This year the annual Best of the West Ribfest and Street Fair will have a concert with three musical groups. The free concert will be held Friday, Aug. 13 on Main Street Watford City. Cape Air To Replace Fleet With New Planes

Cape Air presented their new Tecnam P2012 Traveller planes to the public at the Sidney-Richland Municipal Airport on April 7. The new planes will replace the airline's current fleet of Cessna 402s. The first commercial flight from the Sidney Airport took place April 9. The company currently has three of the new planes in service in Montana with two more entering service this week. Eventually all

eight planes in the Montana fleet will be replaced with the new Tecnam P2012 Traveller. The older Cessna 402s will remain on hand as backups making Cape Air's service even more reliable in the future.

The Tecnam P2012 Traveller is an eleven-seat aircraft designed and manufactured by the Italian company Costruzioni Aeronautiche Tecnam, based in Capua, Italy, near Naples. The new planes will make

room for an additional seat on each flight and will increase the cabin capacity by 30%. The high wing design will ensure a great view from every seat. Other new features include Italian leather seats, overhead lighting, under seat storage, USB charging ports and cup holders. The increased cabin capacity will also provide additional head & leg room compared to the Cessna 402.

Cape Air, the nation's

largest commuter airline, began serving eastern Montana Tuesday, Dec. 10, 2013, taking over the service provided by Big Sky Airlines. From its hub in Billings, Cape Air operates daily, year-round flights to five regional communities. There are currently five daily round trip flights to and from the Sidney Airport to Billings. As the only statewide resource for cooperative development, the MCDC works with new and existing co-ops and other interested groups to evaluate co-op business models and strategies to meet their objectives. MCDC is a nonprofit corporation that receives financial assistance from state and federal sources, which allows MCDC to offer services at little or no cost to project groups.

This tour will be in Sidney on Thursday, April 15 with two special opportunities to learn more about the value of cooperatives and how MCDC can help.

The first event commences from 8-9 a.m., at Sidney Elks Lodge small room. Casual conversations will be held over coffee, with MCDC staff available for one-on-one consultations if necessary.

The second opportunity will be held at the Richland County Extension Center from 11:30-1 p.m. with the discussion and presentation focusing on cooperatives and food hubs. Lunch will be provided to attendees, and LYREC is sponsoring the lunch.

The resolution reads as follows:

Emergency Resolution No 2021-06

Open Burning Not Permitted in Richland County

Whereas, existing dry conditions, low humidity, high winds and continued high temperatures contribute to hazardous fire conditions, and there currently have been many fires in our regions; and

Whereas, condition

continue to deteriorate;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Richland County Commissioners, that Richland County be declared in Stage I restrictions for burning.

This resolution shall become effective at midnight April 7, 2021 and be in effect until further notice.

Hoeven Working To Maintain America's Energy Leadership

Senator Holds Roundtable Discussion With Western ND Energy Producers

Tioga - Senator John Hoeven, of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee member, held a roundtable discussion with local energy producers in western North Dakota to review ongoing developments in the region's energy industry and outline his efforts to maintain America's leadership in energy production. To this end, Hoeven is working to:

- Secure approval for WBI Energy's North Bakken Expansion Project from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC).
 - Push back on Biden administration's executive actions targeting US domestic energy production, including oil, gas and coal development on federal lands.
 - Ensure the reliability of the electric grid by supporting the continued use of baseload power sources, like coal.
- This includes cracking the code on carbon capture, utilization and storage (CCUS) technologies.

"North Dakota built the right kind of legal, tax and regulatory environment needed to unleash innovation and realize the potential of the Bakken region," said Hoeven. "This has led to a strong economy, created good-paying jobs and made America a global energy powerhouse. We need to build on this progress to ensure our continued economic and national security. However, the Biden administration is headed in the wrong direction, reviving burdensome regulations, locking away taxpayer-owned energy resources and threatening tax increases that put our nation at a competitive disadvantage. This has serious consequences for local economies, increases prices for consumers and reduces needed revenues to state, tribal and local governments. That's why we will continue our efforts to press back on duplicative federal rules and unilateral actions like these from the administration, and instead work in bipartisan fashion to advance new innovations, like CCUS, that empower us to produce more energy with better environmental stewardship."

North Bakken Expansion Project

Hoeven is working to secure approval for WBI Energy's proposed \$260 million natural gas expansion project, which will help reduce natural gas flaring in the Bakken by providing an additional 250 million cubic feet per day of natural gas takeaway capacity for operators in the region. Accordingly, Hoeven has led efforts with the North Dakota delegation in expressing their support for the project to FERC and urging the agency to take timely action on the project before its next scheduled meeting. Doing so would help keep the project on schedule and ensure the pipelines are in service by Nov. 1.

Addressing the Administration's Executive Actions

Hoeven's work on the WBI expansion project aligns with his ongoing efforts to support the infrastructure and energy development needed to strengthen the nation's economic and national security. To this end, the senator has:

- Worked to maintain the operation of the Dakota Access Pipeline (DAPL).

Hoeven has been pressing Army Corps leadership to keep the pipeline flowing as the Corps completes its environmental impact statement (EIS) process.

The senator is also supporting MHA Nation Chairman Mark Fox in his request for the tribe to be consulted on DAPL.

- Pressed the Interior Secretary for answers on the administration's oil and gas moratorium and questioned limitations placed on public participation in a recent virtual forum on the matter.

Hoeven also helped introduce legislation to prohibit the administration from issuing moratoria on leasing and permitting for energy and mineral resources on federal lands.

- Helped introduce legislation, along with Senator Cramer and Congressman Armstrong, to authorize the continued construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline following President Biden's decision to revoke the cross-border operation permit.

Ensuring the Reliability of the Electric Grid

Hoeven has been pressing FERC to ensure coal's role, as a reliable source of baseload power is properly valued, outlining the need to maintain diverse sources of electricity. At the same time, the senator continues supporting the development of CCUS technologies to help produce more energy from coal-fired electric, while also reducing emissions. His efforts include:

- Getting the 45Q tax credit implemented in a way that makes CCUS projects more commercially-viable.
- Securing funding in the Fiscal Year 2021 appropriations legislation for critical loan guarantee programs at the Department of Energy (DOE) and the Department of Agriculture's Rural Utility Service to help CCUS project developers secure financing.

This aligns with legislation Hoeven helped introduce to provide loans and grants to support construction of CCUS infrastructure.

- Prioritizing enhancements for the 45Q and 48A Advanced Coal tax credits, which include his legislation to modernize the 48A tax credit for CO2 capture retrofit projects and a bipartisan bill he helped introduce to provide a direct payment option for the 45Q and 48A CCUS tax incentives.
- Bolstering DOE's partnership with UND's Energy & Environmental Research Center (EERC) in support of efforts like Project Tundra.

Hoeven has helped secure \$43 million in federal funding for Project Tundra.

NWND Community Foundation Announces Community Recovery Mini-Grants

Williston - The Northwest North Dakota Community Foundation (NWND CF) is announcing the availability of grants to support the communities of northwest North Dakota to recover from the effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic. In 2020, area individuals, businesses, and others donated thousands of dollars to the NWND CF's Relief Fund, and through nearly \$90,000 of grants, NWND CF supported communities, nonprofit organizations, hospitals, daycares, and food efforts within the region. The remaining funds within the Relief Fund are being pivoted from direct relief projects to community recovery efforts.

"As a regional Community Foundation, we work to serve and strengthen communities across Williams, Divide, McKenzie, and Mountrail counties every day," remarked Ward Koeser, NWND CF Board of Directors president. "Our Community Recovery Mini-Grants are directed specifically toward small, quick-action projects that will enhance or help communities as they move toward recovery from the COVID-19 Pandemic."

The maximum grant award is \$2,500 for specific projects, and eligible recipients of grant funds are nonprofits (501c3, 501c4); governmental agencies; and unincorporated community groups with an appropriate fiscal sponsor. The mini-grants might provide project support for shopping local initiatives, outdoor enhancements like seating or other amenities, artistic enhancement of community spaces, a specific community event, and more. The focus is explicitly on Community Recovery. The application deadline is May 14, and projects need to be completed before December 31.

"Through this funding allocation, we are hoping to invest in physical reminders of the strength and resilience of northwest North Dakota through the creative efforts of the region's residents," said Koeser.

Last week, her peers and coworkers selected her as the Employee of the Quarter for her commitment to patients and dedication to quality care. “Danielle takes initiative and often takes it upon herself to ask others if there is anything she can do to help,” said Karla Hunter, Director of Nursing. “She’s been helpful with department changes as they come and willingly takes on complicated tasks and projects with enthusiasm,” Hunter continued.

Alexander Robotics Team Preparing For Success

The Alexander Robotics team is busy perfecting their robot for an upcoming competition. The regional contest will be held this week and the team is hoping for a big win. If they advance from regionals, they will have a chance to compete in the North Dakota state competition in May.

"The students are busy preparing for regionals and in addition to things that they've done in the past like our everyday building and design processing, we've hosted two scrimmages at the school and welcomed other robotics teams," said Cathy White, Alexander Robotics Team mentor/coach.

Due to COVID-19, the robotics season has been extended, which allows the team members more time to build and perfect their robots and put on community events like Turkey and Easter Bingo.

The team is currently working on an innovation project. FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) offered an additional project this year called the innovation project. This project is where students develop a plan to increase the mental and physical health of the community members.

For this project, the members put together a plan for building a full-sized basketball court in Alexander.

"We do have a basketball court at the school but it's not regulation and the kids would say the hoops are horrible. So they're looking at applying for a grant and trying to figure out where they could place a basketball court. We've done surveys with community members and have been to the City Park board a couple of times and will be attending the City Council meeting to talk to them about it," added White.

In addition to this, the team is sponsoring a rookie team from Eswatini, South Africa. They helped them start their new team of five students by supplying their registration fee, and kit expenses.

"We have had the opportunity to work remotely with the team via zoom monthly. It has been a great experience for the teams to work together and learn from each other," stated White.

The team is also looking at going to Washington DC again this summer to advocate for STEM and robotics. They are planning on meeting with congressmen and senators to share information on the importance of STEM.

Last year, the team won The Inspire award at the state competition, which meant that they won the opportunity to attend the world competition, which was canceled because of COVID. So, this year, the students have put in a lot of work in hopes that they can make it to the world competition.

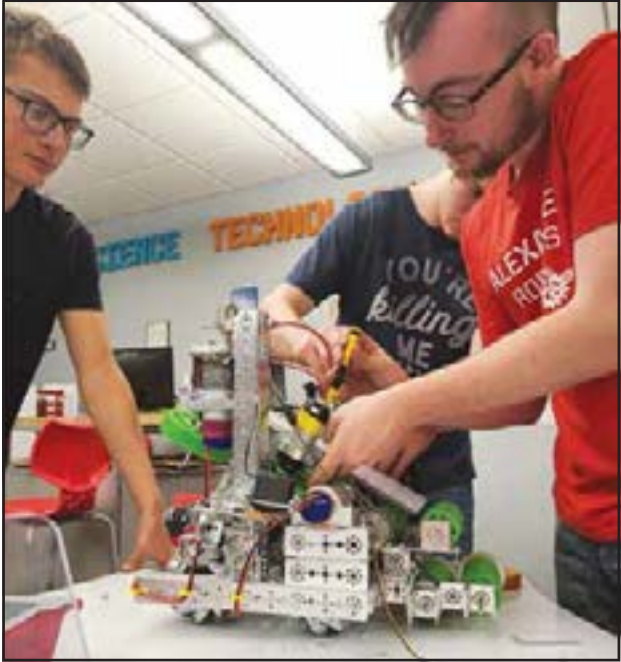
"My goal this year was to help the team make it to World's again, and to prepare the juniors for next year," said Drew LeBrun, Robotics Operations Department Manager.

White said, "It's been difficult because at times some of the team was in quarantine and we've had to work with distance learning. We were able to do some of the computer-aided drafting and drawing at home and come up with other additional ideas when they were in quarantine. It definitely was a challenge, to begin with, but now with our numbers in the state as low as they are, we are able to continue at normal capacity with social distancing."

I told him I'd replace the wine glass. He told me he preferred the cash. I told him I'd put a check in the mailbox.

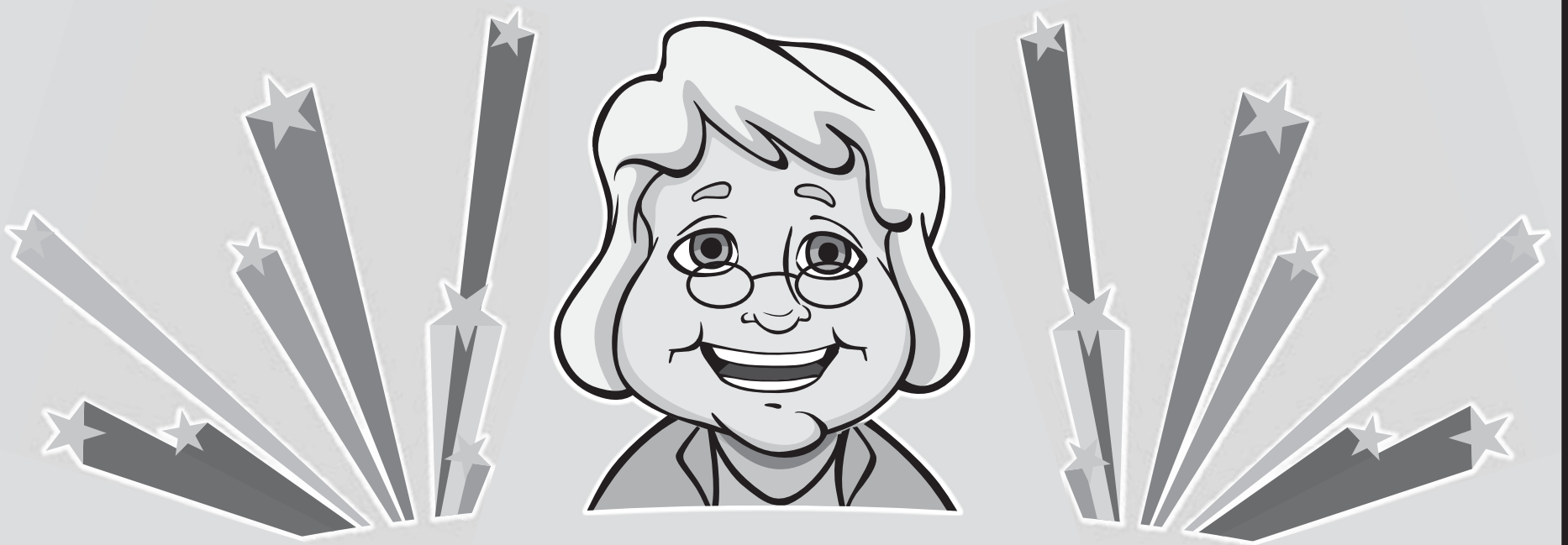

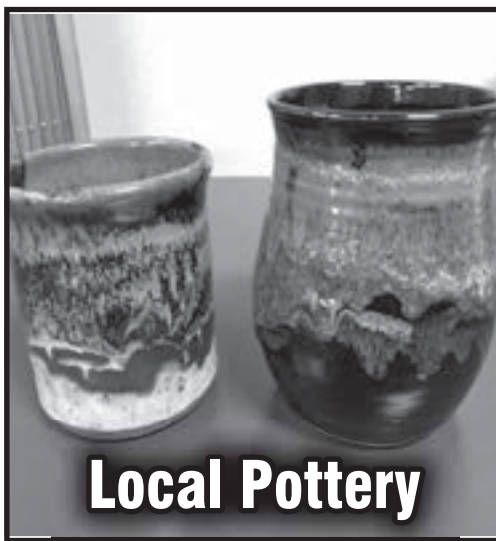

Guest Opinion: Legislative Report

Greetings from Helena!
In Public Health, Welfare and Safety Committee we heard a bill, HB334, that more specifically explains the rights of students that need an exemption from immunizations, whether it is for medical or religious reasons. There is a lot of concern about what the Health Departments are going to require because of the health concerns this past year. We also heard HB502 which helps the process of adoption become easier between expectant mothers and adoptive parents. HB398 would allow legislators to review records of cases investigated by the office of the child and family ombudsman. There are a lot of concerns about how much authority Child Protective Services (CPS) has.
In Judiciary Commit-

tee we heard from three district judges that Governor Bullock had nominated, and we have to confirm or reject them. I have some concerns about all of them. We also heard HB337, the Personhood Amendment, which states life begins at conception. This is a constitutional amendment, and we need 34 votes in the Senate in order for it to pass. HB481 dealt with penalties for damages done to critical infrastructure. These include pipelines, electrical facilities, petroleum facilities, etc.
We heard HB2 on the floor of the Senate. HB2 is the main money bill for the next biennium. This is always a complicated process because there is a little bit for this and a little for that and pretty soon it adds up to being a lot of money. That money has to be taken

from hard working Montana taxpayers. It is still in the process of getting trimmed. We will see what happens.
A bill I carried, SB157, which would allow non-public school students to participate in public school extracurricular activities, passed through the Senate and the House and is ready for the Governor's signature. This bill had bi-partisan support from both houses.
We had another Page this week, Bronte Bennion, from Sidney. I think the Page Program is a great learning experience for our young people. If you are in Helena, be sure to stop and see us. If you want to look up the text of a bill you can find it at <https://leg.mt.gov>.

USDA Announces Funding Available to Organizations to Assist Socially Disadvantaged Farmers & Ranchers under Pandemic Assistance for Producers Initiative

Washington - The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced the availability of \$2 million to establish partnerships with organizations to provide outreach and technical assistance to socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers. The funding was made possible by USDA's new Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative, an effort to distribute resources more broadly and to put greater emphasis on outreach to small and socially disadvantaged producers impacted by the pandemic. April 5 also marked the reopening of FSA's Coronavirus Food Assistance Program 2 (CFAP 2) signup as part of the Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative. Farmers and ranchers will have at least 60 days to apply or make modifications to existing CFAP 2 applications.

Montana FWP Sites In Carter, Richland, Wibaux Counties Enter Stage 1 Fire Restrictions

Miles City - Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks is implementing fire restrictions on sites within three eastern Montana counties, due to dry conditions and high fire danger.

Citing dry conditions and high fire danger, commissioners in Carter, Richland and Wibaux counties all implemented fire restrictions. Following the counties' lead, FWP will have restrictions on campfires and smoking at sites within those counties.

For Carter County, which began restrictions at 12:01 a.m., April 9, campfire

and smoking restrictions will be in place at Medicine Rocks State Park. For Richland County, which entered Stage 1 Wednesday, 12 a.m., restrictions affect Sidney Bridge Fishing Access Site (FAS), Diamond Willow FAS, Gartside Reservoir FAS, Elk Island FAS and Wildlife Management Area (WMA), Fox Lake WMA and Seven Sisters WMA. Wibaux County has no FWP sites with restrictions, but Stage 1 restrictions starting Monday, 12 a.m. include all private lands in the county.

Stage 1 restrictions mean that people cannot

build or maintain a campfire. People also may not smoke except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is cleared of flammable materials. Recreationists may cook on a liquid petroleum gas or propane stove that can be turned on and off.

The restrictions at FWP sites will be in place until further notice. FWP urges people to use caution while they are out recreating due to the already dry conditions and fire dangers.

DPHHS Confirms First Hantavirus Case For 2021

Case is first one since 2018; Health officials remind Montanans to take precautions to avoid hantavirus

The Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) has confirmed that an adult male from Richland County has been diagnosed with hantavirus infection.

The individual acquired the illness while working out of state where there was an occupational exposure to mice. The individual was hospitalized but is now in the process of recovering at home.

DPHHS and local public health agencies remind Montanans and visitors to the state to be aware of the risk of hantavirus and to take precautions to avoid exposures to rodents, their droppings and nests. This is Montana's first hantavirus case in 2021 and is the state's 45th case since it was first identified in the state in 1993. Previously, the most recently reported case was in 2018.

"Although hantavirus infection can occur during any month, the risk of exposure is increased in the spring and summer as people are cleaning cabins and sheds, and are spending more time outside which may result in rodent exposures," said Erika Baldry, DPHHS Public Health and Safety Division epidemiologist.

Hantavirus infections are relatively rare in the US and in Montana. Early symptoms of hantavirus include fatigue, fever and muscle aches with progression to coughing and extreme shortness of breath. Hantavirus infection can cause severe illness; about 25% of Montana's cases have resulted in death. Supportive medical care is essential to survival and, if diagnosed early, can help victims through the period of severe respiratory distress.

Studies have shown that deer mice are the most common host of the virus and are well dispersed throughout Montana. People can become infected with hantavirus when saliva, urine, or droppings from an infected deer mouse are stirred up and inhaled. It is important to avoid activities that raise dust, such as sweeping or vacuuming, if there are signs of rodents in the area.

The best protection against hantavirus is to control rodent populations in the places where people live and work by taking these precautions:

- Seal Up: Prevent mouse entry into homes and sheds by sealing up holes and gaps in walls.

- Trap Up: Use snap traps to eliminate any mice indoors. Individuals can also reduce rodent populations near dwellings by keeping shrubbery near the home well-trimmed and moving woodpiles at least 100 feet from the dwelling and raising them at least one foot off the ground.

- Clean Up: Carefully clean up areas where mouse droppings are found.

- Avoid sweeping or vacuuming areas with rodent droppings and urine, as the action can stir up dust and aerosolize the droppings.

- If cleaning an area such as a cabin, camper or outbuilding, open windows and doors and air-out the space for 30 minutes prior to cleaning.

- Wear rubber or plastic gloves.

- Thoroughly spray or soak the area with a disinfectant or a mixture of bleach and water to reduce dust. Let soak for five minutes.

- Wipe up the droppings with a sponge or paper towel, then clean the entire area with disinfectant or bleach solution.

- When cleanup is complete, dispose of sponges and paper towels used to clean, remove and discard gloves and wash hands thoroughly with soap and warm water.

For those who think they have been exposed to hantavirus, monitoring for symptoms is vital. Any one experiencing symptoms such as fever, muscle aches and shortness of breath after a potential rodent exposure, should see a medical provider immediately.

"Be sure to tell your doctor that you have been around rodents—this will alert your physician to look closely for any rodent-carried disease, such as hantavirus pulmonary syndrome," Baldry advises.
