Youth Wants To Be "A Voice For His People"

A Poplar youth recently traveled to Washington, DC, after winning a national essay contest about a subject he feels intensely strong about; youth and violence. The trip, as well as his life experiences and renewed outlook on life, have served as a catalyst, sparking a passion in him that has helped him find his identity and the leadership role he would like to take on for his community.

Joshua Failing, 15, is like many other freshmen at his school. He enjoys hanging out with his friends. He loves some aspects of school and dislikes others. He plays football, basketball, wrestles, is involved in track, pep club and choir. He enjoys listening to music and is indecisive about what he would like to be when he grows up. However, there is a level of maturity in him not typical of your average teen. He wants to hear more positive news about his Native American community and he wants to be a voice for "his People".

The essay contest, "Do the Right Thing", is sponsored through the Montana Crime Board and centers on topics relating to bullying and violence. Failing's three-page essay answered three questions which included how violence has affected him personally, what the possible causes of youth

violence are and how he could effect change on the topic.

In July, he traveled on an all expense paid trip with his mother, Allison, and his 8th grade English teacher, Erin Solem, Culbertson, as a representative student for Montana. Of 65,000 applicants, only 55 students were selected nationwide with most states selecting a female and male representative. Prior to being selected, he was one of 10 finalists in Montana that got to travel to Helena for the selection process. He was invited to a buffet styled celebration in the capital where he was announced as one of the selected essay winners.

Weeks later he was packing his bags.

"I knew I would be the only person from a reservation so I didn't think a lot of people would relate to me or some of the things my school went through with violence and suicide,"

Failing stated. As it turned out, he connected with the youth right away and spent all of his free time with them rather than taking in all of the sites. He did visit the Supreme Court and the Department of Education and was one of the few students to read his essay at the Library of Congress to dignitaries including several senators and the Ambassadors of Kuwait.

Tragically, several years ago, there were six local teen suicides that took place in the Poplar community over a period of time. This is where some of Failings essay inspirations derived from. "It was hard to see my friends and their families suffering. It was really a tough time for our school," Failing recalled. It was these tragedies and the issues of bullying and youth violence that led Failing to his decision to try to make a difference in people's lives.

While he agrees there are problems on the reservation with drugs and alcohol abuse and youth violence, he is concentrating on changing the stereotypes of "rez life" by acting as a role model to his peers. "I think a lot of our societal problems stem from the fact that many younger generations aren't familiar with their Native culture and heritage. There is a lost identity there. We don't have a voice for our people. We need more role models. I want to help kids and be that voice," he said.

Erin Solem has been encouraging her students to participate in the contest for three years.

"A lot of the issues this contest wants youth to discuss are relevant and I want my students to see just how far writing can take them. Journaling is an excellent release for them. It's an outlet for them to express themselves," she said.

Failing is the first of her students to be selected as a contest winner.

Failing admits he wasn't always open to changing his attitude or behavior. "I used to get in trouble, but then I chose to listen. I want to be a leader for my community," he said. His mother says the change in his attitude has been an amazing process to watch over the past few years. "It has been a huge change that words can't describe. Josh grew up without a dad but other relatives and friends stepped in and offered guidance, wisdom, belonging and encouragement. While we were on this trip I felt like I was watching all of these qualities come out in him," she remarked.

Failing has held dear to one of his cultural traditions and attributes the practice of 'sweating' with saving his life and motivating him to be a better person more in tune with his identity. Several years ago, he began attending a sweat lodge with his grandfather, John Morsette, Poplar. "I thought this would be a one-time experience for me but I have stuck with it. It helped me find my identity and my place because before I had no identity. When I am doing this, I feel at home and I have met a lot of great people," he said.

He also attributes his success to being involved in the Native Youth Academy, a summer camp program for Montana and Wyoming youth to learn and grow with varying activities and workshops.

In the future, Failing wants to pursue a PhD in law or the medical field.

The 2006 Rural Water Act changed the process for authorizing rural water systems. Therefore, it was not until 2010 that the rules for this water act were written, unfortunately stalling progress on this project. Richland County portion would be the first part of the DRWA project to be finished and when DRWA receives funding for this project, it would eventually receive water from Fort Peck. Let's get going, and be the first in the DRWA to get good, safe, quality drinking water!

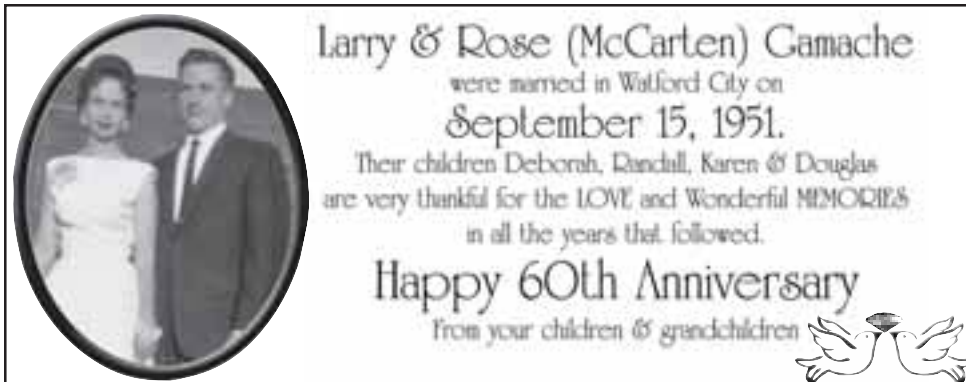

Heritage Park Adds New Attractions To Annual McKenzie Co. Heritage Day & Threshing Bee Sept. 17

New attractions were added to the Annual Heritage Day and Threshing Bee at the Heritage Park, Watford City, to be held Saturday, Sept. 17 starting at 10 a.m.

A Case Steam Traction engine was placed on display in July at the park. The 75 hp. Engine was manufactured by the JI Case Threshing Machine Company, Racine, WI, on May 25, 1910. It was shipped to Rugby, ND where it was sold to F.J. Wagner. It changed hands several times but is presently owned by Lloyd Lester, Fairview, ND.

In the summer of 2010, Lester offered to place the engine on display at the Heritage Park. The engine is for display only because its boiler doesn't pass inspection and a boiler replacement would cost about \$30,000. In the fall of 2010, an agree-

ment was reached. Park Board President LeRoy Lillibridge, with the help of Shane Linseth and Jay Lillibridge, agreed to replace the sheet metal on the rear of the engine, called fuel bunkers and to sandblast and paint the engine which was paid for by Lillibridge. Heggen Equipment, Watford City, transported the engine to Iron Steer Trailers for restoration and on July 9, Clayton Monson, Heggen Equipment, donated the transportation to the park.

The second attraction is a garage which housed the sheriff's car in the '30s and '40s.

The dedication of the Don Erikson Fire Station will be at 11 a.m. with Rev. Alton Hillesland, the only remaining member of the original board of directors, as speaker.

Other activities include a coin scramble in the straw and stilt walking for kids, threshing, feed grinding, a horse power demonstration, the Les Sivertson Blacksmith Shop, a working saw mill, shingle mill, four-sided planer and stationary baler. There will be buggy and wagon rides, live music by the "Bah'n Quartet, food concessions, antique tractors and stationary engines. The pioneer village will be open.

Admission is free but donations are accepted.







AQHA, Weaver Quarter Horses Team Up To Offer Free Weanling To Youth

Responsible Alcohol Server Trainings Planned

District II Alcohol and Drug Program will be sponsoring free Responsible Alcohol Sales and Service Trainings (RASS) in Wibaux and Glendive. The training in Wibaux will be held at The Beaver Creek Brewery, 104 Orgain Ave. E. Wednesday, Sept. 28 from 1-4 p.m. The Glendive trainings will be held at Dawson Community College, UC Room 102 located in the Ullman Building, 300 College Drive, Thursday, Sept. 29 from 1-4 p.m. and again from 5-8 p.m. This will be the last of the Responsible Alcohol Sales and Service trainings to be conducted in the area by District II prior to the Oct. 1, 2011 deadline when Mandatory Server Training becomes law. All area alcohol retailers from Dawson, McCone, Prairie, Richland, Garfield and Wibaux counties have been notified by letter regarding these trainings.

The new law mandates all license holders, alcohol sellers, servers and supervisors are to attend a state approved server training program. The law also requires that any new employee must be trained within 60 days of hire, and all must be trained every three years thereafter from a state approved server training course.

District II Alcohol & Drug Program has conducted multiple trainings in the region the past several months in order to inform and prepare area retailers for the upcoming changes mandated by Senate Bill 29. Retailers are encouraged to attend one of these free sessions or they can visit www.AlcoholServerTraining.mt.gov and participate in one of the state-approved server training courses online prior to Oct. 1 deadline. There is a fee associated with the online server training courses and cost ranges from \$20-\$40 per

participant.

Individuals who have received training in the past couple of years, will be in compliance with the new law as long as they are retrained within a three-year period from the date listed on their previous training certificate.

Due to the high volume of requests for training, it is mandatory all participants

pre-register to insure ample training materials and space are provided. Participation cannot be guaranteed without pre-registration. It happens way too often...unintentional injury or death! I am not speaking of accidents; which in the Webster Dictionary are defined as an unexpected happening causing loss or injury which is not due to any fault or misconduct on the part of the person injured.

Drivers need to start making the choice to buckle up. 43% of all unintentional deaths in Montana are due to motor vehicle crashes. 72% of fatal crashes in rural areas involved only one vehicle. 81% of those killed in a pick-up crash were not wearing a seatbelt. High school students are less likely to wear seat belts than adults in Montana. 56% of Montana high school students reported never or rarely using a seat belt while driving and only 41% reported never or rarely using a seat belt as a passenger. 71% of adults report wearing their seatbelt.

If the statistics don't convince you to buckle-up how about the finances. According to Montana DOT: On average, an unbelted occupant has a longer hospital stay, required more intensive care and accrued significantly higher hospital charges (\$52,993 for average unbuckled occupant - \$36,420 for average buckled occupant). According to Montana Emergency Care: Those injured pay for only 26% of the total healthcare cost, the remainder is paid by society. Montana spends \$14 million dollars in Medicaid and uncompensated care for unrestrained motor vehicle occupant inpatient hospital charges. After medical expenses there is an additional \$5000 to \$10,000 plus in expenses for funerals.

Again, if the statistics and cost don't convince you to buckle up, how about the people you have an effect on each and every day? What effect would a traumatic injury or death have on them? Will your children really be OK if you can't take care of them? Will your spouse really be OK without your support and love; and able to handle the additional burden? Will your parents really be OK not going to your activities? Will your friends be OK without your support and friendship? Will your employer be OK without your dedication and able to find another employee? Will they be OK? Yes, but really OK? You make the choice....do you want to leave these lasting effects with the people you touch each and every day?
