## "Best Of The West" Ribfest & Street Fair This Friday

Country music act Blackhawk opening for this year's headliner, Hairball.

Get your grub and good times on at the 19th Annual Best of the West Ribfest & Street Fair on Main Street, Watford City, ND, Friday, Aug. 11.

Ribfest teams must be set up and ready to cook by 10 a.m.; judging will start at 3 p.m. There is no limit to the number of teams that can register, but there is a minimum of 200 lbs. of ribs that each team must cook, and teams must provide an emailed receipt for the purchase of the meat by 4 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 9. First place will be awarded \$1,000 and bragging rights, of course. Second place will get \$500 and third place will receive \$250. Teams can set up the night before as well as the morning of the event.

The 12th Annual Classic Car & Truck Show, sponsored by Panther, is happening from noon-7 p.m. with judging beginning at 4 p.m. This is open to vehicles of all ages. Awards for both the Classic Car & Truck Show and Ribfest winners will be held at 5 p.m.

The Bags & Bones Cornhole Tournament starts at 11 a.m. Teams will play for cash prizes sponsored by RTC Networks & Watford City Tourism; first place will win \$1,000, \$400 for second, and \$100 for third place.

The Kids Zone, sponsored by Legendary Smiles, will be open from noon-8

p.m. with Jump & Fun Inflatable Games. This is free, however kids under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

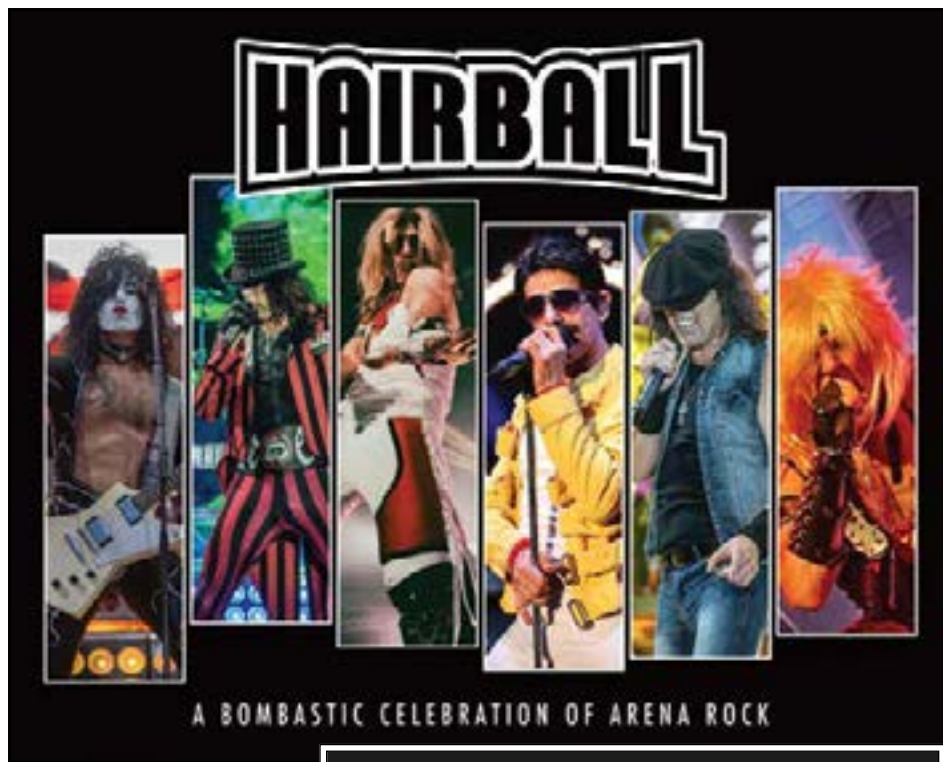
There will be food vendors available throughout the day, as well as craft vendors for anyone who would like to do a little shopping.

North Dakota native and musician Josh Kehr will be getting the party started from 4-7 p.m. on the 3rd Ave. side stage, sponsored by Badlands Hydrovac Services LLC.

Ribs will be served to the public at 6 p.m. and at 7:30 p.m. country music act Blackhawk will be opening for this year's headliner, Hairball. 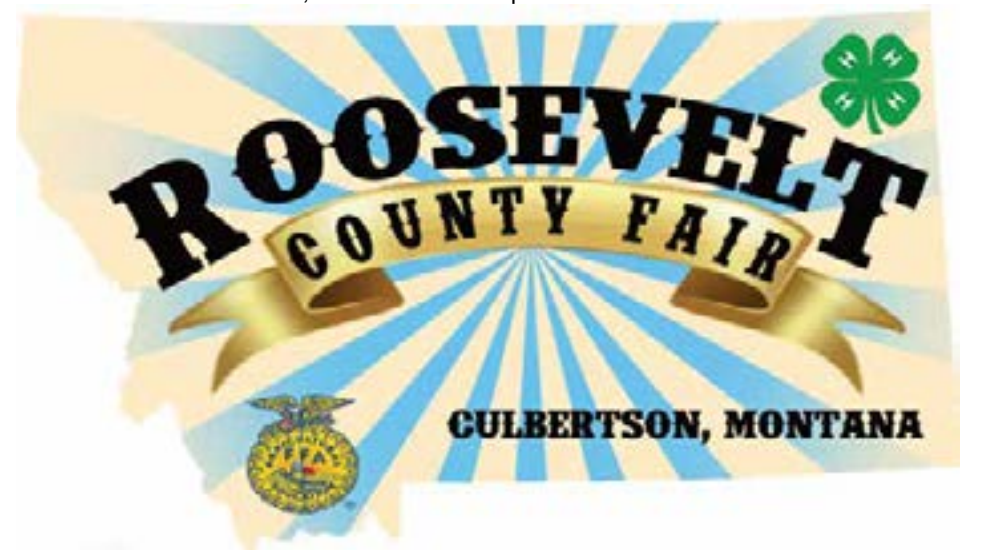

## McKenzie County Fatal Crash

On Aug. 1, at approximately 5:59 p.m. CT, on Hwy. 85-mile marker 177, five miles south of Williston there was a two-vehicle head on collision.

A 2020 Chevrolet Equinox driven by Maria White, Groves, TX, with a passenger, Jose White, Groves, TX, was traveling northbound on Highway 85 near mile marker 177 when it hydroplaned on the wet road caused by a heavy downpour in the area. A 2021 Kenworth semi driven by Richard Poline, Minot, ND, was traveling southbound in the same location at the time. The Equinox crossed over center and struck the Kenworth head on. White and her passenger, Jose White were pronounced deceased on the scene. Poline sustained minor injuries and was transported via ambulance to CHI St. Alexius, Williston, ND.

At the time of the crash the road conditions were wet and it was raining.

The agencies who responded to the crash were North Dakota Highway Patrol, McKenzie County Sheriff's Office, Williston Rural Fire Department and Williston Ambulance.

The crash remains under investigation by the North Dakota Highway Patrol.

## Mountrail County - Pedestrian Fatality

On Friday, Aug. 4, around 3:45 a.m., the North Dakota Highway Patrol received a report that a female pedestrian had been struck by a vehicle on Hwy. 23 near mile marker 52, approximately one mile east of New Town. A 31-year-old female from Roseglen, ND, was located deceased. A witness advised that a vehicle had struck the female and left the scene.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is the primary investigating agency and are being assisted by the North Dakota Highway Patrol, Three Affiliated Tribes Police, and the Mountrail County Sheriff's Department.

Law Enforcement is asking the public for any information related to the incident. Anyone with information is asked to call the FBI at 763-569-8000 or the North Dakota Highway Patrol at (admin line) 701-328-2447 or (State Radio) 701-328-9921.

This incident remains under investigation by the FBI with the assistance of the North Dakota Highway Patrol, Three Affiliated Tribes Police and Mountrail County Sheriff's Department.

# Watford, ONT, Canada, Shares 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary With Olsons

After meeting each other at the Long X Visitors' Center in 2019, Kelly and Frances Olson, Watford City, ND, and Jeannie and John Minten, Watford, ONT, Canada stayed in touch with each other partially because they experienced so many likenesses in their

communities. Since the village of Watford was having their 150th anniversary on June 23 the Mintens chose to invite the Olsons to attend. Since Dr. Vaughn Morris, who was a doctor in Schafer and Watford City from 1906-1940, named

Watford after his hometown Watford, ONT, in 1915. Later the post office and freight shipments got confused with Wolford, ND, so added the word "city" to the town's name. Excited to see their Canadian friends, the Olsons were curious and chose to

attend. "At every event, they introduced us and why we were there," states Frances. "Making it really easy to talk to everyone about the likenesses and differences." They had a parade and the stores had displays of antiques in their windows. Watford, ONT, is 1430 miles from Watford City, ND, one hour north of Detroit, between Lakes Huron and Erie and has a population of 1750. They raise hogs and sheep primarily like Watford City, but the difference in the two is that acreage sells for \$40,000/acre (Canadian dollars). The other difference between the two, the Canadians closed their show with a fire of sawdust from their Searson Sawmill (see photo).

# Three Sidney Wrestlers Going to Brazil For International Competition

Three wrestlers from Sidney have been chosen to go to the 2023 World School Sport Games as part of Team USA. They will be joining many other school sports athletes from across the country to participate in an international event in Brazil with 22 different sports.

According to a bulletin handed out to high schools across the country, The World School Sports Games was organized for the first

time in ISF history in 2021 in Belgrade, Serbia. It brought together 1,849 school athletes from 36 countries aged 13-15 in a multisport event, creating a unique context for high-level sports competitions, educational programs, and cultural exchanges. The best student-athletes in the world will participate in the World School Sports Games as an individual and as part of teams. In addition to the name of the respective member, individuals, and

individuals as part of the teams will represent their school. Sidney High School was not able to send any students but that has changed.

Aaron Schmitz, Tyson Syth, and Bodee Bright are the Sidney High School athletes that will be going for wrestling. Shane Gorder nominated them for the program and, after a rigorous process of training and tournaments, Rob Pilcher a coach from Nebraska picked them.

On Aug. 16, the three wrestlers and Coach Shane Gorder will be heading out to Miami, FL, for a wrestling camp from Aug. 17-18. After the camp, they will fly to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil for the games. The competition will be from Aug. 19-27. While there they will be staying in a hotel along Barra de Tijuca, Rio's longest beach. The competitions will be held at the Barra Olympic Park. The park was originally built

for the 2007 Pan American Games and served as the Olympic Park during the 2016 Summer Olympics.

Whether they win or lose the three wrestlers are in for the experience of a lifetime. Besides interacting with other school athletes from all around the world and participating in educational and cultural programs, they will be able to experience the local culture of Rio de Janeiro. This trip would

not have been possible without those in the community that paid the wrestlers for doing yard work, landscaping, and moving furniture, and the help of the Sidney Wrestling Club.

## Montana Public Service Commission Hosted Listening Hearing at Sidney Extension Office

The Montana Public Service Commission hosted a listening session on Tuesday, July 25, at the MSU Extension Office, Sidney, MT, and by Zoom regarding MDU's request to raise rates by 9.1% in their service areas.

After recapping the request and subsequent reactions by the Montana Consumer Council and Denbury Onshore, LLC by the Commission's Chief Legal Counsel Lucas Hamilton, and Montana Public Service Commissioner Randy Pinocci opened the listening session up to the attendees both at the extension office and over Zoom.

John Mercer, Sidney said that he thinks they should double the increase just to end the meetings. He also said that because of MDU getting rid of methods of electricity production that he feels are reliable such, as coal, and switching to solar power and wind generators, methods he feels are not as durable, the rates will continue to go up anyways.

Ann Hoff, Glendive, disagreed with Mercer on the effectiveness of solar power but also was against MDU's request.

In total, 10 of the 12 people speaking from Sidney, Richland County, Miles City, Terry, and Glendive both in person and over Zoom expressed that they were not in favor of MDU's request for the increase in rates.

Various reasons were given ranging from, "MDU needs to tighten their belt and work through the current economic climate with what they have like everyone else is" and "there are too many people, businesses, and organizations who are experiencing financial hardship in MDU's service areas over eastern Montana and cannot take the hit" to "9.1% is too high of an increase" and "if North Dakota is going to be benefitted the most by MDU's improvements then why should we have to get the rate increase?"

When the meeting was adjourned Commissioner Pinocci assured everyone that the Public Service Commission was still taking public comments in writing, by phone at 1-800-646-6150, or by email to pschelp@mt.gov.

# Sidney Job Service Provides Valuable Resources For Former Sidney Sugars Employees

Former Sidney Sugars employees have found resources through the Sidney Job Service over the last few months. Within days of learning that the factory was closing, Governor Gianforte visited Sidney and tasked the Sidney Job Service with providing every possible resource to the individuals impacted by the layoffs.

A welding trailer, provided by Great Falls College, was brought to Sidney Sugars for onsite training April 3-13, 2023. Dawson Community College provided the trainer, materials and safety gear, and Sidney Job Service called on other area Job Services to assist.

"We arranged to bring in extra support from other Job Service offices to ensure

all the welders had their enrollment paperwork done for access to the training funding as well as the documentation needs of Dawson Community College being met. This was accomplished on site at Sidney Sugars with support of their management," explained Sidney Job Service Manager Steve Olson.

Fourteen Sidney Sugars employees completed the two-week, non-certified, prevocational course which was funded at Olson's request by the Dislocated Worker Training Grant. The grant of federal funding was approved by the Montana Department of Labor & Industry's Program Director.

On April 19, the Sidney Job Service, in partnership with the Sidney Area Cham-

ber of Commerce & Agriculture, had a booth at the local job fair with staff on-site offering resume assistance, career guidance, assistance to present employers with hiring and retention strategies, and updating their employment-related posters.

"I presented to a group of area employers on timely and relevant hiring and retention practices and how those have changed over the years," he said. "I also presented to a group of career seekers and those seeking to improve their careers on modern day job search and employability skills."

Additionally, the Sidney Job Service has had over 50 sit-downs with former Sidney Sugars employees where they assisted the workers in

obtaining new careers and developing plans to reach their employment goals. The Sidney Job Service was able to fund career-related training such as CDL certification, welding, and software applications through the Dislocated Worker program, and helped nearly every laid off employee with their unemployment claims. Olson noted that the majority of the individuals they have spoken with have stayed within the community.

"Our goal is to understand the needs of the clients so that we can best assist their unique situation through assessments and discussions," Olson said.

The Sidney Job Service continues to offer resources such as one-on-one customized employment services

for anyone looking for work or seeking a better career. These can include mock interviews to develop interview skills, resume building, application guidance and online application support, interest assessments, access to both formal education and vocational training for those who qualify, and general support for those who are struggling to find, keep or change careers. They also provide a number of valuable services to employers.

Olson and his team have received several compliments from the individuals they have worked with and Sidney Sugars general manager. Olson also extends his gratitude to his colleagues at the Glendive and Miles City Job Services who have dedicated their time and energy

in assisting displaced Sidney Sugars employees.

"Beyond the concern for the local economy, as someone who has experienced a layoff, my concern is for the well-being of the individuals and their families," Olson commented. "The financial impact of a layoff is understood but what often is missed is the emotional impact. We do our very best to be good listeners to those who have experienced a job loss such as this to ensure we make referrals to other supportive services they or their family members may need."

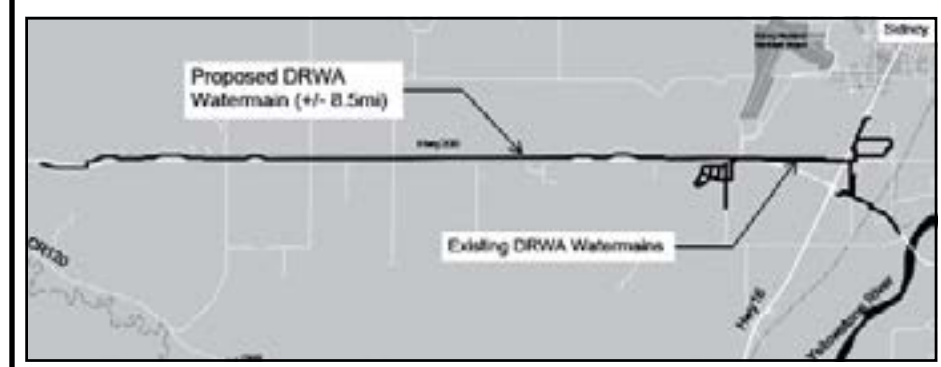

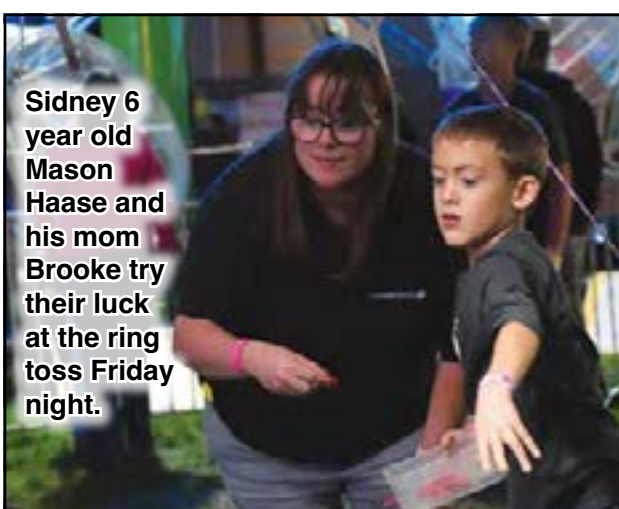

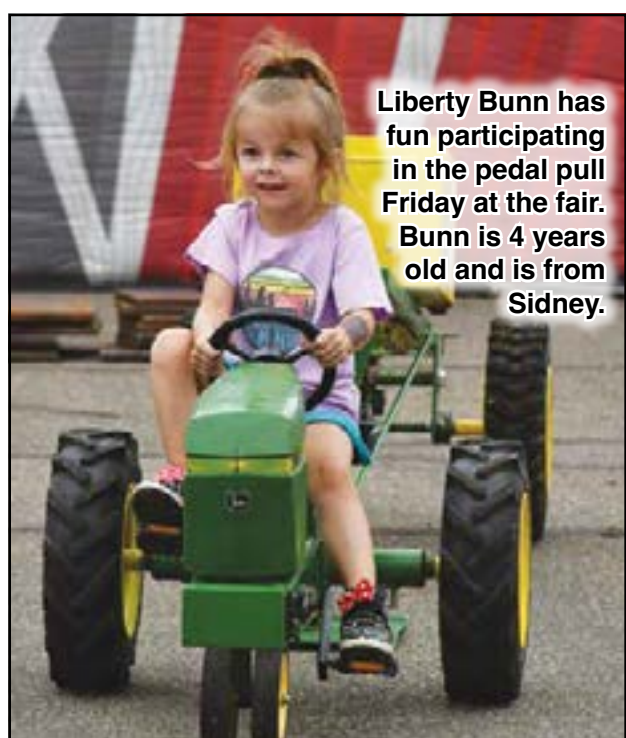

# Martha's Place To Hold Barn Dance Fundraiser In September

# Bakken Rocks Cookfest Comes Full Circle

The Bakken Rocks Cookfest, which is in its 14th year, was held again this year in Killdeer, coming full circle. The Cookfest began in 2009, being held in the towns of Killdeer and Belden that first year. Over the next 12 years there would be two Cookfest's each year in various towns around the western third of North Dakota. The past fests were held at: 2009: Belden and Killdeer; 2010: New Town and Tioga; 2011: Crosby and Watford City; 2012: Belfield and Ray; 2013: Parshall and Powers Lake; 2014: Dunn Center and Kenmare; 2015: Alexander and South Heart; 2016: Mandaree and Stanley; 2017: Medora and Westhope; 2018: Grenora and Twin Buttes; 2019: Bowman and Van Hook; 2020: Canceled due to COVID-19; 2021: Arnegard and Mohall; 2022: Trenton and White Shield.  
This year, however, there will be only one and that was in Killdeer Tuesday afternoon and evening, July 18. The event was very well attended.  
Starting at 2 p.m. the first two hours were taken up with the educational session

of the fest.  
Ron Ness, ND Petroleum Council, welcomed the attendees and then former Lt. Governor Brent Sanford spoke. Sanford is Bakken Global Recruitment of Oilfield Workers project manager, or GROW, a new initiative to bring workers to the oil field through immigration, focusing initially on Ukrainians.  
Other speakers during the informational session included Martin Stuart, Marathon Oil Vice President of Operations, Lynn Helms, North Dakota Department of Mineral Resources, Justin Kringstad, ND Pipeline Authority, spoke on the transporting of Bakken crude. Finishing up the education segment was Tioga geologist Kathy Neset, owner of NESET. Neset spoke on drilling, geology and the energy of the future. Later she had a booth showcasing pieces of actual oil shale, a jar of crude oil and the jars with crushed rock to show differences in the various shale's making up the different levels of the Bakken Shale zones. It was weird to think that that dark black hard rock, if it were hot,

would-be oozing oil from it.  
Next came all the fun stuff.  
There were around 20 oilfield-related companies in the cookfest and each had their own flavorful menus for people to try. The companies competed to win at being people's favorite. Some of the food featured at the booths were baked beans, barbecued ribs, prime rib pieces, brisket, walleye and pepper tacos, and smoked mac and cheese. For dessert, there were cookies, cakes, popcorn, bars and Crestwood's booth was popular with their handmade root beer floats.  
The entire event was free to the public.  
Alongside the delicious food were piled hundreds of free swag items, emblazoned with company logos, waiting on the tables for people to acquire.
