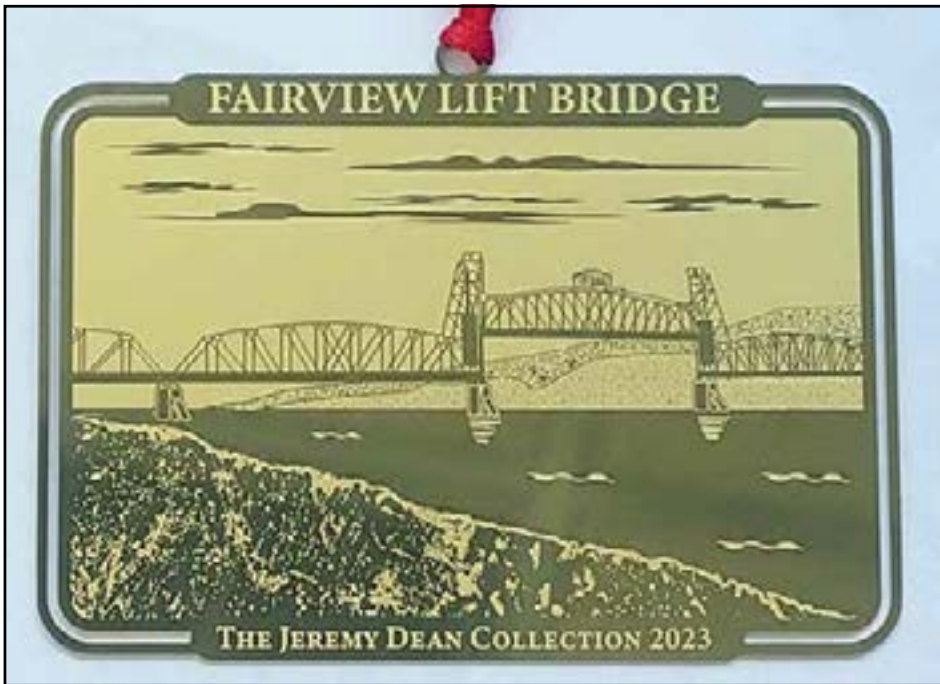

Richland Co. Health Department Offers Updated COVID-19 Vaccine

The Richland County Health Department is now offering the updated COVID-19 vaccine by appointment at regular vaccine clinics.

The updated vaccine covers the COVID-19 variant that has caused most infections in 2023. The vaccine protects against COVID-19 only, and does not contain flu vaccine or any other vaccine.

The Health Department carries Moderna vaccine for people aged six months and older. The vaccine is largely covered by insurance, though it is the client's responsibility to contact their insurance to determine coverage. Both Medicare and Medicaid will cover the vaccine. The cost of the vaccine is \$190. The Health Department is a Bridge Access Program provider, which may provide vaccine to adults who are uninsured. The Vaccines for Children Program provides vaccine to uninsured children. To locate providers of other brands of COVID-19 vaccine, visit www.vaccines.gov.

To be eligible for the new vaccine, you must wait at least two months after the last COVID-19 vaccine, or up to three months after having COVID-19.

The Health Department currently offers COVID-19 vaccine during regular vaccination clinic hours, which are Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 10-4:30 p.m. by appointment, as well as the second Wednesday of each month until 6 p.m., and the third Thursday from 10 a.m.-noon and 1-4 p.m. All times are MST.

For questions or to make an appointment for a COVID-19 vaccine or other vaccinations, call the Health Department at 406-433-2207. The Health Department is located in the Community Services Building at 1201 W. Holly, Ste. 1, Sidney.

Jeab's Thai Kitchen, Authentic Thai Food In Sidney

A Thai restaurant opened up on Fox Run Oct. 11, in Sidney. Calvin and Kamonwan Urbatsch plus Juree Naowarat now run Jeab's Thai Food, serving authentic Thai food to Sidney, MT.

In 2003, the Urbatschs came to Williston, ND. from Thailand. Kamonwan had grown up in Thailand and worked in a restaurant back in KB, Brunei. One of the first things she noticed when she came to North Dakota was that there was nowhere to eat authentic Thai food. She longed to share the flavors of her homeland with the people around her by starting a restaurant but then was not the time. She got a job at Walmart and worked there faithfully for 15 years. Finally, about five years ago, Ka-

monwan was able to act on her dream. The Urbatschs were able to purchase a food truck and Jeab's Thai Kitchen was born. The husband-and-wife team ran the food truck for four years. Then, an opportunity opened up in Tioga and Kamonwan finally got her first mortar and brick restaurant and Jeab's Thai Kitchen in Tioga was born and is still in operation, today.

Then, one day, while taking a drive into Sidney to get some meat, Kamonwan saw a sign in the window of one of the empty spaces in Fox Run and she wanted to bring her Thai food to Sidney. Jeab's Thai Food in Sidney opened on Oct. 11. Although very supportive of his enterprising wife, Calvin was not as enthused with this one, "We were going to

retire," he said. Their daughter, Juree Naowarat, who has helped in the restaurant and food truck, plans to take a trip to Thailand and when she returns the Urbatschs are handing it off to the next generation.

The Urbatsch's Sidney restaurant is open from 11 a.m.-9 p.m. Tuesday-Sunday and serves many culinary treats from chow mein and fried rice to panang curry and Thai tea with boba or lime. Jeab's Thai Food is located at 430 N Central Ave, Sidney. They offer food for dine-in, take-out, and online ordering.  Books on Broadway, the delightful bookstore at 12 1/2 W. Broadway, Williston, was started 30 years ago by Robin and, Williston native, Chuck Wilder. Robin was the force behind the store from its beginnings in 1993 until her passing away from cancer in 2000.
 She moved to Williston when she married her long-time college friend, Chuck, after a lengthy career with the Bell Systems. Robin and Chuck began the process of opening their bookstore. It took lots of time and sweat. They were fascinated by the book buying process and got "A Cup of Christmas Tea", as one of the first books because it was highly recommended. They sold about 100 copies of that book that year! Another item that sold well that year were Farside Calendars! They sold about 100 of those as well. The store opened in the fall of 1993 and was embraced by the community which found Robin to be a delightful and knowledgeable source for books and gifts.
 The Wilder's shared

love of antiques meant many happy hours finding treasures and then decorating the store with them. They found the coffee bar's gorgeous back bar at an auction in Fortuna with the intention of opening a coffee bar. Unfortunately, that didn't happen until five years after Robin's passing, but it now boasts the best beans in Williston.
 Many memories have been shared during the past few months of this anniversary year. By all accounts, Robin was a wonderful, nice, and considerate person who loved meeting the community and making friends. Robin would help customers discover new books and authors. When Beanie Babies were the craze, Robin would sneak them up from downstairs when they were requested by people to avoid a rush of people trying to buy the last one. Robin would hide little elves and figurines around the store, some of which the staff are still finding. They also find things that are for sale in random areas of the store where staff didn't place them! Robin's spirit is in the store.
 Robin had started reading to her friend's students at St. Joseph School in 1996 and that has expanded to include all the elementary schools in Williston with the occasional addition of Ray, Trenton, Alexander, and sometimes daycare age kids during the holiday season. Local school children are invited for a story and a treat. Today this amounts to approximately 500 children.
 After her cancer diagnosis, the community rallied



around the couple, helping with everything from yard work to volunteering at the store and always encouraging Robin to get well and come back to the store she loved.
 Since 2000, Books on Broadway has been in the capable hands of Chuck Wilder. Following Robin's dream and feeling that Robin's spirit is still in the store, he has not only maintained, but also added to the store's offerings and atmosphere. He and his capable staff are always happy to help a customer find the perfect book or gift.
 In addition to thousands of books covering every taste, shoppers can find unique gifts, such as music supplies, rocks and crystals, antiquarian books, and the

infamous Woolworth Table! And don't forget the coffee or a steaming mug of hot chocolate!

NCAA Division III National Champion Speaks To Sidney Middle School Wrestlers



NCAA Division III National Champion and 2001 Dan Hodge Trophy winner Nick Ackerman spoke to Sidney Middle School wrestlers Oct. 19. He visited with them following practice in the Sidney High School wrestling room.

Ackerman is not a typical wrestler and not a typical champion. As a young child he was afflicted with spinal meningitis resulting in the amputation of both of his legs to save his life. It was only through hard

work and perseverance that Ackerman reached the top of college wrestling.

He started his wrestling career in the third grade. "I got beat a lot. I had a lot of coaches that believed in me," Ackerman said. "My freshman year of college they didn't say this guy is going to win a national title and win the Hodge Trophy that year. Then go on to be this excellent, exceptional wrestler."

Ackerman finished his college senior year with a

38-4 record with 13 pins. In the 2001 NCAA Division III finals he defeated defending national champion Nick Slack for the 174-lb title. Ackerman broke Slacks 60 match undefeated winning streak. Also, that year, he won the Dan Hodge Trophy along with four time NCAA Division I champion Cael Sanderson. The Dan Hodge Trophy is collegiate wrestling's equivalent to the Heisman Trophy.

Ackerman stressed three important steps to take to become successful. These steps include surrounding yourself with exceptional people, believe

in yourself and don't complain. "You can't beat a guy that doesn't quit," Ackerman stated.

Ackerman is a regular visitor to the Sidney area. In 2018, he spoke at the wrestling banquet. Ackerman makes yearly trips to the area to hunt with Sidney Middle School coach Shane Gorder and his family. This year, Ackerman was accompanied by his son, Grayer, 12, and friend Ryan Hadsall with his son Kyle, 12. Grayer and Kyle were each lucky enough to harvest 4x4 bucks during the Montana deer youth hunt Oct. 19-20.

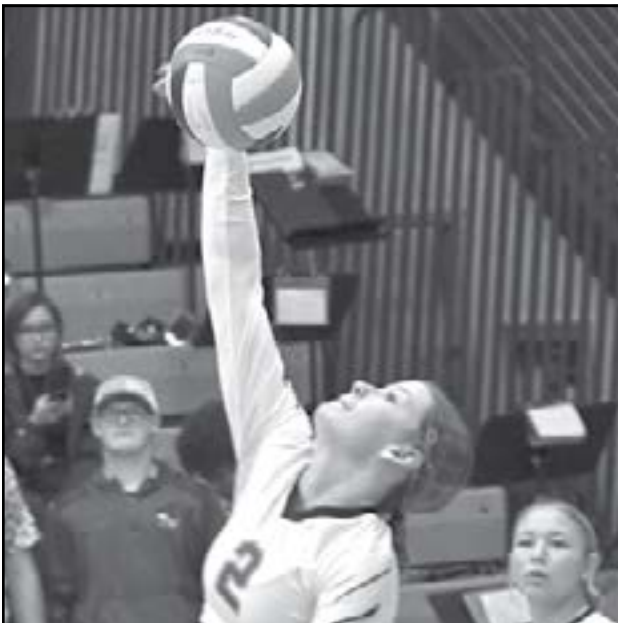

Fairview Warriors Overcome Shelby Coyotes In Heated Football Game Oct. 27

The Fairview Warriors came out hot on an unusually cold October day shocking the Shelby Coyotes in the first round of the Class C 8-man playoffs. Fairview, the #1 seed in the East, scored 40 unanswered points in the first quarter against Shelby, the #3 seed in the North. After a first play 30-yard pass to Jaxon Vitt, Wyatt McPherson took the handoff on the next play 35-yards for a touchdown. Keegan Skogas added the 2-point conversion and two plays into the game it was 8-0 Warriors. Brock Schlothauer caused a fumble on Shelby's first series. The Warriors

Fairview ran 28 plays for 413 total yards. That is 18 rushes for 203 yards with 4 touchdowns and 7-10 passing for 210 yards with 3 touchdowns. Schlothauer had 6 carries for 127 yards and 1 touchdown while Gackle had 4 catches for 135 yards and 2 touchdowns. The #1 ranked Warriors travel to Arlee this weekend to face the #1 seed in the West in the quarterfinal round of the playoffs.

Patten's life has been dedicated to his community in western North Dakota and serving the state and its people's best interests. Born in Plaza, ND, he graduated from NDSU with a degree in animal science and served as McKenzie and Slope County's extension agent for 5 years before starting at McKenzie County Bank, now Cornerstone Bank, in Watford City. Patten was a part of the McKenzie County Bank for 33 years, with his last held position that of market president of the bank, from which he retired in 2017. Retirement has been far from quiet for Dale, with him joining the Senate in 2019, representing McKenzie and Dunn counties in District 26. His wife, Joy, is a retired teacher, who operates a family farm and ranch in McKenzie County. His children, Kendra and Austin both live and work in Watford City;

Kendra graduated from UND and teaches elementary school, and Austin graduated from NDSU with a degree in agricultural economics and works for Helena Chemical Company.

Over a lifetime of service, Dale has served on and led committees and boards anywhere from a local to the federal level. He served as McKenzie County Commissioner for 12 years and chaired the new McKenzie County Planning Commission. With the explosion of growth due to the Bakken formation's opportunities, the county needed to implement zoning for the first time. He has repeatedly stepped up to ensure his county's and state's interests are represented at the national level. Locally he has served on the McKenzie County Job Development

Authority Board, Watford City Economic Development Corporation, and McKenzie County Fair Board. He currently is the chairman of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, vice chair of the Mountrail McKenzie Human Service Zone Board and the State and Tribal Relations Committee, and co-chairs the Clean Sustainable Energy Authority. Additionally, he serves on the Senate Finance and Taxation Committee, Energy Development and Transmission Committee, Tax Relief Task Force, the Energy Council, the Lignite Research Council, the ESG Study Engineering Committee, the NDSU FARMS Engine Governance Board, High-Level Radioactive Waste Advisory Committee, and the NDSU Animal Science Education Foundation.







IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL LANDOWNERS

The Lower Yellowstone Irrigation Project (LYIP) has Dominant Federal Easements and ownership of land adjacent to ditches, drains, ditch banks and buried pipes dating back **prior** to the County being created. Therefore, most records will **not** be found at the **County Courthouse, on Cadastral, or online.**

If your property has any Ditches, Ditch Banks, Drains, Drain Banks or Buried Pipes on or near it, come to LYIP office at 2327 Lincoln Avenue SE, Sidney MT before making any improvements. This includes planting any trees, building fences, drain fields, buildings/sheds, commercial signs, center pivots, or making any other improvements to property, so you do not have to remove those improvements in the future.

This is Federally Owned Land or dominant easements. The Bureau of Reclamation may have you remove whatever improvements you make on their Federal Land or Easements, or **they will remove it and charge you for the removal.**

FURTHER, any **ruts deeper than 6”** made by center pivots **MUST BE** filled and maintained by Center Pivot **OWNER** or **LESSEE** in order for safe passage of Ditchrider pickups, or they will be fixed by LYIP and you will be charged for it.

NON-PAYMENT OF LYIP INVOICES = NON-DELIVERY OF WATER AND EVENTUALLY A LIEN PLACED AGAINST THE PROPERTY.
