## Biodiversity "Hotspots" Down Under focus of ARS BrownBagger

Submitted by Beth Redlin The USDA-Agricultural Research Service's Northern Plains Agricultural Research Laboratory (NPARL) in Sidney will open its 12th winter Brown Bagger series at noon on Friday, Jan. $17^{\text {th }}$ with a special "science travelogue down under" by NPRAL Plant Ecologist Erin Espeland. The event is open to the public.

Dr. Espeland's research is focused on restoration of disturbed lands in semiarid regions of the Great Plains and her talk will focus on the ecology of southwestern Australia and problems in restoration there following a recent visit to that country.

Southwestern Australia is similar to the Northern Great Plains because of its livestock production, low rainfall, and frequent fire. However, the ecology of southwestern Australia is very different from here, because of sandy, low nutrient soils, few native grazers, and moderate temperatures

While in the region, Espeland visited Perth, which is located within one of the most important global biodiversity hotspots. Come learn about what the implications are for restoration in biodiversity hotspots, the fascinating plants of this part of Australia and the special problems
they present when trying to restore native communities after mining activities.

## Commission Recognizes Hovsing Incentive Pund Contributor

The North Dakota Industrial Commission today recognized QEP Resources, Inc., for contributing $\$ 1$ million in December to help the Housing Incentive Fund (HIF) create hundreds of new affordable housing units in western North Dakota.

The company was one of five entities contributing \$1 million or more to the fund, allowing for the full capitalization of the program a year in advance of the deadline.
"With North Dakota's economic growth expected to continue well into the future, affordable housing development remains a top priority for our state," commission members said in a joint statement. "North Dakota taxpayers, whether they are individuals or businesses like QEP Resources, recognize this need and have shown resounding support for the Housing Incentive Fund."

The Industrial Commission, consisting of Governor Jack Dalrymple as chairman, Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring and Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem, oversees the state's housing development efforts.

housing development program," said Matt Thompson, Vice President of QEP Energy's Northern Region. "As we safely and responsibly develop North Dakota's natural resources, we are committed to supporting the growth and development of the state's local communities through programs like the Housing Incentive Fund. In addition, we allocated more than \$800 million of capital investment to our North Dakota operations in 2013, and we look forward to continued investment in the state for years to come."

QEP's contribution will support development of Arrowhead Estate in Arnegard and the second phase of a Williston State College Foundation development. Both projects are intended to provide affordable housing for essential service workers. The North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) administers HIF.
"We sincerely appreciate the support our development program has received," said Jolene Kline, NDHFA executive director. "We look forward to seeing these developments through to their completion, providing the affordable housing North Dakota's communities need for healthy growth and development.

NDHFA received 448 contributions with the greatest monetary support - more than $\$ 11.3$ million - coming from financial institutions. Gate City Bank and U.S. Bank each contributed $\$ 3$ million, and Bell State Bank \& Trust and Wells Fargo Bank contributed $\$ 1$ million apiece.

The successful capitalization means that 34 projects that NDHFA conditionally funded last year will move forward creating 934 new housing units in Arnegard, Beach, Bismarck, Burlington, Crosby, Devils Lake, Dickinson, Dunn Center, Fargo, Grafton, Hettinger, Jamestown, Lignite, Mandan, Minot, New Rockford, Turtle Lake Watford City and Williston.

The Industrial Commission recommended that HIF be reauthorized during the 2013 legislative session. NDHFA received a \$15.4 million general fund appropriation and was authorized priation and was authorized o further capitalize HIF by issuing $\$ 20$ million in state tax credits.

The "Trashy Tuesday" drive will be held this comin Tuesday, January 21 st from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Richland Opportunities, Inc. located at 1100 Silurian Lane in Sidney This is the 4th year of quarterly plastic, paper, cardboard and aluminum can drives. The drives are being sponsored by the Recycling Advisory Committee. The committee consists of area citizens who would like to ensure that the community has an opportunity to recycle material that cannot be recycled using the current resources. All paper products can be recycled with the exception of manila envelopes and bright neon paper. The office/junk mail must be sorted from the newspapers and magazines. Catalogs and telephone books cannot be accepted.

## Influenza Cases Increasing Throughout Montana

## Public health officials encourage influenza vaccine

Submitted by Jon Ebelt Influenza activity is widespread in Montana with half of the counties reporting con firmed cases, state public health officials said today. Influenza-related hospitalizations across the state have also increased. As of January 4, 2014 there have been 101 hospitalizations re ported this season, with ove half in the last two weeks Further, one death from complications of influenza was reported last week in Hill County. DPHHS influenza surveillance for the 2013-1 season officially began on October 1, 2013
"It is important that al ndividuals older than six months get vaccinated to protect themselves and oth ers," said DPHHS Director Richard Opper. "Pharmacies and health departments stil have vaccine and getting vaccinated is the single most important thing you can do to prevent influenza and its complications.'

The virus responsible for cases this year is the same H1N1 strain that circulated during the 2009 season. The current vaccine includes pro tection against H 1 N 1 as well as other types of influenza ex pected to circulate. The U.S Centers for Disease Contro and Prevention (CDC) has received a number of reports of severe illness among young and middle-aged adults and strongly encourages thos in these age groups to be vaccinated.

As Montana enters the most active part of the influen za season, public health offi cials are offering the following
advice to keep yourself and your family healthy

Get vaccinated. Protect yourself and others by getting vaccinated now.

If you are ill, stay home from work or school. CDC recommends that you or you child stay home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone without the use of fever-reducing medicine.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing. Cough or sneeze into the crook of your arm if you have no other choice.

Washing your hands ofen will help protect you from viruses like influenza. Soap and water should be your firs choice, but if soap and wate are not available, use an alco hol-based hand rub.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Viruses are often spread when a per son touches something that is contaminated with viruses and then touches his or her eyes nose, or mouth.

If you get sick, ask your healthcare provider if antiviral drugs are right for you. They can prevent serious flu com plications like pneumonia. Fo people with a high risk medica condition, treatment with an antiviral drug can mean the difference between having milder illness instead of very serious illness that could result in a hospital stay.

I will not support a "petition" to tax ourselves forever. believe this idea has two strikes before it gets off the ground First: There is no sunset clause in this law. If this tax is imposed whether effective or not, it says on the tax assessment until another "petition" removes it. In my lifetime I have seen many taxes imposed but can't remember any removed! Second: Do we really want to be in bed with a Federal Agency? Michae seemed like a "nice guy". What happens when he's replaced? If we go forward with this self imposed tax, we lose control of how the money is used when we turn it over to the feds.

I would voluntarily contribute to a predator control fund, on an annual basis, If that fund was controlled by a local board of Richland County Livestock Producers, who could hire a private contractor to fly or trap problem areas.

In my humble opinion anything government can do, private enterprise can do better and more cost effectively.
