SECFOR. On April 27th, 2012, Darren was deployed to Laskar Gha, Afghanistan with the 818th Engr Co. On March 11, 2011, Darren earned the rank of Sgt 1st Class. Darren was a Com-

bat Engineer, Cannon Crewmember, and Bridge Crewmember. He received numerous awards, including the Iraq Campaign Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Combat Action Badge, North Dakota Legion of Merit (Posthumously), Purple Heart (Posthu-





Montana Department of Transportation Urges Montanans to be the "Jaws of Life" and Stop Impaired Driving

The end of a semester, a holiday party across town, bringing in a new year, all great reasons to celebrate this joyous season in Montana. But too often what should be an enjoyable night to remember on the way home becomes one that will never be forgotten. In Montana, December ranks as one of the deadliest months on Montana highways, and the Montana Department of Transportation is increasing outreach efforts throughout the holiday season to have Montanans to do their part to encourage safe and sober driving.

In December 2011, the Montana Highway Patrol reported 19 fatal crashes. Last year that was the fourth highest month for fatal crashes on Montana roads after July, August and October. The Montana Highway Patrol and local law enforcement agencies will increase patrols throughout the season, and this week MDT begins a statewide effort to inspire Montanans to be the "jaws of life" *literally* to use their power of persuasion to prevent the real Jaws of Life from extricating loved ones in a serious car crash.

Billboards, television commercials, social networking videos and Pandora ads urge Montanans to reach out to neighbors, friends and family to display responsible, caring behavior remind a family member to buckle up, call a taxi for a friend, and volunteer to be the designated driver. Do anything, everything, possible to make sure a loved one doesn't drive impaired.

"We are asking all Montanans this holiday season and throughout the year to step up and not hesitate to say the extra words or take the extra step that could save someone's life," said Montana Department of Transportation Director Tim Reardon. "We have tremendous power of persuasion over our friends and loved ones. Instead of encouraging them to take one more shot before leaving the bar or not reminding them to buckle up, we ask that you do everything possible to get them and yourself a safe and sober ride home."

The message is clear in the MDT videos. "Prevent Impaired Driving," a new Myth Crasher video that is being shown on popular websites (including Yahoo.com, TheOnion.com, and AutoSport.com) shows just how far some people go to stop someone they care for from getting behind the wheel drunk from shrink-wrapping the car to putting an

attack dog in the backseat. Another Myth Crasher video demonstrates that buzzed driving is drunk driving. Similar messages are being conveyed in MDT's entire holiday public information campaign.

These videos can be viewed at plan2live.mt.gov, which

also provides planning tips and tools that can help Montanans plan for a safe ride home including texting before a party to plan who will be the designated driver, calling a cab or ride home service listed on the website, and downloading a blood alcohol calculator.

Soil Health Topic Offered For Wheat Show

During last year's Wheat Show, many crop producers came just to learn more about soil health and how it can impact productivity of the land and profits on the farm. Since then many of the attendees urged members of the Wheat Show planning committee to include more information on soil health during the February, 2013 event.

So this year's Wheat Show will feature two speakers who will address the components of soil quality and how certain farming practices specific to western North Dakota and eastern Montana can make soils in these areas more productive and profitable. In addition, one of the speakers. Chris Augustin, area NDSU Extension Soil Health Specialist, is offering to test producer's soil for salinity during the Wheat Show. To accomplish this, Augustin suggests sampling the soil from a handful of spots in a field, mix the soil and place it in a small dish on a sunny windowsill for a few days to allow the sample to melt and dry. Then place the sample in a zip-lock plastic bag and bring it to the Wheat Show. The test will only take a few minutes. There will be no charge for the test.

Salts are native to North Dakota's glaciated mineology. They affect soil health and this quick test gives farmers an idea of how bad it is and what can be done to fix the problem.

Rick Bieber, a Trail City, SD farmer, has offered to share how he has improved soil health and productivity of his farm located north of Pierre, SD. Rick works closely with the researchers of South Dakota State University. He believes yields of annual crops can be substantially increased through the implementation of farming practices that mimic Mother Nature. He tries to accomplish this through specific crop rotations and the maintenance of live root systems.

Rick brings with him a long time experience with no-till farming practices, speaking engagements around the world and as a consultant to farmers in the Dakotas and Montana.

Beef Cattle Workshop Set For December 19

Two beef cattle workshops, Beyond the Bunk and Beef College, combined this year to give producers a bigger program with more options.

This daylong beef cattle workshop will be held Dec. 19 at the Ramada Bismarck Hotel (formerly the Best Western Doublewood Inn) in Bismarck. The workshop is a collaborative effort of the North Dakota State University Animal Sciences Department, NDSU Extension Service and North Dakota Stockmen's Association (NDSA).

Key industry spokesmen will offer insights into the state of the beef industry and how current research efforts can position North Dakota producers to adapt to a changing industry. The latest research on feed efficiency, vaccination programs and improving the feeding value of corn stover are among the topics at the event.







Final Montana Oil Pipeline Safety Council Report Published

The Montana Oil Pipeline Safety Review Council has completed its final report. The report was presented to Governor Brian Schweitzer on November 27, 2012.

The report is the culmi-

nation of the work of the Oil Pipeline Safety Review Council, created by the Governor in the wake of the ExxonMobil Silvertip oil spill in July 2011. The purpose of the Council was to review all available information for each pipeline river crossing in Montana to assess the risk

of ruptures and leaks. The Governor asked the Council to evaluate the regulatory framework for pipelines and to identify any regulatory gaps that might exist. The Council was also asked to make recommendations to prevent future failures.

The report describes a

new, interactive Montana Pipeline Safety Map created through a cooperative agreement with the federal Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) and with the assistance of pipeline operators. The map contains numerous layers of information including aerial photos, topographic maps, property

boundaries and ownership, as well as locations of environmental interest like monitoring stations and wells.

The report also contains six recommendations designed to reduce the chances of future pipeline breaks that could spill products into Montana's waterways. It is available on the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) website at www.deq.mt.gov.

DPHHS Reports Increase in Influenza, Activity Officials Say It's Not Too Late to Vaccinate

Local and state public health officials are reporting an increase in influenza activity and reminding all Montanans that it is not too late to vaccinate - get your influenza vaccine today!

"Influenza season typically peaks in February and can last as late as May," says Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services Director Anna Whiting Sorrell. "We are encouraging people who have not yet been vaccinated to get vaccinated now."

Each year, millions of people are infected with influenza, more than 200,000 people are hospitalized, and thousands die from its complications.

Public health officials stress that every Montanan aged 6 months and older should receive the influenza vaccine each year. Getting vaccinated protects the person getting the vaccine and the community. The influenza vaccine is available in two forms: a shot and a nasal spray. The nasal spray is for use in healthy people ages 2 to 49 years who are not pregnant.

Anyone can get influenza, but some people are at greater risk for serious complications. Influenza complications can include pneumonia, hospitalization, and even death. Getting the influenza vaccine is especially important for those at greater risk for complications. People at greater risk include:

• Children younger than 5 years old, but especially children younger than 2 years old

- Pregnant women
- People with certain medical conditions like asthma, diabetes, or heart and lung disease
- People 65 years and

It's also important to get the vaccine if you care for or live with anyone at greater risk. It is especially important for those caring for infants younger than 6 months to get vaccinated because infants less than 6 months old cannot be vaccinated.

Getting the influenza vaccine is more convenient than ever. Vaccines are avail-

able from your doctor, local health department, and at many retail pharmacies. The annual vaccine supply continues to grow, so everyone who wishes to can get the vaccine.

Please remember: the influenza vaccine is the single best way to prevent influenza and its serious complications.

Montana Employers will see a Decrease in Their 2013 Unemployment Insurance Rates

The Department of Labor and Industry recently announced that the Unemployment Insurance Contribution Rate Schedule will be adjusted from schedule 7 to schedule 6, resulting in a decrease in many Montana employer's contribution rates

Submitted by Casey Kyler for 2013. "This is good news for Montana employers, both large and small, as we continue our economic recovery in the state," said Labor Commissioner Keith Kelly. "UI benefits provide a critical financial safety net for Montana's unemployed workers, and as more Mon-

mand for those benefits decreases, in turn lowering the rate schedule."

During the recession Montana employers saw an increase in their contribution rate schedules. Each vear a statutory formula is used to determine employer contribution rates for the next calendar year. Legislation, initially passed in 1979, requires the automatic rate adjustment. There are 11 schedules as provided by law and the rates are decreasing from schedule 7 to schedule 6. The contribution rates in 2013 will average 2.12% as compared to 2.32% in 2012.

Throughout the recession, Montana has been one of only 18 states in the U.S. to maintain a positive UI Trust Fund balance. This means through careful management, and the timely contributions from Montana businesses, Montana did not have to borrow from the federal government in order to continue paying state UI benefits. Many states are now in the position of requiring additional taxes from employers in order to pay back loans to the federal government and achieve solvency for their trust fund accounts.

"Our statutory unemployment Rate Schedule is doing exactly what it is designed to do, provide for benefits during economic downturns, while rebuilding the fund as the economy grows," said Unemployment Insurance Administrator Roy Mulvaney. Some employers

will not experience a rate decrease as individual rates are based on an employer's overall unemployment rate
